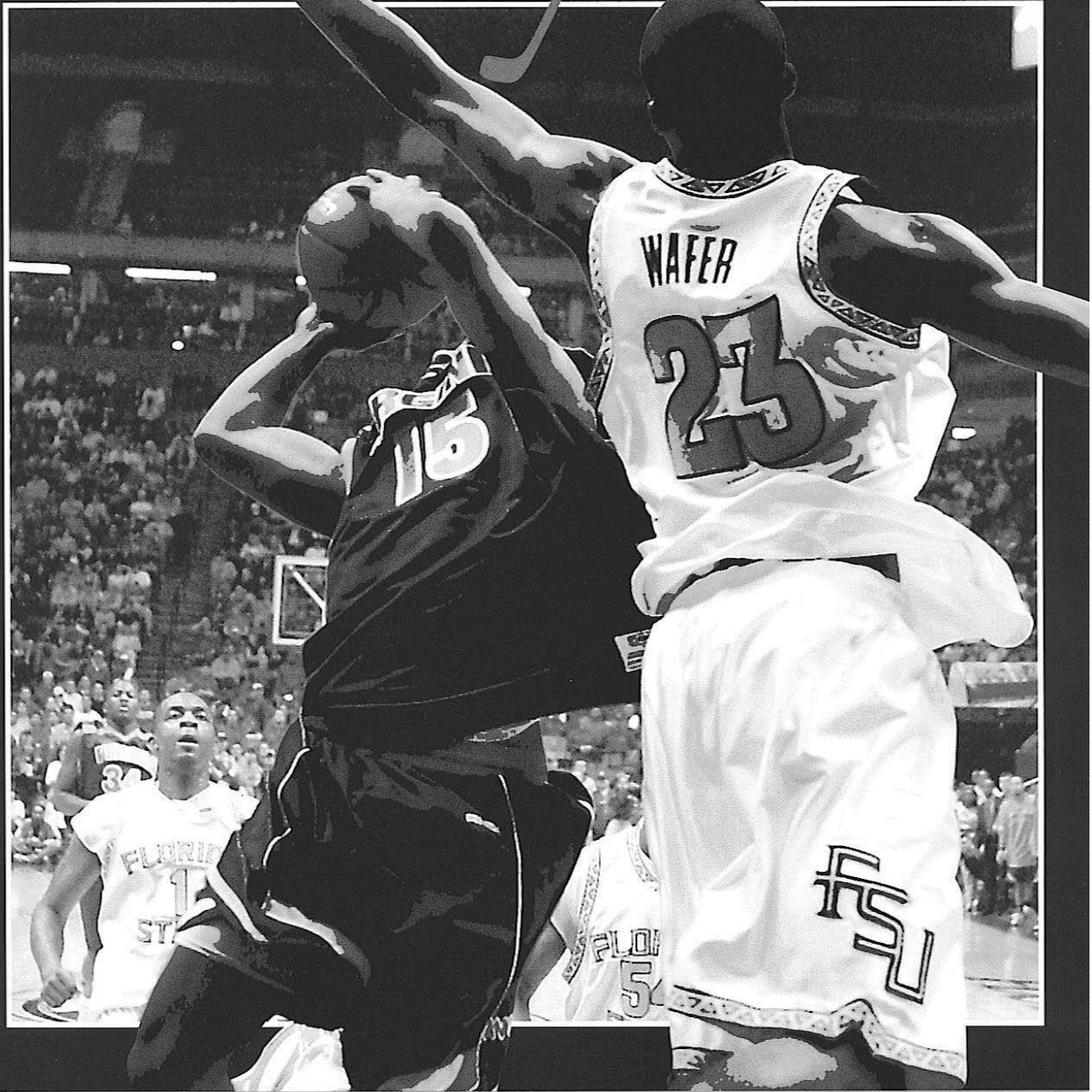

**TOP**

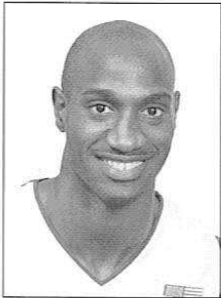
Senior Anthony Richardson has the athletic ability and experience to be one of the top players in the ACC. With 90 career games played he will soon be one of the few players in school history to hit the century mark in games played.

**O**ne of the top defenders in the ACC who returns among the league leaders in career blocked shots (68) and career steals (81) ... emerging as a student of the game who has become more consistent for the Seminoles on both the offensive and defensive ends of the floor ... his continued development as a dependable scorer and rebounder will allow him to become one of the top senior players in college basketball entering the 2004-05 season ... his experience (he has played in 90 career games), explosive athletic ability and steadily increasing basketball knowledge makes him a dangerous player in head coach Leonard Hamilton's system ... enters his senior season with 805 points and needs only 195 points to become only the 38th player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points ... is ranked 13th all-time in school history with 68 blocked shots and needs only seven to become only the 12th player in school history with 75 or more career blocked shots ... an average season of 23 blocks per game during his career would push him into the

Seminoles' all-time top 10 for blocked shots ... is one of the top free throw shooters in school history with a .762 percentage for his three-year varsity letter winning career ... he is mere percentage points from becoming one of the all-time top 10 free throw shooters in school history ... Mickey Dillard (1977-77, 80-81) and Terrell Baker (1998-99) are ranked tenth in school history with .768 marks from the line ... earned the award as the team's top free throw shooter at the 2004 banquet ... double figure scoring has come in 39 of 90 career games (.433 percent) ... tied a school record for free throws made as he was a perfect ten-of-ten against Georgia Tech during his sophomore season ... marked only the second time any Seminole player had made ten or more free throws in an ACC game and was only the eighth time a player was perfect on at least seven free throws in an ACC game ... an All-ACC Freshman Team Honorable Mention selection in 2002 ... earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors Jan. 13, 2002 for his 19-point, six-rebound performance against NC State in his first return to his hometown of Raleigh, N.C. ... as a prep senior he was rated as the No. 1 prospect in the

state of North Carolina by recruiting guru Bob Gibbons ... rated as the nation's 16th best prospect by Brick Oettinger ... rated as the 26th best prospect and No. 4 nationally among small forwards by *The Sporting News* ... All-America Third-Team selection by *Parade Magazine* following his senior season ... the first McDonald's All-American to sign with the Seminoles since Randell Jackson signed with the Seminoles in 1995 ... the only player from the basketball rich state of North Carolina to earn the wonderful selection of playing in the McDonald's All-American game as a high school senior in 2001.

**AS A JUNIOR (2004):** Averaged 7.3 points (fourth on the team), 3.6 rebounds (fifth), 0.6 blocks (tied for second) and 0.8 steals (tied for fifth) while leading the Seminoles with a career-high .815 free throw shooting percentage ... enjoyed a consistent season in all phases of the game ... shot a career-high .304 from the 3-point line and .815 from the free-throw line while averaging nearly 18 minutes per game ... totaled 16 points in the Seminoles' season opener against Maine (Nov. 21) and 19 in game number three against Nicholls State (Nov. 26) ... added 14 points against Savannah State in the Seminoles' win over the Tigers at home (Feb. 1) ... averaged 4.3 points and 2.9 rebounds against the 15 ranked teams on Florida State's schedule in 2003-04 ... ACC season high of 12 points at home against NC State (Jan. 11) and at Virginia (Jan. 18) ... ACC season high of two steals came in Florida State's miraculous come-from-behind victory over North Carolina as they trailed by as many as 24 points and won in overtime ... considered to be the greatest comeback in school history ... started the first 16 games of the season and has started 40 games during his career entering his senior season ... **(vs. Clemson)** averaged 5.0 points and 3.5 rebounds in two games against Clemson ... totaled eight points and four rebounds as Florida State defeated Clemson in Tallahassee (Feb. 14) ... totaled one point and three rebounds as Florida State played at Clemson (Jan. 13) ... **(vs. Duke)**

averaged 2.0 points and 2.0 rebounds in two games against NCAA semifinalist Duke ... a first half layup brought the Seminoles to within five at 22-17 with 8:02 remaining ... scored two points and pulled down three rebounds in five minutes of play as the Seminoles nearly upset the Blue Devils in Tallahassee for the third consecutive season (Feb. 29) ... **(vs. Georgia Tech)** averaged 6.0 points and 4.5 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament finalist Georgia Tech ... scored eight of his 12 points against the Yellow Jackets from the free-throw line as he was a near perfect eight-of-ten from the line in the two games ... has made 23 of 30 (.766) free throw attempts during his career against Georgia Tech ... scored nine points and pulled down six rebounds as Florida State defeated No. 10-ranked Georgia Tech in Tallahassee (Feb. 3) ... three first half points on three free throws sent the Seminoles to a 29-25 lead as the Seminoles traveled to play in Atlanta (March 6) ... **(vs. Maryland)** averaged 3.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in two games against ACC champion and NCAA Tournament participant Maryland ... scored six points and pulled down seven rebounds as Florida State defeated No. 24 Maryland in Tallahassee (Dec. 28) to open the ACC season ... pulled down five rebounds and recorded one steal as Florida State traveled to Maryland (Feb. 8) ... **(vs. North Carolina)** averaged 1.0 point and 1.5 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament participant North Carolina ... scored two points and pulled down one rebound in Florida State's incredible 24-point comeback for its 90-81 overtime victory over No. 7-ranked North Carolina in Tallahassee (Jan. 22) ... helped the Seminoles rally from 24 points down in the first half and 14 down at halftime ... two rebounds and one assist in nine minutes of play as the Seminoles played in Chapel Hill (Feb. 21) ... **(vs. NC State)** averaged 9.0 points and 2.3 rebounds in three games against NCAA Tournament participant NC State ... scored in double figures in two of three games against the

Wolfpack with 12 in Tallahassee (Jan. 11) and 11 in Raleigh (Feb. 10) and he returned to his hometown of Raleigh, N.C. ... scored 11 second half points as he helped the Seminoles rally from a 13-point half-time deficit in Raleigh ... scored four points and pulled down two rebounds against NC State in the ACC Tournament in Greensboro (March 12) ... all four points came in the second half and helped the Seminoles take as much as an 11-point lead ... **(vs. Virginia)** averaged 8.5 points and 1.5 rebounds in two games against NIT participant Virginia ... led the Seminoles with a .600 shooting percentage from the field (six-of-10) and an .800 mark from the free-throw line (four-of-five) ... tied his ACC season high of 12 points and had one rebound as the Seminoles took Virginia to overtime in Charlottesville (Jan. 18) ... scored five points and pulled down two rebounds as Florida State defeated Virginia in Tallahassee (Feb. 17) for the second consecutive season ... **(vs. Wake Forest)** averaged 3.0 points and 1.5 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Wake Forest ... scored two points in 13 minutes to help the Seminoles past No. 10 Wake

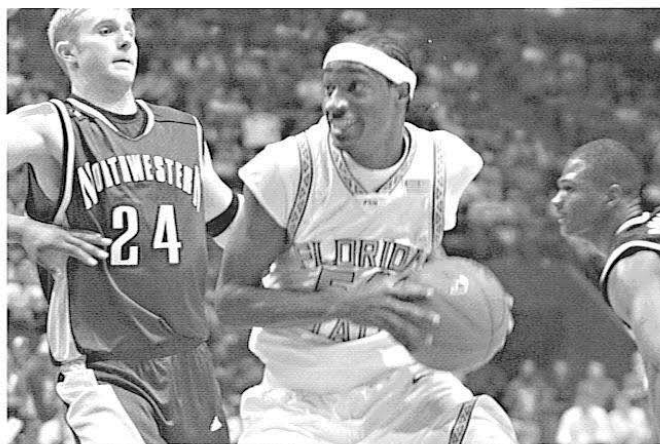

Forest, 75-70, in Tallahassee ... scored four points and pulled down three rebounds as the Seminoles took the 11th-ranked Demon Deacons into overtime in Winston-Salem (Feb. 25) ... averaged 1.5 points and 2.0 rebounds **against Wichita State and Iowa State during the Seminoles' two-game run in the NIT** ... scored three points and pulled down four rebounds as Florida State defeated Wichita State in double overtime, 91-84, for the first postseason win for the program since beating TCU in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament ... played six minutes with one assist against Iowa State in the second round of the NIT.

**AS A SOPHOMORE (2003):** Averaged 12.4 points (second on the team), 5.3 rebounds (second), 1.1 blocked shots (second) and 1.2 steals (third) ... also ranked among the team leaders in field goal percentage (.470, third), free throws made (62, first), free throws attempted (104, first), free throw percentage (.788, second) and minutes played (29.0, third) ... one of only four players in the ACC to finish in the conference's top 20 in scoring, rebounding, free throw shooting percentage, blocked shots and offensive rebounds ... was joined by only Josh Howard of Wake Forest and Julius Hodge and Josh Powell of NC State ... ranked 17th in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 12.4 points per game ... ranked 16th in the ACC in rebounding with a career-high 5.3 rebounds per game average ... finished eighth in the ACC with a .788 free throw percentage ... finished tenth in the ACC in blocked shots per game with a 1.1 per game average ... scored in double figures in a single season career-high 21 of Florida State's 29 games (.724 percent) and trailed only junior All-ACC Second-Team selection Tim Pickett (25 of 29) in that

category for the team lead ... scored in double figures in 11 of 16 ACC games during the season - scored a career-high 361 points for a career-high 12.4 points per game average ... averaged more points per game in 16 ACC games (13.1) than he did during 13 non-conference games (11.6) ... led the team with a single season career-high 34 blocked shots for a 1.1 blocks per game average ... blocked a career-high five shots against Georgia Tech (Feb. 15) as the Seminoles defeated the Yellow Jackets in Tallahassee ... improved his free throw shooting percentage by more than 14 percentage points from his freshman season to his sophomore season (.644-.788) as he ranked eighth in the ACC in free throw shooting percentage ... scored in double figures in a career-high ten consecutive games from Dec. 18 through Jan. 21 and averaged 14.3 points per game during the span ... ranked in the top five of four different statistical categories for the Seminoles (blocked shots, assists, 3-point field goals made and steals) ... **(vs. Clemson)** averaged 13.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.0 blocked shot in three games against Clemson ... scored in double figures against Clemson in all three games - 12 in Tallahassee, 16 in Clemson and 11 in Greensboro in the first round of the ACC Tournament ... two game-winning free throws with 0.4 seconds remaining against Clemson as the Seminoles defeated the Tigers, 60-59, at home (Jan. 21) ... Richardson was fouled by Clemson's Sharrod Ford just before the game clock expired on a shot attempt ... made the two pressure-



packed free throws to put the Seminoles up and helped Florida State gain the victory ... scored six second half points in the win including a jumper with 24 seconds elapsed in the second half to bring the Seminoles to within one (35-36) and another layup to bring the Seminoles to within one (52-53) with only 3:05 left on the game clock ... 16 points on seven-of-ten shooting from the field as Florida State traveled to Clemson (Feb. 22) ... 11 points, eight rebounds and a career-high six assists in Florida State victory over Clemson in the first round of the ACC Tournament (March 13) ... **(vs. Duke)** averaged 14.5 points and 3.5 rebounds against NCAA Tournament participant Duke ... was nearly perfect shooting the ball in the Seminoles' 75-70 victory over No. 5 Duke in Tallahassee (Feb. 2) ... shot six-of-eight from the field including a perfect one-of-one from the 3-point line and added one-of-two free throws to help in the Seminoles' second consecutive upset of the Blue Devils ... 11 first half points to spark Florida State to a 41-35 lead at intermission ... a crucial block on a dunk attempt by Sheldon

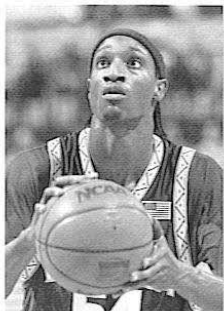
Anthony Richardson is one of the nation's most athletic players and is closing in on the 1,000 points scored plateau entering his senior season.

Anthony Richardson is one of the top free throw shooters in the ACC and has made more than 75 percent of his attempts during the first three years of his career.

Williams with 4:26 remaining in the game allowed Florida State to hold a 60-57 lead ... scored 15 points, pulled down five rebounds and credited with a career-high four steals as Florida State traveled to Durham to play the Blue Devils (March 6) ... **(vs. Georgia Tech)** averaged 19.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocked shots in two games against NIT participant Georgia Tech ... scored his season high of 20 points, pulled down his season high of nine rebounds and blocked one shot as he nearly earned his first career double-double as the Seminoles played in Atlanta (Jan. 14) ... tied a school record for perfection and established personal single game career highs as he made ten free throws in ten attempts for a 1.000 success rate ... scored 16 of his 20 points in the second half as Florida State outscored the Yellow Jackets, 43-39, in the second half during a furious comeback attempt ... 18 points and a career-high five blocked shots as the Seminoles defeated the Yellow Jackets in Tallahassee (Feb. 15) ... was a one-man wrecking crew in the first half with ten points, four blocked shots and two rebounds in 19 minutes as the Seminoles built a 45-30 halftime lead ... his four blocks came in a 2:50 span early in the first half as Georgia Tech threatened to blow the game open ... **(vs. Maryland)** averaged 11.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 blocked shots against NCAA Tournament participant Maryland ... scored 14 points and pulled down four rebounds as Florida State played at Maryland (Jan. 11) ... the two 3-point shots made tied his season high (also against Clemson in the ACC Tournament) as Florida State nearly upset the No. 12-ranked Terps in Tallahassee

(Feb. 12) ... **(vs. North Carolina)** averaged 14.5 points and 4.5 rebounds in two games against NIT participant North Carolina ... 12 points, five rebounds and two blocked shots off the bench as the Seminoles played host to the Tar Heels (Dec. 22) ... strong with 17 points, four rebounds and two assists as Florida State visited North Carolina (Feb. 12) ... a rebound and a put-back put Florida State up 57-53 with 4:19 remaining ... **(vs. NC State)** averaged 11.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.0 assist against NCAA Tournament participant NC State ... was a perfect five-of-five from the free-throw line in two games against the Wolfpack ... scored 14 points and pulled down four rebounds against the Wolfpack in Tallahassee (Jan. 18) ... made six field goals and was a perfect two-of-two from the free-throw line ... totaled nine points and five rebounds in 24 minutes as the Seminoles traveled to Raleigh (Feb. 18) to play in his hometown for the second time during his career ... **(vs. Virginia)** averaged 13.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in two games against NIT participant Virginia ... totaled nine points, six rebounds and two blocked shots as Florida State defeated Virginia in Tallahassee (March 1) ... tied his season high with two 3-point shots made within two minutes of each other as the Seminoles held court with the Cavaliers ... scored 17 points, pulled down three rebounds and blocked one shot as the Seminoles played in Charlottesville (Jan. 29) ... **(vs. Wake Forest)** averaged 9.3 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists against regular season ACC Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Wake Forest ... scored 14 points, pulled down five rebounds and was credited with two assists as the

Seminoles nearly became the first No. 9 seed to beat a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament (March 14) ... nine points, six rebounds, two assists, one block and one steal as Florida State nearly pulled off one of the biggest upsets of the regular season in Tallahassee (Feb. 26) ... five points and four rebounds against Wake Forest in Winston-Salem (Jan. 26).

**AS A FRESHMAN (2002):** All-ACC Freshman Team Honorable Mention selection in 2002 ... averaged 7.2 points (sixth on team), 3.7 rebounds (sixth), and ranked among the team leaders in blocked shots (15, third), assists (27, fourth), 3-point field goals made (24, fourth) and steals (21, fifth) ... earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors once during his freshman season (Jan. 13) after scoring his season high of 19 points and grabbing six rebounds against NC State (Jan. 8) as he returned home to play in Raleigh for the first time during his career ... led the Seminoles in scoring twice – against Savannah State (Nov. 20) and at Maryland (Jan. 26) and topped the team in rebounds twice also against Western Carolina (Dec. 8) and Campbell (Dec. 29) ... scored in double figures nine times to rank sixth on the team ... 15 total blocked shots with his three coming against Savannah State in only his second career game ... added two against Elon (Nov. 23) in his third game and had five blocked shots after only three career outings ... multiple blocked shots in four different games ... established his season high of four assists and three steals against Birmingham-Southern (Dec. 4) as the Seminoles defeated the Panthers at home ... tied his season high with three

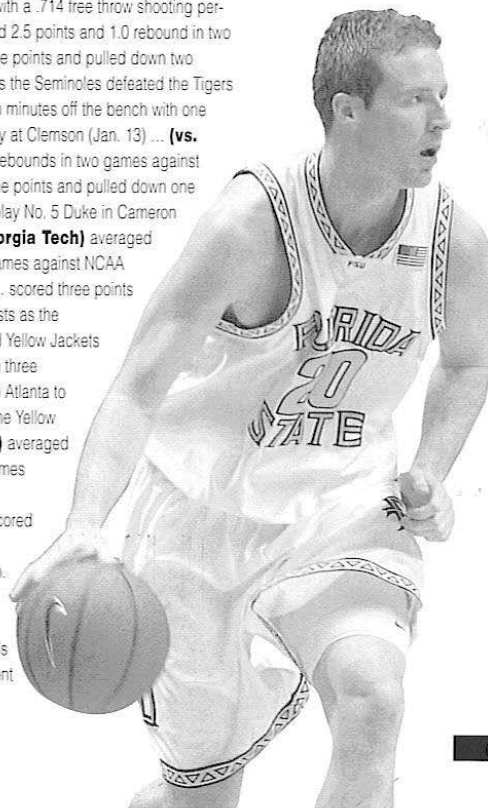
# Started

In his fifth season as a member of the Florida State men's basketball team and earned his bachelor's degree in sport management during the spring of 2004 ... will play as a graduate student during the remaining two years of his basketball career in Tallahassee ... returns as a starter for the second consecutive season for the Seminoles and has started 22 games during his career ... has played in two full seasons - his first as a Seminole in 2001 and his most recent in 2004 - during his four-year career ... played one game in 2002 before injuring his knee and was a starter in the first five games of the 2003 season before injuring his right wrist ... had surgery to remove excess bone close to the attachment of the Achilles' tendon to the heel of his right foot in April of 2004 ... the surgery was performed to give the tendon more room to move freely thus reducing the chances of the tendon becoming inflamed ... led Florida State in free throw shooting percentage with a .808 (42-52) percentage during his inaugural collegiate season (2000-01).

**AS A REDSHIRT JUNIOR (2004):** Averaged 4.1 points (eighth on the team), 2.0 rpg (seventh) and 0.8 apg (tied for seventh) while shooting .394 from the 3-point line (fourth) and making 28 3-point shots (fourth) ... a starter and averaged 9.0 points in two games as the Seminoles advanced to the second round of the NIT ... made his first start of the season against Virginia in Charlottesville (Jan. 18) and started every game for the remainder of the season ... made a single-season career-high 28 3-point shots on the season including a career-high seven at North Carolina ... 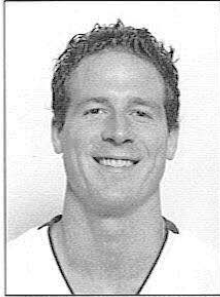

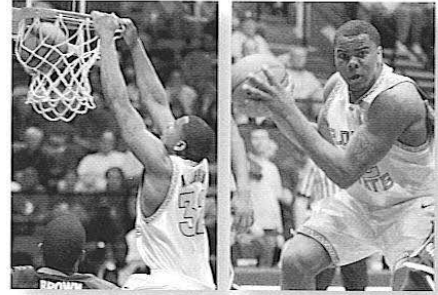

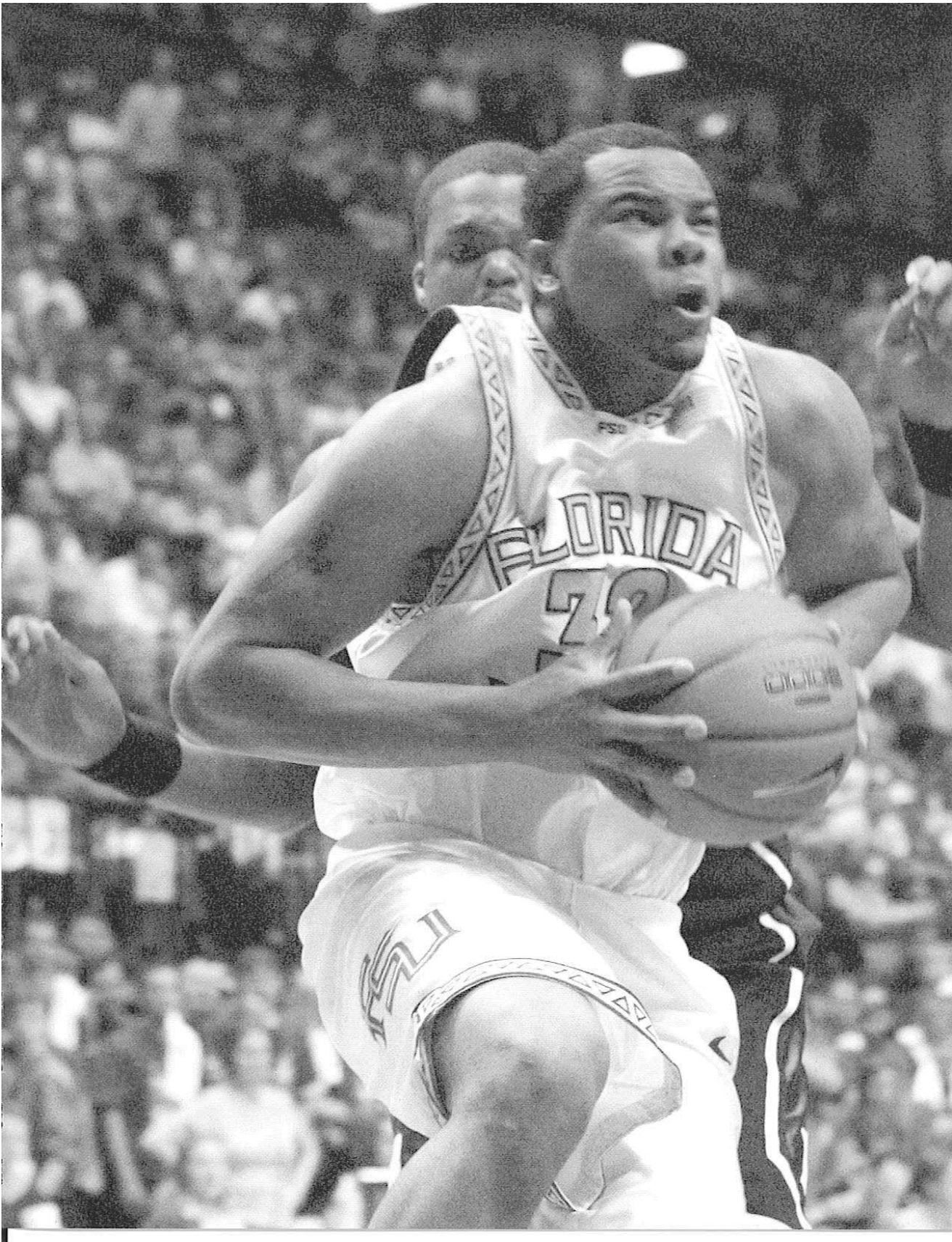
# Phenom

In a breakout freshman season, forward Alexander Johnson became the third Seminole in school history to earn All-ACC Freshmen Team honors. In 2003-04, he was one of only three Seminole players to block at least 20 and earn at least 20 steals, the first freshman since the 1993-94 season to lead the team in shooting from the field, and was among team leaders at the free-throw line.

**A**t season's end, Johnson was tapped for Freshman All-America Honorable Mention honors by Rivals.com ... one of the top post players in the ACC and destined to be one of the nation's top players during his career at Florida State ... named to the ACC All-Freshman Team in 2004 as he ranked second among all conference freshmen in rebounding (4.2 rpg), third in scoring (9.5 ppg), third in field goal shooting (.551), fifth in blocked shots (0.61 bpg), tenth in free throw shooting (.675), 11th in assists (0.82 apg) and 12th in steals (0.82 spg) ... finished third in the voting for the All-Freshman team behind only Chris Paul of Wake Forest and Luol Deng of Duke ... he joins Seminole greats Corey Louis (1995) and Michael Joiner (2001) as the only three Florida State players who have been named to the All-ACC Freshman Team ... Florida State's second leading scorer who totaled 312 points and a 9.5 points per game scoring average ... started

each of the final 16 games of the season after being inserted into the starting lineup in place of Mike Mathews on Jan. 22 against North Carolina ... was the only freshman to start a game for the Seminoles during the 2004 season ... named to the All-Tournament team at the University of Pittsburgh Holiday Hoops Classic as a freshman ... was one of the nation's top high school recruits as a senior at Dougherty High School in Albany, Georgia, in 2002 ... was one of the players who made up the consensus No. 1 recruiting class in the nation along with Diego Romero and Von Wafer at Florida State in 2003 ... rated as the 16th-best player and a five-star forward by Rivals.com following his post-high school year at Bridgton Academy in Maine ... *PrepStar's Recruiting Handbook* rated him as the nation's 26th best player entering the collegiate ranks for the 2003-04 season ... *Sporting News* ranked him as the nation's 14th best prep prospect as a high school senior ... played in the 2002 Capital Classic making him one of six current Seminoles who have played in the Capital Classic ... origi-

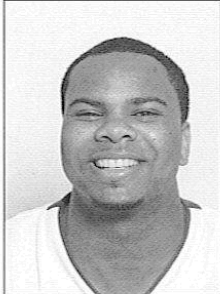

nally signed with Georgia out of high school but never attended the SEC school ... earned two awards at the Seminoles' season-ending banquet in 2004 - the award as the Seminoles' top field goal percentage shooter and the award for academic achievement among first-year players.

#### ROMERO'S REDSHIRT SEASON (2004):

A highly touted big man who decided to redshirt the entire 2003-04 season when the NCAA restored his eligibility after the Seminoles had played 15 regular season and two exhibition games ... in question was Romero's amateur status resulting from his playing days in his native Argentina before enrolling at Lon Morris Junior College in 2001 ... a ruling by the NCAA Division I Management Council announced Jan. 12, 2004 restored his eligibility ... during its annual meeting in Nashville, the Division I Management Council determined that its endorsement of the effective date for the new amateurism standard for transfer student-athletes should be amended ... the initial directive, made in July 2002, from the management council stated any student-athlete who enrolled in an NCAA institution after August 1, 2003, and had signed a professional contract would fall under a new reinstatement standard ... the management council determined the new standard, which makes student-athletes permanently ineligible to play a sport if they sign a professional contract that makes them a professional in that sport, unintentionally harmed transfer student-athletes by not applying the former standard for those student-athletes already enrolled at a collegiate institution before the effective date ... the new directive made it clear to the student-athlete reinstatement staff and committee that any student-athlete who is in conflict with the amateurism rules dealing with professionalizing themselves, and enrolled at an NCAA institution after the effective date, would be ineligible to play that sport ... the new standard also alleviated the two-prong standard that was previously applied to student-athletes seeking reinstatement ... by amending the directive, student-athletes who enrolled at any college prior to August 1, 2003, would be evaluated under the intent-to-professionalize standard which was previously used ... said Florida State Director of Athletics, Dave Hart, Jr.,

regarding the decision: "If not for the combination of expertise, persistent effort and research on the part of Bob Minnix (Florida State University's Associate Athletic Director for Compliance), I don't know that we would have ever arrived at this ultimate outcome. Certainly, the decision to restore Diego's eligibility is in the best interest of fairness and student-athlete welfare."

**ON ROMERO:** "Some services rated him as the best big man in the country. He's a very gifted high post player and shoots the ball from 17 to 20 feet as well as any big man in the country. He likes to rotate to the blocks off the jump shot," said his junior college coach Dale Dotson ... was one of four members making up the Seminoles' consensus No. 1-ranked recruiting class in the nation of the players entering college for the 2003-04 season ... an ideal fit for Florida State's up-tempo system ... plays a high post game not typical for 6-10 players ... has the ability to play inside and the skill to move outside and outplay his defender ... shoots and passes the ball well and has good mobility for a player of his size ... sets himself apart from other big men with his outside shooting ability ... named as 27th best junior college player by CBS SportsLine.com following his second season at Lon Morris ... a pre-season All-America by *Street and Smith's* magazine and rated as the eighth best JUCO prospect in the nation prior to his sophomore season according to *Lindy's College Basketball Annals* ... helped Lon Morris reach the quarterfinals of the junior college national tournament as a freshman and the semifinals of the junior college Region XIV Tournament as a sophomore ... scored his career high of 26 points against Paris Junior College and pulled down his career high of 13 rebounds against Panola Junior College during his freshman season ... Lon Morris won 55 games (27.5 wins per season) during Romero's two seasons in the lineup ... rated as the ninth best junior college power forward by *Future*

*Stars Magazine* ... grew up playing soccer in his native Argentina and has been playing basketball for seven years.

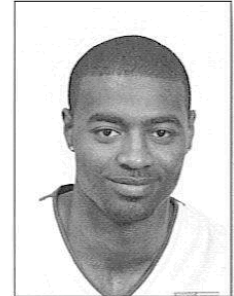

## Notes

In only his second season at Florida State, Leonard Hamilton led the Seminoles to the second round of the NIT marking the first time since 1998 the Seminoles had earned a postseason berth. Four of the Seminoles' top five scorers (Alexander Johnson, Von Wafer, Anthony Richardson and Adam Waleskowski), their top rebounder (Waleskowski), their top shot blocker (Waleskowski), their top free throw shooter (Richardson) and three players (Johnson, Richardson and Wilson) who all started at least 16 games in 2003-04 return to the lineup for the upcoming season. A talented forward -

Diego Romero - will be on the court as a team leader after redshirting the 2003-04 season. Romero could prove to be one of the top big men in the ACC and was a junior college All-American during both of his seasons at Lon Morris (Tex.) Junior College. Florida State set school records for 3-point field goals made (296) and 3-point field goals attempted (788) in 2003-04 and return all but two players who made more than five 3-point field goals during the season. Wafer, a two-time ACC Rookie of the Week, made 43 of the Seminoles' 116 returning 3-point shots while Johnson, an ACC All-Rookie Team

selection, led the Seminoles in free throws made (106) and attempted (157) while averaging 9.5 points per game. Florida State ranked 21st in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.401) and second in the ACC in scoring defense (65.1) as they continued to be one of the nation's top defensive teams under Hamilton. The Seminoles' pair of incoming freshman guards - Jason Rich and Isaiah Swann - were both ranked among the nation's top 30 high school players entering the collegiate ranks this season.
