2013 WOMEN'S B-TEAM



Representing the 'Noles with passion, while chasing their dreams

Originally launched as the Seminole Striders program by current FSU men's coach Bob Braman back in 2001, the newly-renamed Florida State B-team provides female cross country and distance runners the opportunity to be a part of the program.

Now in its second decade, the B-team remains an integral part of the highly successful women's program under coach Karen Harvey.

"Our program is very unique," said Harvey. "It is a chance to help develop future talent. It is for runners of all levels that have a passion for the sport, but might not be at scholarship or walk-on level right now. However, with time and consistent training, provided by this opportunity, they can become such and potentially make the travel team."

Members of the B-team are provided equipment, academic support, training programs and racing opportunities in both cross country and track & field. In return they are expected to attend practice daily, participate in community service and maintain a high level of excellence in the classroom, the same as the other student-athletes on Harvey's team.

"In cross country we have a unique opportunity where you can put an unlimited number of people on the starting line," Braman said. "It's not like most sports where you have a limited number of positions and you would just be putting more people on the bench. ... We can literally put them into action. They can go out and train and compete."

To ensure that the B-team members are getting proper coaching and training, Harvey and Braman assign a volunteer coach and a graduate student to lead the hard-working group and manage their needs. With a commitment to the training schedule, many improve dramatically.

"It is a fitness and conditioning sport, so everybody's conditioning, running and training," Braman said. "You still have the fine-tunings that you do with your elite athletes, but we can train as many as 42 [B-team runners]."

Despite the lack of fanfare surrounding the program, the B-team program is not a well-kept secret. The FSU coaching staff promotes the program in high schools throughout the state of Florida.

"The program has caught a lot of momentum at the high school level and we are now to the point where they seek us out," Braman said.

The benefits of the program are obvious. The B-team members expand

the number of opportunities for female student-athletes, to the benefit of the Florida State athletic department. They are given the opportunity to compete in a sport that they love throughout the cross country and track & field seasons. Harvey hopes to expand that opportunity beyond cross country and track races to include half-marathon training and racing during the winter months.

Intrinsically, members of the B-team learn the importance of sacrifice and team-work, while maintaining a healthy lifestyle which will serve them well in their adult lives.

Wilcox brings wealth of experience to post as **FSU Director of Athletics**

Florida State University announced the appointment of Stan Wilcox as the institution's new Director of Athletics following a national search. Wilcox, who served as Senior Deputy Director of Athletics at Duke University since 2008, was named FSU's eleventh full-time AD by University President Eric Barron on August 7, 2013

During his time at Duke, Wilcox's duties included managing the day-to-day operation of the department and oversight of the football program. Other areas within athletics he oversaw were Human Resources, Contracts, Legal Affairs, Athletics Training, Strength and Conditioning, Equipment, Campus Recreation, Physical Education, External Operations that included Marketing and Promotions, Ticketing, Digital Media, Sports Information and Video Operations. In addition, Wilcox was responsible for coordinating football scheduling.

Before arriving at Duke, Wilcox, a former basketball letterman at Notre Dame, spent three years as the deputy director of athletics at his alma mater. Prior to returning to South Bend in 2005, he served 11 years as an associate commissioner of the BIG EAST Conference.

While working at the BIG EAST Conference, Wilcox was the league's representative to the NCAA Management Council from 2000-05 and served on the Management Council subcommittees on incentives and disincentives, governance, nominations and the task force to review the NCAA's one-time transfer exception rule. Also, he spent time on the NCAA recruiting task force and the basketball issues committee. For the BIG EAST, Wilcox, who in 2001-02 received the National Association of Athletics Compliance Coordinators Outstanding Achievement Award, was responsible for the league's NCAA governance, legislative, enforcement, compliance services and legal issues.

Additionally, Wilcox helped create the Minority Opportunity Athletics Association (MOAA) and is a former board member of MOAA. Wilcox is also a past president of the Black Coaches Association (BCA), having held the post from June, 2003 to June, 2005. Overall, he served 11 years on the BCA's Board of Directors.

Before his tenure at the BIG EAST Conference, Wilcox worked as a legislative assistant at the NCAA from 1989-94. Prior to that, he worked as a senior court analyst for the Kings County Supreme Court in Brooklyn, N.Y., from 1982-89. Following his graduation from Notre Dame in 1981 with a degree in economics, he spent one year as an account executive for Serres, Visones & Rice Insurance in New York, N.Y. and as a graduate assistant basketball coach at C.W. Post College.

A native of North Babylon, N.Y., Wilcox played in 100 career games on the hardwood for the Fighting Irish and was a member of Notre Dame's 1978 club that faced Duke in the NCAA Final Four in St. Louis, Mo. He helped the Irish to a four-year ledger of 92-26 with four NCAA Tournament berths. Wilcox went on to earn a juris doctor degree from the Brooklyn Law School in 1988 and is a member of the New York State Bar Association.

He is married to the former Ramona Harrell. Stan has three daughters, Soraya, Yasmeen and Nadia, and Ramona has three sons, James, Brian and Charles.



Sport Oversight



Under the direction of head coach Bob Braman the Florida State men's cross country program has reached unprecedented heights. Entering his 14th season at the helm of the Seminoles – and his fourth decade in the collegiate ranks – Braman has guided the Seminoles to 10 consecutive NCAA Championship meet appearances, highlighted by a runner-up finish in 2010 and a fifth-place showing in 2012.

To add perspective to those accomplishments, prior to Braman's arrival Florida State had made just one NCAA Championship appearance and produced just two All-Americans. Now they own the nation's seventh-longest active streak of championship appearances and have produced two All-Americans in each of the last three seasons; seven overall on his watch.

Not surprisingly, the Seminoles have been one of the premier programs in the Atlantic Coast Conference over the course of Braman's tenure. Prior to his arrival in 2000, the FSU men's cross country team had not finished higher than seventh in nine ACC Championship meets. Braman matched that all-time best finish in his first season, then guided the 'Noles to back-to-back fifth-place finishes in 2001 and 2002. In 2003 the Seminoles charged to the first of four consecutive runner-up finishes at the ACC Championship meet, which, not surprisingly, coincided with the start of their 10-year run of NCAA Championship appearances.

The Seminoles flirted with the title on several occasions, including a onepoint loss to NC State in 2004, before breaking through to win the school's first men's ACC team title in 2010. From 2003-2012 FSU's men have finished third or better nine times, including five runner-up performances. Individually, Andrew Lemoncello claimed back-to-back ACC Championship titles in 2004 and 2005 and the Seminoles have piled up 31 All-ACC honors in Braman's first 13 seasons, after failing to claim any in their first nine years of league membership. FSU has also produced four ACC Rookie of the Year honorees, while three 'Noles – Matthew Leeder, Michael Fout and Jakub Zivec – have earned ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors.

FSU enters the 2013 season looking to post a third consecutive NCAA South Region title, and the fifth for the program since 2004. The 'Noles won their second consecutive title in 2012 at Apalachee Regional Park, FSU's home course, which Braman was instrumental in developing as part of a joint venture between Leon County, the Gulf Winds Track Club and the university.

In addition to his work with the men's team, Braman also laid the foundation for the women's cross country program, which he directed from 2000-2006 before turning it over to Karen Harvey. He guided the women to the first NCAA Championship appearances (2002, 2003 and 2006) in school history. His final women's team, in 2006, finished fourth at the ACC Championship meet – a program-best at the time – and began the program's current streak of seven consecutive NCAA appearances.

Braman succeeded Terry Long as the head men's and women's track & field coach prior to the 2004 season and helped transform the Seminoles into a national power, claiming NCAA Championships in 2006 and 2008. Florida State has finished fourth or better seven times in the last nine outdoor seasons and fifth or better five times in the last eight indoor campaigns. Along the way, FSU has become synonymous with success on the national stage.

Florida State's trophy case provides substantial evidence. The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) bestowed the John McDonnell Award, presented to the program that posts the highest average NCAA Championships finish from cross country, indoor and outdoor seasons, for the 2010-11 and 2011-12 school years. The FSU men are the only program nationally to place in the top five in the final McDonnell Award tabulations each of the past five years. Not to be outdone, the Florida State women have finished sixth or higher for five consecutive years – one of only two programs that can make that claim – in the competition for the Terry Crawford Award, signifying comprehensive excellence on the women's side.

Over the course of Braman's first 10 seasons as head track & field coach the Florida State men have won eight Atlantic Coast Conference indoor and eight outdoor championships, including the 2013 outdoor crown. In 20 combined team championship opportunities in the ACC with Braman at the helm, the Seminoles have four runner-up finishes to go with the 16 titles. The FSU women's track & field team swept the 2009 indoor and outdoor ACC titles and nearly pulled off the 2013 outdoor title.

Since his arrival at FSU, Braman has won a combined 36 national, regional and conference Coach of the Year honors, including a sweep of the ACC men's and women's outdoor track & field awards in 2013.

On his watch, the Seminoles have brought home 187 All-American honors between the track & field and cross country programs and produced 34 national champions on the track. In 2011, Ngoni Makusha claimed The Bowerman Award – college track & field's version of the Heisman Trophy – after claiming NCAA titles in the 100 (he set the collegiate record, 9.89), long jump and 4x100 relay.

Florida State's success can

also be attributed to Braman's ability to maintain continuity within his outstanding coaching staff, led by veterans Ken Harnden, Dennis Nobles and Karen Harvey.

The Seminole brand extends well beyond the borders. Twelve student-athletes who competed collegiately for the Seminoles participated in the 2012 London Olympics. It marked the second consecutive Summer Games the 'Noles were represented by a dozen Olympians.

Before joining the Florida State family, Braman enjoyed 17 years of national success at the University of South Florida, where he began his coaching career as the men's cross country assistant in 1983. He was promoted to head cross country coach in 1985 and launched the women's program in 1986. When USF began its track program in 1991, Braman assumed head coaching duties for that sport as well.

Under Braman's guidance, the USF men's cross country team won three Conference USA titles (1997-1999), which followed a streak of six consecutive titles (1988-1993); three each as members of the Sun Belt and Metro conferences. He was honored Coach of the Year 14 times with the Bulls and his men's cross country team earned national rankings in 10 of his last 12 years. On the track his team's produced 41 NCAA qualifiers, highlighted by two-time NCAA 5000-meter champion Jon Dennis (1992-93).



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A Tampa, Fla. native, Braman graduated from the University of Florida in 1980 with a degree in broadcasting. He is married to the former Debbie Turner. They have two sons, Steven – a Florida State graduate - and Tyler, who is in his final year at FSU. Braman was a three-year captain of the Florida cross country team and earned All-SEC honors in cross country (1979-80) and indoor track (1979), while setting the school record in the indoor three-mile run.

Now in her seventh season, Florida State women's cross country coach Karen Harvey has transformed the Seminoles into one of the most powerful programs in the country.

An NCAA Championship contender and Atlantic Coast Conference juggernaut, the Seminoles know their way to the podium. Under Harvey's direction, FSU has finished in the top four at the NCAA Championship meet for six consecutive seasons, claimed five NCAA South Region titles and carried home the ACC Championship trophy six times.*

Florida State enters the 2013 season with the sixth-longest active streak of consecutive NCAA Championship appearances (seven); a stretch which includes back-to-back runner-up finishes in 2009 and 2010. An incredible run on its own merit, the streak is even more impressive when considering the Seminoles had made just three NCAA appearances prior to her arrival in 2007 and had not finished better that 18th.

Excellence, however, has become the new norm in Tallahassee, both collectively and individually. Beyond developing teams capable of producing championships at the highest level, Harvey's first six teams have produced 16 All-American, three NCAA South Region athletes of the year and four individual ACC champions. In 2012, Violah Lagat became the first Seminole to win the ACC title since Susan Kuijken rattled off three consecutive (2007-09), as FSU cruised to another team crown. Not surprisingly, Harvey has been selected ACC Coach of the Year each of her six seasons, and won five NCAA South Region Coach of the Year honors in six years.

In addition to her cross country honors, Harvey has oversight of the Florida State track & field women's distance team, which has enjoyed similar success. On the track the women's distance runners have earned 22 first-team All-America honors between the indoor and outdoor seasons and excelled at distances from 800 to 10,000 meters. In 2013, Amanda Winslow earned NCAA Indoor runner-up honors in the mile, establishing a new ACC record with the 10th-fastest time in collegiate history. Colleen Quigley's runner-up finish in the 3000 steeplechase at the NCAA Outdoor meet ranked as the eighth-fastest mark for a collegian.

The `Noles have enjoyed similar success within the ACC ranks. At the 2013 indoor championships, Winslow won her second consecutive 3000-meter title in meet record time and also helped the distance medley relay smash their own year-old conference mark. Outdoors, Quigley claimed her first individual ACC title in the steeplechase and Winslow led a 1-2-3 sweep in the 5000 as the Seminoles very nearly pulled out the team title.

Throughout her coaching career Harvey has established a reputation for developing cross country stars from outstanding middle-distance runners, including 2011 World Championship track & field silver medalist Hannah England, Pilar McShine and Hannah Brooks. Her most recent protégé along those lines was Lagat, who capped her collegiate career in the fall by following up her ACC cross country title by winning the NCAA South Region meet, followed by a 12th-place finish at the NCAA Championship meet.

Beyond performance-based results on the course and track, Harvey's teams have flourished academically, earning USTFCCA All-Academic honors both in cross country and track. Winslow swept ACC Indoor and Outdoor Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors in 2013 and earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors. Seminoles have also won three of the last four ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors in cross country.

As a team, the Florida State cross country women have been the recipient USTFCCCA All-Academic honors in each of Harvey's six seasons and never dipped below a cumulative 3.0 GPA. They have also been active in a wide range of community service endeavors.

Prior to joining the Florida State staff, Harvey turned Illinois into one of the finest cross country programs in the nation over a five-year run from 2002-2006. In her final two seasons, the Illini posted a pair of top 10 finishes at the NCAA Championships. The program made its first NCAA Champion-ship appearance in 2004, placing 20th, then followed up by finishing fifth in 2005 – the highest in school history – and eight in 2006. The 2006 team delivered the program's first NCAA Midwest Region championship, which earned Harvey coach of the year honors. A pair of runner-up Big Ten Championship finishes are also the best in Illinois history.

Harvey launched her coaching career as a two-year, volunteer cross country and track & field assistant coach at her alma mater, Michigan, before taking the Illinois post.

She also enjoyed an impressive running career, both collegiately and professionally. In 1998 she was ranked No. 1 in the world in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. A native of Brantford, Ontario, Harvey was a nine-time member of the Canadian national team, including three World cross country teams. She is the former Canadian record-holder in the steeplechase (10:14.27) and finished fifth at the 1998 Goodwill Games in the event. In

2000, Harvey was Canada's top 1500-meter runner after clocking a time of 4:16 at the Boston Indoor Games.

Collegiately, Harvey collected All-American honors in both cross country and track at Michigan between 1991-1995. She was 21st at the 1992 NCAA Cross Country Championships and also earned first-team All-Big Ten honors in 1992 and 1995. On the track, Harvey was eighth in the mile at the NCAA Indoor Championships and fifth in the 3,000 meters in 1995.

A 1995 Michigan graduate, Harvey received her B.A. in anthropology. She was also a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree, winning the 1995 Scholar Athlete of the Year award.

Harvey returned briefly to competition in 2011, running her first marathon, where she captured the Tallahassee Marathon title in a course record 2:43.

Harvey is married to Kevin Sullivan, a four-time NCAA champion, threetime Olympian and co-owner of Capital City Runners. Sullivan also serves as a volunteer assistant for the FSU women's cross country team.







Veteran All-Americans pace new-look teams with same standards

There are no names on the back of cross country jerseys, but Florida State coaches Bob Braman and Karen Harvey might want to consider nametags for their respective 2013 squads.

One year after Harvey's FSU women placed fourth and Braman's men finished fifth at the NCAA Championship meet, the Seminoles begin anew with their same goals and a host of new faces.

Each team returns only two runners from their seven-member lineups that chased titles in Louisville, Ky. last November. Fortunately, both coaches will have a returning All-American to show the way and provide the leadership necessary to extend impressive streaks.

Junior Colleen Quigley and senior Jakub Zivec placed 12th and 21st, in their respective women's and men's races at last year's championship races.

"We will have to find our identity in the first half of the year," said Braman, now in his 14th season at the helm of the Seminoles. "How we do in the championship season will likely be set by the bonding and work ethic established early on. I like the talent of this team but we have a long ways to go to reach the standard set the last five years."

Dating to 2003, the Seminole men have made 10 consecutive NCAA Championships appearances, which is tied for the seventh-longest active streak among Division I programs. They have finished third or better at nine of the last 10 Atlantic Coast Conference Championships over that same stretch.

The Florida State women are working on an equally impressive stretch. The program has made seven consecutive NCAA Championship appearances, including six in a row under Harvey's watchful guise. Not only have each of Harvey's six previous teams finished on the podium – in the top four – at the NCAA Championship meet, they have also carried home the last six ACC Championship trophies.

"It's been awhile that Florida State women's cross country has not been the favorite to win the ACC title and earn a spot in the NCAA top 10," Harvey said. "We have a lot of integrating of new talent to the FSU system and that weight will fall a lot on myself. I feel very blessed that our team captains, Colleen Quigley and Linden Hall, will help lead this team through the season.

"I remember 2007 and what it was like to be underdogs. Like then, we will have to quickly learn to sacrifice, be disciplined, focused and hungry for success as a team."

Neither squad will be void of talent. In addition to Zivec, who was the NCAA South Region champion and an All-ACC performer last season, sophomore Zak Seddon returns to the lineup off an outstanding track season. Seddon won the

U23 European Championships in the steeplechase for his native Great Britain in July, following up his ACC title and NCAA Championships appearance in the spring. As a freshman, he won the Virginia Tech Cross Country Invitational, earned All-South Region honors and was FSU's No. 6 finisher at the NCAA Championship meet.

"Zivec and Seddon are two of the most gifted runners I've ever coached, and are natural leaders for this squad," said Braman, who enters his fourth decade of collegiate coaching.

A host of transfers and newcomers will help pilot the 'Noles through the 2013 season. Missouri transfer Bryant Blahnik (11th, 2012 SEC meet) and Cornell graduate Kevin Johnson, who will compete as a grad school student, bring valuable experience to the fold.

The late addition of Matt Mizereck, a Tallahassee native and senior transfer from Florida where he was a two-time All-Region performer, should provide a big lift.

Glen Yarham, an Australian with significant international experience, has three years of eligibility remaining and loads of talent. He is joined by two more newcomers from the high school ranks: two-time Foot Locker finalist and Illinois state champion Grant Nykaza and Avery Lopez, who starred at Florida powerhouse Miami Belen Jesuit.

Redshirt senior Josh Gracia returns for his second season eager to make an impact, and his offseason commitment has led Braman to make him a tri-captain along with Zivec and Seddon.

Redshirt freshmen Chris Godwin and Max del Monte – promising signees a year ago – are on the comeback trail after putting a transition season at the Division I level behind them.

Quigley, who won the Notre Dame Invitational

and was the runner-up at the NCAA South Regional, is the clear leader for the women. One of only seven women to earn All-American honors in cross country, indoor and outdoor track last season, the St. Louis, Mo. native will be among the nation's best this fall.

Beyond Quigley, sophomore Georgia Peel and junior Aubree Worden are the only other returnees who have competed in an NCAA Championship meet. Peel earned All-ACC and All-Region honors as a freshman and was the No. 6 finisher for the 'Noles at last year's NCAA meet. Worden's season was cut short by injury.

Linden Hall, a junior who missed all of last cross country season due to injury, is coming off a brilliant track season which culminated with a ninth-place finish in the 1500 at the NCAA meet.

Hall and Quigley will serve as co-captains for Harvey.

"We will not have three key runners from last year - Amanda Winslow, Violah Lagat and Kayleigh Tyerman – but we have a very high powered recruiting class coming in," Harvey said.

Harvey maintained FSU's long-standing pipeline to Birmingham University in the U.K. with the signing of Hannah Walker and Pippa Woolven. Walker is one of the top U23 10k and 5k runners in Great Britain, while Woolven is a rising talent in the steeplechase.

They will be joined by a pair of freshmen, Orlando's Bridget Blake and Anna Holdiman from Iowa, who have competed at Foot Locker Nationals.

Among the returnees battling for spots in the top seven, redshirt junior Chelsi Woodruff and sophomore Carly Thomas have been the alternates on FSU's last two NCAA Championship qualifying teams. Graduate student Jess Butler and redshirt sophomore Teresa Ristow have designs on fitting into the rotation as well.

Conference cross country strength enhanced by additions

The Atlantic Coast Conference has long been considered one of the nation's finest when it comes to producing outstanding men's and women's cross country programs and addition of Notre Dame, Syracuse and Pittsburgh to the lineup for 2013 will only enhance that reputation.

A year ago the ACC sent five men's teams and three women's teams to the NCAA Championship meet, which includes only the top 31 nationally for each gender. The Notre Dame men and women also qualified, as did the Syracuse men, in their final season of Big East competition. Neither the Irish or Orange were one-time wonders.

In the NCAA championship history of the sport, which dates to 1938 for the men and 1981 for the women, only one program has made more cross country championship appearances than the 48 of the Notre Dame men. The 18 appearances by the Syracuse men ranks third among all current ACC programs. And while Pittsburgh has not been a formidable, they have been to the championship seven times on the men's side, which is more than Maryland, North Carolina and Virginia Tech. On the women's side, Notre Dame has made 11 trips to the championship meet and Syracuse has been four times in the last five years.

"I've always felt that the ACC is the premier cross country conference nationally, but there's no debate now as we've added to long-standing cross country powers in Notre Dame and Syracuse," FSU coach Bob Braman said. "The ACC Championship is going to be one whale of a meet come November 1st ."

"It's a great conference in all six sports," veteran Notre Dame coach Joe Piane said, referencing the indoor and outdoor track programs as well. "Teams like Florida State and Clemson are perennial national powers and we get to compete against them at several meets throughout the year. ... There are some great coaches and student-athletes in a league that is just filled with elite schools. We look like a lot of the schools and that makes



FSU, Virginia, Virginia Tech and NC State were among five ACC teams (along with Duke) that qualified for the 2012 NCAA Championship meet. So did 2013 newcomers Notre Dame and Syracuse. me very excited to get started. It will provide a great challenge for all our teams."

That challenge runs both ways. FSU women's cross country coach Karen Harvey has guided her team to five consecutive ACC titles, but is quite wary of the influx of talent that comes with the new programs.

"With the addition of the new teams to the ACC we will have to be at the top of our game," Harvey said. "It is going to be super competitive."

It began with Leon County's green light for space utilization, a topographical map, and a couple of machete-wielding men with a passion for running and even bigger dreams. Five years later the Apalachee Regional Park Cross Country Course is one of the finest facilities in the country and getting better each year.

"It's been almost five years from when we walked out there and said, `OK, how does one design and build a course?'" Florida State men's cross country coach Bob Braman said. "From the very get-go, we knew we could attain a regional championship course and we also knew we weren't too many years away from having our turn hosting the ACC Championship."

Braman and Gulf Winds Track Club's Brian Corbin were the men who not on plotted the course, but carved it from undeveloped land. Thanks to the collaborative efforts of Leon County, Florida State University and the Gulf Winds Track Club, all of whom have provided physical and financial support, Apalachee Regional Park – The ARP – is home to one of the nation's finest cross country programs and is rapidly becoming a fixture on the big stage racing circuit.

The course hosted its first meets in 2009, highlighted by the annual FSU Invitational, which includes collegiate and high school competition. As the venue continued to improve the number of meets, and the size of those meets, grew commensurately. The big break came when the course was awarded both the 2012 NCAA South Region and a three-year contract to host the Florida High School Athletics Association (FHSAA) State Championship meets. By virtue of landing those two events, the 2012 FSU Invitational became a "must-attend" event, drawing well over 2,000 runners eager to preview the venue over the course of the two-day, 12-race events.

"This has been a very proud moment for us to be able to partner with Florida State and our local running community through the Gulf Winds Track Club, establishing a venue that's worthy of attracting such events," said Leon County Administrator Vincent Long. "We would not have been able to do that without that partnership. It also opened minds perfectly in everything we're trying to do in our community in the area of tourism. This is just a great fit and we're happy to be a part of it.

"One of the things that makes me most proud about this is I don't think this could have happened if there had been a year-long plan, or a consultant's study or 35-point plan. This happened because people could talk to each other and staff at the university and staff at the county were really able to

look at what would work. We would have not had the level of expertise if we had gone out and created this facility ourselves."

From the moment it opened Braman and others took to calling the ARP, "Florida's Cross Country Playground," and for good reason. The layout, which can accommodate virtually any traditional racing distance from two miles to 10,0000 meters, features a blend of terrains, from spacious and tightly-mowed grass fields at the start to the crushed and packed shell/clay portions that wind through dense woods on the north side of the course, which borders Lower Lake Lafayette.

In all, the cross country course portion of the park covers approximately 125 dedicated acres, which makes it the showcase destination. Among the many improvements which were part of a \$250,000 upgrade project, was the addition of roughly 24 acres of parking with direct access to the

course. Additional changes to the course included the widening of the trails to meet NCAA specifications, along with some modest adjustments to the routing.

From the huge, grassy meadow starting area runners set off for a gap between two huge Live Oak trees as the trail rolls along its downward start, before a gentle incline leads to a left bend. At this point, approximately a half-mile into the race, runners hook up with a 15-meter wide crushed shell path, which winds through another meadow, a pine stand and through a heavily shaded hammock before it descends just before the mile mark.

Over approximately the next 800 meters the crushed shell trail parallels the lake's edge until it bends to the left. In a span of 70 meters runners make a 40-foot climb – the equivalent of a four-story building - up what is commonly called "The Wall" before emerging at the meadow behind the starting line area.

The first or primary loop of the course, which measures nearly 3,000 meters, can be repeated to achieve the desired race distance. It can also be altered by accessing several additional smaller loops that branch off the main course and are identical in terms of running surface.

It is that kind of flexibility which enabled Florida State to not only land the 2012 NCAA South Region, one of nine regional meets which annually qualify teams for the NCAA Championship, but also positions the school - and the course - for even bigger events down the road.

FSU is in the rotation to host the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Championship meet and Braman has made it clear he wants the regional meet to return, perhaps as early as 2014 and again in 2016. But there is an even bigger carrot being dangled.

Florida State has submitted a bid to host the 2016 NCAA Championship meet, which, if successful, would provide another financial boon to the community. Actually, two of them. Should the NCAA accept the school's proposal, FSU would also play host to a Pre-National meet, which would draw even more teams to Tallahassee than the championship.

Those were exactly the kind of events Braman and Corbin had in mind between swings of the machete more than five years ago. It is also one reason Leon County has been firmly behind the endeavor.

"The Board of County Commissioners views this as a real investment," said Long. "It's a relatively small investment, but we think it's going to have a big economic return."

"It's also going to bring events of a world-class nature to Tallahassee probably an NCAA meet and the Pre-National meet and then you could look at the World Cross Country Trial, the USA Club Championships," Braman said. "All of those events are extraordinarily attainable with the weather and the support that we've got from the country and the community."

With the help of Brian Hickey, Sports Marketing Director for Visit Tallahassee, Leon County has been trumpeting the potential benefits of EcoTourism locally. Just recently the county launched a website - Trailahassee. com - which features Apalachee Regional Park as one of dozens of venues ideal for running, hiking, biking and canoeing.

While the ARP is the racing home for the Seminoles, the myriad of local trails are regularly used by the FSU men's and women's teams for training, which helps the nationally-ranked program stand out from the crowd

And Apalachee Regional Park plays no small role, especially with the additional exposure it has received in recent years throughout the state and southeast, and with even bigger events headed to the venue in the near future.

"This has been an unbelievable partnership," Braman said. "Gulf Winds, with Brian Corbin, Bill Lott, Judy Alexander and all of their people, have done the work days and supported it financially to build the thing. Obviously, FSU's been very supportive, putting a lot of money into it, as well as work days with our cross country teams"

2012 SEASON REVIEW

A fifth consecutive NCAA Championship podium finish by the Florida State women's team and an inspiring fifth-place performance by the men at Louisville's Tom Sawyer State Park, capped an impressive season by the Seminoles harriers.

For the third consecutive season, coach Karen Harvey's Seminole women laid claim to the NCAA South Region team title, this time on their home course at Apalachee Regional Park with a team record-tying 24 points, behind champion Violah Lagat and runner-up Colleen Quigley. Not to be outdone, Bob Braman's FSU men laid claim to a second consecutive South Region title in impressive fashion. Led by the sideby-side, 1-2 finish of Jakub Zivec and Breandan O Neill, the 'Noles totaled just 27 points - the fewest in program history - to win in a landslide on their home turf.

Lagat's remarkable closing stretch to a memorable senior campaign began with her runaway victory at the ACC Championship meet, delivering the 'Noles their fifth consecutive title. Five Seminoles earned All-ACC honors. O Neill was the runner-up on the men's side at the ACC Championship meet in Blacksburg, Va. as the Seminoles placed third in one of the tightest three-team finishes in meet history. Three 'Noles earned All-ACC distinction.

Covered Bridge Open

The two teams made the trek to Boone, N.C., their annual getaway, and kicked off the 2012 campaign with easy team wins at the Covered Bridge Open. Linden Hall and Jessica Butler posted a 1-2 finish and freshman Carly Thomas was sixth overall, paving the way to victory. Graduate student Paul Lagno finished second in his FSU debut, while O Neill and Will Bridges were fourth and fifth to lead the men to victory.

Virginia Tech Invitational/ Pre-ACC

The Seminoles got their first look at the ACC Championship course and had no trouble dispatching the competition. Freshman Zak Seddon (25:08.3) set the course record and earned his first collegiate victory as the FSU men scored just 19 points as Zivec and O Neill chased the youngster across the finish line for a 1-2-3 sweep. FSU's women were even more impressive as senior Amanda Winslow was the first of five consecutive Seminole finishers for a perfect 15-point total.

Notre Dame Invitational

The Notre Dame Invitational once again provided the Seminoles with their first test of the season and both teams were up for the challenge. Led by sophomore Colleen Quigley's individual victory over the 5k course (16:29), the second-ranked FSU women romped to the title with four finishers among the first seven. Seniors Lagat (3rd,16:45), Kayleigh Tyerman (5th, 16:47), Winslow (7th,16:49) and Jessica Parry (12th, 16:57) contributed to the 28-point total. The 'Noles defeated three other ranked opponents in the 19-team field.

Braman's Seminole men collected some valuable at-large points with a fourth-place finish, highlighted by Zivec's collegiate-best, fourth-place finish (23:40) over the five-mile course. O Neill was ninth (23:56) and Lagno was 23rd (24:13) as the 10th-ranked men dispatched ranked ACC rivals NC State and North Carolina, who were among the 21-team field.

FSU Invitational

In what served as a preview for several teams of the NCAA South Region meet, the 40th annual FSU Invitational drew its largest field of competitors. Though only a handful of FSU's top 10 runners toed the starting line at Apalachee Regional Park, both the women and men emerged victorious. Senior Jennifer Dunn (21:49.0) and grad student Jess Butler (21:59.1) placed fourth and sixth, respectively, to lead the women to victory in the first collegiate 6k race at the course. Senior B-team standout Katherine McMeekin was 11th as the 'Noles easily out-distanced the competition. On the men's side, Bridges led a late-race surge by the 'Noles, who overhauled in-town rival Florida A&M (64-80) and claimed the title. A redshirt freshman, Bridges placed fourth (25:18.2). Grad student Seth Proctor (5th, 25:26.8) was right behind him, but walk-on Dominick Cabrera (15th, 26:12.9) was critical in sealing the victory.

Royal XC Challenge

A small group of Seminoles headed to Charlotte, N.C. and came away with some positive results at the Royal XC Challenge. On the women's side, Thomas led the way by placing third overall (17:38.1) in the 5k race at McAlpine Park and Butler was fourth (17:44.6). Backed by the top B-team runners, the women placed third overall. Sean Quinn placed 13th overall in the men's 8k race (25:07.7), though the 'Noles did not score a full team.

Louisville Invitational/Pre- Nationals

The Florida State women appeared undaunted racing as the nation's top-ranked team for the first time, as they got their first look at Tom Sawyer State Park, which would host the NCAA Championship meet in a month. Harvey's team was not to be denied as Lagat (3rd, 20:00.6), Quigley (6th, 20L06.4) and Winslow (14th, 20:15.9) paved the way for the Seminoles to win the title and remain unbeaten on the season. FSU edged fourth-ranked Oregon (72-87) for the team title and also dispatched No. 6 Georgetown and No. 8 Michigan from the field of 38 teams.

Braman's Seminole men arrived ranked 14th nationally and helped their cause with an impressive fourth-



place finish. Zivec continued his breakout season with a 10th-place finish (23:29.3) over the fast 8k track and O Neill was 17th (23:45.0). The 'Noles finished behind No. 7 Colorado, No. 3 BYU and No. 15 Oregon, but knocked off four ranked teams (Tulsa, Villanova, Georgetown and William & Mary), as well as ACC contenders Duke and Virginia Tech.

ACC Championships

Lagat fulfilled her mission of claiming an individual title, becoming the first ACC individual champion since Susan Kuijken in 2009, to lead a dominating performance by the Seminoles. It marked the sixth consecutive time the 'Noles carried home the ACC Championship trophy under Harvey. Quigley (4th, 20:17.6), Tyerman (5th, 20:20.1), Winslow (11th, 20:43.7) and freshman Georgia Peel (14th, 20:52.5) each earned All-ACC honors as the Seminoles out-pointed runner-up Duke 35-67.

The highly anticipated men's finish did not disappoint as only seven points separated first and third place. Despite All-ACC showings by O Neill (2nd, 23:42.2), David Forrester (12th, 24:12.1) and Zivec (13th, 24:14.8), the 'Noles settled for third behind host Virginia Tech (55) and runner-up Virginia (61) with 62 points.

NCAA South Regional

With comfortable temperatures and the crowd on their side, the Florida State men's and women's teams did not disappoint, delivering South Region titles on their home course at Apalachee Regional Park. For the second consecutive race, Lagat proved to be the class of the field, winning in a 6k course-record time of 20:06.6. The Seminole women not only swept the top three spots - Quigley and Winslow were second and third - but placed five in the top 10 as Tyerman was eighth and Peel 10th. FSU's winning 24-point total matched the program's record for fewest at the meet. Also, for the thirdconsecutive year, all seven Seminoles finished in the top 25 to earn All-Region honors as Parry was 13th and Dunn was 20th. Vanderbilt was a distant second with 112 points as the top two teams claimed spots in the NCAA Championship field.

Not to be outdone, the men put all the pieces together for an equally impressive title defense in front of the home crowd, securing their 10th consecutive NCAA Championship meet appearance. Zivec (30:23.9) and O Neill (30:23.9) celebrated the romp as they raced to a 1-2 finish doing their best Seminole chop over the final 100 meters. Senior Wes Rickman was close behind in a career-best fourth (30:37.2), while Proctor (9th, 30:44.3) gave the 'Noles four finishers in the top 10. Forrester (11th) rounded out the scorers, but Seddon (17th) and Lagno (22nd) also earned All-Region honors, marking the first time all seven 'Noles gained that distinction. FSU finished with a career-low 27 points to out-distance runner-up Georgia (48).

NCAA Championships

The top-ranked Florida State women had all of the front-end firepower it needed to claim the program's first NCAA Championship as Lagat (11th, 19:52), Quigley (12th, 19:53) and Winslow (17th, 20:02) claimed All-American honors. The Seminoles, however, came up short in their title bid and settled for fourth place for the second consecutive year.

On the men's side, Braman was hoping his squad could muster a top-10 finish and they exceeded expectations. With Zivec (21st, 29:47) and O Neill (28th, 29:52) earning All-American honors, Forrester (62nd), Rickman (77th) and Proctor (131st) pushed the 'Noles to a fifth-place finish - the second best showing by FSU in NCAA Championship history. The 'Noles finished just 48 points out of fourth place and a podium finish.
