At the top of the list of blossoming big men in the Atlantic Coast Conference ... ranked tied for 10th in the ACC in blocked shots per game (0.9 bpg) and second on the Seminoles behind Mike Mathews in the blocked shots category ... shot an outstanding .548 from the field but did not qualify to place among the team, ACC or NCAA leaders because of not enough attempts ...

signed with Florida State on the final day of the May, 2001 signing period ... is comfortable playing with his back to the basket on the blocks and has a nice shooting touch for his size ... is also very active near the basket and continues to develop into a strong shot blocker ... one of the top junior college players entering the Division I ranks this season in the nation according to PrepStars ... a member of the junior national team of the Bahamas and has been since his prep playing days.

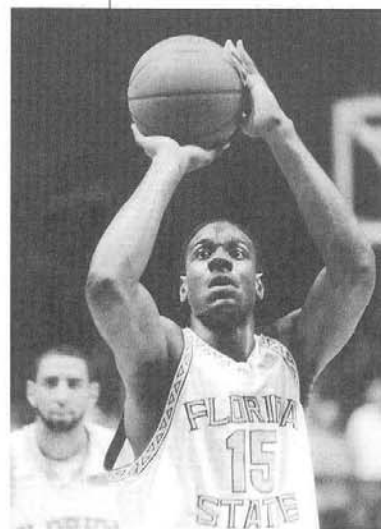
AS A JUNIOR (2002): Averaged 4.2 points (seventh on the team), 3.1 rebounds (seventh), 0.9 blocks (second) and 12.6 minutes while playing in 28 games ... ranked tied for 10th in the ACC in blocked shots and is the seventh leading returner in that category for the upcoming season ... earned three starting assignments and was on the court to begin conference games against Wake Forest (Feb. 2) and NC State (Feb. 10) and at Duke (Feb. 7) ... averaged 5.6 points, 4.0 rebounds and 1.0 blocked shots in three games as a starter ... enjoyed an outstanding season from the field as he finished with a .548 shooting percentage ... fell just short of qualifying for the ACC and NCAA statistics with a 3.0 field goals made-per-game average ... an average of 5.0 field goals made-per-game is the minimum to qualify for the conference and national leader boards ... improved his free throw shooting as the season went on to close the year with a .531 percentage from the line ... in his final six games he shot .818 (nine-of-11) from the line after making 17 of his first 40 shots (.425) to realize an improvement during the span of nearly 40.0 percent and upped his overall percentage by more than 11 percentage points ... made a career-high five free throws in a career-high five attempts against Maryland in the ACC Tournament (March 8) and three in games against Florida (Nov. 16), at Maryland (Jan. 26) and in the Seminoles' win over No. 15 Virginia (Feb. 20) ... ranked second on the team with 26 blocked shots (0.9 bpg) including a career-high three at Georgia Tech (Jan. 30) ... blocked at least one shot in 20 of his 28 appearances for the Seminoles during his first season at the Division I level ... led or was tied for the team lead in blocked shots in 11 of Florida State's 29 games ... scored his career-high of 10 points against Western Carolina (Dec. 8) ... made his career high of five field goals in six attempts against the Catamounts ... six points and three rebounds in Florida State's victory over Campbell (Dec. 29) and six points and two rebounds as the Seminoles

defeated NCAA Tournament participant South Florida (Jan. 2) ... **(vs. Clemson)** averaged 7.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.0 blocked shots in three games against Clemson ... scored seven points, grabbed nine rebounds and blocked one shot as Florida State defeated Clemson in the first round of the ACC Tournament (March 7) ... was a perfect three-of-three from the field and grabbed a career-high nine rebounds as the Seminoles won in overtime ... tied his career-high with three offensive rebounds and established his career high with six defensive rebounds in the victory ... played 11 minutes, scored five points and grabbed six rebounds in the second half ... scored a lay-up with 2:26 remaining in the second half to bring the Seminoles to within one at 64-63 ... second half lay-up (as part of six points and six rebounds) against the Tigers (Jan. 24) put the Seminoles up by four and allowed Florida State to pull away at home for the victory ... eight points on the road against Clemson (Feb. 23) ... **(vs. Duke)** averaged 6.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 1.0 blocked shots in two games against ACC Champion and ACC Tournament participant Duke ... scored four points and grabbed two rebounds in seven minutes as Florida State defeated No. 1 ranked and previously undefeated Duke in Tallahassee (Jan. 6) ... scored all four of his points in the first half as the Seminoles sprinted to a 32-28 halftime advantage after leading by as many as 10 ... slammed home a dunk with 10:13 remaining in the first half to give the Seminoles a 14-8 lead and a lay-up with 8:56 remaining in the half put the Seminoles up 16-13 ... a starter against Duke on the road (Feb. 7) with eight points and six rebounds in a career-high 21 minutes ... **(vs. Georgia Tech)** averaged 5.5 points and 4.5 rebounds in two games against Georgia Tech ... shot .625 (five-of-eight) from the field in two games against the Yellow Jackets ... scored seven points and added seven rebounds as Florida State traveled to Georgia Tech (Jan. 30) ... his seven rebounds marked his regular season high and he played a near season-high 20 minutes in the game ... career-high of three blocked shots came on the road against the Yellow Jackets ... scored four points, added two rebounds and a career-high two steals as the Seminoles hosted the Yellow Jackets in Tallahassee (March 2) ... **(vs. Maryland)** averaged 4.0 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.3 blocked shots in three games against National Champion Maryland ... scored seven points, grabbed three rebounds and blocked one shot against Maryland in the quarterfinal round of the ACC Tournament (March 8) ... was perfect from the free throw line as he made a career-high five free throws in a career-high five attempts ... his perfect free throw line performance against the Terps brought his shooting percentage for the year from .477 to a season ending .531 ... scored five points, grabbed five rebounds and blocked two shots as Florida State traveled to Maryland (Jan. 26) ... **(vs. North Carolina)** averaged 4.5 points and 2.5 rebounds in two games

against North Carolina ... played well with his ACC career-high of nine points against the Tar Heels as the Seminoles won in Tallahassee (Jan. 16) ... four first half points in a span of 44 seconds in helping Florida State jump to a 30-13 lead with 8:06 remaining in the first half ... consecutive baskets (four points) in a 37 second span gave Florida State a 65-60 lead with 4:55 remaining in the game to push a one-point Seminole lead to a five point Seminole lead ... Florida State maintained that lead and won the game to defeat North Carolina at home for only the third time in school history ... victory over the Tar Heels allowed the Seminoles to defeat both Duke and North Carolina in the same season for the first time ever ... played eight minutes for the Seminoles in his first trip to Chapel Hill (Feb. 17) ... **(vs. NC State)** averaged 2.0 points and 1.5 rebounds in two games against ACC Tournament finalist and NCAA Tournament participant NC State ... scored four points and added three rebounds against the Wolfpack in Tallahassee (Feb. 10) ... all four points came in the first half in his third of three consecutive starting assignments ... **(vs. Virginia)** averaged 3.5 points and 2.0 rebounds in two games against Virginia, who was ranked as high as No. 4 in the nation during the season ... scored three points, grabbed one rebound and blocked one shot as the Seminoles defeated the No. 15 Cavaliers at home (Feb. 20) ... all three of his points came from the free throw line and all were significant ... two free throws in the first half gave the Seminoles an 18-13 lead with 12:13 remaining and his third tied the game at 48 with 8:30 remaining ... **(vs. Wake Forest)** averaged 2.5 points, 2.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocked shots in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Wake Forest ... first career ACC game against Wake Forest (Dec. 16) resulted in two rebounds and a near-career-high two blocked shots in only six minutes of playing time ... five points and three rebounds in 16 minutes as Wake Forest visited Tallahassee (Feb. 2).

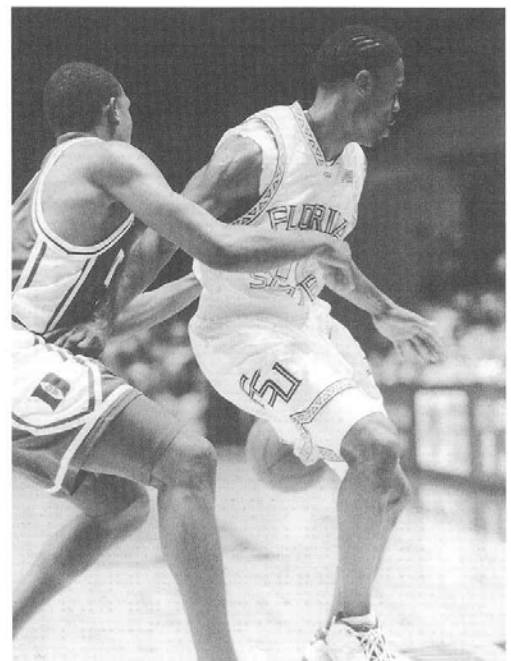
AT MARSHALLTOWN C.C.: Averaged 13.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.0 blocked shots (first on the team) and shot .571 from the field (first on the team) during his second season at Marshalltown ... helped

lead Marshalltown to a 15-15 record in the extremely tough Iowa Community College Athletic Association ... ranked fifth in the conference in scoring, fourth among the conference leaders in rebounds and tied for fifth in field goal percentage shooting during the 2000-01 season.

AT FREEPORT CATHOLIC: Graduated from Freeport Catholic High School in 1999 ... led Freeport Catholic to the Championship of the Hugh Campbell Tournament during his senior season.

PERSONAL: Born Sept. 25, 1980 ... Trevor is the son of Elizabeth Missick ... full name is Trevor Livingston Harvey.

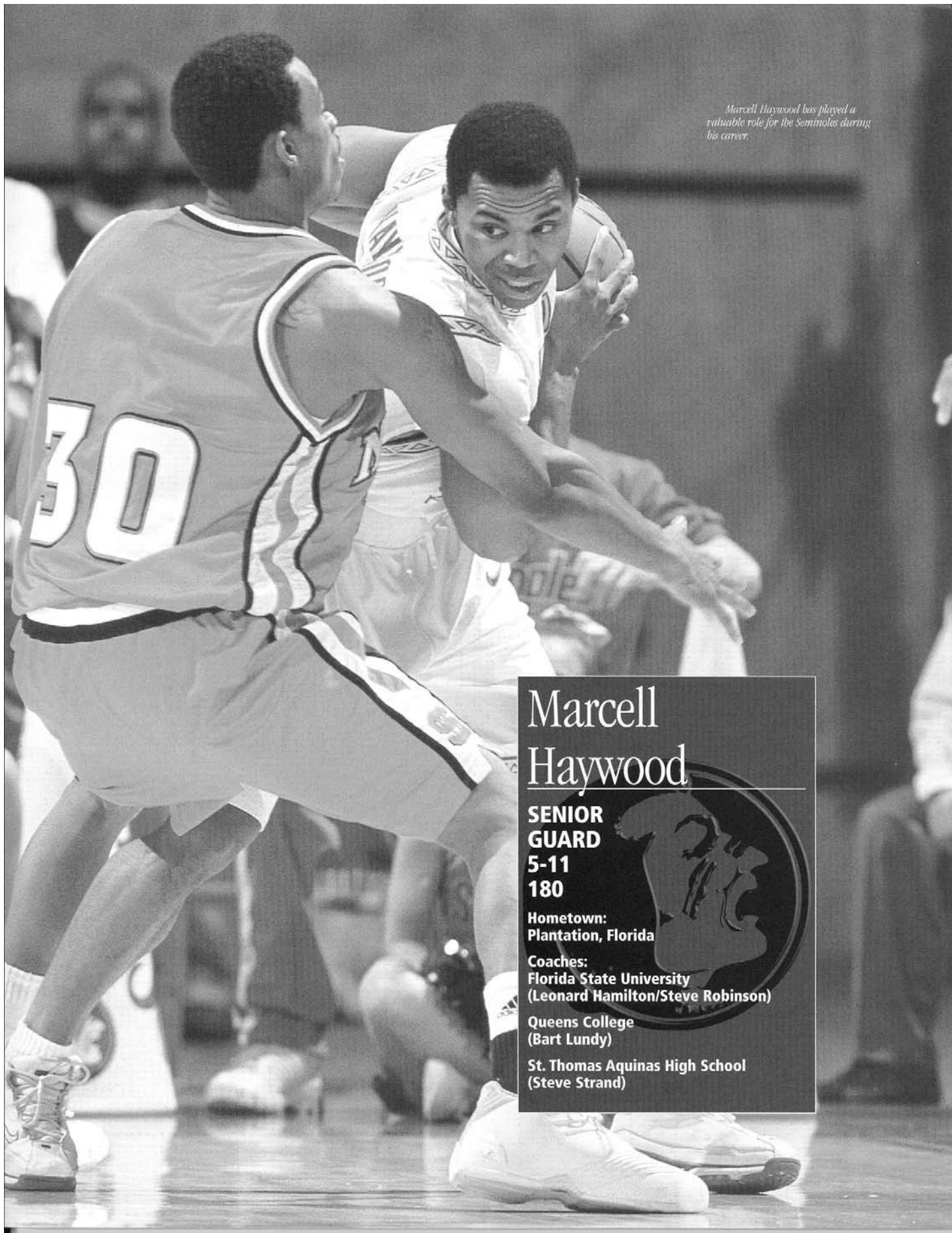

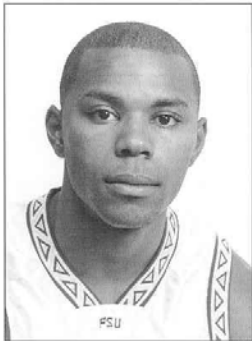

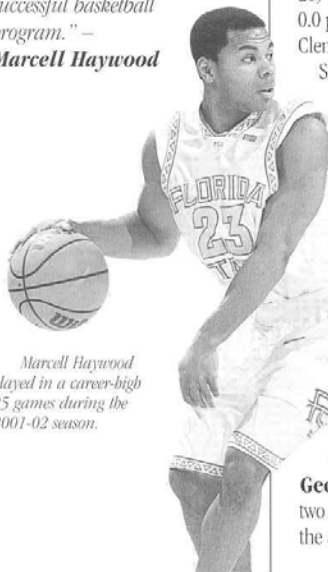

Marcell Haywood

A walk-on member of the Seminoles who will play as a senior during the 2002-03 season ... earned his undergraduate degree in information systems in April of 2002 ... played in a career-high 25 games (including the final 20 of the season) as Florida State's primary back-up point guard during the 2001-02 season ... averaged a career-high 5.4 minutes as he played in every game from Dec. 27 through both of Florida State's games in the ACC Tournament ... is in his fourth season as a member of the team after transferring from Queens College in Charlotte, N.C. ... has played in 34 career games during his two years of eligibility as a Seminole ... was a redshirt member of the Seminoles during the 1999-2000 season but could not play due to NCAA transfer regulations ... will battle for playing time in the Seminole backcourt this season.

AS A SENIOR (2002): Averaged 0.1 points, 0.4 rebounds, 0.5 assists and 0.4 steals in 25 games as the primary back-up point guard to All-ACC honorable mention selection Delvon Arrington ... played in a career-high 25 games, a career-high 136 minutes, made a career-high three free throws, attempted a career-high five free throws, grabbed a career-high 10 defensive rebounds, grabbed a career-high 10 overall rebounds, dished out a career-high 13 assists, was credited with a career-high 10 steals, averaged a career-high 5.4 minutes played per game ... career-high tying two assists came in victories over Savannah State (Nov. 20) and North Carolina (Jan. 16) ... **(vs. Clemson)** averaged 0.0 points, 0.7 rebounds and 0.3 assists in three games against Clemson ... played ten minutes in the three games as the Seminoles defeated the Tigers two out of three times including in the first round of the ACC Tournament ... **(vs. Duke)** averaged 0.0 points, 0.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals in two games against ACC Tournament Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Duke ... earned his career-high of three steals in only four minutes of play as Florida State defeated No. 1 and previously undefeated Duke, 77-76, in Tallahassee (Jan. 6) ... all three steals came in the first half and helped the Seminoles take as much as an 11-point first half lead and a 32-28 lead at halftime ... his second steal (off a Dahntay Jones turnover) led directly to an Anthony Richardson 3-point shot and a 27-17 Seminole lead ... his third steal (off a Jason Williams turnover) came with three seconds remaining in the half and allowed Florida State to preserve its halftime lead ... **(vs. Georgia Tech)** averaged 0.0 points, 0.5 steals and 0.5 assists in two games against Georgia Tech ... one steal and one assist as the Seminoles traveled to play in Atlanta against the Yellow

Jackets (Jan. 30) ... earned two minutes of playing time as Florida State played host to Georgia Tech on Senior Night in Tallahassee (March 2) ... **(vs. Maryland)** averaged 0.0 points, 0.3 rebounds and 0.3 steals in three games against National Champion Maryland ... grabbed one rebound in two minutes of play as Florida State traveled to play in Cole Field House (Jan. 26) ... tied his ACC career-high with 13 minutes played and credited with one assist as Florida State played host to Maryland (Feb. 27) ... **(vs. North Carolina)** averaged 0.0 points and 1.5 assists in two games against North Carolina ... contributed two assists as Florida State defeated North Carolina at home (Jan. 16) for only the third time in school history ... his two assists came within a 39 second span and helped the Seminoles to an early 23-7 lead ... both assists came on back-to-back 3-pointers by Seminole co-captain Antwuan Dixon ... one assist in six minutes as the Seminoles traveled to play at North Carolina (Feb. 17) ... **(vs. NC State)** averaged 0.0 points and 1.0 rebounds in two games against ACC Tournament finalist and NCAA Tournament participant NC State ... one rebound in eight minutes as Florida State traveled to Raleigh (Jan. 8) and one assist in a career-high tying 13 minutes as the Seminoles hosted the Wolfpack in Tallahassee (Feb. 10) ... **(vs. Virginia)** averaged 0.0 points, 0.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists in two games against NIT participant Virginia ... added one assist in four minutes of play as the Seminoles defeated No. 15 ranked Virginia in Tallahassee (Feb. 20) ... his assist came on a Mike Mathews jumper which gave the Seminoles a 24-23 lead with 7:10 remaining in the first half ... **(vs. Wake Forest)** averaged 0.0 points and 0.0 assists in four minutes played in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Wake Forest.

AS A JUNIOR (2001): Averaged 0.6 points and 0.6 rebounds in nine games during his first year of eligibility at Florida State ... developed into the primary back-up point guard to Delvon Arrington during the final six games of the season ... played in all six of the Seminoles' final six games and averaged 6.3 minutes played per game ... earned his way into the lineup with his improved play in practice and played extensively from Florida State's near-victory at home against Virginia (Feb. 17) through the Seminoles' game against Clemson (March 8) in the first round of the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament ... averaged 6.3 minutes played per game in his final six games as compared to 1.7 minutes per game during his first three appearances ... made his first career free throw in his first career game at Florida State against South Florida (Dec. 7) ... **(vs. Clemson)** averaged 1.0 points, 1.5 assists and 1.0 steals in two games against Clemson ... played a season-high 12 minutes and scored a career-high two points against Clemson in the ACC Tournament (March 8) ... career-high in playing time came as starting point guard Delvon Arrington was saddled with three fouls within the first five minutes of the game ... also played 10 minutes in the regular season finale at Clemson (March 3) as he tied his career-

One of Florida State's top outside shooters and one of the biggest secrets in the Atlantic Coast Conference who returns to the Seminole lineup after missing almost the entire 2001-02 season with a knee injury ... suffered a sprained MCL in his right knee against Florida in the season opener after having played only seven minutes ... worked extremely hard to get back into the lineup but decided on a medical redshirt which was granted after petitioning the NCAA ... led Florida State in free throw shooting percentage with a .808 (42-52) percentage during his inaugural collegiate season (2000-01) ... became the first freshman in school history to lead the Seminoles in free throw shooting ... a regular in the Seminoles' rotation from the first day of the season as he played 14 minutes in his first collegiate game against Florida ... the Seminoles' version of a utility player ... at times during the season, he will be asked to play the power forward position, at times he will be asked to play perimeter defense and at times he will be Florida State's designated 3-point shooter ... often compared to former Seminole standout and all-time leading scorer Bob Sura because of his ability to drive as well as shoot.
