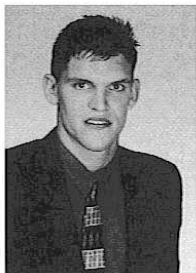

Coming off a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee ... suffered the injury against Michigan State in the second round of the National Invitational Tournament ... rehabilitation is going well and he may be able to return to the lineup as early as December ... could challenge for a starting job when he is completely healthy ... had an up-

and-down sophomore season when he appeared in 29 games and made three starts ... provides FSU with an excellent long-range shooting threat ... possesses the ability to create his own shot or shoot coming off a screen ... able to provide instant scoring punch off the bench ... has good size and is a physical player from the perimeter ... one of three Seminoles' who hail from the state of Florida.

As A SOPHOMORE 1996-97

Had his season end early when he suffered a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee against Michigan State in the second round of the NIT ... started the first three games of the season before coming off the bench in the next 26 contests ... averaged 6.3 points in 15.3 minutes per game ... scored in double figures seven times during the year ... ranked fourth on the team in three-point shooting hitting 33.3 percent (28-of-84) and field goal percentage at 45.1 percent (65-of-144) ... averaged 16.4 points per 40 minutes played ... committed just 25 turnovers, the second lowest figure among Florida State regulars ... matched a career-high and established a season-best with 17 points in the season-opener versus Southwestern Louisiana ... hit a career-best eight field goals in nine attempts in that game ... had a pair of 15-point efforts off the bench in wins against NC State and Marist ... hit 6-of-8 from the floor in 22 minutes versus the Wolfpack ... canned 4-of-6 from three-point range and scored 12 points in the win at Jacksonville ... got off to a hot start during the season's first 10 games ... averaged 10.4 points while shooting 62.3 percent from the floor (38-of-61) and 44.8 percent from three-point range (13-of-29) during that span ... suffered through a shooting slump during the middle of the year ... connected on just 7-of-42 (16.7 percent) from the field and only 3-of-29 (10.3 percent) from three-point range during a 12-game stretch ... started to break out of his slump in the six games prior to his injury ... averaged 8.2 points during that span while going 10-of-23 from three point range (43.5 percent) ... stepped up his play in the postseason ... had nine points in the ACC Tournament loss to Wake Forest and eight in the first round NIT win at Syracuse ... hit 5-of-11 from three-point range in the postseason.

As A REDSHIRT FRESHMAN 1995-96

Emerged as a go-to player in the Seminoles' final nine games of the season ... inserted into the starting lineup midway through the ACC schedule and started each of the last nine games ... averaged 10.1 points a game as a starter and scored at a 6.7 clip for the season ... proved worthy of the first starting assignment of his career with a 17-point outing at Wake Forest, a career-high he matched twice more during the season ... followed up with 17 more in FSU's next contest versus Maryland ... also netted 17 points in a winning effort at North Carolina ... went 5-for-5 from three-point range in that game against the Tar Heels ... scored in double figures in four of his nine starts ... one of two freshmen (Randell Jackson) to finish the season in the starting lineup ... the Tribe's top three-point threat making a team-best 38.0 percent of his attempts from beyond the arc (27-71) ... tied for second on the team by hitting 27 shots from beyond the arc ... hit 41.8 percent (23-55) from long range in conference play ... committed just 28 turnovers, the second lowest figure among Florida State regulars ... scored a then career-high 14 points in 16 minutes in a losing effort at N.C. State ... netted 14 points in 16 minutes at Georgia Tech ... scored 10 points and pulled down a career-best five boards at home against Georgia Tech ... showed signs of performance to come with a 12-point outing in an early season win over Maryland-Baltimore County when he hit 3-of-4 three-pointers.

As A FRESHMAN 1994-95

Missed majority of season after surgery to remove lymphoma from right shoulder joint ... received medical redshirt.

HIGH SCHOOL

Was one of the top offensive players in the country ... re-wrote the record book at Ft. Walton Beach High School, breaking all the school's scoring records ... prolific scorer who once scored 60 points in a game as a junior ... ranked among the nation's Top 50 players by Bob Gibbons ... averaged 32 points, nine rebounds and four assists as a senior for the Vikings ... a first-team 4A all-state selection.

Chose Florida State over Florida ... also an avid golfer ... majoring in social science ... brother, Chris, played basketball at Virginia Commonwealth and is now a coach at Lander (SC) College ... born December 5, 1975.

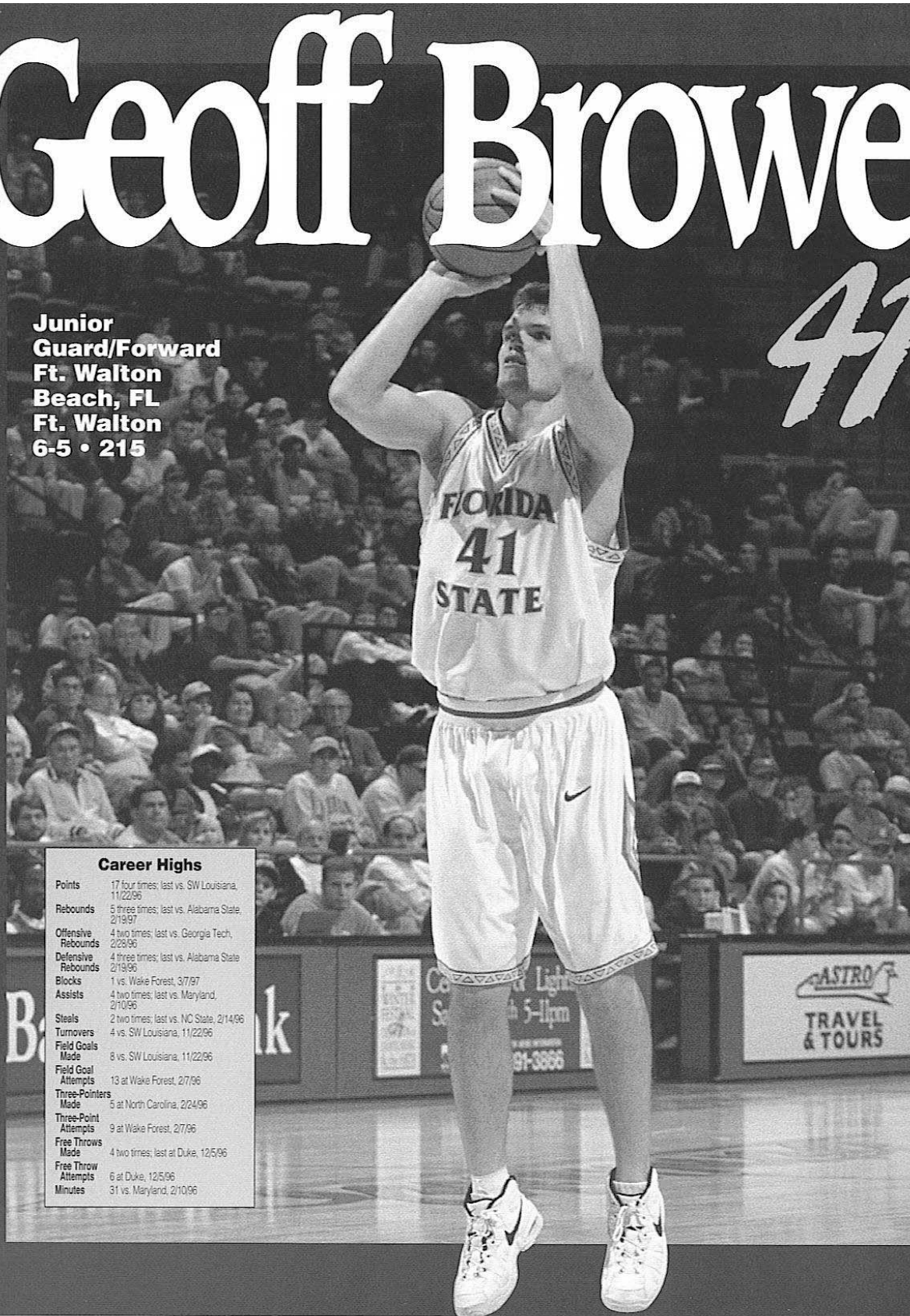

Will miss the first portion of the season while sitting out for academic reasons ... will be eligible to return at the conclusion of Florida State's fall semester ... adds quality depth to the point guard and wing positions ... will contend for more game time on the wing during the 1997-98 campaign ... started the first three games of

his freshman season before moving into a reserve role behind Kerry Thompson at point guard ... one of the team's most athletic players ... quick with the ball in his hands and has the ability to be a fine defender ... has great size for a backcourt player ... excellent passer and extremely unselfish ... has good hands and is a solid rebounder from the backcourt ... worked on developing his jump shot during the offseason ... earned Parade All-America honors at St. Thomas More Prep School in Oakdale, CT two years ago.

AS A FRESHMAN 1996-97

Saw considerable playing time during his rookie campaign ... appeared in 31 of Florida State's 32 games ... started the first three games of the season at point guard before moving into a reserve role behind Kerry Thompson ... averaged 10.6 minutes of playing time and 2.5 points per game ... ranked fourth on the team with 66 assists for a 2.1 per game average ... posted a respectable assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.38 ... put up his best numbers of the season against Tennessee State ... scored 13 points with five assists, two steals and just one turnover in 23 minutes in that game ... scored in double

figures one other time, an 11-point effort at North Carolina ... recorded a season-best seven assists in the victory over Marist ... had six assists against both Rice and Alabama State ... showed poise early in the season by knocking down a pair of crucial three-pointers in an overtime loss at Duke ... had eight points and four assists in 21 minutes at Jacksonville ... recorded a season-high three steals on four occasions.

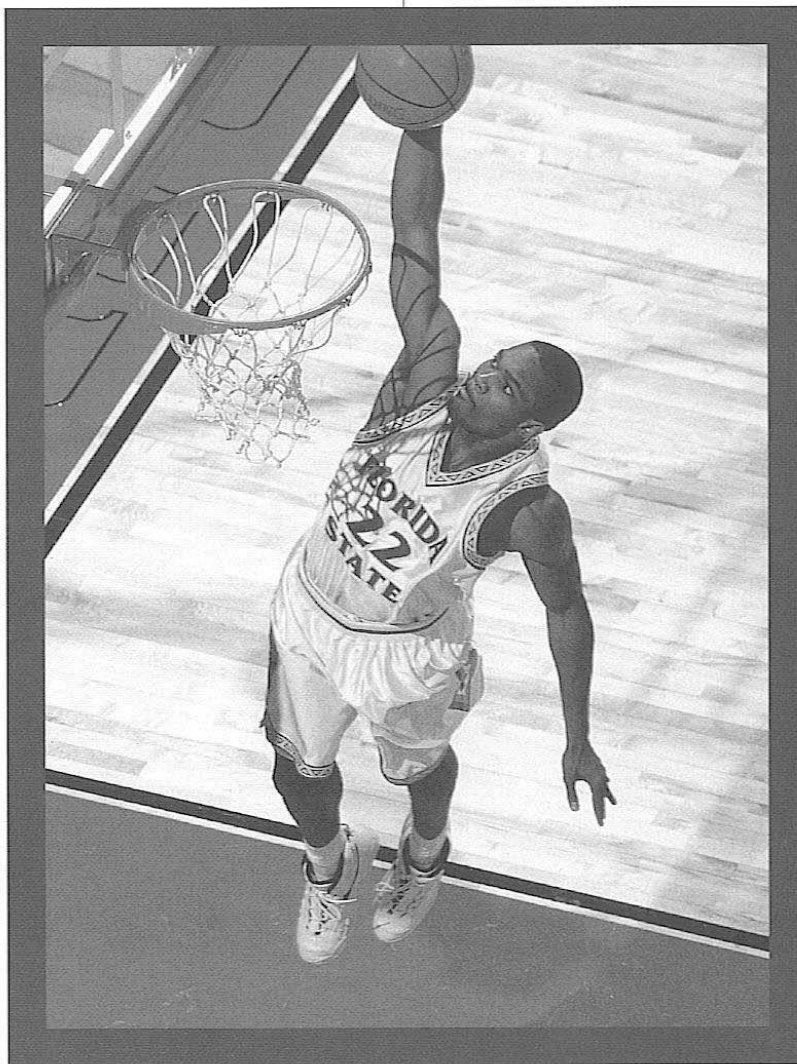
HIGH SCHOOL

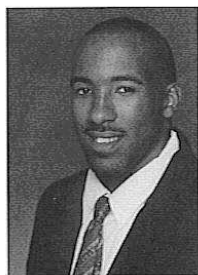

Versatile player who is a three-year starter at Florida State ... started his freshman and sophomore seasons at point guard before moving to the wing last year ... has started 69 of his 85 games in college ... dedicated himself to improving speed and quickness over the summer ... also worked on extending his shooting range ... enters the season in the best condition of his FSU career ... emerged as a team leader during the 1996-97 postseason and over the summer ... one of the hardest-workers on the team ... versatility provides the coaching staff with many options ... can play any of three positions ... combines excellent size with good ball-handling and passing skills ... may also see time at point guard when situations deem necessary ... has developed into a good three-point shooter who has hit some clutch shots from beyond the arc in his career ... unselfish player who can score when called upon ... has a great feel for the game and sees the court well ... can use his size to post up smaller defenders ... one of three McDonald's High School All-Americans on the Florida State roster along with Randell Jackson and Corey Louis.

As A JUNIOR 1996-97

Had a solid junior season after making the move from point guard to the wing prior to the season ... appeared in all 32 games and started 20 ... ranked fifth on the team in scoring with an 8.4 points per game average ... also averaged 3.9 rebounds and 2.2 assists ... scored in double figures 12 times on the year ... opened the season against Southwestern Louisiana with one of the best games of his career ... scored 16 points, pulled down seven rebounds and handed out nine assists in that game ... was Florida State's second-best three-

point shooter, hitting 36.2 percent (38-of-105) on the year ... took his play to another level during the postseason ... third on the team in scoring in the NIT with an 11.4 points per game average and hit 40.9 percent from three-point range ... also averaged 4.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists in the postseason ... scored in double figures in four of five NIT games ... keyed the Seminoles first round win at Syracuse with a 16 point, five-rebound effort ... added 11 points in the second round win over Michigan State ... scored 10 points, grabbed six rebounds and put FSU ahead for good with a three-pointer with 4:06 to play in the Tribe's third round win at West Virginia ... scored 15 points and hit three three-pointers in the NIT Championship Game loss to Michigan ... began the year on a strong note averaging 10.0 points in the first seven games ... pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds in an overtime loss at Duke in December ... had 10 points, five rebounds and five assists in the win over Florida ... started 11 of the first 13 games before losing his starting job to Ron Hale ... came off the bench for a career-high 23 points in a home loss to Duke in February ... went 7-of-14 from the floor in that game and knocked down four three-pointers ... that performance helped him regain his spot in the starting five late in the season at Clemson.

As A SOPHOMORE 1995-96

Started 25 of the Tribe's 27 games at point guard ... also saw considerable time at the two-guard position when Scott Shepard entered the game ... ranked third in the ACC with an average of 4.9 assists per game ... the Tribe's third leading scorer with an average of 9.4 points per game ... assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.01 (131-65) was the league's third best ... hit for double figures in 11 contests ... best offensive game of the year was in Florida State's conference opening 69-64 win at Virginia ... scored a game-high 22 points in that contest ... came through with 15 points, five rebounds and four assists in FSU's next game, a 75-73 overtime loss to Wake Forest ... began the season on a strong note with 18 points and nine assists against Howard ... posted a career-high 12 assists versus Tulane ... had 13 points, nine assists and four rebounds with just one turnover against Florida.

As A FRESHMAN 1994-95

Won the starting point guard spot in the preseason and started 15 of the first 16 games ... started 24 games as a rookie ... scored a season-high 13 points vs. North Carolina and was 3-of-4 from three-point range ... did not have a turnover in 35 minutes in that game ... hit a three-point bomb to give FSU a 58-53 lead versus Clemson and then made four straight free throws to ice the win ... scored 11 points in the first meeting versus Clemson on 3-of-4 three-point shooting ... drilled a three with :58 remaining in the Tulane game to give FSU a 76-71 lead ... canned another three-pointer with :10 left to send the first Florida game into a second overtime ... was forced to miss the Florida Atlantic game because of an ankle injury.

HIGH SCHOOL

New Jersey Player of the Year in 1994 ... widely considered one of the top five guards in the nation as a senior ... a second team Parade All-American ... averaged 26 points, 11 rebounds, and 10 assists while leading his team to a 30-3 record and the state Group II title as a junior ... averaged 33 points, 10 rebounds, and seven assists as a senior ... scored 13 points in the McDonald's All-Star game and had 16 points and 10 assists in Magic's Roundball Classic in Detroit.
