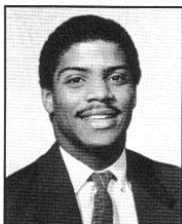

No second baseman in the country can match the diverse abilities of Edwin Alicea ... Combining speed, power and a steady glove, he appears to be following brother Luis as another top pro draft pick ... Did any other leadoff hitter in college baseball get on base in a higher percentage of games (67-of-73) ... He'll be a steadying influence on a revamped 1988 infield ... With a big 1988 season he has the tools to hit 20 home runs and steal 40 bases ... Florida State will certainly not look the same after the Alicea reign finishes at second base ...

1987: Had an All-American season statistically. An outstanding leadoff batter, he was on base 67 of 73 games and hit safely in 63 of 73. Showed some good power as well, battling for the club lead in home runs down the stretch and then to show some versatility stole more than 30 bases. Had the team's longest hitting streak last season, a 22-game run from March 8 through April 4. Led the team in at bats, runs scored and hits.

1986: Hit .312 for Chipola with five home runs and 32 RBIs in 44 games ... excellent base runner, Alicea stole 18 bases ... had a total of 15 extra-base hits ... played summer ball with Jerry's Caterers ... drafted in 8th round by California Angels in January draft.

HIGH SCHOOL: Played in American Legion World Series ... was an All-American at Roesler High School in Puerto Rico. **PERSONAL:** Brother of former Florida State All-American Luis Alicea ... majoring in physical education ... 19-years-old ... will turn 20 on March 9.

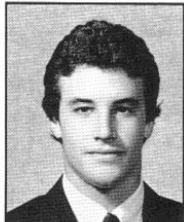

Catcher

Summit, New Jersey

Unquestionably the leader of the 1988 Baseball team as he begins his fourth season as a regular ... Has provided the Florida State Program with a totally unselfish career, having been called on to play three different positions as well as designated hitter ... This year, he'll handle his true calling as he becomes the club's everyday catcher ... He'll enter this season after closing with a flurry in 1987. He blasted two game-saving home runs in the final month of the season, including a dramatic two-out, ninth-inning shot against LSU in the opening game of the College World Series ... A pre-season All-American pick by "Collegiate Baseball," a healthy Blackwell should be the college game's best catcher in 1988. Ironically, he'll replace Ed Fulton, a 1987 All-American catcher for the Seminoles.

1987: After a slow start, Blackwell placed himself among the team's leaders in most offensive categories — a position he expected to be in when the season began ... He had his best year at FSU in virtually every category ... He was named to the All-Metro Conference team as well as the all-tournament team for both the regional and conference tournaments ... enjoyed a good season defensively when called upon to catch, gunning down 11 base-stealers and committing only five errors.

1986: Played almost entire season at third base — volunteering for position when need developed ... charged with 13 errors at third, but none in last 21 games of regular season schedule (including Metro Conference Tournament) ... had good World Series at plate, collecting seven hits in 19 at-bats (.368), scoring four runs ... started season off slow with just 10 hits in first 46 at-bats, but then went on seven game hitting streak in middle of season to lift average from .215 to .348 ... had 11 multiple hit games, including four hits against Richmond (3/14) ... excellent bunter, Blackwell led team with seven sacrifices ... played in Cape Cod League.

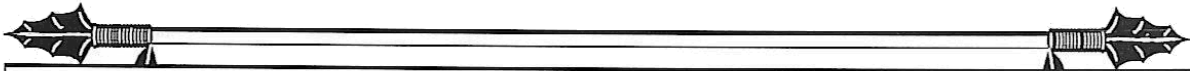
#21 ROD BYERLY

1987: Got off to a fast start, winning seven games in his first 10 starts ... Had posted a 2.49 ERA through that point ... Then was shifted to spot relief appearances during the final month of the season and, in fact, did not start a game after April 23 at Central Florida ... May have as good a walk/strikeout ratio as any pitcher in the country ... He walked 18 and struck out 96 in 109 innings.

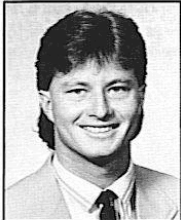

He is a valuable asset to the 1988 Seminoles because of his defensive ability and experience ... An injury last year kept him out of post-season play, but don't forget he was a starter in left field the entire 1986 season and helped carry that team to the final game of the College World Series ... Clayborne will battle for a starting role, but don't be surprised if he fills a number of needs as a utility player and defensive replacement ... he can do a lot of things well that could help the 1988 club.

1987: Filled a key role as a defensive replacement until he suffered a season-ending injury on May 2, 1987 when he made a sensational diving catch against Miami ... He missed the remainder of the season because of a severely bruised kidney ... Prior to that he played in 48 games, starting sparingly, but almost always making a late-inning appearance ... hit .259 and his only home run was a game-winner vs. Southern Mississippi.

1986: Walked on Seminole team and won starting job in left field ... hit .288 with four home runs and 25 RBIs ... one home run came against Miami relief ace Rick Raether in tough 4-3 loss in Tallahassee (4/12) ... had 15 multiple hit games, including a career high of three against Richmond (3/15) and South Carolina (5/12) ... had outstanding Metro Conference Tournament, collecting six hits in 18 at-bats (.333) and scoring four runs ... also went six for 13 in South II Regional (.462) ... spectacular diving catch against South Carolina during Metro Tournament in eighth inning snuffed out potential rally as FSU won championship game, 7-2. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Lettered three years in baseball and one in football at White High School ... MVP his senior season. **PERSONAL:** Attended Florida Junior College for two years, but did not play baseball there ... majoring in mathematics ... 22-years-old ... born 1/15/65 in Honolulu, HI.

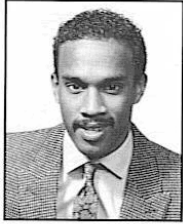

Wautugh, New York

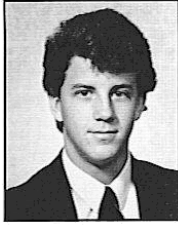

Will be making a return to his true position this season as he takes over at short after a year at third base ... he is being asked to fill a very important role on the left side of the infield as last year's shortstop, Rafael Bournigal, departs with one of the best gloves ever to play that spot at FSU ... Erickson is no stranger to the position as he enjoyed his finest collegiate season while playing short at the College of the Canyons in 1986 ... A streaky hitter, Erickson would like to improve on his .261 run last year and avoid a repeat of his 0-for-31 slump near the end of the season ... that came right on the heels of his 14-game hit streak that included five of his eight home runs.

1987: Started every ballgame, taking over the third base slot from Barry Blackwell ... Turned in a good year, perhaps a bit short of expectations both offensively and defensively ... Struggled with the bat most of the season, but went on a tear in mid April and his stats improved dramatically ... Put together a 14-game hitting streak at one point and pulled his average to near .300, but had a nose-dive late in the year ... Also showed some power during one stretch, getting his home run production up to eight for the year.

1986: Hit .417 for College of the Canyons in Los Angeles, where she had 12 home runs and 43 RBIs ... played shortstop in junior college ... two-time all-conference selection, Erickson was drafted in the 18th round by the Chicago White Sox ... good base runner, Erickson swiped 26 bases that year ... also had 13 doubles and seven triples. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Was a three-year letterman at Kennedy High School, where he was selected team MVP as a senior ... selected to All-Metro team and played in North-South state all-star game ... also lettered and earned All-American honors in soccer. **PERSONAL:** Majors in physical education at Florida State ... 22-years-old ... born 12/28/65.

The minute this big guy first walked to the plate in January of 1987 it was apparent that he would be able to help the Seminoles ... who would have ever thought he would win the team's batting title with a .382 average? ... he has the ability to carry a ballclub with his bat and its difficult to keep him out of the lineup ... coaches have been working hard on his defensive play and he may very well earn a starting position in the outfield or at first base ... If not, he'll get the nod as the team's designated hitter ... look for good power from Giordano as 22 of his 47 hits a year ago went for extra bases ... he also appears to be a big-game player as evidenced by his performance in post season play ... he went 13-for-25 with two homers and nine rbi in regional and CWS play.

1987: Another pleasant surprise of the year ... A spot starter in the outfield or as a DH, he hit better than .350 all season long ... His .382 average led the team ... he is described as a "natural hitter," who can contribute with the bat in any situation ... Giordano played more in the outfield late in the year and has shown some improvement ... not blessed with a great deal of speed ... his base-running and defense have been drawbacks with a club built on speed.

1986: Played at Brevard Junior College and was a teammate of FSU pitcher Rod Byerly there ... also played for Brevard in 1985 ... was utilized at first base and in the outfield as well as a designated hitter ... selected to the All-Tournament team at the junior college state tournament in 1985 as a designated hitter ... **HIGH SCHOOL:** Attended Piper High School in Sunrise, Florida ... selected All-Dade County in both his junior and senior years ... was named Miami Herald Player of the Year in 1983 ... **PERSONAL:** 22-years-old ... born 7/3/65.

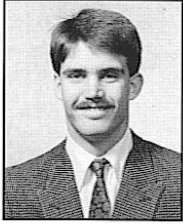

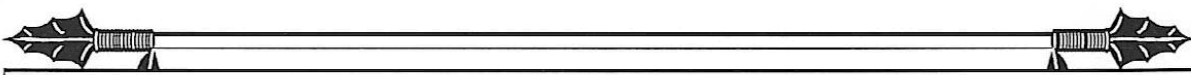
#22 JERRY NIELSEN

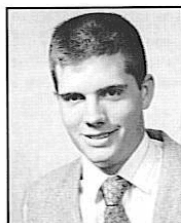

Tallahassee, Florida

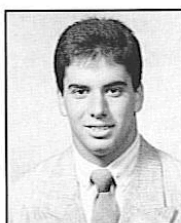

Tampa, Florida

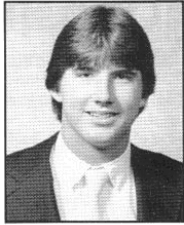

Guaynabo, Puerto Rico

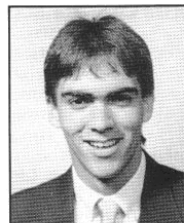
