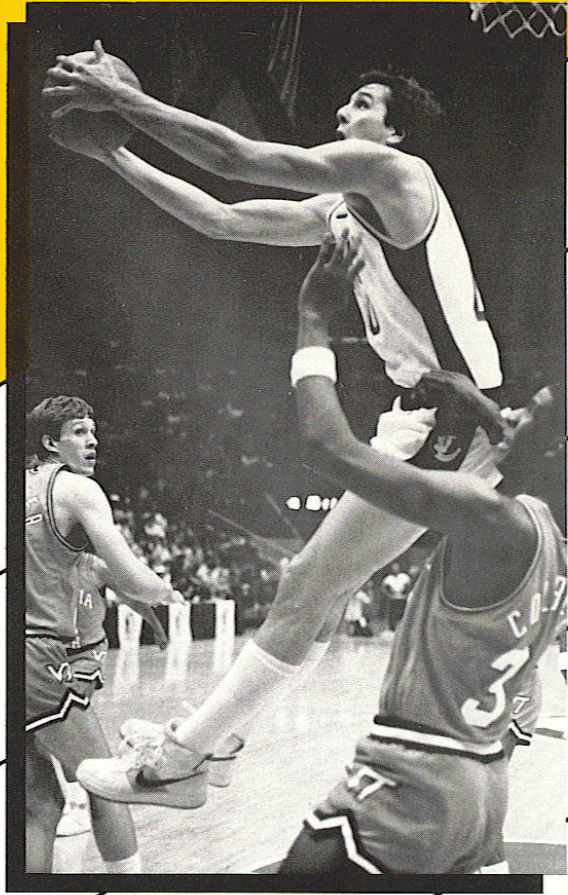

RADIO-TV CHART



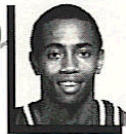

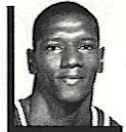

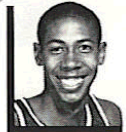

The Seminole Sports Network will carry all 27 regular season basketball games plus the Metro Conference Tournament live throughout the state.

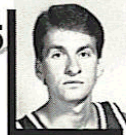

built to play basketball ... has a vertical jump that sends him 20 inches over the rim yet he's big enough not to get pushed around underneath ... fundamentally sound ... has averaged 11.9 points during his freshman and sophomore seasons at Florida State ... he has maintained a 52.6 percent field goal accuracy during those years also ...

has averaged 5.8 rebounds while accumulating 51 blocks, 62 steals and 43 dunks ... his point total of 691 is 309 short of 1,000 and his rebounding total of 338 is 162 short of FSU's 500 club ... his only apparent weakness is his foul shooting ... **1984-85:** made second team all-Metro Conference in just his second season, one of only two underclassmen in the conference to do so ... scored in double figures in all but four games while averaging 15.2 points and 6.8 rebounds per game ... had eight games where he scored 20 or more points ... top game came against Memphis State in a regionally televised matchup where he had 31 points, 27 of those in the first half, nine rebounds, one assist, one block, one steal and four dunks ... he shot 14-21 in that contest ... and was named the conference's Player of the Week ... on

the season, shot 53.1 percent from the field and totaled 37 steals and 28 blocks ... turned the ball over just once every 20.9 minutes ... started 27 games and one other game he did not start because of a foot injury ... led Florida State in scoring in eight games and was the leading rebounder in seven games ... although he shot just 61.4 percent from the line during the season, he hit a personal best nine of nine from the foul line vs. Cincinnati ... high rebound game of the year was the 13 he totaled the first time FSU met Jacksonville ... had a team-leading 34 dunks ... made the USA-ABA all-star team that played exhibition games in Yugoslavia and then played in the annual World Cup Team Championships in Spain ... fellow Metro Conference member Virginia Tech was represented by Dell Curry on that

QUESTIONING ALLEN:

- Q. When you were coming out of high school, what were you looking for your college experience to be like?
- A. I expected to go to school and get a degree. I also hoped that I'd get to play a lot and improve my game.
- Q. How tough is it to combine the student and the athlete? Although you are provided tutoring services and all the support systems that are available, can you be just a normal student?
- A. I'd have to say it's really difficult. I like to go fishing and I don't even have time for that. You're either studying or playing ball or going to team meetings.
- Q. Since you left high school, basketball has allowed you to make three over-seas trips. What differences did you find in international basketball?
- A. Their game doesn't have the quality of athletes that we've got here. But the teams that we played were superb in that they played together.
- Q. What was the hardest thing for you to get used to when you were traveling with the summer basketball teams?
- A. I'd have to say it was the language. We had to communicate by hand signals and to get what you wanted to say across you had to point. That's what was really fun. I see people over here from France and I know how they feel—just like I felt over there.
- Q. How 'bout the food over there?
- A. I lost 10-15 pounds on each trip. I guess you have to get used to the food. I did a little bit. It's by no means as good as the food over here. The summer before I came to college I went to Central America and down there... I couldn't live down there. It makes you appreciate the United States.
- Q. Getting back to basketball, you've probably been the most successful freshman and sophomore who has ever worn an FSU uniform. Does that surprise you, your early success?
- A. I really thought that I could have played a lot better. I guess I wasn't mature enough. I didn't come here expecting to start as a freshman but thought I'd get a chance to play.
- Q. How did you get to be as good as you are?
- A. I'd have to say Coach Williams pushed me and my high school coach did too, but most of the credit goes to my dad. He taught me how to shoot and showed me other things. He is really an athlete himself.
- Q. Fans see that you're an excellent jumper, yet few people know the problems that you've had with your knees and the pain that accompanies playing hard.
- A. My freshman year I think a lot of it had to do with my growing so much and so fast. Now they're starting to catch up. I did go through a lot of pain. They were so sore. I'd go home to my room after the ball game and just have to sit down and ice them.
- Q. What are your goals for your junior season?
- A. I'd like to see the team as a whole do really well and get to the NCAA Tournament. I would like to see myself do well but as long as we're winning I'll do whatever it takes for the team to win.
- Q. There's some question as to where you're going to play this season—whether it's going to be out on the wing where you'll be more of a shooting forward or underneath in a post position with your back to the basket. Which do you prefer?
- A. There's been a lot of talk about that. I'll probably end up playing the wing even though I'm established at the post. I've already proved I can score on anyone at the post. But I think I can handle it. I haven't played it enough to know which I like better, but I do like the post because I like playing with my back to the goal.

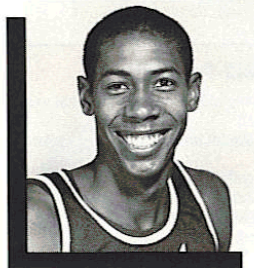
