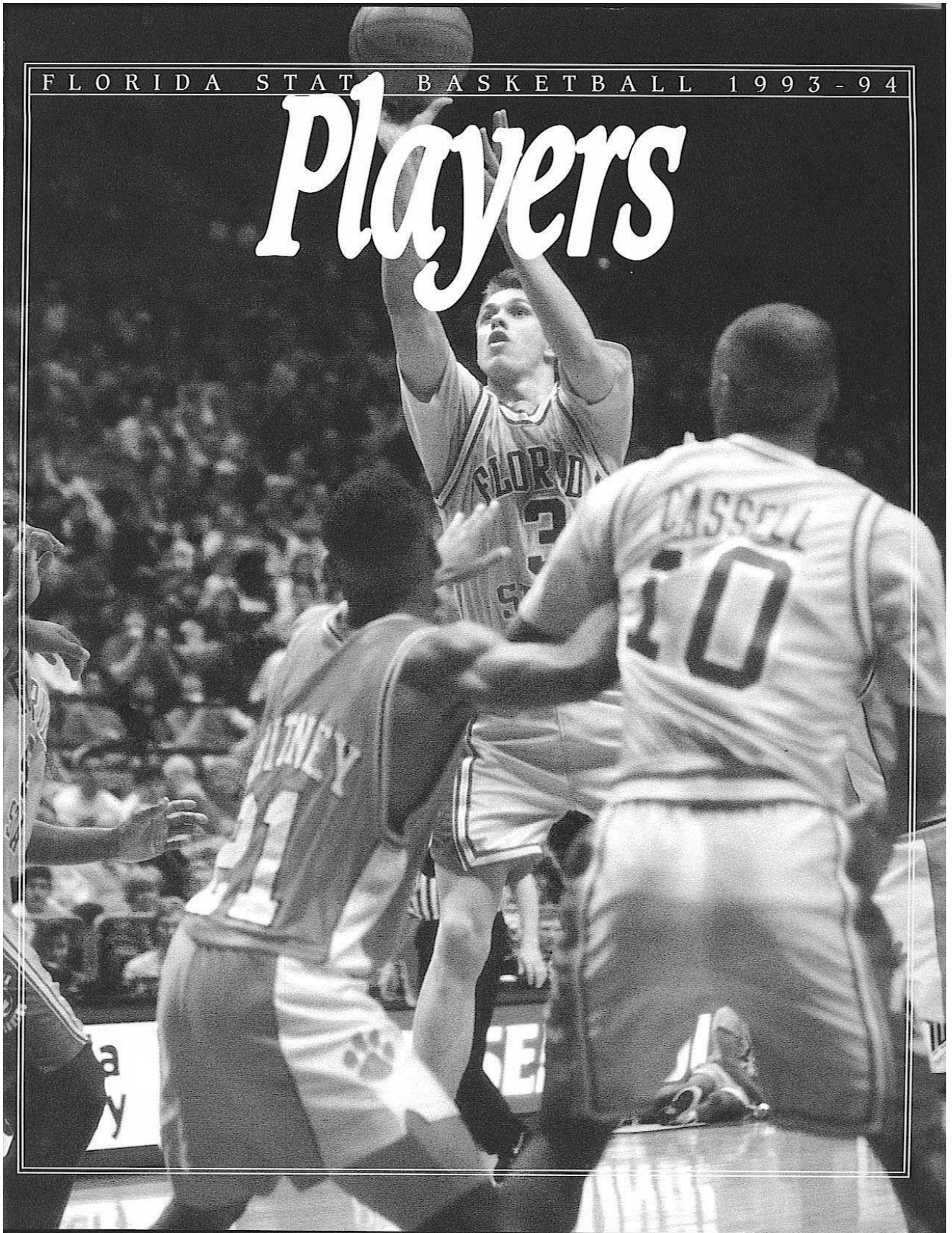

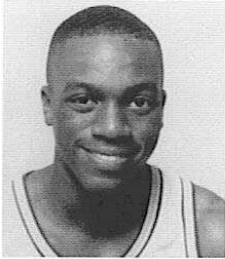

SEMINOLE BASKETBALL 1993-94 • PLAYERS

Returns from total knee reconstructive surgery performed in December of last year ... team physicians expect him to be close to 100 percent by January but he may have to wear brace throughout season...adds leadership and experience to young Seminole squad ... should clear academic hurdle and be ready to play in December ... explosive offensive player who has been instrumental in FSU's drive to prominence over the past four seasons ... among the nation's top leapers with a 41-inch vertical leap ... releases jump shot at top of full vertical leap adding to the drama of a long-range bomb ... has been one of FSU's top three-point shooters, by percentage, over his last two seasons ... already 23rd on the Seminole's career scoring list ... has been streak shooter at times but has been hot coming down the stretch ... capable of wearing-out an opponent from long range or moving by defenders for circus dunks ... has seen role bounce from starter to sixth man and back ... excellent player off the bench because of flair for dramatic shot and putting points together in a run ... scored his 1,000th career point on a dunk for the Tribe's final points in the 1991-92 regular season ... team player who adjusts well to what coaches ask of him ... has improved defensive skills ... once slammed over 7'2" Pervis Ellison of Louisville in the open court ... exceptionally strong player ... saw his freshman scoring average record broken two years ago by Bob Sura.

As A SENIOR 1992-93

Suffered season-ending injury just three minutes into season-opener against Siena when his knee gave way on an open court layup ... granted a medical hardship after missing the entire season.

As A JUNIOR 1991-92

FSU's third-leading scorer on the season averaging 13.0 points per game ... grabbed an average of 3.5 rebounds per game during season ... Noles top free throw shooter at 81.2% on the year (69-of-85) ... averaged 11.6 points and 3.0 rebounds against ACC competition ... led Seminoles in scoring in four games including a career-high 33 in the season-opener against Jacksonville ... also was team's top offensive gun against: Duquesne (19), Mercer (19) and at Virginia (18) ... came off the bench for his 18 at Charlottesville ... scored in double figures 23 times, including the first eight games ... had 24 points in starting role against North Carolina in FSU's last regular season game ... scored 10 or more in six of the last eight games ... 36 three-pointers is third best total on the team ... second on the team in three point shooting percentage at 38.8% ... started 24

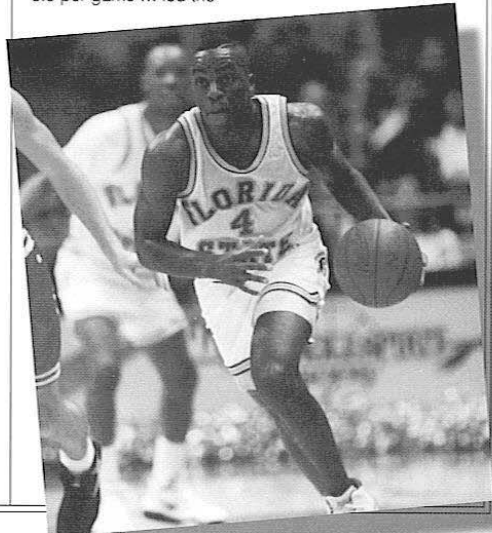
games and played in 30 ... missed the game at N.C. State with an ankle sprain ... averaged 13.8 points per game in starting role ... 10.1 when coming off the bench.

As A SOPHOMORE 1990-91

One of only four Seminoles to average in double figures in 1990-91 ... started just six games but averaged 10.9 points and 2.7 rebounds a game ... put on spectacular shooting exhibition against Virginia Tech in the semifinals of the Metro Tournament canning 9-of-12 field goals and both his free throws for a team-high 23 points in just 21 minutes ... led team in three-point shooting percentage at 34.6% for the year ... a better scorer on the road where he averaged 14.8 points per game in Metro contests ... 23 points against Virginia Tech in the Metro Tourney was career-high ... grabbed season high seven rebounds on three different occasions ... came off the bench to lead the Tribe in scoring seven times ... put-back dunk at South Carolina was tabbed "Play of the Day" by CNN.

As A FRESHMAN 1989-90

Surpassed Kennedy's most ambitious hopes when he finished the year averaging 10.1 points per game, the highest scoring average ever by a true freshman at FSU ... started 20 of the Tribe's 31 games - all at shooting guard ... fourth highest rebound average on the team at 3.5 per game ... led the



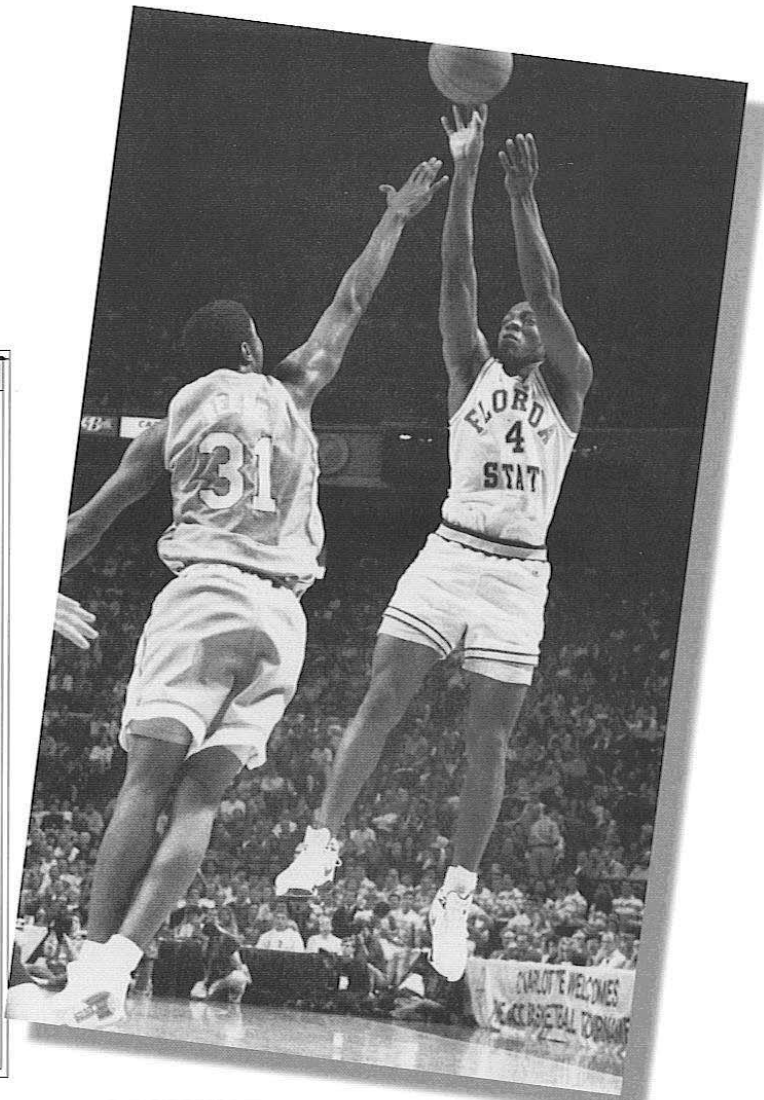
team in three-point field goal shooting at 37.9% ... very consistent performer who reached double figures in 19 of FSU's 31 games ... had his best game against Cincinnati scoring 22 points and grabbing five rebounds ... got his first start against New Orleans scoring 20 points and grabbing six rebounds ... averaged 25 minutes playing time per game.

HIGH SCHOOL

Averaged 29 points and eight rebounds a game for the Musketeers of Richmond Academy ... led the Augusta (GA) school to a 21-8 record and the regional championship as a senior ... earned all-conference honors all four years of high school ... named state's top high school 3A player as a senior ... named to first team All-State squad ... played for USA all-star team against Russia ... named MVP of the Tennessee/Georgia all-star game ... co-MVP of the BC All-Star camp in Carnersville, GA ... also earned dunk championship at BC camp ... posted a .562 batting average for Musketeer baseball team as senior ... earned all-conference honors in baseball.

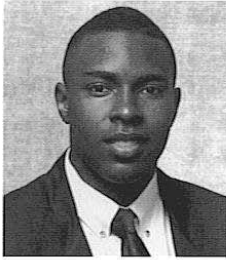

Expected to join the basketball Seminoles after recuperating from leading the football Seminoles as the starting quarterback ... one of the finest point guards in FSU history who will become FSU's all-time steal leader with his 10th theft this season ... already a member of FSU's top ten all-time leaders in assists ... lightning quick defender with first step that can leave defenders ... has guided the Seminole offense over the second half of the last three seasons posting a 40-15 record as the starter ... excels in every facet of the game but may be asked to score more this season with the departure of Sam Cassell ... led the ACC in steals as a sophomore and averaged 2.7 per game last year ... credited with not only being the steady ball handler the Tribe needs, but also a great decision maker and poised leader ... finds the open man, creates shots for teammates, drives to the hoop and can score over a zone ... actually prefers the very long shot because arm extension makes up for "rusty" shot ... great hang time when going to the bucket gives him time to dish to teammates ... cool on-court personality seems to fuel the confidence of the entire team.

As a JUNIOR 1992-93

Led the Seminoles to their second most successful season in school history despite battling recurring shoulder injury that required post-season surgery ... FSU was 11-3 when Charlie started last year ... missed six games after seeing his first action of the season on January 6th at Virginia ... played in three games in addition to starting 14 as a junior ... averaged 5.5 assists, 2.8 steals and 7.8 points per game ... Florida State was 8-4 before Charlie's first game and 17-6 over his half of the year ... played 38 minutes and had 11 points and three assists in overtime win at Wake Forest which was his second game back from the football field ... played his first game of the year in Charlottesville just five days after earning most valuable player honors at the Orange Bowl against Nebraska ... named the MVP of the ACC in football and earned The McKelvin Award as the league's top athlete last year ... started seven straight games until a slight dislocation of his left (non-throwing) shoulder against Georgia Tech on January 31 caused him to miss the next three games ... 10 steals shy of setting the career record at FSU ... dished a season-high 10 assists in win over N.C. State ... scored a career-high 19 points in FSU's win at Clemson and followed that with 11 points in the win over Duke.

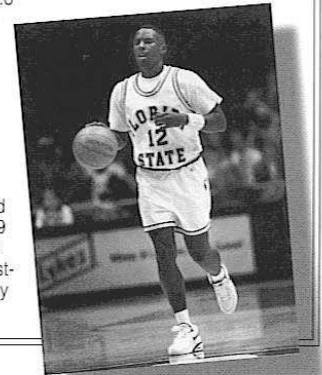
As a SOPHOMORE 1991-92

Led the Seminoles to a 14-6 record (12-5 in ACC games) after settling in as starter against Wake Forest on January 11th ... earned second team All-ACC

Tournament honors after scoring 13 points, stealing six passes against N.C. State and following that with 15 points, five assists and three steals against UNC ... marvelous record does not even count FSU's historic win at North Carolina in their ACC opener where Ward tied a career-high 18 points, along with five rebounds, four assists and two steals ... led the ACC in steals despite playing just 28 games with an average of 2.7 per game ... 75 steals tied for second highest single season total in FSU history - six behind Dean Schaffer who set the mark in 1984-85 ... assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.64 ranked ninth among ACC stars ... ranked 10th in the league in assists with 4.4 per game ... had a career-high 11 assists in win over Georgia Tech in Atlanta ... dished five or more assists in 13 games ... recorded four or more steals in six games ... averaged 7.2 points and 3.2 rebounds per game ... played in 28 games, starting the last 22 straight ... had 93 of his team-high 122 assists against ACC competition ... dished six or more assists in nine of the last 16 games ... suffered a separated shoulder in NCAA first round win over Montana and missed second round game against Georgetown ... played 26 minutes in Sweet 16 game against Indiana with instructions to limit motion ... scored three points and dished three assists against the Hoosiers.

As a FRESHMAN 1990-91

Given credit by teammates for rallying the Seminoles and leading them to an NCAA Tournament appearance ... FSU was 15-6 with Ward starting ... proved to be the Metro Conference's top point guard ... earned a spot on the Metro all-freshman team ... also earned a spot on the Metro All-Tournament team along with Doug Edwards ... probably would have been Metro Tournament MVP had ballots been collected after FSU's stunning comeback win over Louisville in the championship game ... averaged 8.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists per game as a rookie ... averaged 9.8 points per game as a starter ... nailed a 30-foot three-pointer with :16 left to give the Seminoles the lead for good in a 76-69 win over Louisville for the school's first-ever Metro Tourney title ... dished an



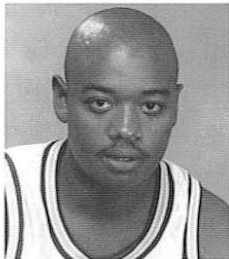

AS A FRESHMAN 1992-93

Averaged 5.4 points and 2.6 rebounds a game during rookie year ... joined Maurice Robinson on ACC All-Freshman team despite being slowed with a stress fracture in his foot over last half of season ... suffered injury in home game with Wake Forest on February 10th and missed next five games ... scored nine points in NCAA Sweet 16 contests against both Western Kentucky and Kentucky ... played both guard and forward ... very productive when on the floor last year with good offensive rebounding instincts ... played 15 minutes and scored eight points in NCAA first round win over Evansville ... played more minutes than any other non-starter for FSU in the NCAA Tournament averaging 15.5 minutes and averaged 7.0 rebounds per game ... started four games as a freshman including three consecutive until foot injury ... averaged 7.5 points and 4.0 rebounds in four starts (at Virginia, at Connecticut, Virginia and Wake Forest) ... had his best game against Temple in Orlando when he connected on 4-of-12 three pointers and 8-of-10 from the foul line in FSU's 91-80 overtime win ... earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors following the game ... poured in 18 points, including 5-of-8 from three point range in win at Jacksonville ... reached double figures in scoring in six games ... grabbed season-high eight rebounds in home games against South Florida and Georgia Tech ... scoring average of 5.4 points per game ranked fifth among first-year players in the ACC ... 15.3 minutes per game ranked seventh on last year's squad ... attended Maine Central Institute which did not cost

him a year of eligibility ... originally signed with South Carolina but never enrolled.

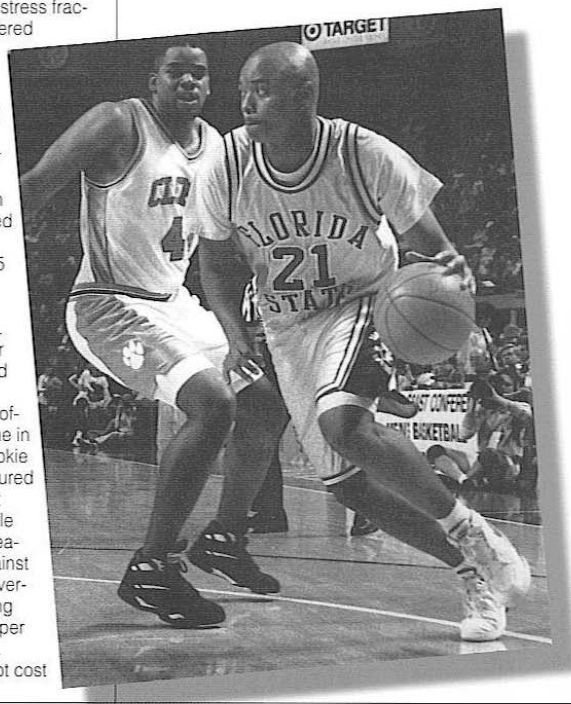
HIGH SCHOOL
