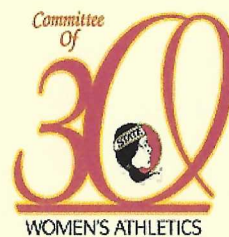
Katherine Blood Hoffman

Katherine "Kitty" Blood Hoffman, class of 1936, was captain of the Even's baseball and volleyball teams; a member of the F Club, Mortar Board, Esteren and Phi Beta Kappa; and president of the student body. She continued her academic career at Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons, earning a Master of Arts degree in chemistry. She married Harold Hoffman and returned to Florida State in 1940. During her long and distinguished tenure as a professor and Dean of Women, she taught chemistry to hundreds of students, and was the recipient of the Coyle E. Moore Award of Excellence in teaching, the Ross Oglesby Award for service and leadership, and the Circle of Gold from the Alumni Association. Also, the Alumni Association honored her with the Bernie Sliger Award, the highest recognition for service to the University. The Hoffmans endowed a major scholarship in chemistry. Upon her retirement in 1984 the University named the Hoffman Teaching Laboratory in her honor. Her son, Norris, is also a chemistry professor. Mrs. Hoffman continues to be a force in the University and in the community.

Alice Bennett Sims

Alice Bennett Sims, class of 1983, came to Florida State on a partial academic scholarship and after a walk-on year, she was given a track scholarship. She attained seven All-America honors as a sprinter and long jumper and was a member of two NCAA championship relay teams. Mrs. Sims graduated with a major in Physical Education. She is well known for her contributions to children and youth having worked with the City of Tallahassee, the Leon County School Board, and numerous state agencies. Currently she is an analyst for the Governor's Committee on Policy and Budget and coaches track at North Florida Christian. She founded and continues to be a leader in the highly successful "Capital City Christian Cruisers" track program for local youth, which has members who successfully compete at the national level. Many agencies recognize her contributions as she has received awards from Leon County, the U.S. Track & Field Association, Tallahassee Community College, and the Florida Commission on the Status of Women. Mrs. Sims is married to Ernie Sime, Jr.; they have two sons, Ernie, III and Marcus.
