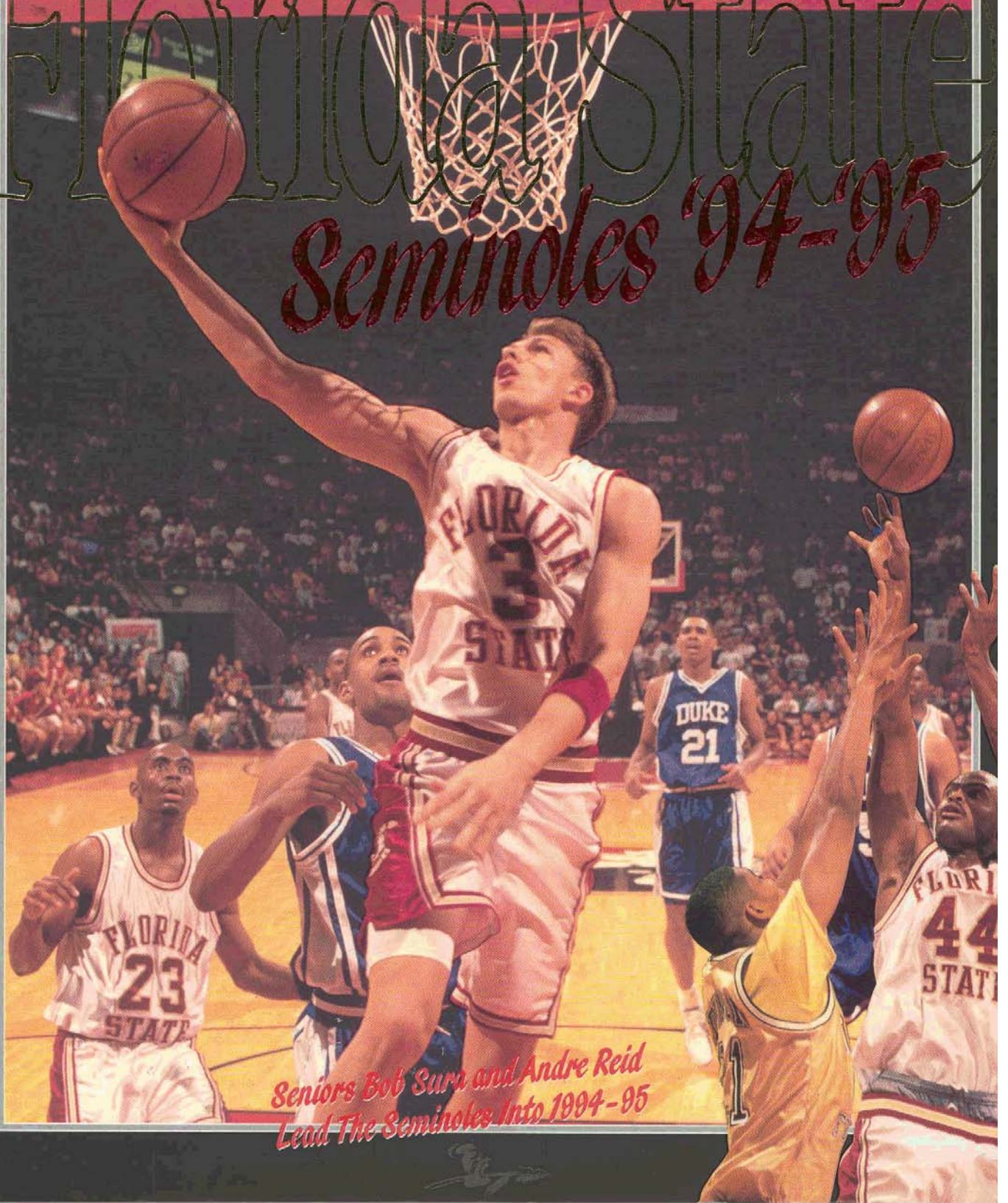

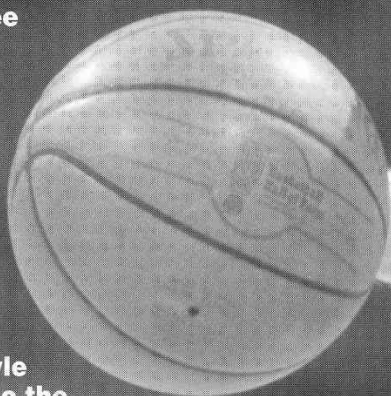

The four freshmen represent the best recruiting class in Florida State history with two McDonald's All-Americans in Corey Louis and LaMarr Greer. Sophomore guard James Collins is coming off a promising freshman season and an outstanding summer of play. Florida State's string of three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament was broken last year, but Pat Kennedy has the athletes to return to his up-tempo style of play, and to the NCAA Tournament.

Press

Credential Requests: All requests for working press, radio, television, photographer or scouting credentials should be made in writing to Assistant Sports Information Director Joey Ferolito at least one week prior to date of game.

Requests will be evaluated and credentials issued according to the following criteria.

- Local metropolitan press; wire services; national publications; metropolitan press from opponents' areas; student newspapers;
- Other daily newspapers;
- Radio and television personnel not broadcasting the contest live;
- Non-daily newspapers (space available);
- Scouts.

Parking: A limited number of spaces in the Civic Center's main parking lot have been set aside for use by the media. Cars should enter the parking lot off Pensacola Street and will be directed to the proper area. **ALL REQUESTS FOR PARKING CREDENTIALS SHOULD BE MADE ALONG WITH REQUESTS FOR PRESS CREDENTIALS.**

Photographers: Accredited photographers will be allowed to shoot the game from courtside upon presentation of a photo pass for the contest. Working press only will be allowed in the designated photo areas of the court.

Television: Facilities are available at courtside for both local and network broadcasts. Please have requests prepared several weeks prior to the broadcast.

NETWORK TELEVISION CREWS WILL BE ISSUED FOUR PARKING PASSES ONLY FOR THEIR ENTIRE CREW. Producers should contact the Civic Center's Roger Englert at (904) 487-1691 directly for special parking needs.

Radio: Sections are reserved for both Florida State and opposing radio on press row. FSU grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on a reciprocal basis. Contact Jim McNeil of Host Communications (904) 644-2550 to assure the lines are available.

Phones: Telephone service should be ordered directly through Centel Telephone Company of Tallahassee. Call (904) 681-6600 to order private lines.

A limited number (six) of phone lines are available in the press/interview room following the game. The phones are for credit card calls only and are on a first-come, first-served basis.

Interview Policies: Florida State players may be reached through the Sports Information Office. A media call-back card will be filled out and given to the athlete who should return the call collect at the requested time.

Following completion of the game, Florida State's locker room will be open following a 10-minute cooling off period. Pat Kennedy will address the media in the press/interview room and two FSU players will be brought to the same room. Media may also conduct interviews in the FSU locker room.

Press Meals: A buffet dinner is available in the Seminole Spirit Room to members of the media with meal ticket attached to credential.

Television crews will be supplied with five meal tickets to accommodate the talent and producers. Any catering needs for television crews should be addressed with Roger Englert of the Civic Center.

ACC Faxback Service

In order to provide timely and accurate information, the Atlantic Coast Conference has a "Faxback System" which allows the league office to provide the latest information, 24 hours a day. The ACC Faxback allows members of the media 24-hour access to the latest press releases (notes & stats) from the ACC office AND the nine sports information offices from each of the league schools.

Members of the media are urged to use this easy system to obtain information on the ACC schools. Below are several of the ACC Faxback features.

Simply dial the Faxback machine phone number on your fax phone. You will then be instructed step-by-step on how to retrieve the information. Connect your fax at the tone and the requested information will start transmitting through your machine. This system is operational 24 hours a day and will contain the latest releases from the nine ACC schools and the ACC office release. We will not release this phone number except to certified media sources. Therefore, you must contact the ACC Media Relations department or fax in your request to (919) 854-8797.

ACC Basketball Coaches Teleconference & Sports Services

The ACC Media Relations Department offers up-to-date statistics on a daily basis and an opportunity to speak to each of the conference coaches via conference-call telephone format on a weekly basis. The statistics will be accessible by computer every afternoon by 3:00 p.m., while the teleconferences will take place on TUESDAY MORNINGS (starting January 3) beginning at 1:00 p.m. The stats line phone number is 910-855-6568 and the teleconference can be accessed by dialing 703-276-4310.

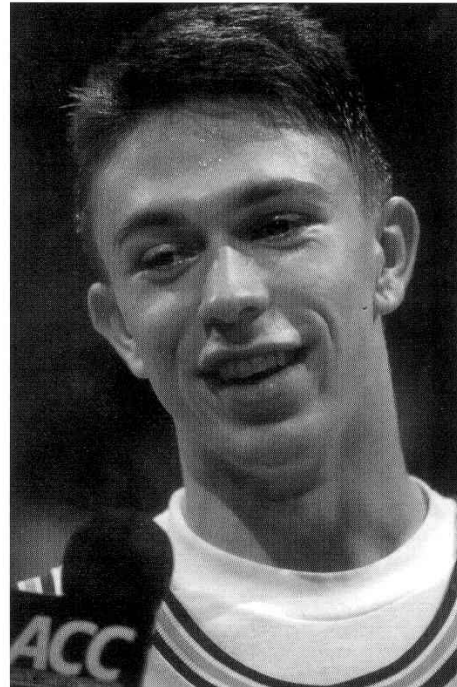

Whether Florida State plays at home or on the road, fans across the Southeast follow every play on the Seminole Sports Network. The regional network brings all the excitement of FSU basketball, as well as pre-game predictions and post-game analysis, to fans, alumni and college basketball enthusiasts across a five state area. The network includes stations in North and South Carolina, and has a strong presence in Georgia, Alabama and Florida.

The Seminole Sports Network is owned and operated by Host Communications, Inc., one of the nation's leaders in collegiate sports broadcasting. Florida State joined forces with the Lexington, KY based company to establish a comprehensive marketing opportunity which includes radio, television, print and corporate sponsorship components.

In addition to Florida State, Host owns the rights to the network of other outstanding schools including Texas, Auburn, Kentucky, Notre Dame, Tennessee, South Carolina, Houston and LSU. Host has a long-term broadcast and print relationship with the NCAA.

The Seminole Basketball Network will reach into nearly 35 markets in 1993-94, including some of the largest in the nation with Tampa, Miami and Orlando slated to receive the games. In Tallahassee, all the Seminole basketball games can be heard on flagship station WTNT-FM (94.9).

Florida State's professional broadcast crew is known as one of the best in the nation as they provide insight and entertainment as well as detailed and expert play-by-play.

The broadcast team features award-winning play-by-play announcer Gene Deckerhoff, a 21-year veteran of the FSU basketball network, who is a seven-time winner of the Sportscaster of the Year award in the Sunshine State.

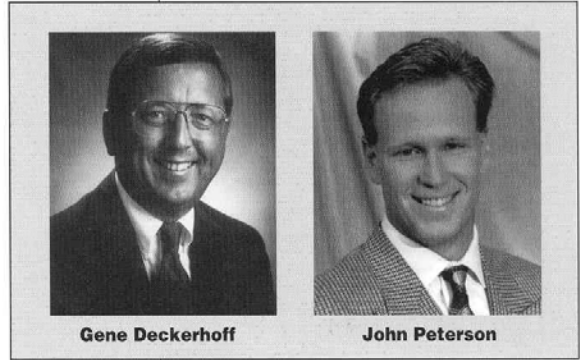
Deckerhoff is nationally known as one of the finest football and basketball announcers in the South. The "Voice of the Seminoles" for the past 16 years in football in addition to his 21 in hoops, Deckerhoff has been named the best college or pro

football play-by-play announcer in the state for 13 of the last 15 years.

A native of Jacksonville, FL Deckerhoff also handles the play-by-play announcing for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers of the NFL, making for some very busy fall weekends. Deckerhoff is also the co-host of both "The Pat Kennedy Show" and the "The Bobby Bowden Show" which he also produces. He runs Gene Deckerhoff Productions, a firm specializing in sports broadcasting and the production of radio and television commercials.

Joining Deckerhoff will be John Peterson, an award winning sports director at WTXL-TV in Tallahassee. Peterson will add color-commentary to all of Florida State's basketball

broadcasts this year after two seasons as the networks analyst for home games. Peterson has a vast knowledge of Florida State sports, also serving as host for Florida State's 90-minute pre-game football show.

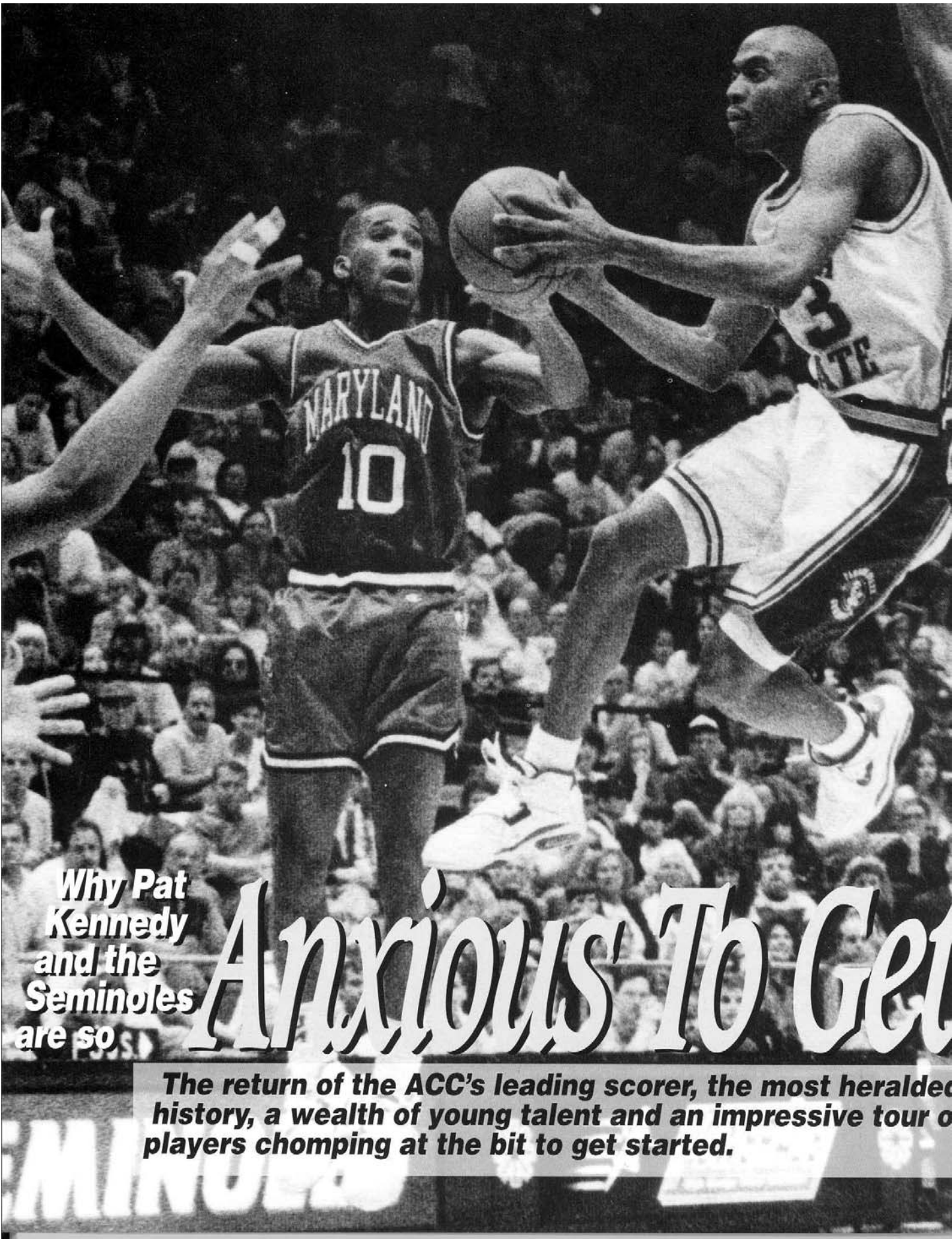

When Florida State officially joined the Atlantic Coast Conference in July of 1991, Pat Kennedy said his basketball program would be looking at a five-year rebuilding process.

But the Seminoles sent shock waves through the league and the nation, finishing second in the regular season in each of their first two years in the land of the giants.

Its immediate success took most by surprise. Now, Florida State is beginning to reap the rewards.

Despite a 13-14 record, 1994 was one of the most important and successful years for the program as Kennedy and his staff signed the best recruiting class in school history. That, an immediate dividend of a 25-10 1992-93 season that saw the Tribe stand just 40 minutes from a spot in the Final Four.

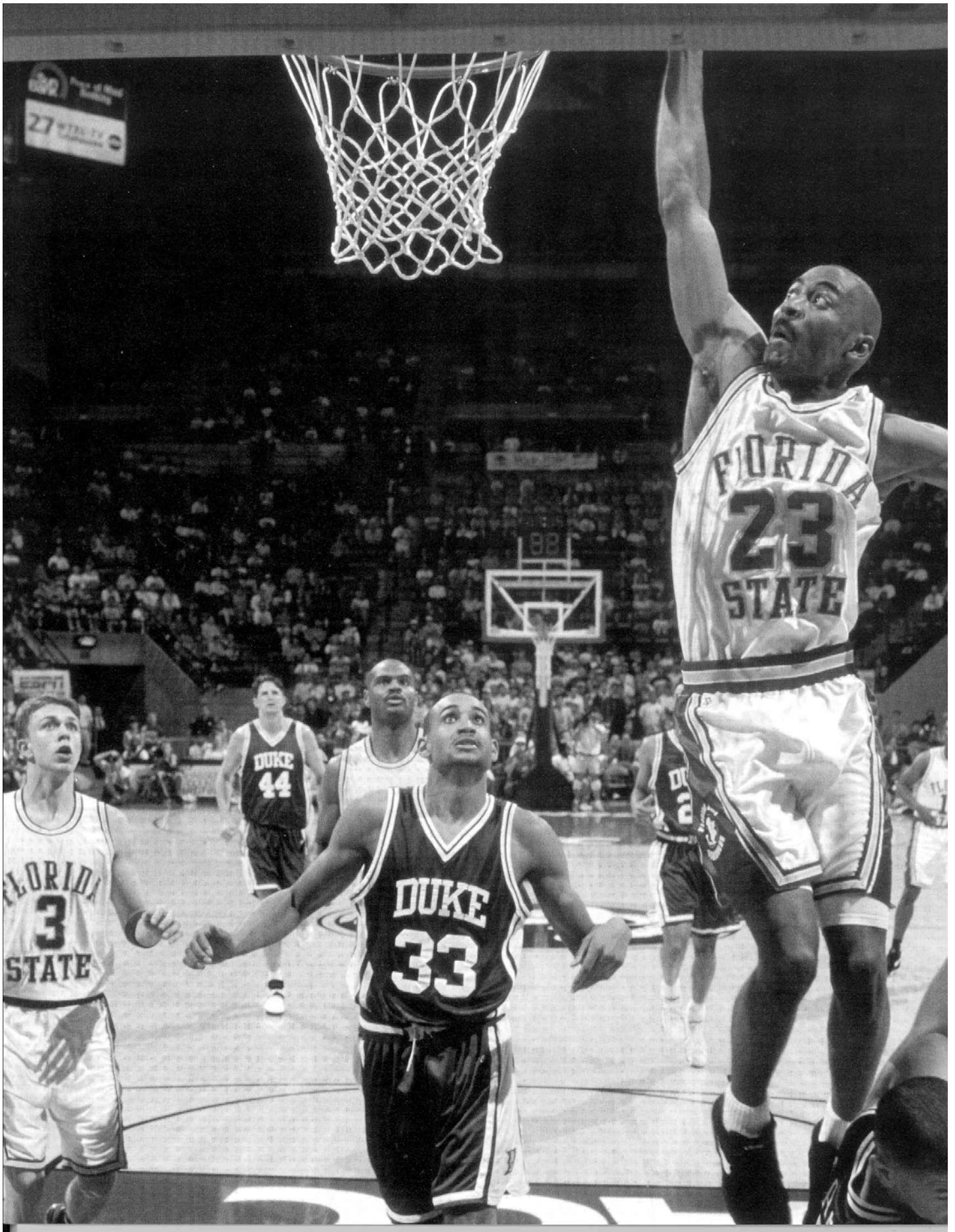

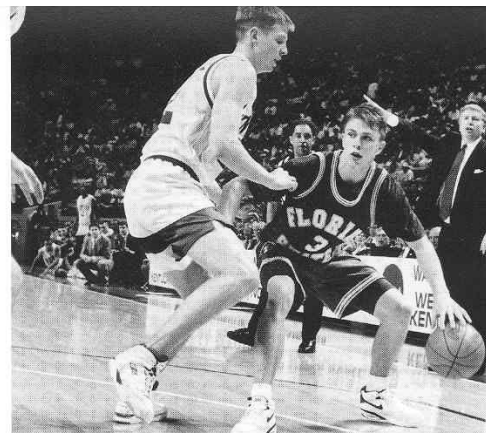

"We are really starting to see the great rewards of being in a strong conference," Kennedy said. "You can look at the seven freshmen and sophomores we have and see the benefits of being in the ACC."

But not even a recruiting class that includes two McDonald's All-Americans and news that guard Bob Sura would return for his senior year could shorten the summer for Pat Kennedy. Driven by an intense desire to succeed, last year's record did not sit well with Florida State's head coach.

Kennedy's first sub-.500 season in eight years at Florida State only serves as a redeeming factor, however. Anticipation was the real reason the days seemed like weeks and six months felt like a year.

Why is Kennedy so anxious to get started? Consider the 1994-95 Seminoles return the ACC's leading scorer (Sura), six lettermen that include some of the league's top young talent, and a recruiting class ranked among the nation's best.

"I can't remember ever being as excited about starting practice as I am this year," Kennedy was quoted in June. "I think the fact that we struggled last year has a lot to do with it. If you've got any competitive instinct, you want to get the chance to redeem yourself right away. But the youth and potential of our team is probably what has me most excited."

His excitement was only enhanced by a mid-August tour of France. The five newcomers couldn't make the trip, but eight returning Seminoles completed a successful journey with a 5-1 record against some of the best European professional teams in France.

"It's apparent that a foreign tour like the one we made brings teams closer together and helps them mature," Kennedy said. "There was great team and individual development made."

"Bobby Sura and James Collins were outstanding in their all-around play."

So dominant was Sura last year that he was joined by only Travis Best of Georgia Tech in appearing among the Top 10 in a remarkable seven of the nine statistical categories kept by the ACC.

Sura's offensive prowess was astonishing considering every Seminole opponent had just one game plan - STOP Bobby Sura! Still, FSU's top offensive threat man-

aged to lead the league in scoring and averaged a team high 7.9 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.4 steals per game.

In fact, Sura will probably break a 39-year old school record as he is just 192 points shy of Jim Oler's career-scoring mark of 1,820 points.

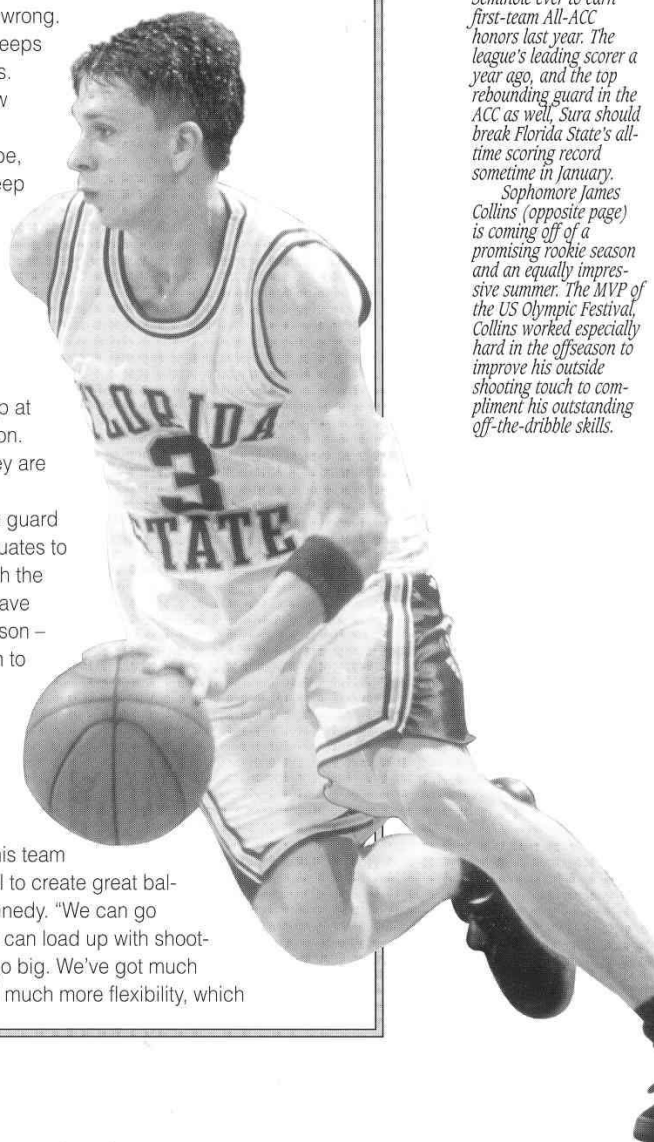
Says Kennedy of Sura: "What I find amazing about Bobby Sura is he never reaches a ceiling. He loves for people to doubt him so he can prove them wrong. As a result, he keeps defying the odds."

"I don't know how good his senior year will be, but I wouldn't keep him off of my first-team All-America ballot."

Led by Sura, the Seminoles are, talent-wise, deep at the guard position. Experienced they are not.

Talent at the guard position also equates to quickness, which the Seminoles will have more of this season - enough to return to the up-tempo style of play that has made them so successful in the '90s.

"I feel like this team has the potential to create great balance," says Kennedy. "We can go super-quick, we can load up with shooters, or we can go big. We've got much more depth and much more flexibility, which

Sura is a consensus preseason All-ACC pick after becoming the first Seminole ever to earn first-team All-ACC honors last year. The league's leading scorer a year ago, and the top rebounding guard in the ACC as well, Sura should break Florida State's all-time scoring record sometime in January.

Sophomore James Collins (opposite page) is coming off of a promising rookie season and an equally impressive summer. The MVP of the US Olympic Festival, Collins worked especially hard in the offseason to improve his outside shooting touch to complement his outstanding off-the-dribble skills.

means we'll have more weapons on both ends of the floor."

Sura will start at shooting guard in FSU's up-tempo offense and will be backed up by a pair of rookies that figure to play right away.

LaMarr Greer is a 6-5 freshman from New Jersey who brings impressive credentials into his first year. A McDonald's and Parade All-American, Greer is a very strong player who could also see considerable time at point guard and small forward.

Freshman Geoff Brower is very similar to Sura in playing style and offensive mentality. His long-range jumper will make him a valuable weapon off the bench at the two-guard.

"Collectively, our freshman class is unquestionably our best ever," says Kennedy. "All four can be impact players and I expect one or two to reach a very high level.

"I don't think we've ever infused our program as much as we're infusing it this year, because you've got to add Derrick Carroll as a sixth kid. Basically,

there's six guys now that can step in and play quality minutes, and we don't really lose a lot".

At point guard, the good news is that Seminole fans will not spend half the season waiting for Charlie Ward to finish with football. The bad news is he won't be coming at all. But Kennedy has recruited several players with the talent to replace the FSU hero.

Still, that position is one of the biggest question marks heading into the season.

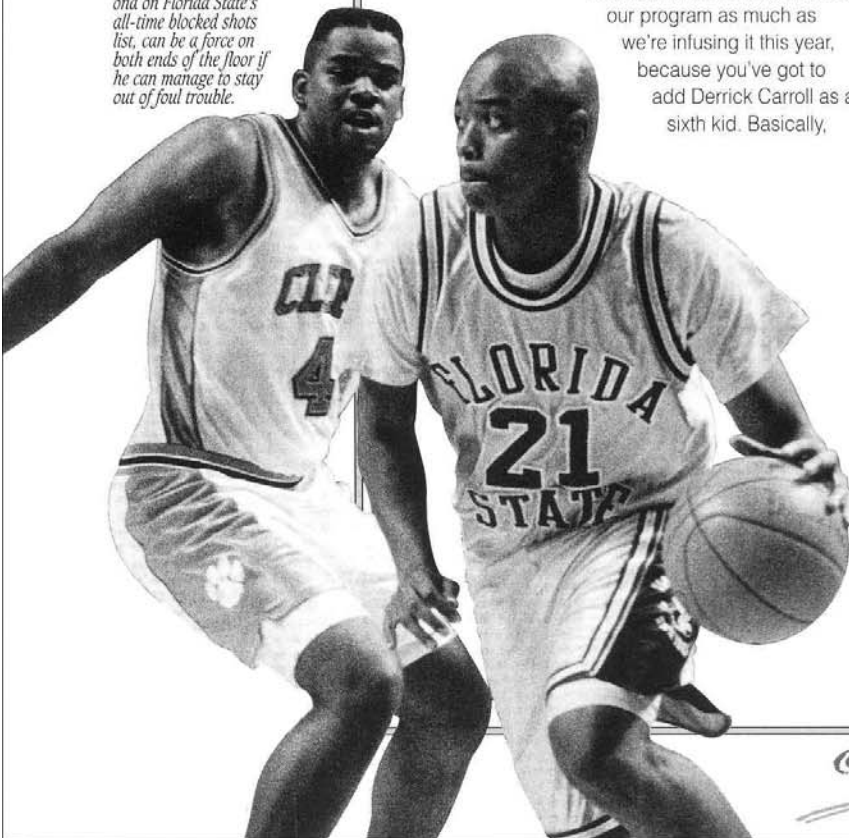
While only a junior, Scott Shepherd is a seasoned veteran. Had it not been for a preseason ankle injury he would have seen a lot more playing time a year ago. Shepherd is confident with the basketball in his hands and will improve with experience in FSU's new lineup.

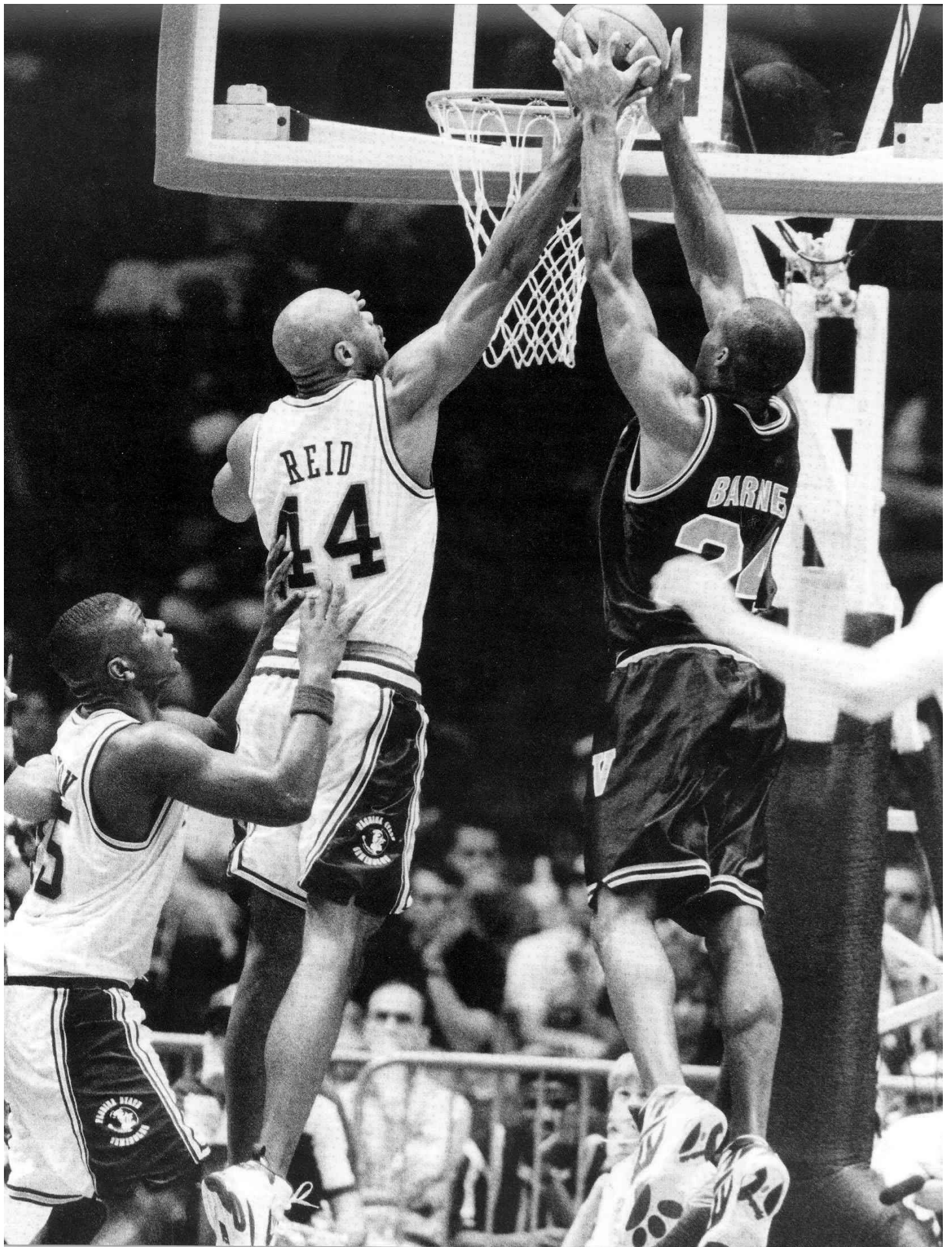
Avery Curry will also compete for the point guard job along with Greer. Curry, a 6-1 freshman from Tallahassee, is a smooth operator in any offense and can beat a defense with the dribble or the pass. He possesses the athleticism to quarterback a face-paced attack.

While James Collins was impressive in earning honorable mention All-ACC honors as a rookie last year, the 6-4 Jacksonville native may have only revealed a fraction of his ability. Collins had an outstanding summer, being named MVP of the United States Olympic Festival before the Seminoles tour of France, where he averaged better than 18 points per game. Collins worked hard in the off-season to improve his shooting and is now a big-time threat from behind the three-point arc. Equally dangerous shooting over the defense or driving through it, Collins will battle Derrick Carroll for playing time at small forward.

Carroll, a 6-6, sophomore, was a starter at forward last year before undergoing shoulder surgery after the fifth game and receiving a medical hardship. An adept outside shooter with the size to battle inside, he can help the Seminole lineup go "big" against some ACC foes.

Returning to the power forward spot is sophomore Kirk Luchman. Luchman proved a pleasant surprise in his first season averaging 5.8 points and 4.0 rebounds a game. He moved into the starting role at center over the middle of the year and got the starting nod eight times in his rookie season. Increased agility and speed should make him a force this season. Luchman will battle a couple of newcomers for playing time in the paint.

'94-'95 Outlook

Corey Louis, one of two McDonald's All-Americans in Florida State's 1994 recruiting class, is also expected to make an immediate impact. A gifted leaper and skilled offensive player, Louis will play both power forward and center. His athleticism will allow the Seminoles to return to the running style that led them to within a game of the Final Four in 1993.

Also working both forward and center spots will be junior college transfer Tim Wooden. At 6-11, Wooden led his Seminole J.C. (Oklahoma) team in assists and blocked shots a year ago.

Andre Reid comes off an up and down junior season that saw his play improve over the second half of the ACC schedule. Reid averaged 7.1 rebounds per game down the stretch, and, when he did

not foul out of the game, the Seminoles posted an 11-6 record.

The seven-foot Reid has shown flashes of brilliance, especially on the defensive end of the floor during his career. He is the school's second all-time leading shot blocker with 122 rejections. He was impressive in France, averaging better than 15 points and 13 rebounds per game while sending back 27 shots.

"I truly believe that Andre has learned a great deal playing in the ACC," said Kennedy. "If there's ever been a time for a guy to step forward, this would be the year for Andre." Reid's play will indeed be a key factor as only two players return to the post positions. Talented newcomers have Pat Kennedy anxiously looking to a bright future.

"We are very excited about the upcoming season," said Kennedy, who enters his ninth year as head coach at FSU. "We've really elevated the expectations of our program and last year's record will just serve to motivate this team. It really felt awkward sitting at home and watching the NCAA Tournament. We had been to three straight and finished second in the ACC twice. We expect to return quickly to that position.

"This is going to be a fun year. We have so many new kids that have so much potential. We are going to have to depend a lot on our freshmen, and they will be forced to grow up in a hurry."

Florida State's schedule will be difficult again in 1994-95 with the Atlantic Coast Conference regulars headlining the slate. In addition to the ACC, the Seminoles will take on non-conference foes Tulane, Arizona, South Florida and Florida. In all, Florida State plays five games against three of last years Final Four participants.

"There's seven powerful teams in the ACC this year with a great deal of equal talent across the board," says Kennedy.

"I think Maryland is a team we're all going to have to contend with. I look for them to be the team to beat this year."

Add it up: six returnees, five very promising newcomers, a 26-game obstacle course to run before tournament time, and one excited coaching staff. Will those numbers return the Seminoles to their now-accustomed post-season NCAA Tournament role? Stay tuned.
