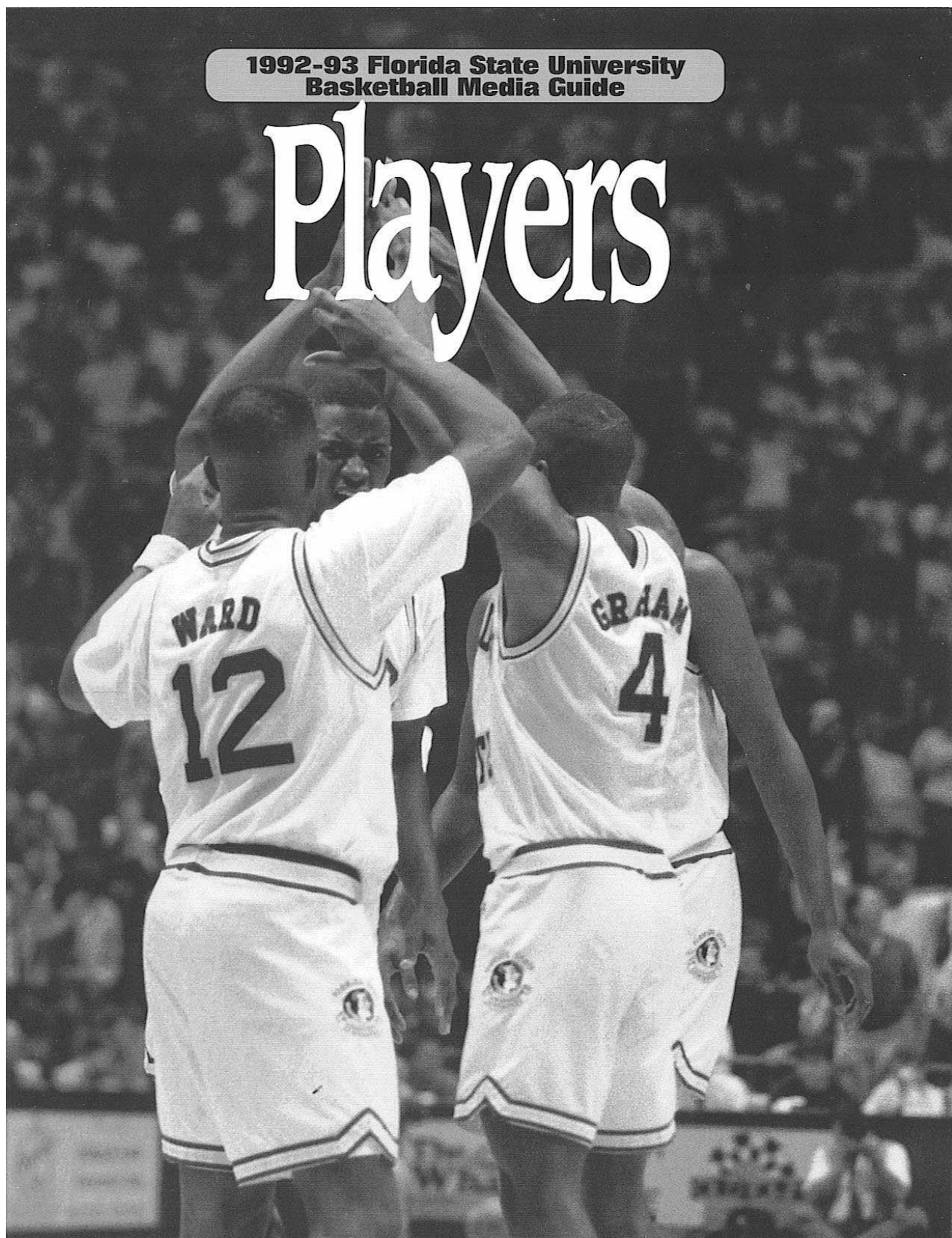


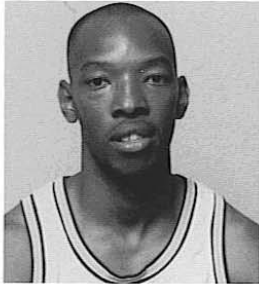

Baltimore, MD



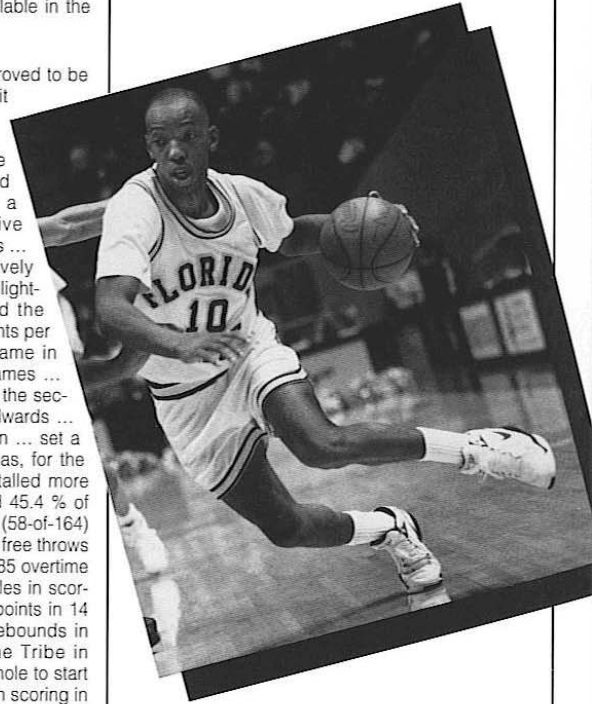
Quickly established himself as one of the top players in the Atlantic Coast Conference in his first year ... great moves and confidence with the ball make him an exceptional scorer ... quick release on outside jumper makes him tough to cover ... loves to drive to the basket and works well inside ... fine ball-handler who will play point guard until Charlie Ward arrives ... instinctive player who reacts well to what is happening on the floor ... can quickly take over a game with ability to beat a defense on the dribble and either score or dish for the easy assist ... quick feet and long reach make him a good defender on the perimeter ... great attitude and love of the game make him fun to be around ... very experienced player who relishes leadership role on the floor ... has flair for the dramatic pass and shot ... wants the ball in his hands in pressure situations ... very consistent scorer with game-breaking ability ... widely considered one of the top guards available in the upcoming NBA draft.

FSU's last 25 games ... earned ACC Player of the Week honors after scoring 22 points and grabbing four rebounds in win at North Carolina ... failed to record a three pointer in only nine games ... sank four or more three pointers in three games ... made five or more free throws in eight games ... dished five or more assists in 11 games ... just the 20th player to score 500 points in a season at FSU ... seventh in the ACC in scoring last season averaging 18.4 ppg; 11th in 3-point percentage at 35.4%; 9th in steals with 1.8 per game and 8th in 3-pointers per game with 1.8 ... had exceptional NCAA Tournament scoring 23 points in win over Montana, 19 vs. Georgetown and 19 against Indiana in the Sweet 16.

As a Junior 1991-92

Proved to be every bit the star

that basketball experts predicted when he came to Florida State ... voted a second team All-ACC player by media as a junior ... coaches feel that his defensive improvement was a key to FSU's success ... possesses the whole package offensively with great range on his jump shot and a lightning quick drive to the bucket ... led the Seminoles in scoring, averaging 18.4 points per game ... averaged 19.9 points per game in FSU's 16 Atlantic Coast Conference games ... attempted 454 field goals, 69 more than the second highest total attempted by Doug Edwards ... also managed 119 assists on the season ... set a school record along with Charlie Ward as, for the first time in FSU history, two players totalled more than 100 assists in a season ... canned 45.4 % of his shots from the field, including 35.4 % (58-of-164) from three point range ... hit 70.4% of his free throws ... scored a season-high 34 points in 88-85 overtime win over Wake Forest ... led the Seminoles in scoring in 14 games ... scored 20 or more points in 14 contests ... grabbed season-high 10 rebounds in win at North Carolina State ... led the Tribe in rebounding in three games ... only Seminole to start all 31 games ... reached double figures in scoring in 29 games ... scored 10 or more points in 23 of

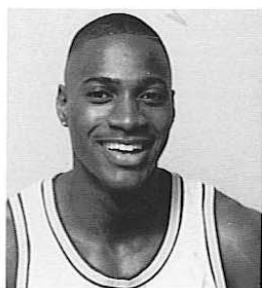

Came on over the second half of last season to become very effective offensive weapon for the Seminoles ... excellent athlete who runs the floor extremely well ... great speed and leaping ability make him a natural shot-blocker ... hard work in the weight room has made him a better athlete ... works well with the ball under the basket ... developed turn-around jumper from the base line that made him a threat last year ... fine rebounder ... among the most accurate shooters in Florida State history ... exciting player on the break who uses speed to beat defenders down court then finishes with highlight film dunks ... finished just a few attempts short of leading the Atlantic Coast Conference in field goal accuracy ... can play either the power forward or center position ... left-handed nature is an advantage in the low post ... loves the put-back dunk off an offensive rebound ... combines with 6-9 Doug Edwards and 7-0 Andre Reid to give the Seminoles one of the tallest front lines in school history.

As a Junior 1991-92

Perhaps the key to Florida State's success in its first year in the ACC ... among the conference's most accurate shooters at 62.4% from the field ... already Florida State's all-time leading shot blocker with 129 ... led the Tribe with 46 blocks last season ... field goal percentage (62.4) was better than his free throw percentage (59.7) ... one of five Seminoles to average in double figures scoring ... averaged 11.0 points per game through the regular season ... FSU's second leading rebounder grabbing an average of 6.7 per game ... missed three starts with a sprained ankle ... had a career-high 28 points in loss to Maryland at home ... only other 20-point game came against N.C. State in the ACC Tournament ... grabbed 10 or more rebounds in five games ... reached double figures scoring in 17 games ... led the team in rebounding eight times ... offensive production went up considerably after he scored 17 points in FSU's win at Wake Forest on Jan. 11th ... averaged 13.4 points per game over the last 17 games of the season ... 4th in the ACC in blocked shots averaging 1.6 per game.

As a Sophomore 1990-91

Started the last 27 consecutive games at center during his

sophomore campaign ... led the team in blocked shots with 47 ... missed most of preseason drills and first five games of regular season with a broken foot ... averaged 8.5 points and 5.2 rebounds per game during the year ... had a then career-high 18 points in win over Memphis State ... third in the Metro Conference in field goal percentage at 57.0% ... recorded at least one blocked shot in all but eight games ... batted away 24 shots against Metro Conference opponents ... overcame poor early season free throw shooting to nail 14 of his last 17 attempts from the charity stripe ... scored in double figures 11 times, but only once in the last five games ... grabbed season-high 11 rebounds against UNLV ... led the Tribe in rebounding against Auburn (8), UNLV (11), South Carolina (8) and Jacksonville (5).

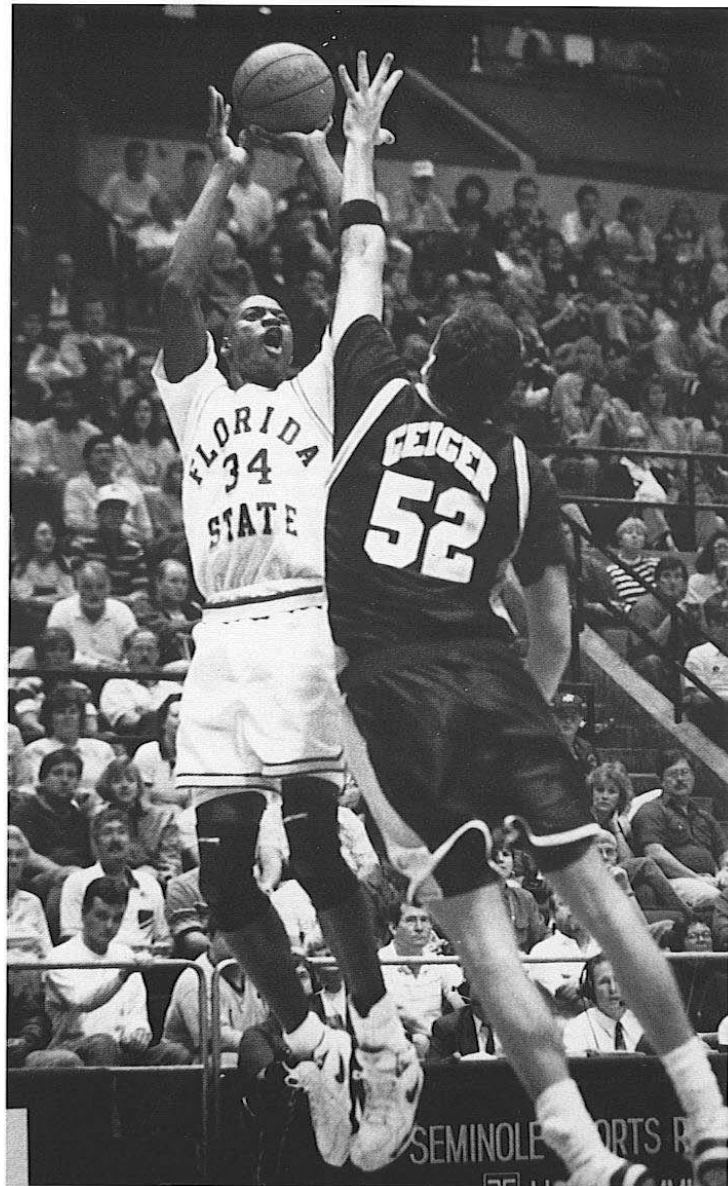

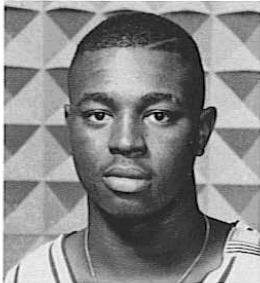

Ranked among the top 10 players in the country by numerous preseason publications ... among the preseason nominees for the John Wooden Award ... hard-nosed player who goes about the game with an economy of motion ... very fluid athlete who knows the game ... can score from inside or on the wing and is a great passer ... always seems to come up with a big defensive play in the tight games ... finished second in the ACC in rebound average last year ... deceptively quick with the ball in his hands ... runs the break well and is one of FSU's main go-to guys in the half court offense ... uses picks extremely well ... instinctive player with ability to make those around him better ... considered the best high school player in Florida history ... excellent baseline jumper and good three-point shot make him tough to defend ... became FSU's 26th 1,000 point scorer in NCAA Tournament game against Montana in first round of the NCAA West Regional ... has scored 500 or more points in each of his two seasons making him the 29th and 31st player, respectively, to do so ... could become the first player at Florida State to score 500 points in three different seasons ... one of only 20 players to ever score 500 or more points in two seasons at FSU.

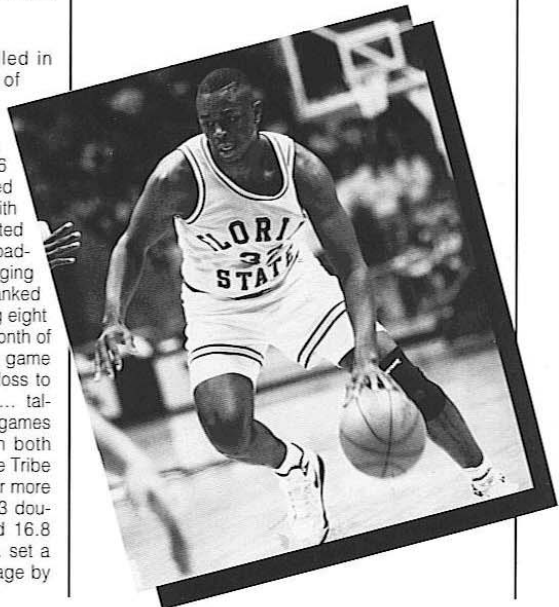

Led the Seminoles to the schools first ever Metro Conference Tournament Championship and to the NCAA Tournament ... led the team in scoring the entire season finishing the year with a 16.4 point per game average ... averaged 7.1 rebounds per game which was second among the Seminoles ... earned second team All-Metro Conference honors following the regular season ... played superbly in FSU's two NCAA Tournament games earning CBS Player of the Game honors in both after scoring 24 points and

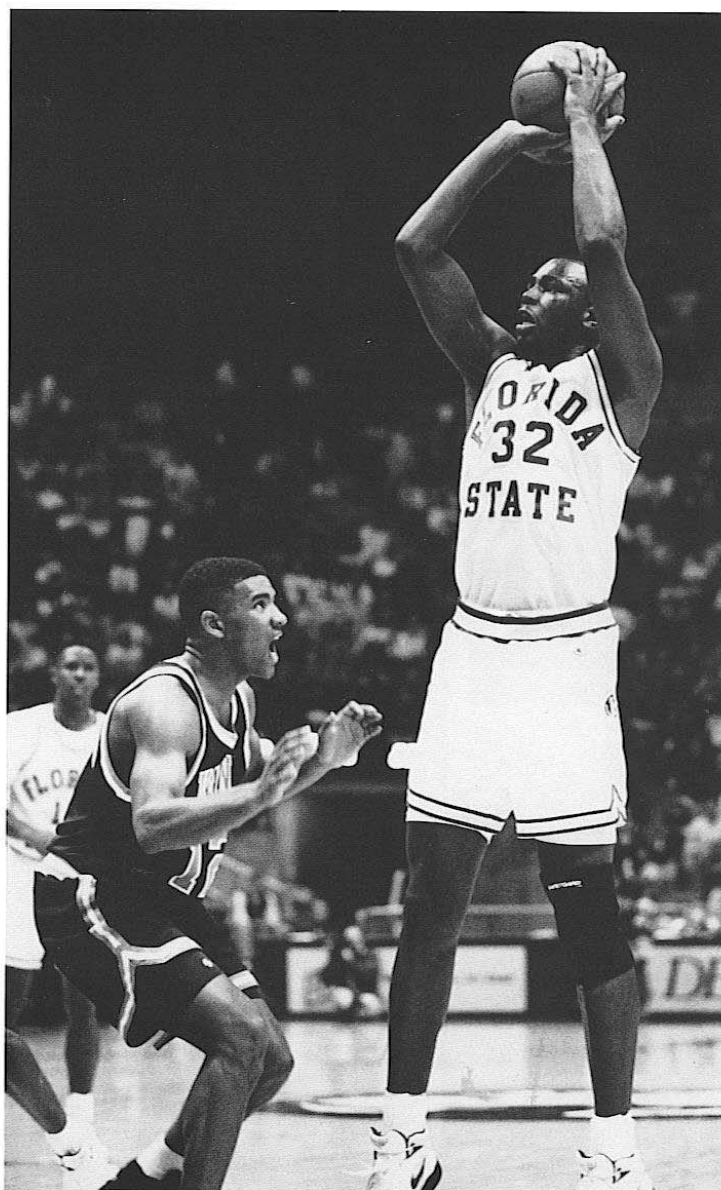

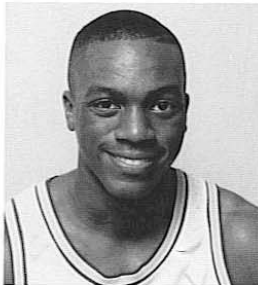

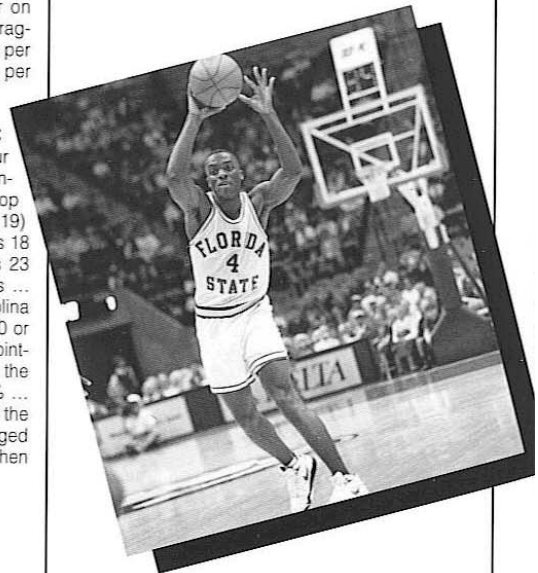

Surpassed Kennedy's most ambitious hopes when he finished



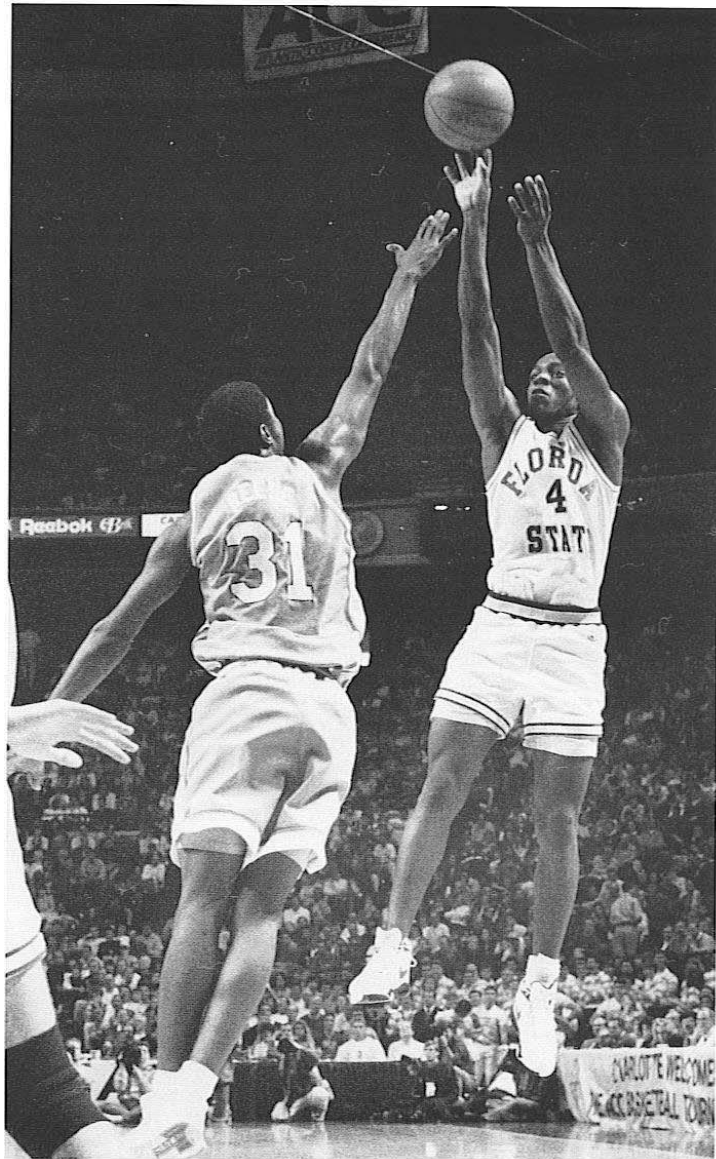
