The Atlantic Coast Conference: Unrivaled in NCAA Basketball Tournament History

The History

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded May 8, 1953 in Greensboro, N.C., with the seven charter members being Clemson University, Duke University, University of Maryland, University of North Carolina, North Carolina State University, University of South Carolina and Wake Forest University.

The withdrawal of the seven schools from the Southern Conference occurred the morning of May 8, 1953, during the annual spring meeting of the conference. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws was adopted and the name became officially the Atlantic Coast Conference.

On December 4, 1953, the Conference admitted the University of Virginia, which began active participation with the 1953-54 basketball season.

The first and only withdrawal of a member from the ACC occurred on June 30, 1971, when South Carolina tendered its resignation. The conference continued with seven members until April 3, 1978, when Georgia Tech was admitted. The Atlanta school became a playing member of the ACC on July 1, 1979, but did not become eligible for the football championship until the 1983 season.

The conference now has nine members with the addition of Florida State on July 1, 1991. The Tallahassee school became a playing member of the conference in the 1991-92 academic year, and became eligible for the football championship in 1992.

The Tradition

Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference schools have captured 43 NCAA and AIAW championships, including 24 in men's sports and 19 in women's competition. In addition, 72 men and 22 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

If success is best measured in terms of wins and losses, then the ACC is unrivaled in NCAA Basketball Tournament history. The men and women's programs have combined for 11 consecutive trips to the final four, and 31 appearances overall. Following Duke's back-to-back national championship seasons of 1991 and 1992, ACC teams have claimed six national championships while finishing second on nine occasions. North Carolina, the nation's all-time winningest team, captured national titles in 1957 and 1982, while N.C. State walked away with the coveted crown in 1974 and 1983.

Over the years, ACC basketball teams have gained global recognition through their NCAA Tournament and national television exposure. During the 1993-94 season, more than 155 regular season games, plus all of the men's conference tournament and the finals of the women's tournament will be televised. Conference teams will be seen on all three major networks, ESPN and the Prime Network.

ACC basketball is more than numbers, though. The faces behind the men's and women's programs account for 22 national player of the year honors and nine national coach of the year awards. The ACC has produced 29 Olympians, including coaches

and players. N.C. State's Yow headed up the 1988 gold-winning Olympic team, assisted by Sylvia Hatchell of North Carolina.

The ACC also stands at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics in terms of academic accomplishments of its student athletes. That accomplishment is nowhere better reflected than in the CFA Academic Achievement Award which is awarded annually to a CFA member institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. Six times over the past 11 years, an ACC member school has claimed the award. Since 1983, 125 women's basketball players have received ACC Honor Roll recognition. The 1991-92 academic year included 36 selections. In addition, since 1963, ACC basketball players have earned first-team Academic All-America honors 31 times.

The Championships

The conference will conduct championships in 23 sports in 1993-94, including 12 for men and 11 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954, while the league's inaugural basketball tournament took place March 4-6, 1954, at North Carolina State, drawing 36,000 fans over the three days. The other sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet being held in tennis at Wake Forest, October 6-8. The first women's basketball tournament was held February 9-11, 1978 at the University of Virginia with a total attendance of 2,750. Since that time, the women's tournament attendance has leaped to almost 20,000. Other championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf and softball.

N.C. STATE — Charter member of the SC in 1921, charter member of the ACC in 1953.

VIRGINIA — Charter member of the SIAA in 1894, charter member of the SC in 1921, resigned from SC in December 1936, joined the ACC in December 1953.

WAKE FOREST — Joined the SC in February 1936, charter member of the ACC in 1953.
