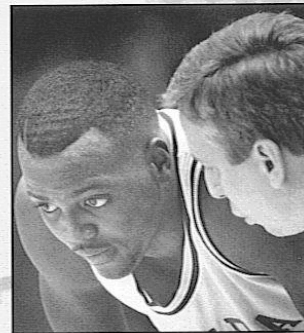
PLAYERS

Kennedy's 10th

Prior to Pat Kennedy's arrival in Tallahassee, only three Seminole basketball players were ever chosen in the first round of the NBA draft. After just nine years on the job, Kennedy has seen five former Seminoles selected in the NBA's first round.

George McCloud became the first FSU player under Kennedy to go in the first round when the Indiana Pacers selected him with the seventh overall pick in the 1989 draft. Kennedy's success at Florida State has not gone unnoticed by the highest league in the land as four Seminoles have been taken in the NBA draft's opening round over the last three years.

So far Kennedy has groomed eight Seminoles for NBA careers and currently has five players listed on NBA rosters.

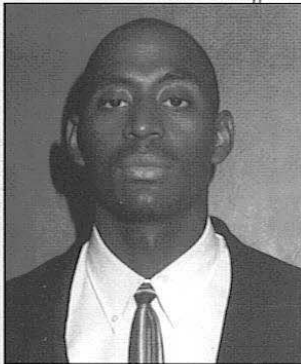

THE 1995-96 SEMINOLES

The ACC's top returning scorer ... earned third team all-ACC honors a year ago averaging 18.0 points and 4.3 rebounds ... only ACC player to score in double figures every game during the 1994-95 season ... owns the conference's longest current double figure scoring streak at 32 straight games ... ready to make his mark as one of the top guards in the country ... an improved marksman with outstanding athletic ability ... a strong finisher on the break who likes to climb for the slam ... looks to fill scoring void left by Bob Sura ... poised to become a player to watch in the Atlantic Coast Conference ... a constant threat to score against any defense ... looks to establish himself as a team leader ... team's leading three-point shooter last season, hitting 72-of-164 (.439) ... can excite crowds with high-flying slam dunks or drain the long three-pointer ... excellent ball handler with great passing skills ... quick and aggressive defender with the speed to distance himself for easy transition scores ... possesses great leadership abilities and a strong work ethic ... named MVP of the United States Olympic Festival during the summer of '94 ... among the most heavily recruited players in the South coming out of Jackson High in Jacksonville, where he was a legendary figure on the basketball courts.

AS A SOPHOMORE 1994-95

Combined with Bob Sura to give FSU one of the most talented wing tandems in the country ... put together a season's worth of highlight film plays with his high-flying dunks ... started all 27 games ... FSU's most consistent scorer down the stretch, averaging 20.1 points per contest over the final seven games of the season ... led the Seminoles in field goal (.511) and 3-point percentage (.439) ... his 18.0 points per game average was second on the team and ninth highest in the conference ... also ranked among the conference leaders in field goal (9th) and 3-point percentage (4th) ... scored a career-high 29 points vs. South Florida before fouling out with just under four minutes to play ... matched a school record for 3-point accuracy with a perfect 7-for-7 night ... drained nine straight three-point attempts by going 2-for-2 vs. Florida Atlantic one game later ... netted 24 points in loss to Florida (2/20), 20 in the first half on 4-of-5 three-point shooting ... snapped out of a brief scoring slump with a game-high 25 points on 10-of-13 shooting vs. UNC-Greensboro ... made 15 of his first 20 treys at home and hit 18-of-29 (62%) behind the arc over the first seven home games before going 2-for-11 vs. Maryland (1/10) ... scored a game-high 26 points and played all 40 minutes at Georgia Tech ... was 5-of-10 from 3-point land in the game ... garnered team-high scoring honors in 11 contests.

AS A FRESHMAN 1993-94

Stepped in immediately at point guard and started 10 of his first 11 games as a Seminole ... played in all 27 games and made 16 starts as a true freshman ... came on strong when FSU went to a four-guard set late in the season, averaging 16.8 points and 5.5 rebounds over the last four games, all starts ... played all 40 minutes of FSU's ACC Tournament loss to North Carolina, scoring 15 points ... matched a career-high with three three-point field goals in that game ... averaged 11 points and 3.9 rebounds per contest ... averaged 10.4 ppg. in regular season ACC games ... earned ACC Freshman of the Week honors (Feb. 28) after scoring 17 points vs. Duke (2/23) and 15 at UNC (2/25) ... netted a career-high 20 points twice, in the season opener vs. Florida Atlantic (12/1) and the final game of the regular season vs. Georgia Tech (3/2) ... handed out nine assists against Morgan State (12/20).

HIGH SCHOOL

Led Jacksonville's Jackson High to a 27-3 record and AA state championship in 1993 ... became the city's all-time leading scorer with 2,212 points over his career ... earned state's "Mr. Basketball" honors after averaging 28.4 points, 16.3 rebounds and 9.0 assists per game in 1993 ... *Parade* All-American who was listed among the Top 30 players in the country ... considered the top senior prospect in Florida in 1993 ... a fourth-team All-American by *Street & Smith* ... selected to *Basketball America's* Super 64 team ... named Player of the Year by the *Florida Times Union* as both a junior and senior ... three-time first-team all-city selection ... two-time first-team all-state selection ... led his team to a 25-5 record as a junior ... averaged 26.9 points, 15.3 rebounds and 8.5 assists as a junior ... scored 50 points in his second high school contest and had a career-high of 55 ... also grabbed career-high 23 rebounds in that contest ... season-low point total as a senior was 20 points and he had 13 assists in that contest ... listed among *Basketball Weekly's* top 35 list ... averaged 25.2 points, 15.3 rebounds and 5.4 assists per game as a sophomore in leading Jackson High to the Final Eight of the AAAA state finals ... prep career was no surprise as he averaged 42 points per game at Southside Junior High.
