

## Celia Slater

A 1985 graduate of Leisure Services and Studies, Ms Slater was a scholarship basketball player, a four-year letter winner whose jersey number was 22. She was named captain and MVP her senior year and was named to the Metro Conference Commissioner's List (academic award). She has been a gold medal winner as a member of Team Handball at the 1987 Olympic Festival, the first coach of women's basketball at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, and women's basketball coach at Lynn University. She was also on the staff of the WNBA first ever pre-draft camp.

Currently, she is the Executive Director of the WinStar Foundation, which has two programs – The Coaches Academy and Play With a Purpose. The Coaches Academy, which the NCAA sponsors, provides training and certification for women coaches at all levels and helps with recruitment and retention. Play With a Purpose provides tools for athletes and their coaches to improve communication styles, honor personal and team values and goals, and to explore their current feelings and behaviors. She is also the Special Projects Coordinator for the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators.

Ms. Slater continues to be dedicated to her personal and professional development. She is a recent graduate of the NACWAA/HERS Institute and the NACDA Management and Leadership Training Institute.

# Jo Anne Whitaker, M.D.

Dr. Jo Anne Whitaker, a 1948 graduate in microbiology, was F Club President, a Tri-Delt and active in student affairs as an undergraduate. During her college years she was two-time winner of the Florida Amateur Women's Golf Association tournament and was the first woman to play in the Florida Open Championship.

A graduate of Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest College she has had special training in hematology, nutrition, oncology, psychiatry and bacteriology. She has been Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Texas and Illinois and St. Louis University and at the Chieng Mai University in Thailand. She originated, and was the Medical Director for the first Hospice in Florida. In addition, she has served as the Director of Research for the Arthritis Pain Center in Clearwater and a Director of the Chronic Pain Center in Colorado. Currently she is the President and Director of Research for the Bowen Research and Training Institute in Palm Harbor, Florida. Two particular areas of interest are the effects of Lyme Disease and the use of alternative medicines.

Her honors, among many, include Distinguished Service Award by the American Medical Society, Distinguished Service Award by the Vietnam Government, the Health Medal, the Florida State Emeritus Club Commitment to Excellence Award and Who's Who in American Women.
