1991: Exiting the Metro In Style



HLeading into the 1990-91 season, most experts thought it would be Pat Kennedy's most challenging. The Seminole roster included just three seniors and FSU's schedule was ranked among the five toughest in the country. Proving equal to the challenge, Kennedy led a 17-10 club into the Metro Conference Tournament as the number two seed and one intent on claiming the school's first Metro tournament title in its last year in the league. Facing perennial power Louisville in the championship game, Florida State trailed 56-36 with 17:03 left in the game. What followed was the greatest comeback in school history. The Seminoles ended the game with a 40-13 run to claim a 76-69 victory and the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

The Atlantic Coast Conference: A Tradition of Excellence

The Tradition

Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor. However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 43rd year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, Atlantic Coast Conference schools have captured 57 NCAA and AIAW championships, including 30 in men's competition and 27 in women's. In addition, 95 men and 24 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

The conference had an immediate impact on the national college football scene in the fall of 1953 when the University of Maryland captured the first of what would eventually be four national football titles for the ACC.

The ACC is one of only two conferences to capture three or more national football titles since 1980. Clemson laid claim to the league's second national title in 1981. Georgia Tech followed suit in 1990 while Florida State pocketed national title number four in 1994.

The nine schools that take to the field this fall under the ACC banner have produced 310 first or second team gridiron All-Americans and 48 first-team academic All-Americans. ACC teams have had 1,336 players selected in the annual professional football draft, including 82 first round selections.

If success is best measured in terms of wins and losses, then the ACC over the years has proved itself to be among the elite in Division I-A football. After posting a 3-1 bowl mark in 1995, the ACC moved past the Pacific-10 as the conference with the best all-time bowl winning percentage. The league's teams are a combined 76-63-5 (.614) in post-season play.

Two ACC teams, Florida State and Georgia Tech, are tied as the nation's winningest bowl teams. The Seminoles are 15-8-2 in bowl play while the Yellow Jackets are 17-8. Clemson is eighth at 12-8 (.600).

The ACC also stands at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics in terms of academic accomplishments of its student athletes. Ten times over the past 16 years, an ACC member school has claimed the CFA Academic Achievement Award which is awarded to a CFA member institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team.

This past year, Duke tied with Boston College and Vanderbilt for the coveted award. In addition, Florida State, Maryland, N.C. State, Virginia and Wake Forest were accorded honorable mention for having graduation rates of 70 percent or better.

1995-96 In Review

The 1995-96 academic year concluded with the league pocketing two more national team titles and seven individual NCAA crowns. In all, the ACC has won 23 national team crowns in the last six years.

The ACC's 1995-96 national champions were North Carolina in field hockey and Maryland in women's lacross. The league also had four teams participate in national title games - Duke in men's soccer, Virginia in men's lacrosse, North Carolina in women's lacross and Maryland in field hockey. Overall, the ACC posted a 67-48-1 (.575) mark in NCAA Tournament play.

In addition, seven ACC schools - North Carolina (6), Virginia (21), Florida State (23), Clemson (27), N.C. State (32) and Duke (39) - were ranked in the Top 40 of the Sears Directors' Cup, an all-sports award honoring the Division I school with the best performance by women's and men's athletic teams during the 1995-96 academic year.

The ACC placed at least one team in the Top 10 nationally, in 13 of the 23 sports sponsored by the league. Other records of note during the 1995-96 season include 77 teams competing at NCAA Championships, four bowl teams and 24 Top 10 showings.

Six ACC teams, in six different sports, representing three of the nine member institutions, earned a No. 1 ranking during the course of the past academic year.

The ACC Academic Honor Roll record was broken for the 10th straight year as 1,185 student-athletes were recognized for their work in the classroom.

A History

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, at the Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, N.C., with seven charter members - Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest - drawing up the conference by-laws.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again at Sedgefield and officially admitted the University of Virginia. The first, and only, withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971 when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation.

The conference operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when Georgia Tech was admitted. The Atlanta school had withdrawn from the Southeastern Conference in January of 1964.

The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of Florida State.

VIRGINIA - Charter member of the SIAA in 1894, charter member of the SC in 1921, resigned from SC in December 1936, joined the ACC in December 1953.

WAKE FOREST - Joined the SC in February 1936, charter member of the ACC in 1953.

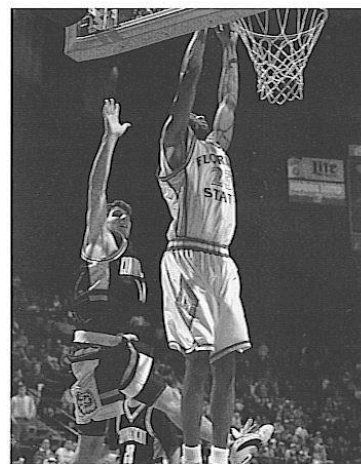
