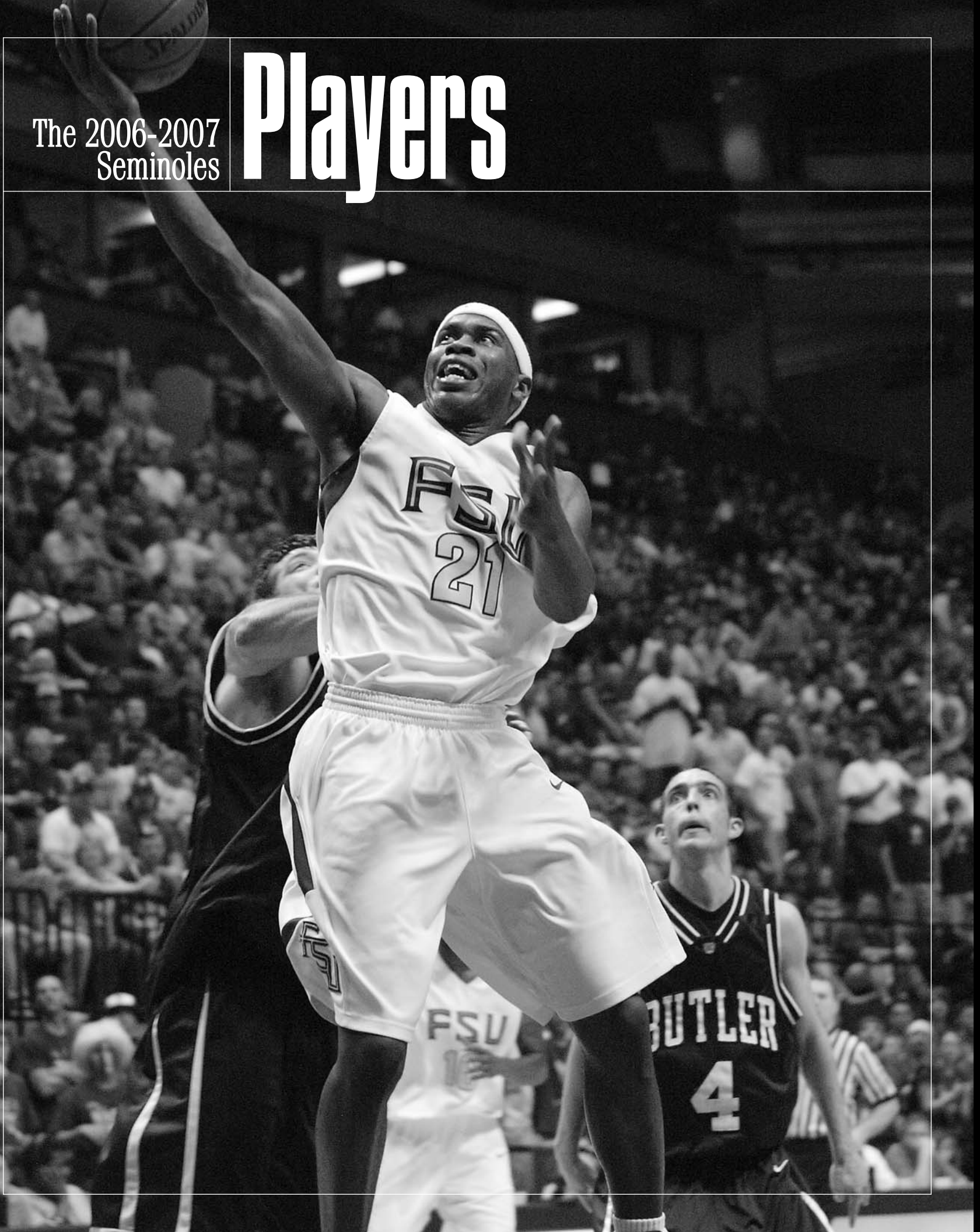

FSU SEMINOLE BASKETBALL 2006-2007 **Players**

AI THORNTON



Al Thornton is an All-America, National Player of the Year and Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year candidate as one of college basketball's top players. His outstanding junior season made him a household name and placed him among the elite players in college basketball for the upcoming season. Thornton earned All-ACC Second-Team honors as a junior in 2006 and returns for his senior season as one of the stars with one of the brightest burning fires among all collegiate players at any position.

AS A JUNIOR (2006)

- Earned All-ACC Second-Team and All-District First-Team honors as he enjoyed an outstanding season in leading Florida State to 20 wins and into the second round of the NIT.

- Averaged 16.1 points (first on the team), 6.9 rebounds (second), while shooting .518 from the field (third), .744 from the free throw line (third) and .476 from the 3-point line.

- A pair of signature games – 37 points at No. 15 Boston College and 37 points at No. 2 Duke – put him on the map and sent his stock soaring into the stratosphere among the nation's elite college basketball players.

- Ranked in the top 15 in the ACC in scoring (12th, 16.1 ppg), rebounding (10th, 6.9 rpg) and field goal percentage (seventh, .518) as a junior. He was one of only five players – joined by only Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina, Craig Smith of Boston College, Eric Williams of Wake Forest and Shelden Williams of Duke.

- Enters his senior season with 831 points and needs only 169 to become the 38th player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points.

- One of the top field goal shooters in terms of accuracy in school history with a career mark of .527 and has shot better than .500 percent from the field in each of his first three seasons.

- Scored 37 points and pulled down six rebounds against Boston College. He

announced his national presence with authority as an impact player in the ACC for the remainder of his career as he scored 37 points and was named the ACC Player of the Week after leading Florida State against Boston College. His 37 points came on an incredible 15-of-18 (.833 shooting percentage) from the field.

- Averaged a double-double of 31.5 points and 10.5 rebounds in two games against Duke. He continued his mandate to be recognized as one of the nation's top players with a phenomenal 37-point, 15-rebound effort against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium and left no national doubt as to his All-America status with a 26-point, five rebound performance in leading the Seminoles past No. 1 ranked Duke in Tallahassee.

- Totaled a double-double of 18 points and 13 rebounds in the Seminoles' regular season ending victory over Miami. He scored eight of his 18 points from the free throw line

with all eight free throws made and all 10 free throws attempted coming in the second half. He was four of five from the free throw line (.800) to help Florida State outscore Miami 10-7 in the last five minutes to gain the victory. His two most important free throws came with eight seconds remaining in the game as he was a perfect two-of-two to

give Florida State a 65-61 lead and made the game a two-possession must for the Hurricanes.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2005)

- Averaged 9.1 points (second on the team), 4.4 rebounds (tied for first), 0.6 blocks (first) and shot .543 from the field (first).

- Season-high 26 points in the Seminoles' fantastic 93-81 victory over No. 3 Wake Forest in overtime in Tallahassee (Jan. 18). He scored 20 points after the intermission and totaled six points in overtime.

- Scored 20 points against Georgia Tech in Tallahassee (Feb. 20). Was on fire as a starter for the first time in his career with eight points in the first half and 12 in the second as the Seminoles nearly rallied for the victory.

AS A FRESHMAN (2004)

- Averaged 3.2 points (tenth on the team), 1.8 rebounds (tied for ninth) and shot .517 from the field to rank second among the regulars in the Seminoles' rotation.

- Ranked in the top 25 among ACC freshmen in seven different statistical categories. Finished the season ranked fifth among ACC freshmen in field goal percentage (.517), 11th in blocked shots (0.2 bpg), 13th in rebounding (1.8 rpg), 15th in scoring (2.8 ppg), 20th in assists (0.4 apg), 21st in steals (0.2 spg) and 24th in free throw shooting percentage (.500).

AS A FRESHMAN (2003)

- A redshirt season
- Originally signed with

Leonard Hamilton during the summer of 2002 but did not enroll at Florida State until December of 2002.

- Was fully eligible as a student and a player upon his arrival but decided on a redshirt season. Practiced with the team during the entire second semester.

AT PERRY

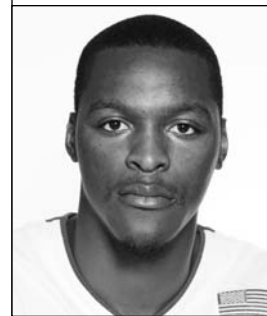
- Graduated from Perry High School in 2002.

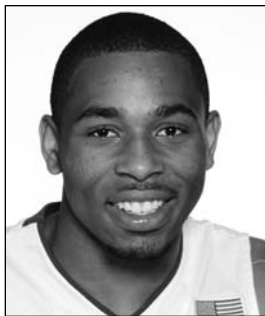

Jerrel Allen's continued improvement and ability to get to his desired performance level will make him one of the top guards in the ACC during his senior season. He played in all 30 of the Seminoles' games and averaged nearly 12.0 minutes of playing time per game as a junior. Allen will see his playing time and performance level continue to increase because of his strong work ethic. With a full off-season to condition and train, Allen should blossom and be one of the rising stars in the ACC.

AS A JUNIOR (2006):

- Averaged 3.3 points (ninth on the team), 1.4 rebounds (tied for ninth) and made 17 3-point field goals (fifth) in his first season as a Seminole.

- Scored in double figures in two games – both victories – against Texas Southern and in an ACC game against Wake Forest.

- Career-high 14 points and career-high four rebounds in the Seminoles' victory over Texas Southern (Dec. 7). He established

single-game career-highs for points scored (14), field goals made (five), field goals attempted (eight), field goal percentage (.625), 3-point field goals made (four) and 3-point field goals attempted (six) against TSU.

- Scored in double figures with 11 points, two rebounds in 14 minutes of play vs. Wake Forest (Jan. 24) to earn his ACC career-high scoring total.

- Earned one rebound and one assist in 14 minutes of playing time as Florida State defeated No. 1 ranked Duke in Tallahassee. His

assist came in the second half on a short jumper by Alexander Johnson that tied the game at 65-65 with 5:27 remaining. The assist by Allen and the basket by Johnson began a 14-9 game-ending run that gave Florida State its second ever win over the nation's No. 1 ranked team.

- Scored seven points in 11 minutes of play in one game against NIT participant Maryland. He scored six of his seven points in the first half to help Florida State to a 37-27 advantage at halftime in the 71-60 win over the Terps.

- Averaged 0.5 points and 1.0 rebounds in two games against Butler and South Carolina as Florida State advanced to the second round of the NIT. He scored one point and pulled down two rebounds in five minutes of play as Florida State defeated Butler in the first round of the NIT in Tallahassee.

- Was slowed just before the regular season began in 2006 as he underwent a short surgical procedure to remove an infection that had developed in the skin around his left knee on Nov. 5 and missed the remainder of pre-season practice.

- Is one of the Seminoles' top defenders who is often charged with shutting down the opponents' hottest player once a game begins.

- The only junior college player on the Seminoles' roster who begins his final season of eligibility in the 2006-07 season.

- A scorer who can get his shot off in any situation and who has the ability to play both guard positions.

AT MOTT

- Earned his Associates Degree from Mott Community College in Flint, Mich., in 2005.
- Earned All-America Honorable Mention honors following his sophomore season at Mott.
- Led Mott in most statistical categories including scoring (497 points/17.2 ppg), steals (106/3.7 spg), 3-point field goals made (79/2.7 mpg) and 3-point field goal percentage (.422) during his sophomore season.
- Shot .750 (66 of 88) from the free throw line as a sophomore.
- Named to the District 8 All-Tournament team, the Region XII Division II Team, and All-State First Team in 2005.
- Ranked third on the team in scoring as a freshman with 293 points (10.5 ppg) and scored 790 points (13.9 ppg) during his two-year career at Mott.

two-year career at Mott. An NJCAA District 8 all-tournament selection as he led the Bears to the championship game of the district Tournament.

Most Valuable Player of the 2005 Eastern Conference team in the MCCA state all-star game.

Named as the fifth best junior college wing guard in the nation by Lindy's College Basketball Annuals prior to the 2004-05 season.

Jason RICH



Jason Rich is destined to be an all-star for the Seminoles and a standout player in the Atlantic Coast Conference during the remaining two years of his career at Florida State. He has displayed the offensive and defensive capabilities that will place him in the top tier of players in the ACC as he leads the Seminoles to a consistent spot in the upper echelon of the league and the nation.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006)

- Averaged 10.0 points (third on the team), 3.1 rebounds (third), 1.2 steals (third) and 1.6 assists (fourth).

- Also averaged a career-high 10.0 points per game and was one of only three Seminole players to average in double figure scoring.

- Among the top defenders on the team, he ranked third on the team with a career-high 36 steals and second on the team with a career-high 10 blocked shots.

- Ranked third on the team with three 20-point scoring games as he totaled a career-high 22 against Butler in the first round of the NIT and scored 20 points each against Miami and at Duke.

- Was one of only four Seminole players with double-figure rebounds in at least one game as he pulled down a career-high 11 in the Seminoles' victory over Texas Southern.

- Averaged 11.5 points and 6.0 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Duke.

- Earned his career breakout game with 20 points, three rebounds and two steals in a career-high 39 minutes of play as Florida State took No. 2 ranked Duke to the limit before falling in overtime, 97-96, in one of the most memorable games of the 2005-06 college basketball season. Rich was nearly unstoppable as he made 10 of 18 field goal attempts.

- Scored three points (all from the free throw line) and pulled down a team-leading nine rebounds as the Seminoles defeated No. 1 ranked Duke in Tallahassee.

- Scored 12 points, pulled down two rebounds and was credited with four assists in Florida State's come-from-behind victory over Georgia Tech. He was credited with one big blocked shot and a second huge defensive play in the final six seconds of the Seminoles' victory over the Yellow Jackets. With six seconds remaining in the game, Rich blocked a 3-point shot attempt by the Yellow Jackets' Lewis Clinch which, if the shot had gone in, would have given Georgia Tech the lead. On the ensuing play (after he blocked the ball out of bounds) he defended Tech's Anthony Morrow to the outside of the court where Morrow stepped on the sideline and turned the ball over to the Seminoles.

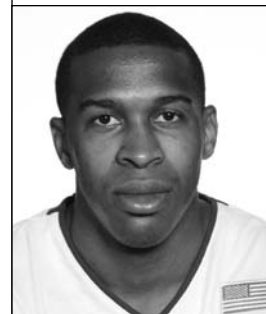

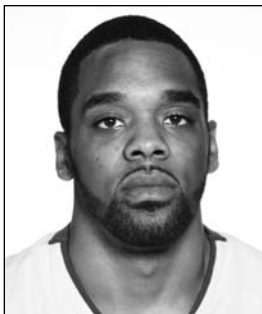

Isaiah Swann is one of the most athletic players in the ACC who returns for his second consecutive season as a starter for the Seminoles in 2006-07. He has played in every Seminole game (61) during the first two years of his career and is the only player on Florida State's 2006-07 roster who has played in every game in the last two seasons. Swann has an incredible ability to drive the lane and dunk over players who are much taller than him.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006)

- Averaged a career-high 8.5 points (fourth on the team), 2.9 assists (second), 2.1 rebounds (sixth) and made a single-season career-high 33 3-point field goals (second). He ranked second on the team with 33 3-point shots made and led the team with 100 3-point shots attempted.

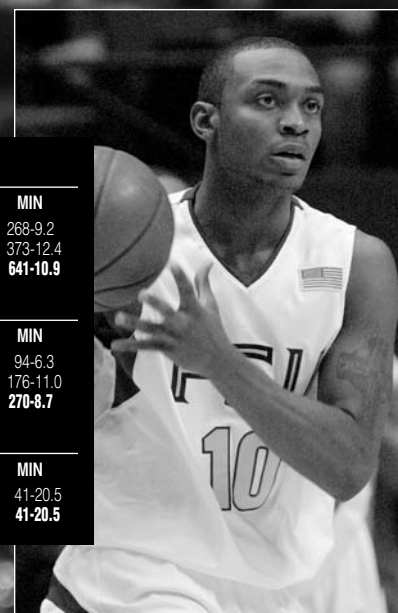

Ralph Mims set the all-time school record for consecutive free throws made, 33, from Dec. of 2004 through Dec. of 2005. He broke Jim Oler's record of 31 consecutive free throws made in the Seminoles' victory over Campbell on Dec. 22, 2005 in the Donald L. Tucker Center. Mims is fifth in school history with a career free throw shooting percentage of .810 (81-of-100) and is one of only five players in school history who has shot 80 percent or better from the free throw line for his career.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006)

- Averaged 3.8 points (eighth on the team), 1.5 rebounds (eighth) and 1.7 assists (third) while shooting .788 (52-of-66) from the free throw line.
- Led the Seminoles for the second time in two seasons with a team-high .788 mark from the free throw line as he made 52 of his 66 attempts from the free throw line.
- Top game of his career came against Butler in the NIT as he played 28 minutes for the injured Todd Galloway and recorded six assists and zero turnovers. His performance in running the point allowed the Seminoles to defeat the Bulldogs, 67-63, and advance to the second round of the NIT for the second time in three seasons.

He played one of the best ACC games of his career with nine points, four assists, two rebounds and one steal as the Seminoles nearly won in Durham. His nine points against the Blue Devils ranks as his second highest scoring total in an ACC game during his career.

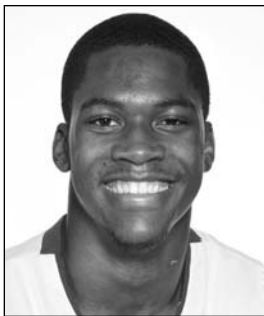

Casaan Breeden is a cornerstone around which the Seminole program will be built during his sophomore year and for the remainder of his career in Tallahassee. He is among the most athletically gifted players on the Seminoles' roster who will earn increased playing time and who will vie for a spot in the starting line-up from the beginning of practice in October. Breeden is an athletic forward who is capable of playing different positions and in different places on the court.

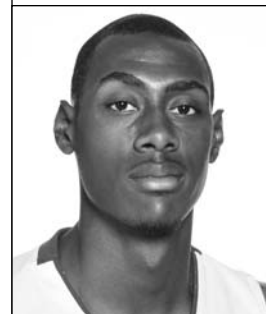

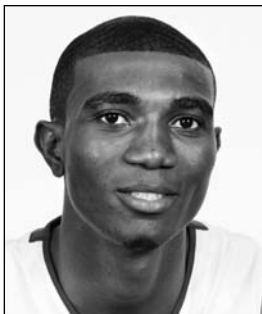

Uche Echefu is one of the nation's top young players and is also a large part of the very bright future of the Florida State basketball program. His abilities have yet to be put on display and his potential as a future All-Star candidate is immense. According to head coach Leonard Hamilton he has yet to even scratch the surface of his potential in his quest to become one of the top all-around players in the history of the Seminole program.

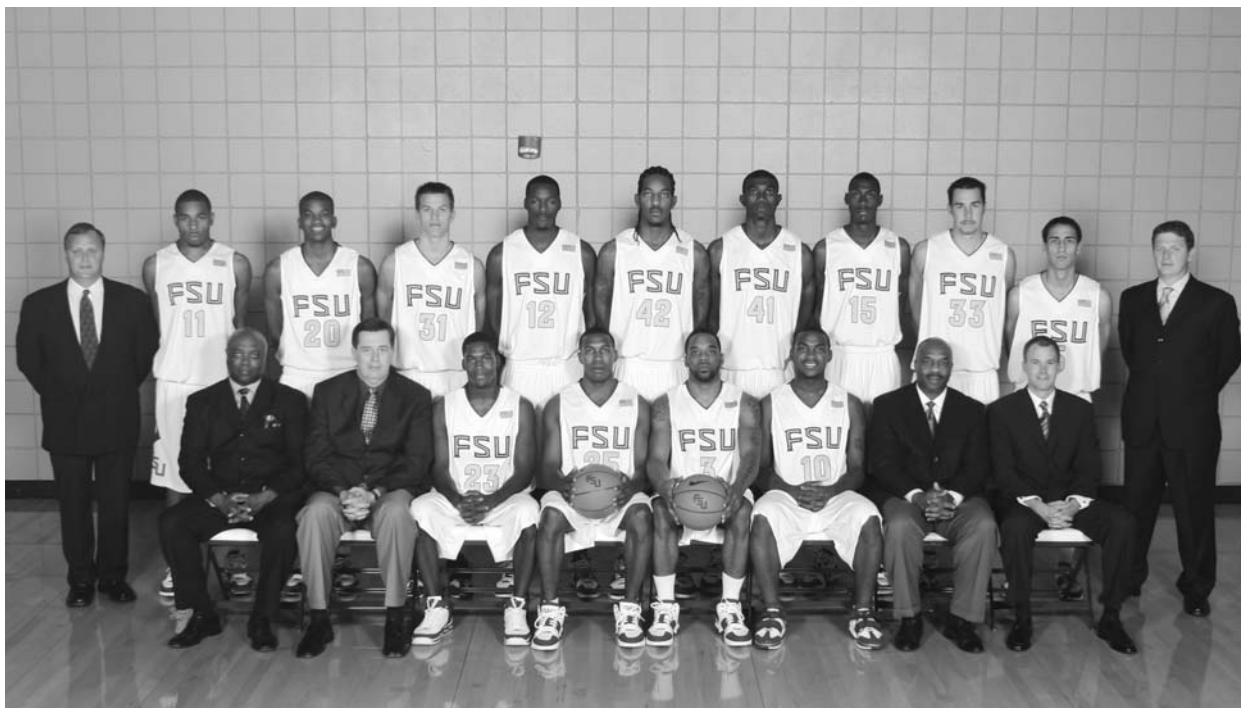

NOTES

Florida State, which advanced to the second round of the NIT, finished fifth in the ACC standings with a 9-7 record and defeated No. 1 ranked Duke during the 2005-06 season. returns three starters and nine letter winners for the 2006-07 season as it looks to continue building on the rock-solid foundation which has been put into place by fifth-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. Led by All-America and National and ACC Player of the Year candidate Al Thornton, the Seminoles return more than 60 percent of their total scoring (.647 percent) and rebounding (.603 percent) from a season ago. Thornton is Florida State's leading returning scorer (16.1 ppg), rebounder (6.9 rpg) and leader in both field goals and free throws made as he enters the 2006-07 season as one of the nation's most top collegiate players. Thornton is the fifth leading returning scorer, the fourth leading returning rebounder and the third leading returning field goal percentage shooter in the ACC for the 2006-07 season. He is joined by only North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough in the top-10 returning ACC players in the scoring, rebounding and field goal shooting categories for the upcoming season. Thornton is the Seminoles' leading returning player in eight different statistical categories including scoring and rebounding. Florida State returns more than 50 percent of

its statistical output in most of their statistical categories entering the 2006-07 season. Florida State enters the 2006-07 season looking to win 20 games or more for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles won 20 games last season (20-10 overall record) and will play to win 20 or more games in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 1991-92 (22-10, NCAA Sweet 16) and 1992-93 seasons (25-10/NCAA Elite 8). Florida State has won 20 or more games in consecutive seasons only twice in school history (1990-91 and 1991-92 / 1991-92 and 1992-93). Florida State enters the 2006-07 season looking to make consecutive postseason appearances for the first time since the 1996-97 (NIT Championship Game, 4-1 record) and 1997-98 seasons (NCAA Second Round). The Seminoles advanced to the championship game of the 1997 postseason NIT with victories over Syracuse, Michigan State, West Virginia and Connecticut before falling to Michigan in the championship game. A year later, the Seminoles defeated Texas Christian in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament before falling to Valparaiso in the second round. Florida State made a school record three consecutive postseason appearances from the 1986-87 through 1989-90 and 1990-91 through the 1992-93 seasons.



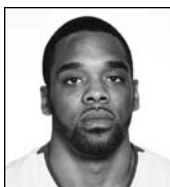

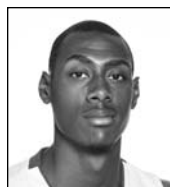
SPEED CHART
