Season-long goals in play after region repeat

A second consecutive South Region title secured Florida State's 13th NCAA Championships appearance, and the second under coach Kelly Phillips. The Noles enter the meet ranked No. 9 nationally, which falls nicely in line with their season-long goal of posting a top-10 finish.

That has been the objective since 2018, when the Noles placed 26th after entering the title race at No. 18 nationally.

- FSU's 58-point margin of victory over South Region runner-up Ole Miss was the largest by any winning team - women or men - in 18 region races;
- The Noles' 42-point winning total was the lowest for a South Region champion since FSU's 35-point score in 2013;
- Florida State was one of five women's teams nationally with six runners earning All-Region honors. Only Arkansas (7) had more:
- Maudie Skyring (4th), Elizabeth Funderburk (6th), Addi Coggins (7th), Jodie Judd (12th), Lauren Ryan (15th) and Rebecca Clark (22nd) claimed those honors;
- The depth of Phillips' roster has been the team's strength and that was once again on display. The Noles had a 17-second 1-5 spli and 21-second gap between runners 1-6.

Women's talking points...

- Not only is FSU's No. 9 national ranking its highest since Week 4 of 2014, it is the highest entering the NCAA Championships since the 2013 was No. 4;
- FSU was the ACC Championship runner-up to No. 6 NC State, finishing 12 points behind the Wolfpack. Ryan (6th), Funderburk (8th) and Skyring (10th) earned All-ACC honors;
- The Noles' top lineup has posted five top-five team finishes in as many races this season, including a third-place finish at the Joe Piane Notre Dame Invitational and fifth-place showing at the Pre-National Invitational;
- Four different Noles have finished in the top spot on the team over five races this season, and there have been five different top-five scoring combinations:
- Four of FSU's eight NCAA Championship roster athletes - Funderburk, Judd, Megan Mooney and Skyring - competed at the 2018 championship meet. Ryan ran in the 2017 NCAA meet for Villanova;
- Among those competing for the first time are Coggins, a redshirt sophomore, and freshmen Ava Peeples and Clark. Mooney is the lone senior on the FSU roster.

At-large berth provides shot at NCAA redemption

The disappointment of a fourth-place finish at the NCAA South Region meet didn't last long for coach Bob Braman's FSU men, who earned at at-large berth to the NCAA Championships. One of the last teams in the field of 31, the Noles are the only team that is unranked, leading those receiving votes.



FSU, however, built a strong enough resume to be included in the final

field. The Noles scored wins this year over automatic qualifiers Arkansas, Georgetown, Villanova and Virginia Tech, in addition to at-large qualifiers Alabama and NC State. They are eager and capable of improving on last year's 31st-place NCAA finish.

FSU is making its 15th all-time NCAA appearance and 14th under Braman, over the past 17 years.

- Sophomore Caleb Pottorff and senior Steven Cross earned All-Region honors, placing 15th and 25th, respectively;
- While FSU's 136-point total trailed Ole Miss (69), Middle Tennessee (83) and Alabama (97), the Noles did some good things;
- FSU had six runners post 10k cross country personal-best times on its Apalachee Regional Park course;
- They also bunched up nicely with just 21 seconds separating runners 2-6.

- Florida State's men have performed well in two high-profile meets this season, placing 10th (out of 22) at the Joe Piane Notre Dame Invitational behind eight NCAA qualifiers, and sixth (out of 37) at the Under Armour Pre-National Blue race;
- The Pre-National performance was especially impressive as a tight pack of four Noles followed grad transfer Kasey Knevelbaard's 15th-place finish. Just six second separated the quartet of Pottorff, Silas Griffith, Cross and Paul Stafford;
- Four members of the eight-man NCAA roster -Cross, Matthew Newland, Pottorff and Stafford - competed at the 2018 NCAA Championships. Knevelbaard will make his fourth NCAA Championships appearance but first since his third consecutive with Southern Utah in 2017;
- Knevelbaard comes into his final NCAA meet with a career-best finish of 82nd at '17 meet. He has been FSU's No. 1 runner in five of six races, highlighted by his Pre-Nats, Joe Piane (19th) and ACC Championship (13th) finishes;
- Among the first-time NCAA competitors are Griffith, a junior transfer from Lipscomb, and redshirt freshman Jacob Holmes, who was 39th at the South Region. Tyler Dau is the alternate.

The USTFCCCA national poll (Nov. 18) has the FSU women ranked No. 9 nationally; their highest ranking since midway through 2014. FSU had climbed to No. 10, but inexplicably dropped two positions to No. 12 following their ACC runner-up finish.

The FSU men tumbled from the top-30 following a sixth-place ACC finish, but are the top unranked team entering the NCAA Championships among those receiving votes. The FSU men had climbed to No. 21 following a sixth-place Pre-Nationals finish.

Those Oct. 22 national rankings - No. 10 and No. 21 - were the highest in five years for the FSU women and men, respectively.

ACC weekly honors come in bunches

There's a direct correlation to FSU's rise in the national rankings and outstanding individual performances from the women and men, which have not gone unnoticed. The Noles women have collected six ACC weekly honors this season, an all-time high for the program. The men have claimed three ACC weekly honors, their highest total since 2016.

Three FSU women - Lauren Ryan, Elizabeth Funderburk and Erin Phelps (twice) - have earned ACC Performer of the Week honors, while Yasmine Abbes has twice been tabbed ACC Freshman Performer of the Week. Kasey Knevelbaard is a two-time ACC Performer of the Week honoree, to go along with a single honor bestowed upon Jacob Holmes.

Knevelbaard (Covered Bridge), Phelps (UAH Charger Open) and Jodie Judd (UAB Blazer Classic) scored their first collegiate cross country victories in 2019.

Phillips named South Region Coach of the Year

Florida State women's cross country coach Kelly Phillips was named the South Region Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season on Tuesday, after guiding the Noles to their second consecutive NCAA South Region title. FSU's 58-point margin of victory over runner-up Ole Miss was the largest of any team – men or women – from the nine region meets contested.

Now in her fifth season at FSU, Phillips has guided the Noles back to a place of national prominence. FSU is making its second consecutive and 13th all-time NCAA Championships appearance on Saturday. Since taking over the program in the summer of 2015, FSU sandwiched a pair of fourth-place South Region finishes around a seventh-place showing over her first three seasons, before authoring the consecutive titles.

This if Phillips' fourth South Region Women's Cross Country Coach of the Year honor, having picked up her first two while directing South Florida in 1999 and 2000.

Rebecca Clark...Florida prep product earned All-Region honors finishing 22nd; second freshman finisher...was 41st in her ACC Championships debut...ran 17:22 to finish fourth in open race at the Joe Piane Notre Dame Invitational... No. 5 scorer at Pre-Nationals in her first career 6k race (21:14)...owns track PBs of 10:1811 (3200) and 17:16.33 (5000).

Addi Coggins...redshirt soph finished 37th in her first ACC XC Championships...ran 16:56 (33rd) at Joe Piane Notre Dame Invite and 26th at Pre-Nationals (20:41); then career-best times... was No. 2 scorer at Pre-Nats... missed entire '18 cross country season... rebounded on track with PBs of 4:24.60 (1500) and 16:30.49 (5000).

Elizabeth Funderburk...sophomore was a career-best 6th at South Region on the heels of 8th-place ACC Championships finish..had breakout 11th-place finish at Pre-Nationals in 6k PB (20:29.1)...had a long season on the track competing in the 10,000...ran No. 6 time in FSU history (33:31.05)...capped year with 10k silver for USA at the NACAC Championships in Mexico.

Jodie Judd...junior is riding a momentous summer on the track...turned in gutsy 12th-place South Region finish for 3rd career All-Region honor...was a career-best 23rd at ACC Championships...scored UAB Blazer Classic victory after a strong performance at Notre Dame...won the England Athletics U23 5000 title, followed by a sixth-place European U23 finish in PB (15:51.56) -No. 4 in FSU history.

Megan Mooney...lone senior on roster was 30th at South Region meet, battling through illness...recorded career-best 29th-place finish at ACC Championships...has been on a roll since her big finishing kick helped Noles to the 2018 South Region title...posted four PBs on the track in 2019...fixture in top five this fall, highlighted by strong showing at Pre-Nationals.

Ava Peeples...two-time Foot Locker finalist has had strong freshman campaign...tentatively set for alternate role at NCAA Championships... placed 40th in first ACC Championships...finished 8th in open race at Joe Piane Notre Dame Invitational...posted 6th-place finish at UAB Blazer Classic in her first 6k performance (21:04.37).

Lauren Ryan...junior transfer from Villanova has been a huge addition top top-five...placed 15th at South Region meet as No. 5 runner...led the Noles with a 6th-place ACC Championships finish...won ACC Performer of the Week honors following Noles debut....competed at 2017 NCAA Championships...former Australian Junior National cross country champ...a 6x All-Big East performer at Villanova between track and cross country.

Braman guides Noles back to NCAAs for 14th time

Bob Braman's 20th season at the helm of the FSU men's cross country team culminates with a 14th trip to the NCAA Championships in the last 17 seasons. The Noles earned an at-large berth into the field for just the second time under Braman, and the first since 2008.

The Seminoles have advanced five times as the South Region champion and eight others as the runner-up, with Braman earning five South Region Coach of the Year honors, most recently in 2015.

And the Noles haven't merely been participants at the big show. The 2010 team posted a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships. FSU was 12th in 2011 and followed that with a fifth-place finish in 2012. Prior to his arrival from USF in 2000, Florida State had made just one NCAA appearance (1981). He has coached seven of FSU's nine All-Americans.

Know the Noles

Steven Cross...senior earned his second consecutive All-Region honor, placing 25th as No. 2 scorer...matched his career-best ACC Championships finish (31st)...rounding into form for the postseason after missing the entire 2019 track seasons...followed fastest 5-mile of his career at Notre Dame with strong Pre-National effort.

Tyler Dau...redshirt sophomore tentatively set as NCAA Championships alternate for second consecutive year...was 108th in ACC debut... season began strong with a pair of top-10 performances, including 8k PB at Virginia Tech course on Sept. 20...fitness level positions him to aid Noles' tightly-knit chase pack.

Silas Griffith...junior transfer from Lipscomb posted career-best 34th place South Region finish as Noles' No. 5 scorer...was 39th in his first ACC Championships..had back-to-back personal-best efforts at Notre Dame and Pre-Nationals... was No. 3 scorer for Noles in Terre Haute; part of tight four-pack instrumental in sixth-place team finish...two-time All-ASUN selection.

Jacob Holmes...redshirt freshman narrowly missed All-Region honors, placing 29th in his first 10k cross country race as Noles' No. 3 scorer... finished in the sixth position for the Noles at ACC, placing 65th...earned ACC Performer of the Week honors after posting 8k PB at the FSU Invitational...New Zealand native Ihelped his team to a pair of secondary school titles and the Auckland U18 cross country club crown.

Kasey Knevelbaard...grad transfer from Southern Utah making his 4th NCAA Championsips appearance; first with FSU...was 33rd at NCAA South Region meet; first race he did not lead the team...climbed to 13th-place ACC finish after hard spill in first mile...has look of a All-American candidate for the first time in cross country based on finishes at Notre Dame (19th) and Pre-Nats (15th)...two-time NCAA podium finisher on the track has PBs of 3:58.5 (mile) and 3:40.3 (1500).

Matthew Newland...sophomore gained valuable experience a year ago in championship season...finished 75th in No. 7 spot at NCAA South...was career-best 82nd at ACC meet...was Noles' No. 5 scorer at Virginia Tech in September...one of two true freshman for Noles in 2018 NCAA Championships lineup.

Caleb Pottorff...bounced back with strong 15th-place NCAA South finish to lead team for first time this season and earn second straight All-Region honor...was coming off a 56th-place ACC finish...was rock-solid 50th at Pre-Nats... has been brought along slowly after injury-marred 2019 track season..was No. 1 runner in 2018.

Paul Stafford...placed 37th as No. 6 runner at NCAA South...has twice been the No. 2 scorer in 2019...posted breakthrough 17th-place ACC finish for first All-ACC honor...that followed an 8k PB at Pre-Nationals, which followed a 5-mile PB at Notre Dame...was Noles' No. 2 scorer at 2018 NCAA Championships as a true freshman.
