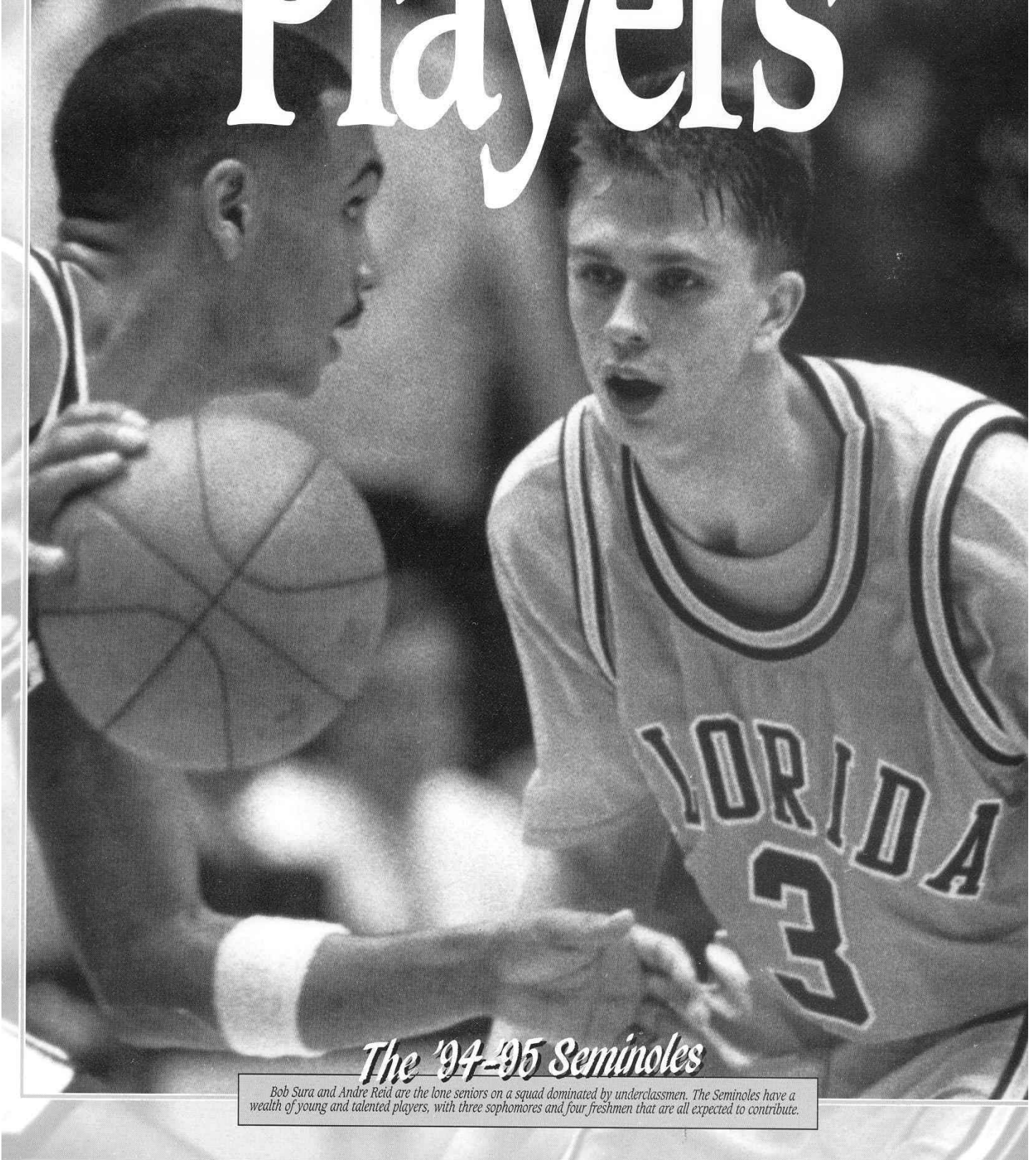

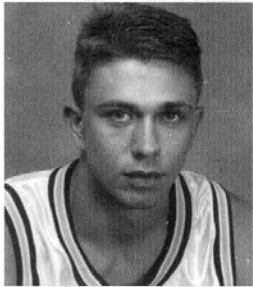
The '94-'95 Seminoles

FSU SEMINOLE BASKETBALL 1994-95

Players

The first player at Florida State to be named first-team All-ACC, Sura returns for what should be a record breaking senior season ... passed up the NBA draft in the spring and is a projected lottery pick in 1995 ... should become Florida State's all-time leading scorer this season ... needs just 192 points to surpass Jim Oler, the school's all-time scoring leader for the past 39 years ... named to almost every preseason All-American squad ... a preseason Playboy All-American for the second consecutive year ... one of 25 players in consideration for the John Wooden Award ... has been the ACC's top scoring and rebounding guard each of the past two seasons ... has proven that he can score against any defense ... quick to the ball of the glass and a skilled defender who often draws the opposition's top offensive threat ... has a flare for the spectacular with acrobatic dunks, and no-look passes ... made an immediate impact as a freshman and was named the ACC's Rookie of the Year ... enters the season having scored in double figures 18 consecutive times.

AS A JUNIOR 1993-94

A first-team All-ACC selection in 1994 ... led the league in scoring at 21.2 ppg., despite drawing the opposition's top defensive assignment ... finished among the league leaders in seven statistical categories ... was passed in the last week of the season for the ACC lead in steals and finished second at 2.4 per game ... led FSU in 15 statistical categories including scoring, rebounding, assists, and steals ... led the team in scoring 19 times and was the top rebounder on 11 occasions ... had an ACC-best five 30-point games ... poured in a career-high 35 points at Duke, the third best scoring effort in the league last year ... also handed out 4.5 assists per game ... had five double-digit rebounding games, including a career-high 13 vs. Florida in Orlando ... honorable mention Associated Press and The Sporting News All-American ... first team All-Southeast Region by Basketball Weekly ... USBWA All-District 3-A selection.

AS A SOPHOMORE 1992-93

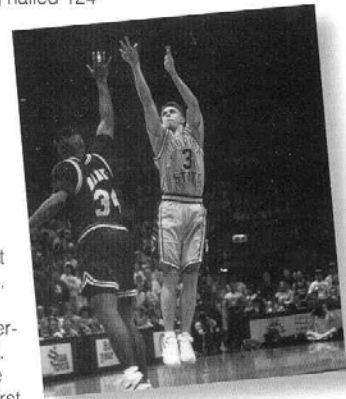
The top scoring and rebounding guard in the ACC ... led the Seminoles in scoring averaging 19.9 points per game ... scoring was no small feat on a team with two 18.3 point per game scorers (Doug Edwards and Sam Cassell) in addition to Rodney Dobard's 11.5 per game ... earned second team All-ACC honors along with Edwards and Cassell making FSU the only team to place three players among ACC's top ten ... reached double

figures in 31 straight games until scoring just seven in NCAA Tournament opener against Evansville ... finished second to Wake Forest's Rodney Rogers in the ACC scoring race ... teamed with Cassell to form the nation's top scoring and rebounding guard combination ... tremendous rebounder who averaged 6.1 per game ... handed out 92 assists (2.7 average), just one short of tying Charlie Ward for second on the team ... became the 28th player in FSU history to score 1,000 points in his career with his first bucket in the NCAA Tournament ... scored 675 points as a sophomore to become the 32nd player in school history to score 500 or more points in a season ... point total marked the third highest single season in FSU history behind Jim Oler (743) and George McCloud (683) ... scored 20 or more points 17 times which led the ACC ... scored a career-high 34 points three times (Iowa State, Duquesne, at Maryland) ... led the Seminoles in scoring a team-high 12 times during the season.

AS A FRESHMAN 1991-1992

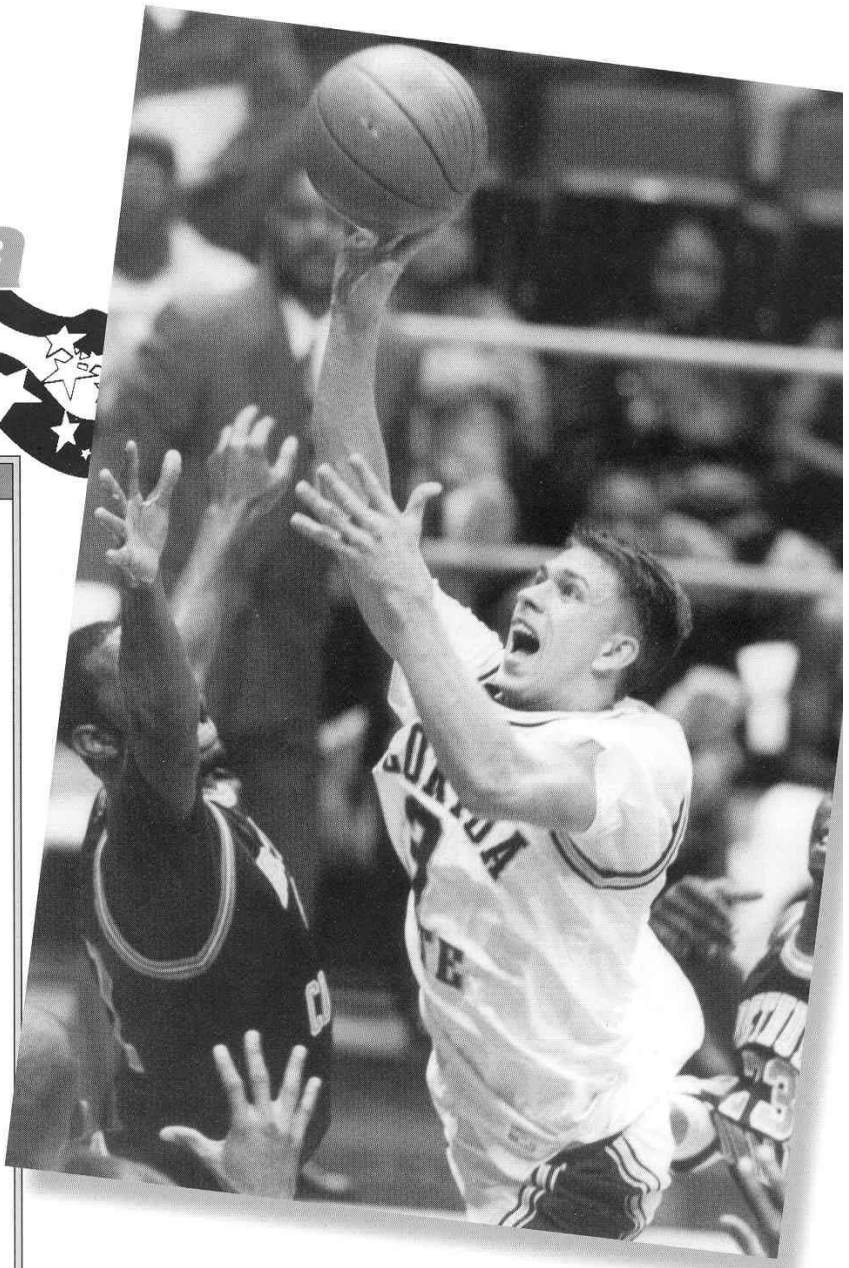
A late signee who burst on the college basketball scene and finished the year as the ACC Rookie of the Year ... averaged 12.3 points and 3.5 rebounds a game during rookie season ... only three-time Rookie of the Week winner in the ACC ... broke Chuck Graham's freshman scoring average mark ... FSU's second most accurate three-point shooter at 38.8 % ... only Sam Cassell made more three-pointers than Sura ... dished an average of 2.4 assists per game ... averaged 12.7 points and 3.3 rebounds a game vs. ACC competition ... scored in double figures on 21 occasions, including nine of FSU's last 12 games ... FSU's fourth most accurate field goal shooter having nailed 124-

of-269 for 46.1% ... scored 25 points and grabbed seven rebounds in win at N.C. State ... averaged 14.5 points over last eight games ... displayed unflappable personality at N.C. State where he air-balled his first

free throw to draw the wrath of the Wolfpack fans — he proceeded to score 25 points, including 7 of 10 from the foul line where he added a wink to each attempt ... also had big offensive games against Clemson (21), at Duke (19) and at Georgia Tech (18) ... keyed a 19-point second half comeback at Georgia Tech with 13 points in a 16-point FSU run ... won many Rookie of the Year votes for his fine play in win at Virginia where he covered All-ACC forward Bryant Stith all night ... stole a Cavalier inbounds pass and drove the length of the court to tie the score with a minute left, then scored the winning point at the foul line with :22 left.

HIGH SCHOOL

Voted Pennsylvania small school Player of the Year as a senior at G. A. R. Memorial ... scored a school record 2,468 points under Coach John Hopkins ... set a school record with 68 points in a single game ... averaged 34 points per game in leading G.A.R. to its second consecutive trip to the 2A state championship game in 1991 ... considered the best player ever from the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton area which includes former UNC All-American Dave Popson.

Majoring in Social Sciences ... born March 25, 1973 in Wilkes-Barre, PA ... selected the Seminoles over Connecticut, Georgia Tech, St. Joseph's and Duquesne ... roommate is Scott Shepherd.

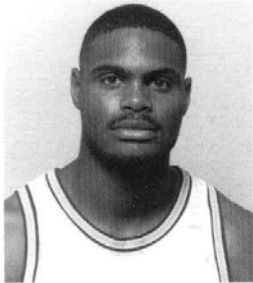

A talented seven-footer who has shown signs of having a break-through season in 1994-95 ... has the coaching staff excited after his inspired all-around play during FSU's tour of France this summer ... averaged 15.5 points and 13.1 rebounds in the six games ... coaches say Reid seems more focused and ready to elevate his game to the next level ... possesses unlimited physical ability ... worked hard to improve his ability to score and rebound in the off season ... has to stay out of foul trouble to be effective ... helped FSU to an 11-6 record in games that he did not foul out of a year ago ... currently second in FSU's all-time blocked shots list with 122 career rejections.

AS A FRESHMAN 1990-91

Proved that he had great potential with agility for a seven-footer ... played 11 crucial minutes in second half of FSU's comeback win against Louisville for Metro Conference title ... finished just two short of Rodney Dobard's freshman record of 36 blocks in a season ... blocked shots worked out to be one for every eight minutes of playing time ... averaged 1.9 points and 2.8 rebounds per game ... scored 11 points against Morgan State and grabbed nine rebounds against Florida International and Texas Southern ... had six blocked shots against Texas Southern ... one of only six Seminoles to play in all 32 games ... started first two games of the year when Dobard was out with a broken foot.

AS A JUNIOR 1993-94

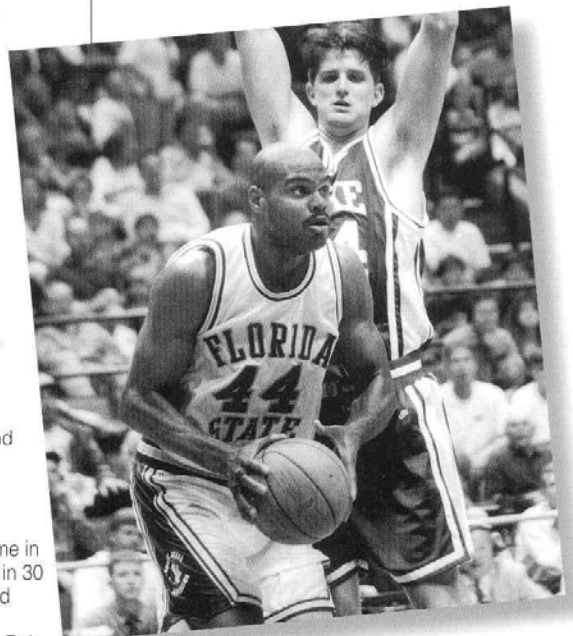
Played in all 27 games, with 19 starts ... after starting 14 of FSU's first 15 games, Reid was re-inserted into the starting lineup for the last five games when FSU went to a four-guard offense ... averaged 6.9 points, 6.2 rebounds and led the team with 54 blocked shots, the third-best single season effort in school history ... climbed into second on FSU's all-time blocked shots list ... averaged two blocks per game, fifth-best in the conference ... had an ACC-best nine blocks vs. Bethune-Cookman and eight vs. UNC-Greensboro ... scored 17 points, grabbed 12 rebounds and sent back six shots in season opener vs. Florida Atlantic ... fouled out of 10 games during the season, including eight of the first 20 contests.

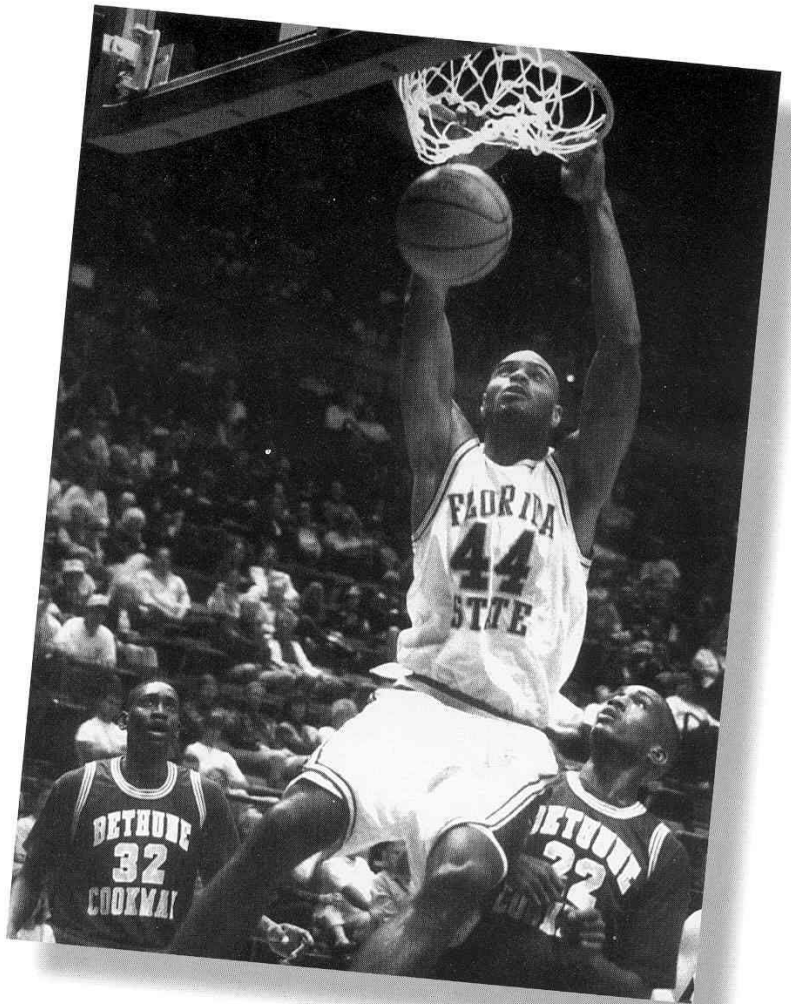


HIGH SCHOOL

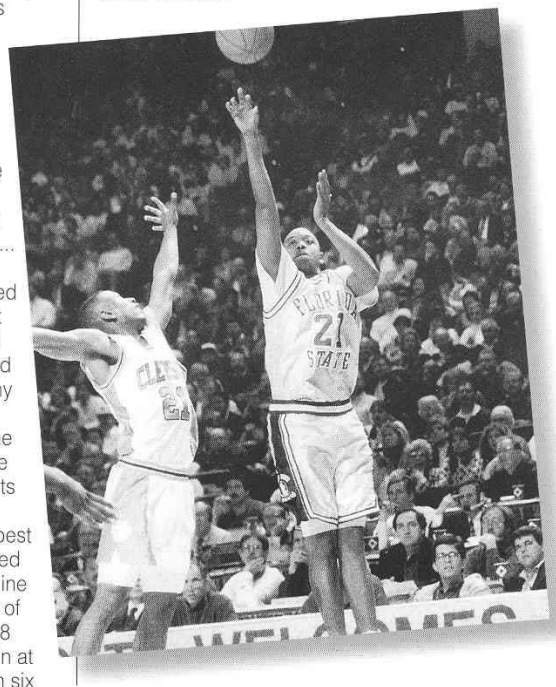


AS A SOPHOMORE 1993-94 (MEDICAL REDSHIRT)

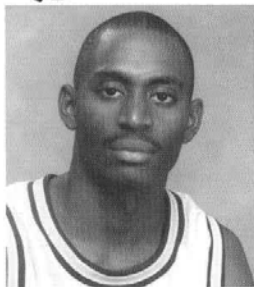

Players

After an outstanding summer, coaches feel Collins is poised and ready to explode onto the national scene as one of the top guards in the country ... named MVP of the United States Olympic Festival (USOF) during the summer after leading the South team to the gold medal ... averaged 19.5 points, six rebounds and three assists over four games at the USOF ... came into his own during FSU's trip to France, averaging better than 18 points in six games ... extra work on perimeter game is beginning to pay dividends ... made 13-of-23 three-point attempts during the tour of France and was 9-of-21 behind the arc at the USOF ... another tremendous athlete that fits into the mold of Pat Kennedy's recent teams ... can excite the crowd with high-flying slam dunks or drain the long three-pointer ... an excellent ball handler with great passing skills ... a quick and aggressive defender with the speed to distance himself for easy transition scores ... a constant threat to score against any type of defense ... possesses great leadership abilities and a strong work ethic ... among the most heavily recruited players in the South coming out of Jackson High in Jacksonville, where he was a legendary figure on the basketball courts.

Considered by most to be the best high school prospect in Florida since Doug Edwards (FSU/Atlanta Hawks) in 1989 ... Florida State's most decorated signee since Edwards, Louis is one of two McDonald's All-Americans in this years freshman class ... has great versatility - can play on the block or the perimeter ... very skilled player with excellent offensive game and tremendous shot block-

ing ability ... great athlete whose ability to run the floor should fit perfectly with FSU's aggressive style ... says Kennedy, "He's a workhorse. He runs, he catches, he finishes, he defends and he's strong." ... played for the runner-up East team at the United States Olympic Festival this summer ... will play over half of his freshman season at the young age of 17, six years younger than senior center Andre Reid.

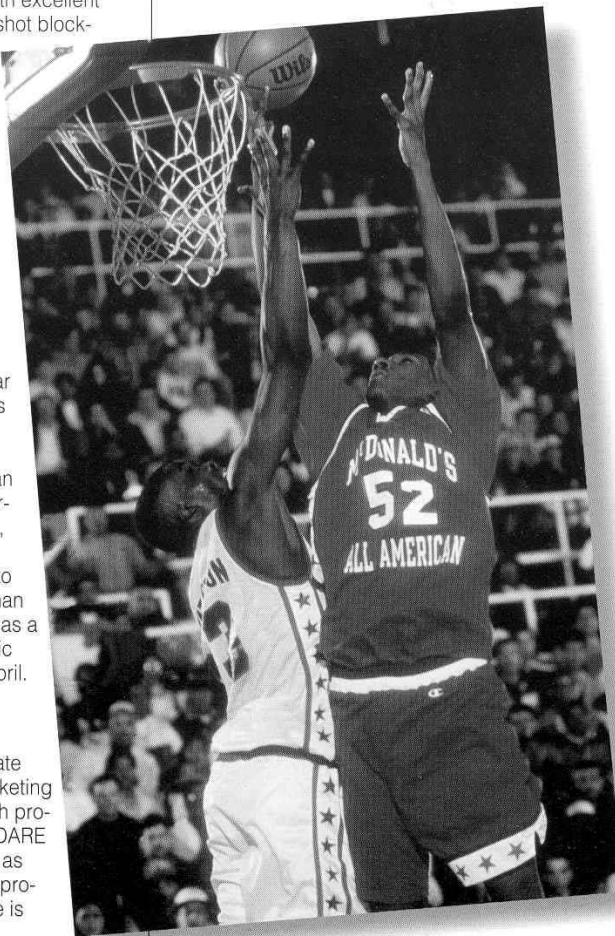
