ACC Tournament Returns to Greensboro

The 42nd annual Atlantic Coast Conference Basketball Tournament, long recognized as the top event of its kind in the nation, returns to the Greensboro (N.C.) Coliseum March 9-12 following a six-year hiatus. The Coliseum has been host to 14 previous ACC Tournaments. For the fourth year in a row the ACC will determine its champion via an eight-game, nine-team format. All eight games will be televised on a national basis by ESPN while the quarterfinals, semifinals and finals will be aired regionally by the conference's Raycom/JP Sports network. ESPN's coverage marks the 13th straight year that the championship game has been telecast nationally.

The Atlantic Coast Conference: A Tradition of Excellence

The Tradition

Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 42nd year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, Atlantic Coast Conference schools have captured 52 NCAA and AIAW championships, including 29 in men's competition and 23 in women's. In addition, 87 men and 22 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

The conference had an immediate impact on the national college football scene in the fall of 1953 when the University of Maryland captured the first of what would eventually be four national football titles for the ACC.

Over the past 13 years, the ACC has captured more national football titles (three) than any other conference. The Big Eight is second with two, followed by the PAC-10, Western Athletic and the Southeastern with one each. Clemson laid claim to the league's second national title in 1981, Georgia Tech followed suit in 1990 while Florida State pocketed national title No. 4 a year ago.

The nine schools that take to the field this fall under the ACC banner have produced 296 first or second team gridiron All-Americans and 47 first-team academic All-Americans. ACC teams have had 1,253 players selected in the annual professional football draft, including 78 first round selections.

If success is best measured in terms of wins and losses, then the ACC has proved itself to be among the elite in Division I-A football. The nine ACC teams are a combined 70-60-5 (.537) in bowl games — a winning percentage second only to the PAC-10's .551 success rate.

Georgia Tech, with a 17-8 (.680) post-season mark, is No. 2 among Division I-A teams in bowl winning percentage. The Yellow Jackets lead a list of three ACC teams that rank in the top seven all-time bowl teams. Florida State is fourth with a 14-7-2 (.652) record and Clemson is seventh at 12-7 (.632).

The ACC also stands at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics in terms of academic accomplishments of its student athletes. That accomplishment is nowhere better reflected than in the CFA Academic Achievement Award which is awarded annually to a CFA member institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. Eight times over the past 14 years, an ACC member school has claimed the award.

This past year, Duke University captured the coveted award for the second straight year and sixth time overall. In addition, the ACC has six of the 20 CFA members who reported graduation rates of 70 percent or better.

1993-94 In Review

The 1993-94 academic year will be remembered as one of the best in the 41-year history of the ACC. Conference teams captured five national titles and five other ACC teams participated in national title games. In all, the ACC has won 18 national team crowns in the last four years.

The 1993-94 national champions from the ACC were Florida State in football, Virginia in men's soccer, North Carolina in both women's soccer and women's basketball and Maryland in field hockey.

The five NCAA runners-up were Duke in men's basketball, Virginia in men's lacrosse, Maryland in women's lacrosse, North

Carolina in field hockey and Georgia Tech in baseball. Overall, ACC teams were 65-39-1 (.623) in NCAA Tournament play.

In addition, North Carolina captured the inaugural Sears Directors' Cup, an all-sports award honoring the Division I school with the best performance by women's and men's athletic teams during the 1993-94 academic year. Three other ACC schools ranked in the top 25 — Clemson (16), Virginia (19) and Florida State (25).

Overall the ACC placed at least one team in the top 10 nationally in 14 of the 23 sports sponsored by the league. Other conference records of note established during the 1993-94 campaign include an ACC-record 82 teams competing at NCAA Championships, five bowl invitations and 29 Top 10 showings.

An all-time high 12 ACC teams (in eight different sports) representing seven of the nine member institutions, earned a No. 1 ranking during the course of the 1993-94 academic year.

The ACC Academic Honor Roll record was broken for the eighth-straight year as 1,151 student-athletes were recognized for their work in the classroom.

The Championships

The Atlantic Coast Conference currently conducts championship competition in 23 sports, including 12 for men and 11 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954, while the league's inaugural basketball tournament took place March 4-6, 1954, at North Carolina State, drawing 36,000 fans over the three days. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet being held in tennis at Wake Forest, October 6-8. Conference championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf and softball.

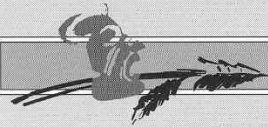
