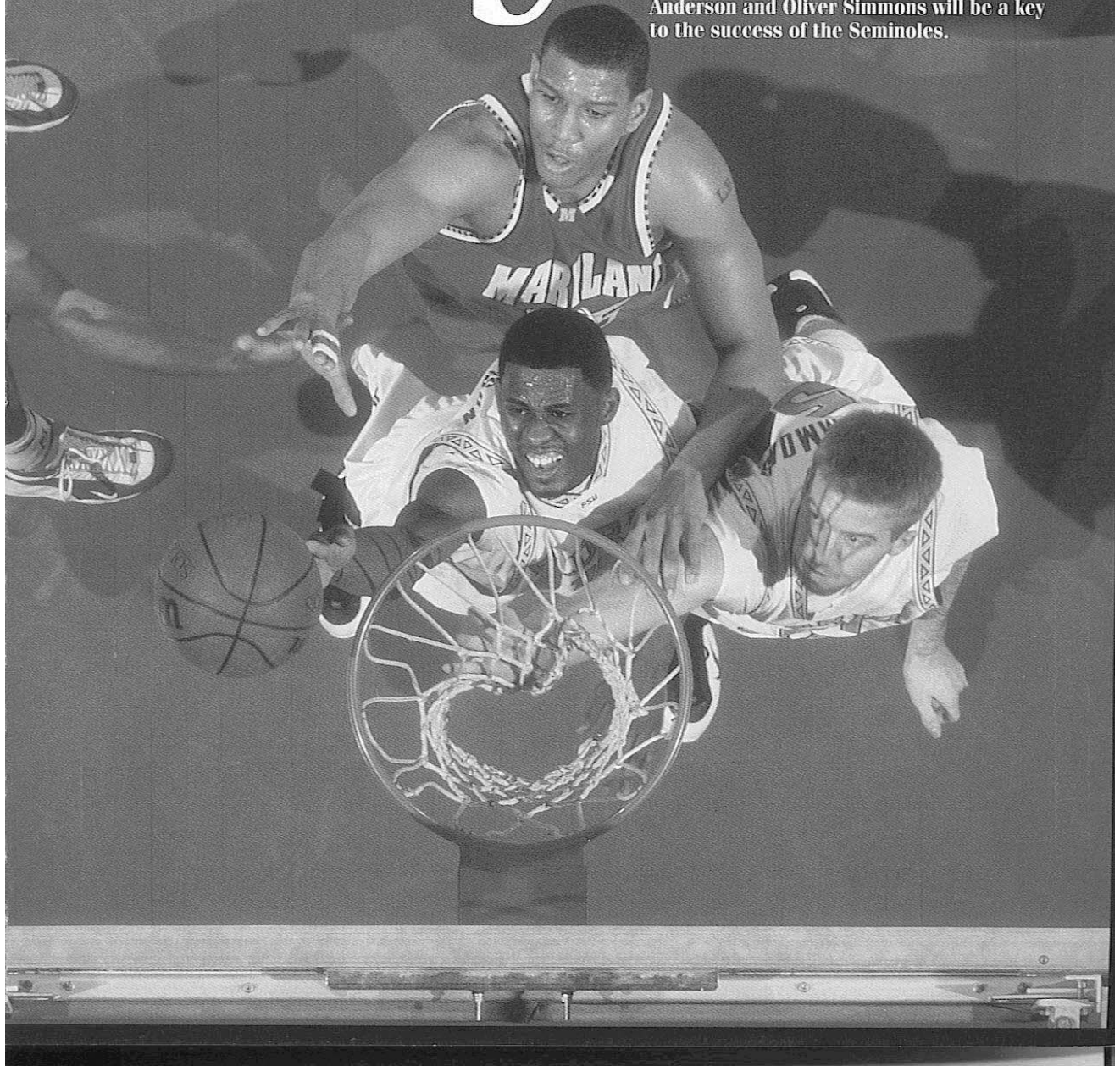


Players

Damous Anderson



- Forward

- Greenville, SC (Metro Atlanta College/Berea HS)

Damous Anderson ranked fifth nationally in field goal percentage, hitting 60.5 percent from the floor.



A candidate for All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in his senior season ... returning starter at power forward and one of four starters back on the 1999-2000 Seminoles ... enjoyed a remarkable season after transferring into the FSU program midway through December last season ... finished third on the team in scoring at 11.9 points per game and second in rebounding at a 5.1 clip ... hit 60.5 percent (115-of-190) from the field to rank second in the ACC and fifth nationally ... coaches love his versatility ... may see some time at small forward when Florida State employs a big lineup ... very efficient player ... owns natural basketball ability ... fine passer for his size ... can knock shots down from the perimeter and put the ball on the floor to get to the basket ... excellent rebounder for his size who also guarded opposing centers when FSU went to a small lineup last season ... was the Seminoles' leading scorer on its seven-game trip to Australia in August ... comes from great basketball bloodlines as two of his cousins have both logged years in the NBA ... cousin Shandon signed a free agent deal with the Houston Rockets last summer after beginning his

career with Utah ... other cousin Willie had a long NBA career with several clubs ... originally signed with South Carolina out of high school and played there for a semester before returning home after his mother passed away from a heart attack ... signed with FSU in the spring of 1998 but was denied admission to the University for fall enrollment, delaying his arrival in Tallahassee.

AS A JUNIOR 1998-99:

Had an outstanding first season as a Seminole after becoming eligible at Florida State on December 20 ... played in the final 23 games of the year and earned the starting job at power forward for the last 10 contests ... averaged 11.9 points to finish third on the team ... was also FSU's second leading rebounder, grabbing 5.1 per night ... ranked second in the ACC in field goal percentage (to Duke's Elton Brand, the No. 1 pick in the NBA Draft), hitting 60.5 percent (115-of-190) ... that figure was fifth nationally and was the 11th best season percentage in school history ... scored in double figures 18 times, including 14 of the final 15 games ... averaged 14.0 points in that span ... in his 10 starts, averaged 13.5 points, 5.7 rebounds and hit 58.7 percent from the floor (61-of-104) ... best game was a 23-point, nine-rebound effort in 27 minutes in a loss at top-ranked Duke ... hit 10-of-14 from the field in that game ... added 16 points, five rebounds and made 8-of-10 shots in the rematch with the No. 1 Blue Devils ... keyed a home win over NC State with 19 points, four rebounds and four steals ... scored 19 points and grabbed nine rebounds in the final regular season game of the year against fifth-rated Maryland ... averaged 12.4 points, 5.3 rebounds and hit 58.5 percent (79-of-135) from the field in 15 ACC games.

JUNIOR COLLEGE:

Georgia's Junior College Athletic Association Player of the Year after averaging 21.7 points and 11.7 rebounds at Metro Atlanta College in 1997-98 ... also earned National Junior College Athletic Association All-America honors ... played one season at Metro Atlanta after transferring from Pensacola Junior College ... did not play basketball at PJC.



HIGH SCHOOL:

Originally signed with South Carolina out of Berea High School in Greenville, SC ... earned all-state honors as a senior after averaging 19.7 points and 9.8 rebounds per game ... scored over 1,500 career points in three seasons ... started 81 of 87 games in his prep career ... averaged 21.0 points and 12.0 rebounds per game as a junior ... also considered Kansas, Xavier and Georgia out of high school.

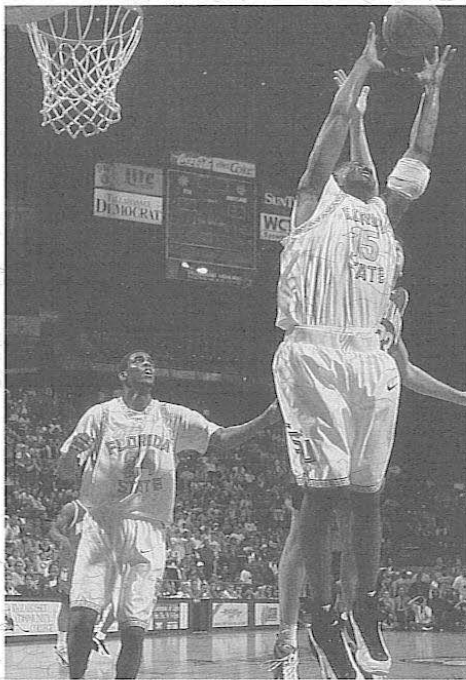
PERSONAL:

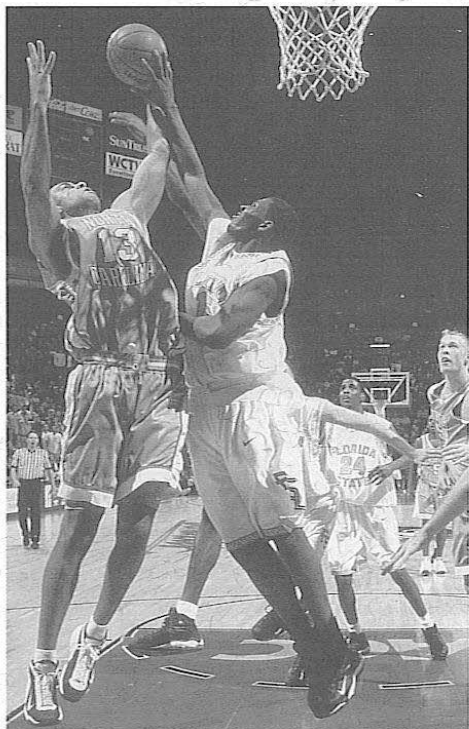


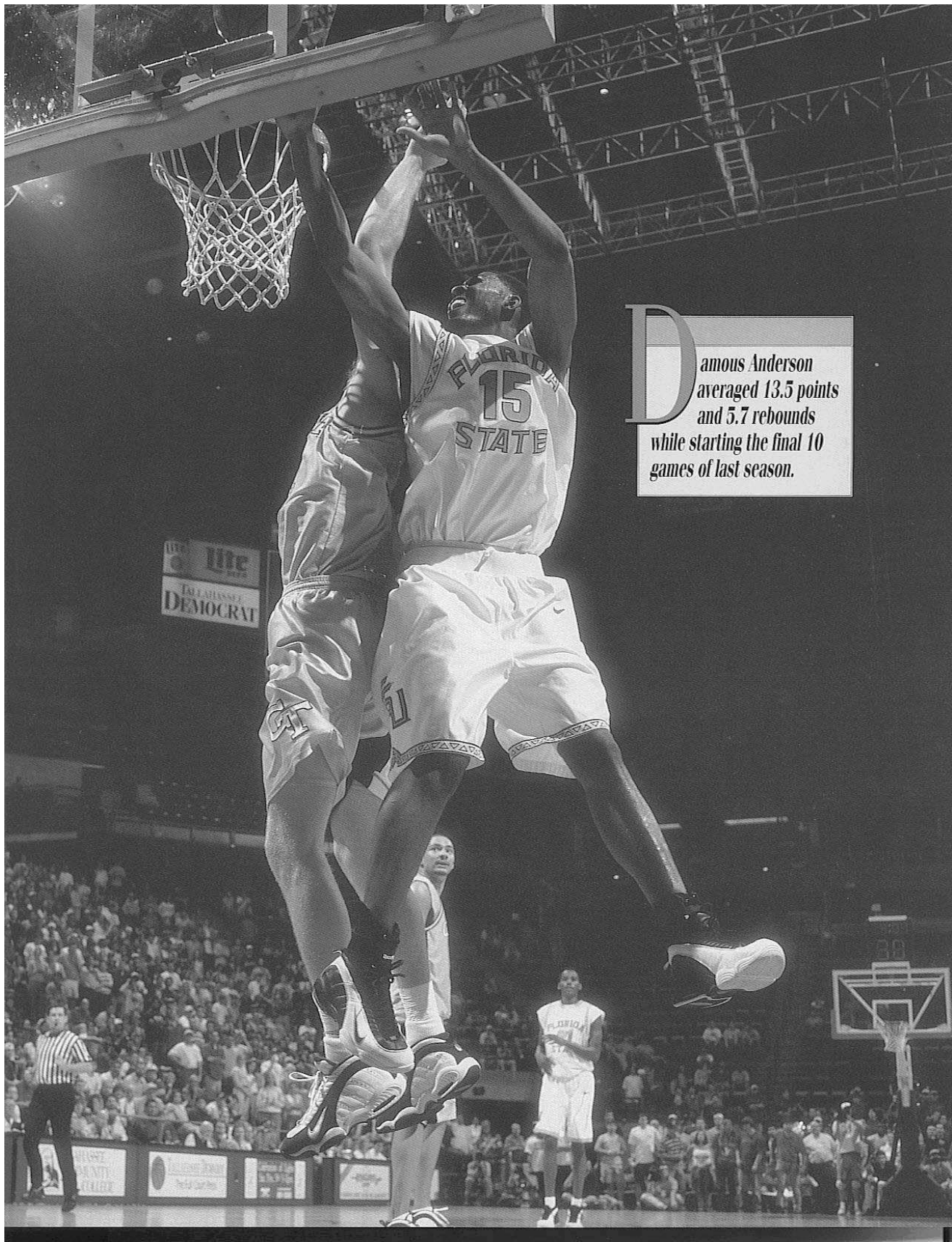

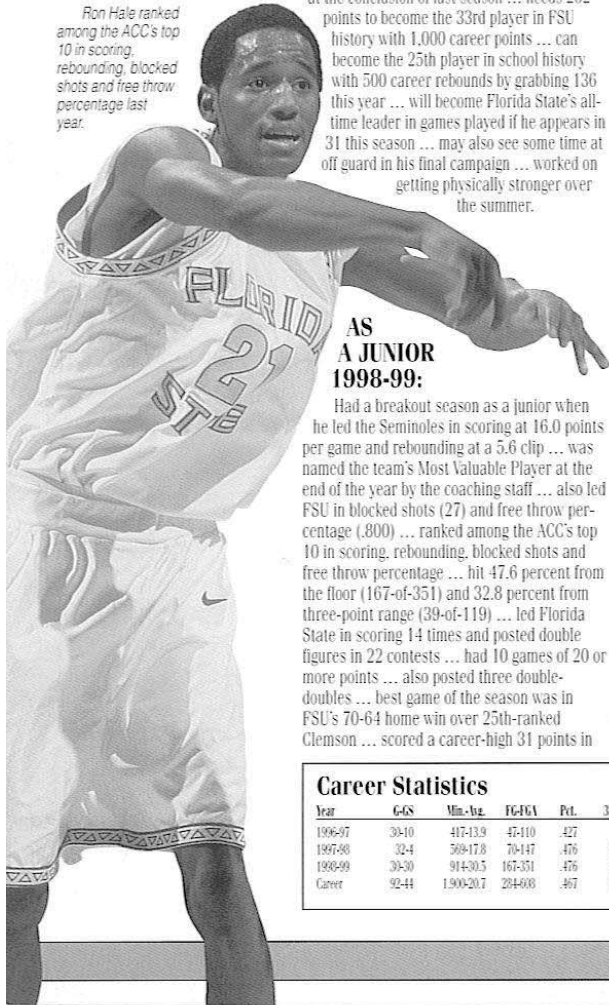

Ron Hale ranked among the ACC's top 10 in scoring, rebounding, blocked shots and free throw percentage last year.



Senior All-America candidate and returning All-Atlantic Coast Conference performer at small forward ... enjoyed a breakout junior season in 1998-99 when he led Florida State and ranked among the ACC's leaders in scoring (16.0), rebounding (5.6), blocked shots (1.0) and free throw percentage (.800) ... led the conference in scoring in ACC games only for most of the year before finishing fourth at 18.3 points per game ... named the team's MVP by the coaching staff at the conclusion of last season ... needs 202 points to become the 33rd player in FSU history with 1,000 career points ... can become the 25th player in school history with 500 career rebounds by grabbing 136 this year ... will become Florida State's all-time leader in games played if he appears in 31 this season ... may also see some time at off guard in his final campaign ... worked on getting physically stronger over the summer.

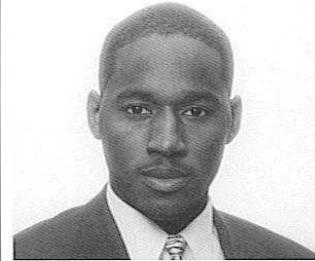
AS A JUNIOR 1998-99:

Had a breakout season as a junior when he led the Seminoles in scoring at 16.0 points per game and rebounding at a 5.6 clip ... was named the team's Most Valuable Player at the end of the year by the coaching staff ... also led FSU in blocked shots (27) and free throw percentage (.800) ... ranked among the ACC's top 10 in scoring, rebounding, blocked shots and free throw percentage ... hit 47.6 percent from the floor (167-of-351) and 32.8 percent from three-point range (39-of-119) ... led Florida State in scoring 14 times and posted double figures in 22 contests ... had 10 games of 20 or more points ... also posted three double-doubles ... best game of the season was in FSU's 70-64 home win over 25th-ranked Clemson ... scored a career-high 31 points in

that contest on 10-of-14 field goal shooting ... helped the Seminoles' win their ACC season-opener at Virginia with 19 points and seven rebounds ... also had 19 points and seven boards at Temple ... first double-double of the year and of his career came against Georgia Southern when he finished with 24 points and 10 rebounds ... added 20 points and 11 boards in his next outing at Butler ... scored 19 points, had seven caroms and rejected three shots in a win over Mississippi State at the Rainbow Classic ... sparked Florida State's win at Georgia Tech with 24 points on 10-of-18 shooting and seven rebounds in 30 minutes ... keyed FSU's home win over NC State with 25 points and 10 rebounds ... averaged 20.5 points on 13-of-24 shooting and 7.5 rebounds in two games versus Wake Forest ... scored 24 in the double overtime loss to Georgia Tech.

AS A SOPHOMORE 1997-98:

Enjoyed a solid sophomore campaign ... earned the Most Improved Player Award by FSU's coaching staff ... played in all 32 games and started four times ... used primarily as Florida State's sixth man ... averaged 5.8 points and 4.0 rebounds per game while averaging 17.8 minutes per contest ... scored in double figures seven times on the season ... hit 47.6 percent from the floor (70-of-146) ... picked up his play in the NCAA Tournament, averaging 14.5 points and 4.5 rebounds in two games ... hit 11-of-15 from the field and 3-of-5 from three-point range as well ... best game of the season came in Florida State's biggest win, a 96-87 victory over Texas Christian in the first round of the NCAA Tournament ... matched a season-high with 15 points and pulled down six rebounds in 21 minutes in that contest ... hit 5-of-7 from the floor and made 1-of-2 from three-point range while also handing out a pair of assists ... followed up with a 14-point effort in the second round against Valparaiso ... came off the bench to hit 7-of-11 from the floor and score 15 points with eight rebounds in the first round of the Preseason NIT against Loyola ... helped spark Florida State in its 84-79 win over defending national champion Arizona with 10 points and four rebounds in 17 minutes ... averaged 13.0 points and 8.9 rebounds per 40 minutes played.



AS A FRESHMAN 1996-97:

Appeared in 30 games and started 10 times during a solid rookie campaign ... established himself as a key contributor off the bench during the first third of the season ... earned a starting job at Seton Hall and made 10 straight appearances in the opening five games before moving back into a reserve role the over final 10 games ... averaged 4.3 points and 2.3 rebounds in 13.9 minutes per game ... scored in double figures three times during the year ... highlight of the season was a clutch performance in a 74-70 victory over fifth-ranked Maryland ... equaled a season-high with 17 points in that contest ... had a break-through game in a win at Jacksonville when he scored 17 points and grabbed six rebounds in 26 minutes.

HIGH SCHOOL:

Regarded as one of the top 60 players in the nation after his senior season at Largo High School ... averaged 23.1 points, 12.5 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 2.3 blocks per game ... first team Class 5A all-state selection ... named MVP of the Coca-Cola All-America game after scoring 18 points and grabbing 12 rebounds ... averaged 16.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game as a junior.

Chose Florida State over Kentucky, Alabama, Missouri and Tennessee ... celebrates a November 5, 1977 birthdate ... majoring in criminology.
