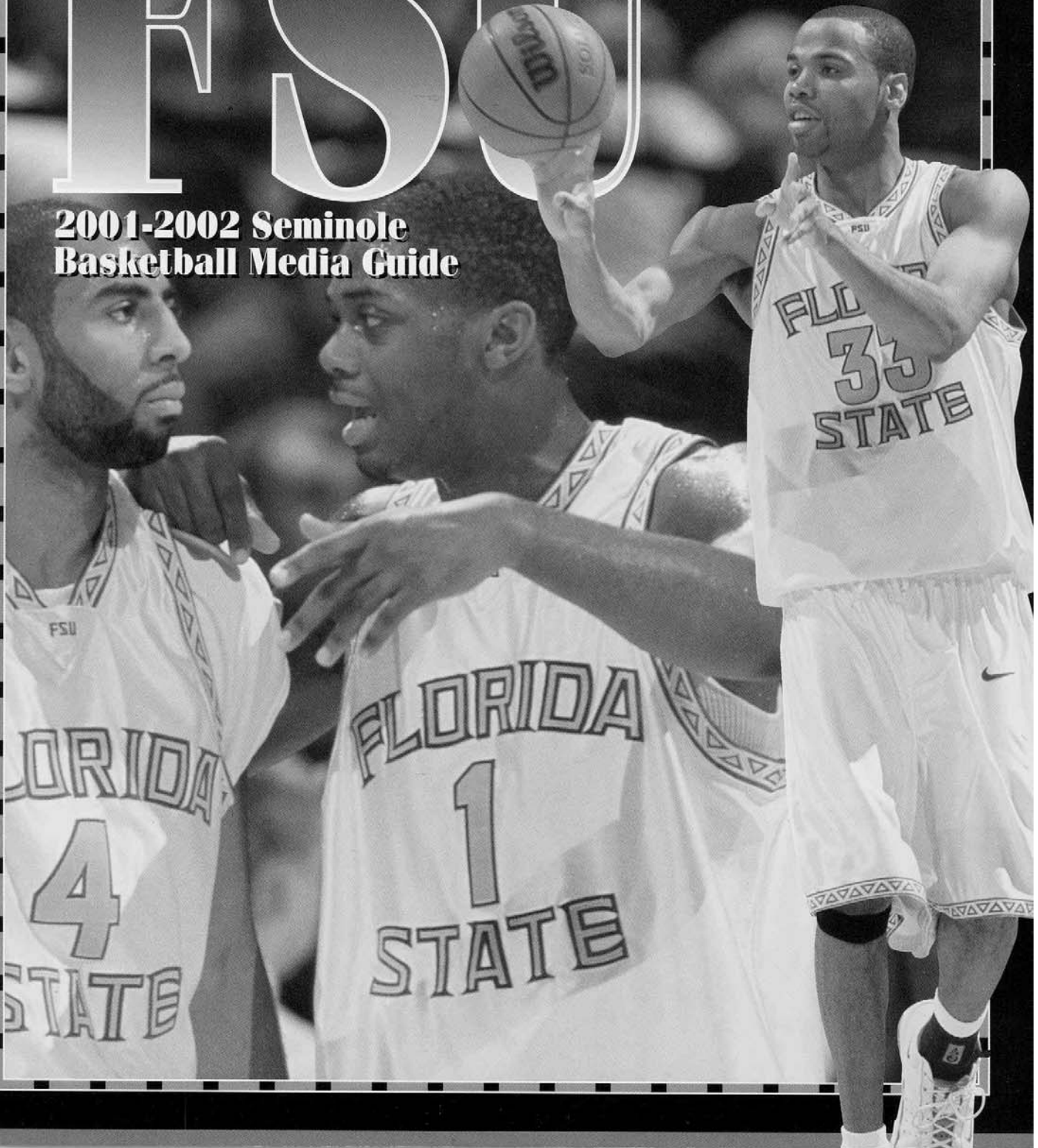
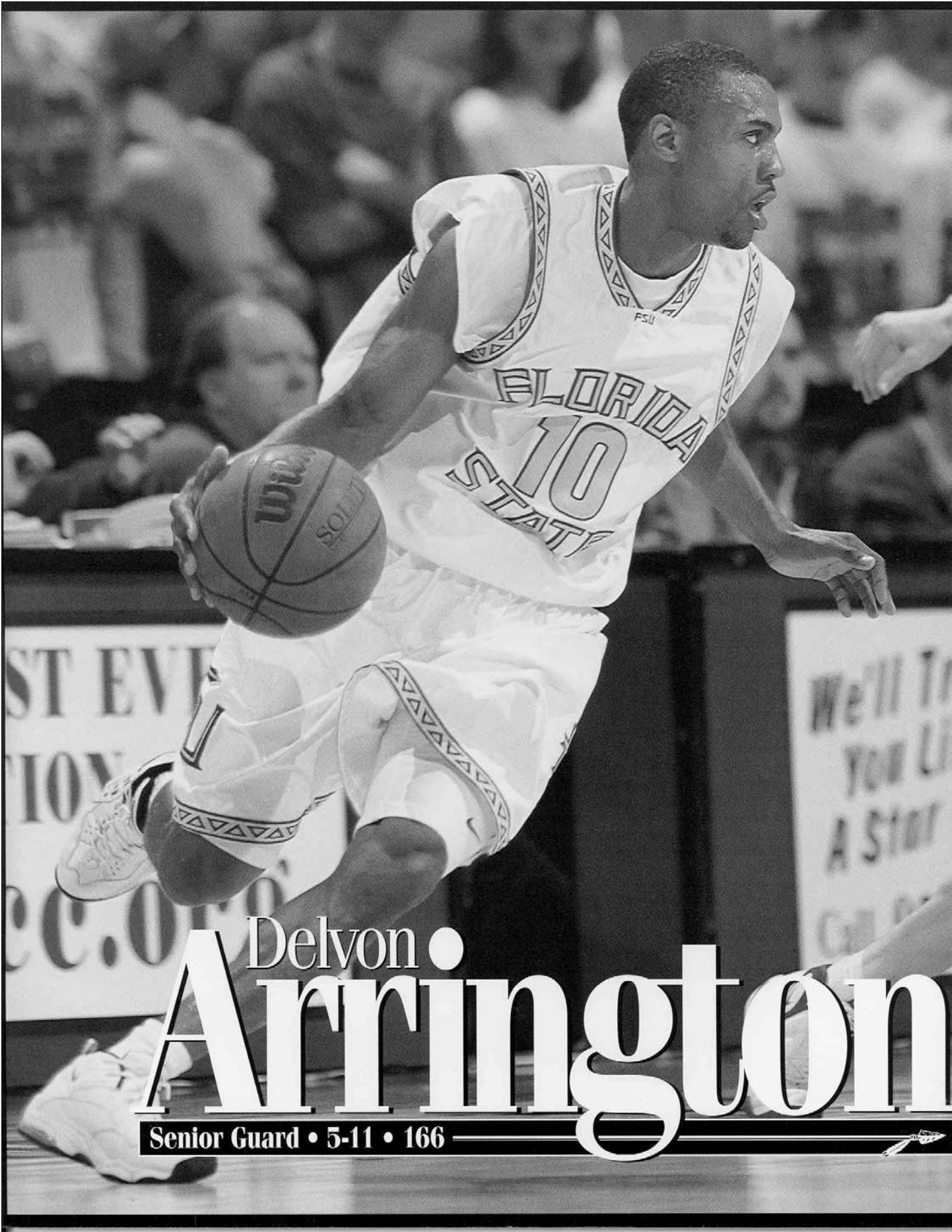

Ranks third on Florida State's all-time assist list with 506 and needs only 97 from the beginning of the season to become the all-time Seminole career leader ... enters his final collegiate season as the ACC's active career leader with 506 assists ... his 506 assists ranks him third in the nation among all players returning for the 2001-02 season ... he trails only Markus Carr of Cal State Northridge (619) and Southern California's Brandon Granville (595) as the nation's active assist leaders entering the 2001-02 season ... has worked himself into the position of being one of Florida State's most prolific assist men in school history and has established himself as one of the Atlantic Coast Conferences' most effective playmakers ... displayed his abilities as a reliable scorer with a career-high 11.5 points per game average during the 2001 season ... needs only 32 assists to tie Brian Oliver of Georgia Tech (1987-90) for 25th place on the ACC's all-time

assist list ... enters the 2002 season ranked 14th all-time in the ACC with a 5.69 assists per game mark ... enters his final season ranked 18th in league history (and third among active ACC players) with a 1.84 steals per game average (164 steals in 89 career games) ... looking to become the first player in school history to lead the Seminoles in assists during four consecutive years ... should he lead Florida State in assists again he will become only the second player in school history to lead the basketball team in one category during each of his four varsity seasons ... he would be joined by only Rodney Dobarb who led the Seminoles in blocked shots from 1990-93 ... enters the 2001-02 season needing 45 assists to pass Tony Jackson (1977-80) and move into second place with 551 assists and needs 97 to pass Otto

Petty (1971-73) to become Florida State's all-time assist king ... enters his final season as the only player in the ACC to rank in the top five in assists in the conference rankings in each of the last three seasons ... enters his senior season with eight double figure assist games ... is ranked sixth in school history with 159 career steals entering his senior season ... needs only 78 steals to move passed Charlie Ward and become the school's all-time chief thief ... moved ahead of 2001 NBA playoff hero,

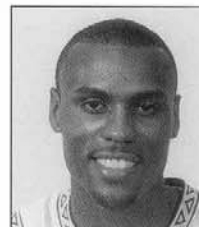
Sam Cassell, on Florida State's all-time steals list during the 2001 season ... the eighth player in school history to lead the Seminoles in scoring, assists and steals in a single season.

AS A SENIOR (2001):

Averaged 11.5 points (first on the team), 4.1 rebounds (fourth on the team), 4.8 assists (first on the team), 1.9 steals (first on the team), 32.7 minutes (first on the team) ... ranked fourth in the ACC in assists, eighth in steals and 27th in scoring ... one of only three players in the ACC to rank in the top eight in steals and assists per game and was joined by only Jason Williams and Chris Duhon of Duke ... led Florida State in assists with 143 (4.8 assists per game) ... season-high of eight assists in the monumental victory over Maryland (Feb. 14) ... 20 games of five or more assists ... seven or more assists in five different ACC

games including both regular season victories over Clemson and the big win at Maryland ... team-leader with 56 steals to rank in the top 10 in the ACC in steals for the third consecutive season ... 35 steals in 16 ACC games for a 2.2 steals per game average to rank third among all conference players ... career-high six steals at Georgia Tech (Jan. 27) ... ranked second on the team with a career-high 77 free throws made and ranked second on the team with a career-high 106 free throws attempted ... his .726 free throw percentage was also a career-high ... a career-high eight free throws made in a career-high 10 free throws attempted against Ohio State in the first round of the Great Alaska Shootout ... made seven-of-eight shots from the line in the second half against the Buckeyes

... was 16-of-20 (.800) from the free throw line during the three games of the Great Alaska Shootout ... ranked second on the team with a career-high 33 3-point field goals made and ranked second on the team with a career-high 102 3-point field goal attempts ... 11 games of multiple 3-point shots made including a career-high tying three against Clemson and Virginia at home ... scored 20 or more points a career-high three times during the season ... first career game of 20 or more points came against Virginia (Jan. 16) with 23 points standing as his career-high ... added 22 points against NC State (Jan. 25) and 20 against Virginia (Feb. 17)

... scored in double figures a career-high 20 times (including 13 ACC games) ... his 20 double figure scoring games led the Seminoles as did his three games of 20 points or more scoring ... was at his near-best in leading Florida State to one of the biggest wins in the history of the program as the Seminoles defeated No. 14 and Final Four participant Maryland in Cole Field House ... led Florida State in scoring (17 points), rebounding (nine) and assists (eight) as the Seminoles won, 74-71 ... in scoring 17 points, he shot six-of-eight (.750 percent) from the field and four-of-six (.667 percent) from the free throw line ...

it was Arrington's fastbreak lay-up that put Florida State up 4-3 with 17:22 remaining ... the Seminoles led the entire remainder of the game in taking

the monumental victory back to Tallahassee ... scored seven consecutive points on a pair of fastbreak lay-ups and a 3-point shot in the span of 1:06 early in the game gave the Seminoles a 9-3 lead with 16:16 remaining ... added six points to secure the victory in the second half ... eight assists against two turnovers and three steals in a team-high 34 minutes played ... grabbed the final rebound of the game after Drew Nicholas missed a 3-point shot at the buzzer to secure the victory ... strong night against NC State (Jan. 25) with 22 points, three rebounds, three assists and three

steals in 40 minutes in an overtime game against the Wolfpack ... scored his career-high of 23 points against Virginia as he made a career-high nine field goals ... was nearly perfect shooting the ball as he was nine-of-11 (.818 percent) from the field, a perfect two-of-two (1.000) from the 3-point arc and a perfect three-of-three (1.000 percent) from the free throw line ... 20 points for a third time in a near-victory over Virginia (Feb. 17) at home ... was nearly perfect from the field (eight-of-11, .727) and was perfect from the 3-point line (three-of-three, 1.000) and from the free throw line (one-of-one,

1,000) ... 16 points in a career-high 43 minutes as Florida State defeated Clemson (Jan. 31), 88-84, in overtime ... ranked fourth on the team with a 4.1 rebounds per game average (123 total rebounds) and was the only Seminole guard with over 100 rebounds on the season ... career-high tying nine rebounds in the victory over Maryland ... established his career-high with nine defensive rebounds as the Seminoles defeated the Final Four-bound Terps ... also tied his career-high for total rebounds (nine) and defensive rebounds (nine) in the senior night victory over Georgia Tech (Feb. 28).

AS A JUNIOR (2000):

Averaged 8.9 points (third on the team), 4.2 rebounds (fourth on the team), 6.3 assists (first on the team) and 1.5 steals (first on the team) while starting all 29 games ... was the only Seminole to start all 29 games and one of only five to play in all 29 ... ranked third in the ACC with a career-high 6.3 assists per game average and a career-high 182 assists ... also ranked among the ACC leaders (10th) in steals per game (1.5) and in total

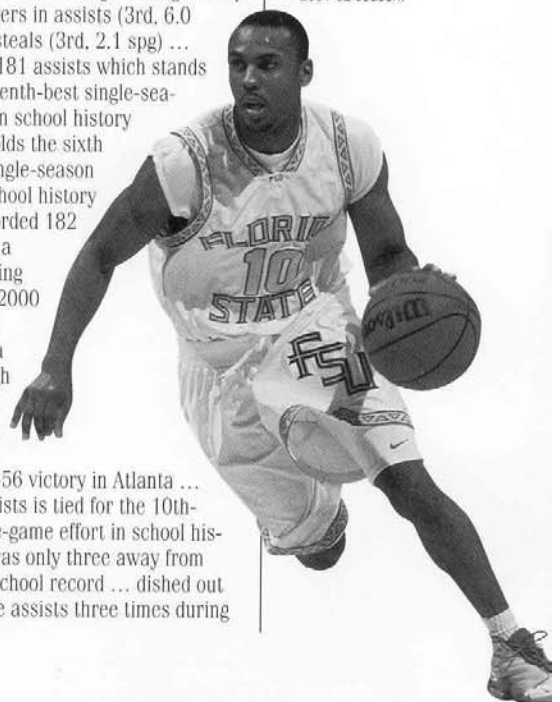
steals (44) ... his 182 assists ranks as the sixth-highest single-season total in school history while his 6.3 assists per game average ranks as the fifth-best in school history ... enjoyed a career-high five games of double-digit assists including a season-high 12 against Northwestern (Dec. 1) during the ACC/Big 10 Challenge ... among the ACC leaders with a 1.48:1 assist to turnover ratio ... enjoyed one of the top games of his career with a 10 assist, zero turnover performance against North Carolina (Feb. 23) ... his performance against North Carolina came on the heels of a 10 assist, two turnover performance against Georgia Tech (Feb. 21) ... his back-to-back double figure assist totals marked a career first ... recorded his third double figure assist outing two games later at Maryland (March 1) to bring his total to 37 assists and only nine turnovers (4.1:1 assist: turnover ratio) during the four-game stretch (Feb. 21-March 1) ... recorded multiple steals 12 times and swiped four against Norfolk State (Nov. 23) ... among the ACC leaders in double/doubles with three ... ranked

third among ACC guards with points/assist double/doubles ranking behind only Jason Williams of Duke and Ed Cota of North Carolina ... double/doubles of points and assists came against Northwestern (12/12, Dec. 1), at Georgia Tech (10/10, Jan. 19) and at Maryland (10/10, March 1) ... scored in double-figures a season-high tying 10 times ... recorded a near double/double of 16 points and eight assists in the Seminoles' victory over Vanderbilt (Dec. 22) ... shot six-of-nine from the floor against the Commodores ... another strong outing of 14 points and eight assists against Seton Hall (Dec. 11) ... helped Florida State to a victory over No. 21 North Carolina (Jan. 22) with 12 points, eight assists and five steals as the Seminoles won in the Dean Dome ... averaged nine assists and three steals in two games against North Carolina.

AS A SOPHOMORE (1999):

Averaged 8.1 points (sixth on the team), 2.8 rebounds (tied for sixth on the team) and 2.1 steals (second on the team) while in all 30 games ... the Seminoles' starting point guard who ranked third in the ACC and 17th nationally in assists with a 6.0 assists per game average ... the only player in the ACC to rank among the league's top three players in assists (3rd, 6.0 apg) and steals (3rd, 2.1 spg) ... recorded 181 assists which stands as the seventh-best single-season total in school history ... also holds the sixth highest single-season total in school history as he recorded 182 assists as a junior during the 1999-2000 season ... recorded a career-high 13 assists at Georgia Tech (Jan. 9) in a 75-56 victory in Atlanta ... his 13 assists is tied for the 10th-best single-game effort in school history and was only three away from tying the school record ... dished out 10 or more assists three times during

his first year running the point for the Seminoles ... displayed his outstanding ability and potential for future all-star honors with a 10-assist performance at Jacksonville (Dec. 17) in only the seventh game of his collegiate career ... back-to-back outstanding games handling the basketball during the second month of the season with his 10-assist/four turnover performance against Jacksonville and a seven assist/one turnover performance three days later against Georgia Southern (Jan. 20) ... garnered a career-high 64 steals, a total which ranks as the 12th-highest single-season total in school history ... recorded at least one steal in 14 of the Seminoles 16 conference games with an ACC season-high tying five coming against Virginia (Feb. 2) and at North Carolina (Feb. 7) ... displayed his scoring ability in his first career game with 14 points against Sam Houston State (Nov. 13) ... also added four steals against Sam Houston ... was perfect from the field (five-of-five) against Auburn (Dec. 6) in scoring 14 points against the Tigers who earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament's Southeast Regional ... recorded 10 double-figure scoring outings as a sophomore, a feat which he equaled as a junior ... career-best scoring spree of double figures came in four consecutive games (49 total points, 12.3 ppg) during the month of February ... scored 13 points (and added 10 assists) against South Florida (Feb. 2), 14 points (and five steals) at North Carolina (Feb. 7), 12 points (and six assists) against Georgia Tech (Feb. 11) and 10 points (to go along with eight assists) at Clemson (Feb. 14) ... shot 65.6 percent (21-of-32) from the field and 2.8 percent (three-of-seven) from the 3-point arc during his hot streak ... recorded his first career double/double of 13 points and 10 assists against South Florida on Feb. 2, 1999 ... helped lead the Seminoles to a 2-1 record at the Rainbow Classic with

victories coming over Mississippi State (Dec. 29) and Murray State (Dec. 30) ... totaled 20 assists (6.7 apg) and only six turnovers (2.0 topg) while shooting 90 percent (nine-of-10) from the free throw line during the tournament ... also amassed seven steals (including five against Murray State) during the three-game visit to the Island State.

AS A FRESHMAN (1999):

Was a member of Florida State's NCAA Tournament team that advanced to the second round of the tournament ... sat out the season in accordance with NCAA regulations ... practiced with the team and was able to learn the Florida State system and acclimate himself to college life ... was a wonderful addition to the team on the practice court and in the locker room.

HIGH SCHOOL:

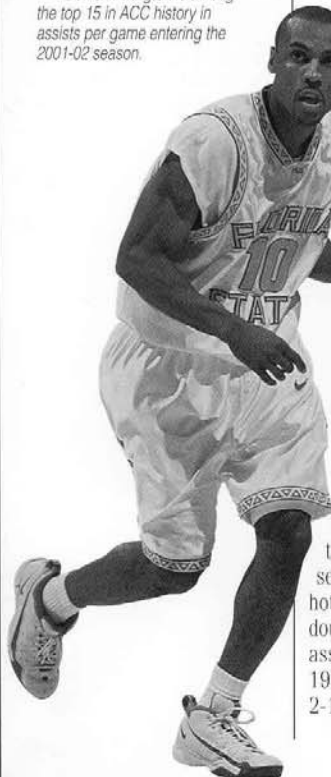
Graduated from the nationally renowned St. Anthony's high school in Jersey City, N.J. in 1997 ... earned three varsity letters as the team's starting point guard all three seasons ... guided the team to a 28-1 record and a No. 7 national ranking by USA

Today as a senior ... averaged a career-high 14.3 points, 6.4 assists and 3.3 steals in earning all-state first-team honors as a senior ... led St. Anthony's to an 81-1 record and to three state titles during his three years as a starter ... St. Anthony's won three all-group Tournament of Champions crowns during his career ... named MVP of the state tournament his senior season ... starter on the team that earned the USA Today national championship as a junior ... team captain as a junior and senior ... a consensus top-20 point guard and a top-100 national prospect as a member of the class of 1997 ... scored 13 points and added five assists in the Coca-Cola All-America game in Indianapolis ... earned honor roll status as a junior and was a member of the National Honor Society.
