## 1986: The Arrival of Pat Kennedy



**W**hen Pat Kennedy arrived in Tallahassee in 1986, the Seminole basketball program faced an uncertain future. The previous six years had resulted in an 88-86 record, low game attendance, fading fan interest and just one post-season appearance. Kennedy brought a volt of energy to the program with the establishment of an up-tempo playing style that created an entertaining brand of basketball for Seminole fans. When introduced as the Seminoles' new head coach, Kennedy promised winning records and regular trips to the NCAA Tournament. Inheriting a 12-17 team in his first year, Kennedy led them to a 19-11 mark and an appearance in the NIT. Ten years later, Kennedy has made good on his promises as his teams have averaged over 18 wins per season during his tenure.

## THE 1996-97 SEMINOLES

Effective wing player who coaches believe will blossom in his sophomore season ... competing for starting job at one wing position, where he opened during the final nine games of the 1995-96 season ... outstanding shooter with great range on his jump shot ... considered a very important part of FSU's plans this season ... fiery, confident player who will not back down from a challenge ... plays with great emotion and intensity ... possesses the ability to create his own shot or shoot off a screen ... able to put the ball on the floor and score in a variety of ways ... brings excellent size and athleticism to the perimeter ... able to put the ball in the basket against any defense ... showed great improvement from the beginning of last year to the close of the season ... often compared to Florida State's all-time leading scorer and NBA first round draft choice Bob Sura.



### AS A REDSHIRT FRESHMAN 1995-96

Emerging as a go-to player in the Seminoles' final nine games of the season ... inserted into the starting lineup midway through the ACC schedule and started each of the last nine games ... averaged 10.1 points a game as a starter and scored at a 6.7 clip for the season ... proved worthy of the first starting assignment of his career with a 17-point outing at Wake Forest, a career high he matched twice more during the season ... followed up with 17 more in FSU's next contest versus Maryland ... also netted 17 points in a winning effort at North Carolina ... went 5-for-5 from three-point range in that game against the Tar Heels ... scored in double figures in four of his nine starts ... one of two freshmen (Randell Jackson) to finish the season in the starting lineup ... the Tribe's top three-point threat making a team-best 38.0 percent of his attempts from beyond the arc (27-71) ... tied for second on the team by hitting 27 shots from beyond the arc ... hit 41.8 percent (23-55) from long range in conference play ... committed just 28 turnovers, the second lowest figure among Florida State regulars ... scored a then career-high 14 points in 16 minutes in a losing effort at N.C. State ... netted 14 points in 16 minutes at Georgia Tech ... scored 10 points and pulled down a career-best five boards at home against Georgia Tech ... showed signs of performance to come with a 12-point outing in an early season win over Maryland-Baltimore County when he hit 3-of-4 three-pointers.

### AS A FRESHMAN 1994-95

Missed majority of season after surgery to remove lymphoma from right shoulder joint ... received medical redshirt.

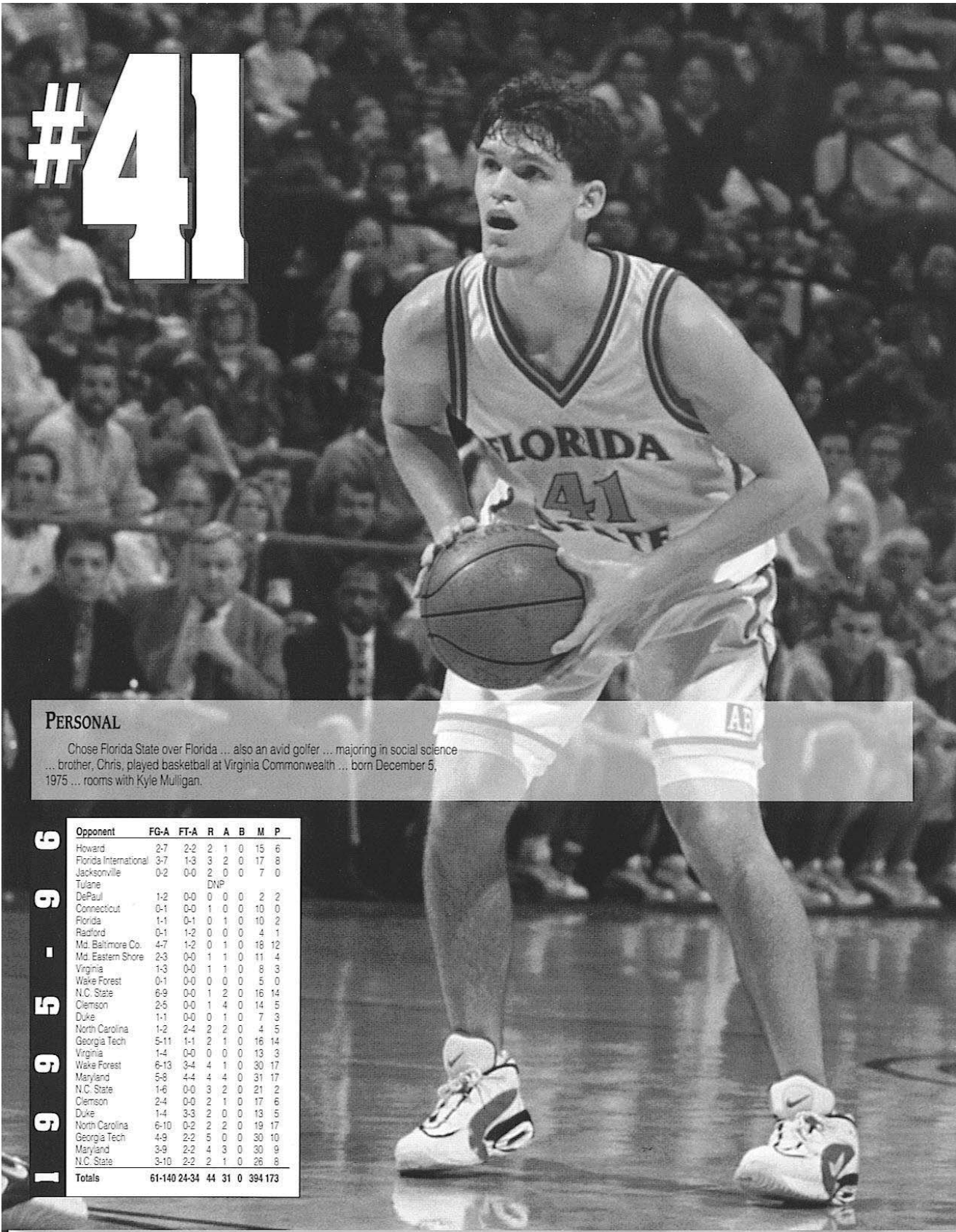
### HIGH SCHOOL

Was one of the top offensive players in the country ... re-wrote the record book at Ft. 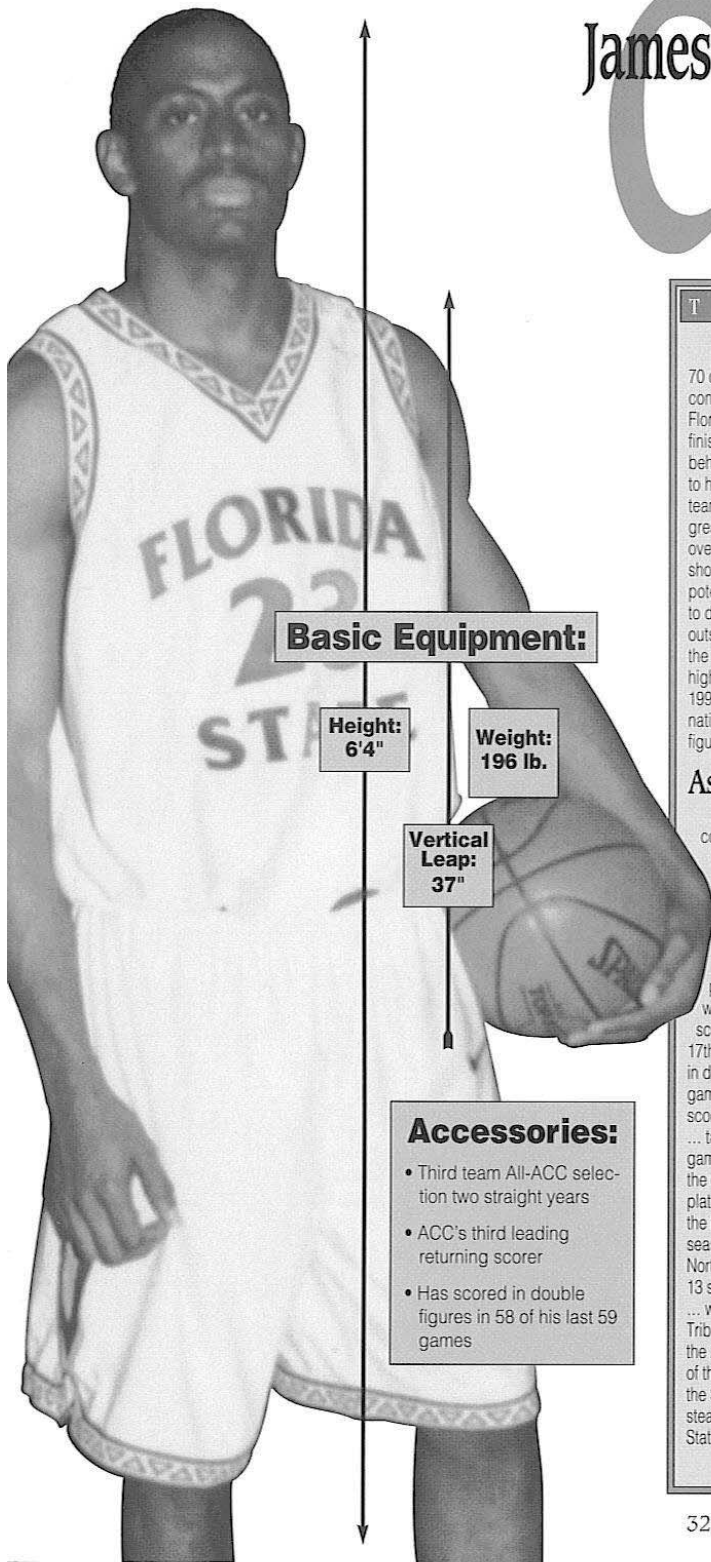

THE 1996-97 SEMINOLES

One of the nation's top returning players ... has started 70 of his 81 games in Garnet and Gold, including 58 consecutive contests ... enters the season ranked 17th on Florida State's all-time scoring list and with 542 points would finish his career as the program's second leading scorer behind Bob Sura ... has taken a tremendous mental approach to his senior season and is ready to shoulder most of the team's leadership responsibilities this year ... possesses great leadership qualities and a strong work ethic ... worked over the summer on improving the accuracy on his three-point shot ... fine defender who often guards the opponent's most potent scorer ... great skill with the ball in his hands and is a fine passer ... great ability to drive and get to the basket ... also a good long range shooter ... possesses outstanding athletic ability ... loves the transition game and is an extraordinary finisher on the break ... constant threat to score against any defense ... can excite crowds with high-flying slam dunks or by draining the long three-pointer ... named the MVP of the 1994 United States Olympic Festival ... among the most heavily recruited players in the nation coming out of Jackson High School in Jacksonville, where he was a legendary figure on the basketball courts.



**As A JUNIOR 1995-96**

Enjoyed another fine season as one of the ACC's top players ... named to the all-conference third team for the second consecutive season ... ranked fifth in the Atlantic Coast Conference in scoring with a team-leading 18.3 points per game average ... averaged 17.8 points in ACC games to rank seventh in the league ... ranked second in the conference in steals per game with a 2.3 average ... listed third among league leaders in three-pointers made per game with 2.6 ... one of the conference's ironmen as he averaged 35.8 minutes per game to rank fifth in the league ... became the 30th Seminole all-time to score 1,000 points in a career ... scored his 1,000th point on the front end of a one-and-one with 1:07 left in a win at Virginia ... has scored 1,279 points in his career good for 17th on FSU's all-time scoring list ... scored in double figures in 26 of Florida State's 27 games ... had a 49-game double figure scoring streak snapped vs. Virginia on Feb. 3 ... tallied team-high scoring honors in 20 games, including 12 in conference play ... the only Seminole to surpass the 25-point plateau during the season, accomplishing the feat four times ... best game of the season may have been in FSU's 84-80 win at North Carolina ... scored 27 points on 10-of-13 shooting and had four steals in that game ... went for 22 points and scored 18 of the Tribe's last 22 points against Tulane ... broke the 20-point barrier 10 times over the course of the year ... buried a three-pointer in 25 of the Seminoles' 27 games ... recorded six steals in FSU's 79-66 home win over N.C. State ... only Seminole to start every game.

## As a SOPHOMORE 1994-95

Combined with Bob Sura to give FSU one of the most talented wing tandems in the country ... put together a season's worth of highlight film plays with his high-flying dunks ... started all 27 games ... FSU's most consistent scorer down the stretch, averaging 20.1 points per contest over the final seven games of the season ... led the Seminoles in field goal (.511) and 3-point percentage (.439) ... his 18.0 points per game average was second on the team and ninth highest in the conference ... also ranked among the conference leaders in field goal (9th) and 3-point percentage (4th) ... scored a career-high 29 points vs. South Florida ... matched a school record for 3-point accuracy with a perfect 7-for-7 night ... drained nine straight three-point attempts by going 2-for-2 vs. Florida Atlantic one game later ... netted 24 points in loss to Florida (2/20) ... scored a game-high 26 points and played all 40 minutes at Georgia Tech ... garnered team-high scoring honors in 11 contests.

## As a FRESHMAN 1993-94

Stepped in immediately at point guard and started 10 of his first 11 games as a Seminole ... played in all 27 games and made 16 starts as a true freshman ... came on strong when FSU went to a four-guard set late in the season, averaging 16.8 points and 5.5 rebounds over the last four games, all starts ... played all 40 minutes of FSU's ACC Tournament loss to North Carolina, scoring 15 points ... averaged 11 points and 3.9 rebounds per contest ... earned ACC Freshman of the Week honors (Feb. 28) after scoring 17 points vs. Duke (2/23) and 15 at UNC (2/25) ... netted a season-high 20 points

twice in the season opener vs. Florida Atlantic (12/1) and the final game of the regular season vs. Georgia Tech (3/2) ... handed out nine assists against Morgan State (12/20).

## HIGH SCHOOL

Led Jacksonville's Jackson High to a 27-3 record and AA state championship in 1993 ... became the city's all-time leading scorer with 2,212 points over his career ... earned state's "Mr. Basketball" honors after averaging 28.4 points, 16.3 rebounds and 9.0 assists per game in 1993 ... Parade All-American who was listed among the Top 30 players in the country ... named Player of the Year by the Florida Times Union as both a junior and senior ... three-time first-team all-city selection ... two-time first-team all-state selection ... led his team to a 25-5 record as a junior ... averaged 26.9 points, 15.3 rebounds and 8.5 assists as a junior ... scored 50 points in his second high school contest and had a career-high of 55 ... also grabbed career-high 23 rebounds in that contest ... listed among Basketball Weekly's top 35 list ... averaged 25.2 points, 15.3 rebounds and 5.4 assists per game as a sophomore in leading Jackson High to the Final Eight of the AAAA state finals ... prep career was no surprise as he averaged 42 points per game at Southside Junior High.

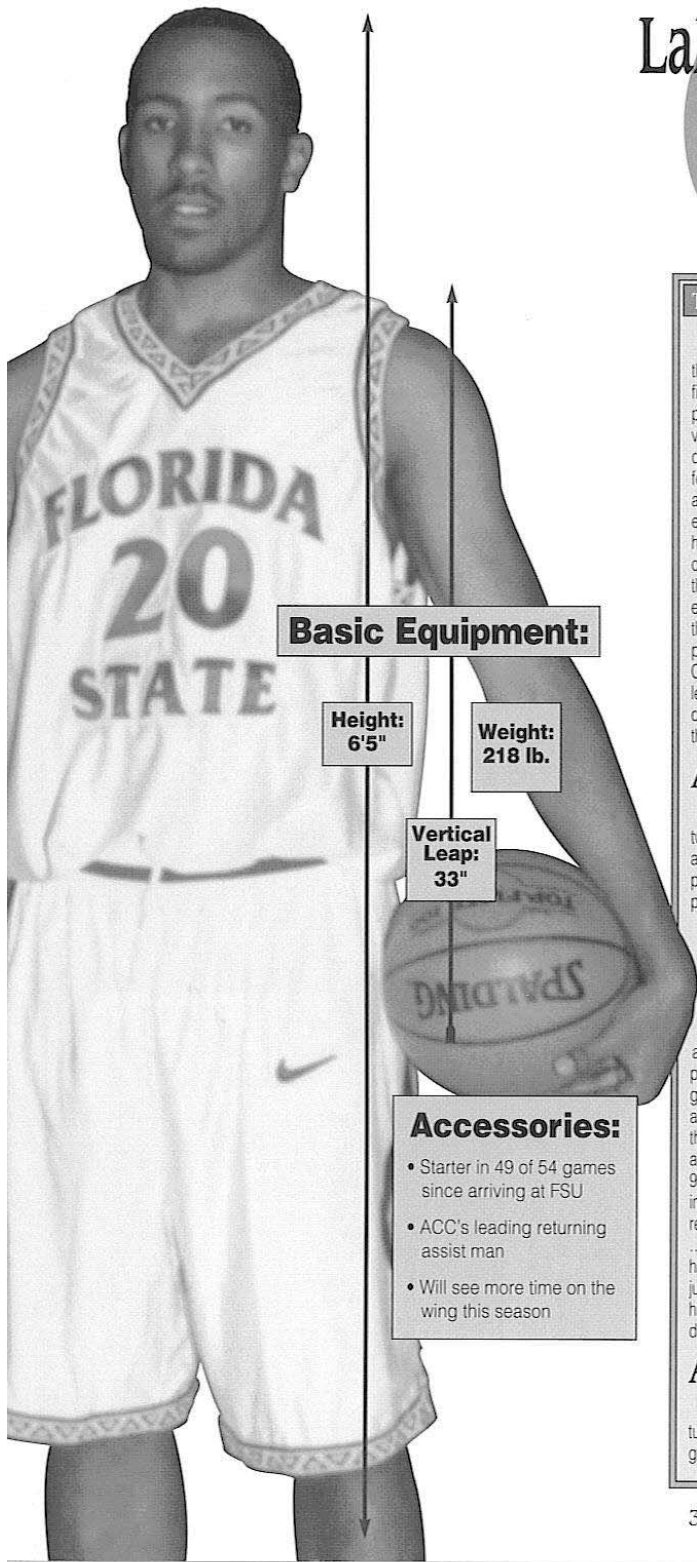

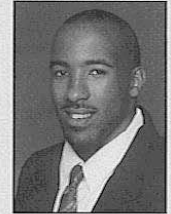

Experienced player who will challenge for a starting job on the wing after starting at point guard for Florida State during his first two seasons ... excellent passer and ballhandler for a player his size ... ACC's leading returning assist man ... versatile player who will also give the coaching staff some quality minutes at point guard when necessary ... has a great feel for the game and sees the floor very well ... brings stability and experience to the backcourt ... good scorer who needs to establish himself in the offense more ... good size allows him to handle two guards and small forwards on the defensive end ... can also use his size to post up smaller defenders ... capable three-point shooter who has hit some clutch shots from beyond the arc in his career ... his experience at point guard gives coaches flexibility in their lineups ... can handle the ball on the break and likes to play an up-tempo style ... one of Florida State's most experienced players ... provides leadership on and off the court ... played on the United States Jones Cup team this summer in Taiwan along with teammate Randell Jackson ... was that team's leader in assists and fourth leading scorer ... enters his junior campaign with improved quickness after spending part of the summer at a speed and quickness camp ... one of three McDonald's All-Americans on FSU's roster along with Jackson and Corey Louis.



**AS A SOPHOMORE 1995-96**

Started 25 of the Tribe's 27 games at point guard ... also saw considerable time at the two-guard position when Scott Shepard entered the game ... ranked third in the ACC with an average of 4.9 assists per game ... the Tribe's third leading scorer with an average of 9.4 points per game ... assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.01 (131-65) was the league's third best ... point production was erratic throughout the season ... averaged 10.3 points over the season's final eight games ... had a pair of 16-point efforts and a 17-point performance in that span to go along with two- and four-point games ... hit for double figures in 11 contests ... best offensive game of the year was in Florida State's conference opening 69-64 win at Virginia ... scored a game and career-high 22 points in that contest ... buried all three of his three-point attempts in that game ... came through with 15 points, five rebounds and four assists in FSU's next game, a 75-73 overtime loss to Wake Forest ... had at least four assists in 12 of 16 ACC games ... began the season on a strong note with 18 points and nine assists against Howard ... averaged 11.5 points and 9.8 assists over the first four games of the year ... included in his start was an eight-point, seven-rebound, career-high 12-assist game versus Tulane ... had a fine game in FSU's 74-52 rout of Florida ... had 13 points, nine assists and four rebounds with just one turnover against the Gators ... established himself as the starting point guard during preseason drills beating out Shepard and Avery Curry.
