Credential

Requests: All requests for working press, radio, television or photographers passes should be made to Assistant Sports Information Director Donna Turner as early as possible prior to game day. Credentials may be picked up prior to the date of the game at the SID Office, or held at the Will Call window for game day pickup.

Parking: Since access to Dick Howser Stadium is available through the tunnel from the Doak Campbell Stadium parking lot, parking passes are not necessary. Those with equipment

should note that the lot does fill, and should make plans to arrive early to avoid longer walks to the field.

Photographers: Accredited photographers with passes will be admitted to shoot in designated areas on the field.

Television: Facilities are available for network broadcasts. Please contact Turner at the Sports Information Office for more information.

Radio: One booth is available for the opposing team's radio broadcast. If more than one booth is needed to accommodate visiting radio crews, an area will be made available in the stadium. When such a case occurs, the visiting team's SID will allocate the booth space.

Phone Lines: Florida State has three phone lines in the main press box for media use. Visiting radio stations are required to secure their own phone service directly through Centel Telephone, (904) 681-6600. WTNT, home of the Seminole baseball broadcasts, has installed one phone line for use by visiting radio stations. Please contact WTNT's Mark Halverson at 904/386-6143 for details concerning the use of this line.

Press Box Services: The FSU Sports Information Office provides scorecards, rosters and updated statistics at

all games. A complete box score will be available approximately 15 minutes after the conclusion of each game. A FAX machine is available in the nearby Sports Information Office.

Interviews: Florida State players will be available to the media prior to and during batting practice. FSU Head Coach Mike Martin and his players will be available for post-game interviews approximately 10 minutes after each game. Please contact Donna Turner or Joey Ferolito of the FSU SID office to arrange off-day player interviews. Contact Coach Martin directly at 904/644-1073 to arrange interviews with him.

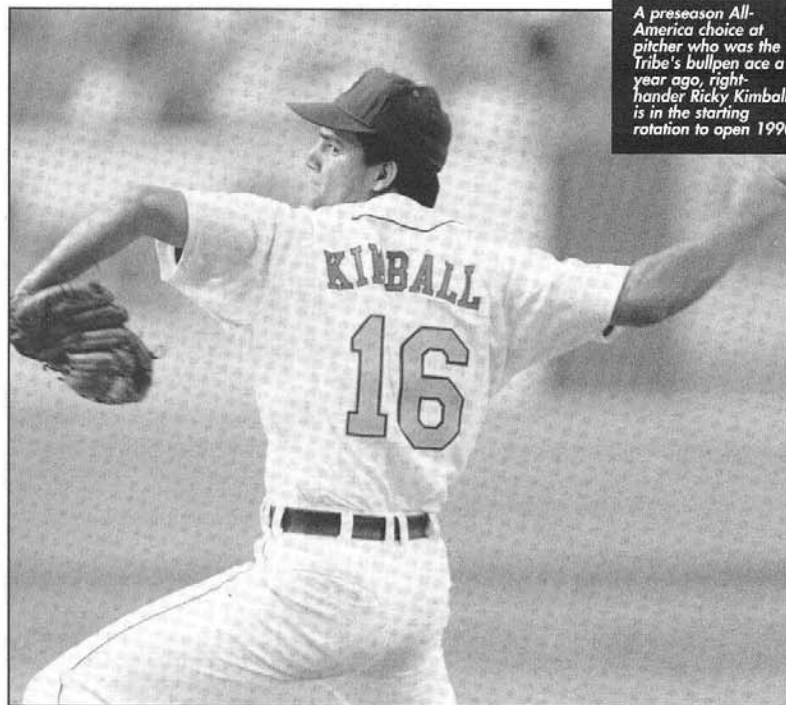

FSU Head Coach Mike Martin could be forgiven for scratching his head and checking his date book when opening practice with his 1990 Seminoles in January. Martin probably felt as if he had stepped back in time — one year back — to January of 1989.

The names and faces that greeted Martin this January sounded strangely familiar to the 11th year mentor of the Seminoles. And reassuringly familiar as well. They were, with a few exceptions, the same names that made up Martin's roster in 1989.

Names like Finnfold, Ronan, Parker, Cribb, Kimball, Gregory, Brady, Reboin, Bargas, Gilliland, Rau, Grifol, Brock and Bevis, to list just a few.

Some things had changed, though. Back in 1989, Martin looked at his roster of one senior, a handful of solid returnees and 15 newcomers, and wondered what kind of a team he had and how far they could go.

This year that group returns, having provided one of the surprises of collegiate baseball in '89 by not only winning the NCAA Atlantic Regional, but taking third place at the College World Series.

"1989 is gone, but it was definitely one of the most enjoyable years I've ever had as a coach," Martin said. "We hope to

duplicate that success and add two more wins in 1990. This year is one of the biggest challenges we've faced in that so much is expected of this ballclub."

Of course, a few names are no longer on the roster. Clyde Keller, who used his perplexing palmball to win 13 games, and Tim Nedin took their talents, and 19 wins of a year ago, to the pros.

Replacing Keller and Nedin, though, are three new faces who comprised what one baseball publication called the best recruiting class in the nation in 1989. The three — Chris Roberts, Kenny Felder and Roger Bailey — will make an immediate impact this season.

"Roberts, Felder and Bailey are definitely going to push some of our veterans," Martin said. "The depth of the club is pretty good at most positions, but we must avoid key injuries."

Roberts and Felder have made FSU history already. A pair of second-round picks in the June '89 professional draft, they

are the highest draft choices to ever play for FSU. Roberts, a pitcher/outfielder from Middleburg, Fla., earned a spot in the starting rotation with his performance in the fall, and is a leading candidate to start in right field when not on the mound. Felder, a quarterback for the FSU football team, has displayed tremendous power in preseason practices, and looks to earn the starting nod in left.

Meanwhile Bailey, a local product from Chattahoochee, Fla., has been a pleasant surprise with his talent on the mound. He will contribute in 1990.

The starters of 1989 will have to contend with this class of newcomers to regain their starting positions this season.

Needless to say, it's a situation Martin relishes. Returning starters at every infield and outfield position, and on the starting rotation and in the bullpen, is the main reason the Seminoles were a consensus preseason number one choice. Healthy competition at many spots, as younger

players challenge the seniors, should make FSU that much tougher.

"With as many returning players as we have, we must guard against complacency," Martin said. "Last year, a lot of things went our way as a result of togetherness and hustle. We must continue that. This ballclub has a chance to compete for the national championship and that is our goal."

To reach that goal, FSU must get through what Martin called the toughest schedule a Florida State team has ever faced.

It's tough right off the bat, too, with the Seminoles traveling to Orlando in the second week of the season to take on two other participants in the 1989 College World Series at the ABCA Hall of Fame Tournament. Series with Western powers Arizona and Arizona State are also on the schedule, as well as bouts with in-state rivals Florida, Jacksonville and Miami. The increasingly tougher Metro Conference slate has South Carolina, Virginia Tech and conference returnee Tulane to challenge FSU's hold on the title.

THE PITCHING STAFF

Although all the roles of the eight-man Seminole pitching staff have not been defined, it doesn't take long to see the group has talent. Last year, FSU had the lowest team earned run average in the nation at 3.06, and eight members of that staff return.

On the mound, the Tribe is led by preseason All-America choice Ricky Kimball. Kimball was 5-2 with nine saves as FSU's bullpen ace last season. He will be given a shot in the rotation to start the year after a successful summer as a member of the USA National Team.

Joining Kimball in the starting rotation are 10-game winner Finnfold, an Academic All-America in '89 and Roberts, named the top high school athlete in the state by *USA Today*.

With Kimball moved into the starter's spot, Brad Gregory becomes a short relief specialist. Gregory, who won seven games as FSU's number three starter last year, and Scott Steinitz, who came on to pitch well at the close of 1989, will share short relief duties from the right side.

Righthander Pat Underhill and lefthander Matt Dunbar, coming back off arm problems in '89, are slated for long relief jobs in 1990.

Three "swing men" will be extremely important to the success of the pitching staff. Seniors Gary Painter and Mike Brady, from the right and left side, respectively, and freshman righthander Roger Bailey, will see duty as spot starters, long relievers and short relievers as needed.

THE INFELDERS

The infield is one place where Semi-

nole newcomers have not made an impact. The line-up on opening day will feature the same players that ended the season in Omaha.

At first base, FSU's leading hitter of a year ago, Bob Reboin, is back. Reboin hit .353 and played well defensively to make a name for himself on the '89 team. Originally signed as a defensive specialist, Reboin's hitting prowess was a bonus.

Junior Buddy Cribb, a power-hitting lefthander, and sophomore Eduardo Perez, who moved from the outfield, will also see playing time at first. Perez has picked up his new position quickly, while Cribb's bat will probably be in the line-up.

At second, incumbent Rocky Rau and speedy sophomore Allen Bevis have staged a preseason battle. Rau ended 1989 as the Seminoles' hottest hitter, and was the lone FSU representative on the College World Series All-Tournament team. Bevis started 31 games as a freshman, and stole 25 bases in 29 attempts. The second base job is in good hands with these two as both are steady fielders who can make the pivot at second.

Marianna's Brian Gilliland, one of the most underrated shortstops in the nation, returns as well. He played in a team-leading 70 games in 1989, and hit .330 in addition to his consistent fielding. According to Martin, Gilliland, with many pressure hits, was a key ingredient to last year's success. Garrett Blanton moves over from third to back up Gilliland, and Rau can play short if needed.

A steady switch-hitting senior, Rob Bargas, handles the third base job again in '89. Bargas hit .328 and led the Seminoles in hits, doubles and sac hits. A solid fielder, he also can make the spectacular play at the hot corner. Another senior, John Marc Tamayo, moves from the outfield where he played in '89, to back up Bargas.

THE CATCHERS

As a freshman, Pedro Grifol earned the starting catcher's job early in the season to provide the cornerstone of FSU's defense. With only 11 errors in over 500 chances, his fielding average was better than 98 percent. He also proved to be an excellent backstop with a flare for handling pitchers. In 1990, the Miami native looks to be even better, helped by the loss of 25 pounds off his 6-0 frame.

Marc Ronan, the Seminoles' starting centerfielder last year, will see more playing time at catcher in '90. An excellent receiver, he will spell Grifol behind the plate.

THE OUTFIELDERS

The most intense preseason competition took place in the outfield where newcomers Roberts and Felder made their presence known, although four returnees

made this a strong area already. An outfield line-up featuring the pair of second round draft choices flanking Ronan is a definite possibility.

In centerfield, Ronan has secured the top spot. A quick fielder with excellent range and a good arm, Ronan provided strength up the middle when moved from behind the plate last season. The junior was also a key member of the FSU offense, batting .309 in the number two spot, and leading the Metro Conference in steals with 43 in 48 attempts. He gives the outfield stability. Speedy newcomer Terrell Buckley, on loan from the Seminole football team where he returned punts, is Ronan's backup in center.

In leftfield, another football player, Kenny Felder, has battled incumbent Brad Parker for the starting job throughout the preseason. Both have good power - Parker led FSU with 15 homeruns in 1989 - but at 6-3, 215 pounds, Felder can crush the ball. Parker played the final third of 1989 as the starter in left, coming over from first base, and has improved defensively. Felder possesses a great arm. They give FSU a potent twosome in left, and either could be called on to DH to get their bats into the game.

Rightfield will be manned by a pair of Chris' - freshman Roberts and sophomore Brock. Roberts is one of the top recruits to ever attend FSU, and his bat and strong arm make him a double threat as a pitcher and outfielder. Brock came on as a freshman to earn the starting rightfielder's job - hitting .333 and leading all FSU outfielders in assists with nine.

Junior Dean Harrison is also competing for playing time in right. Used primarily as a lefthanded pinch hitter off the bench last year, he will fill the same role in '90 in addition to battling the two youngsters for starting duties.

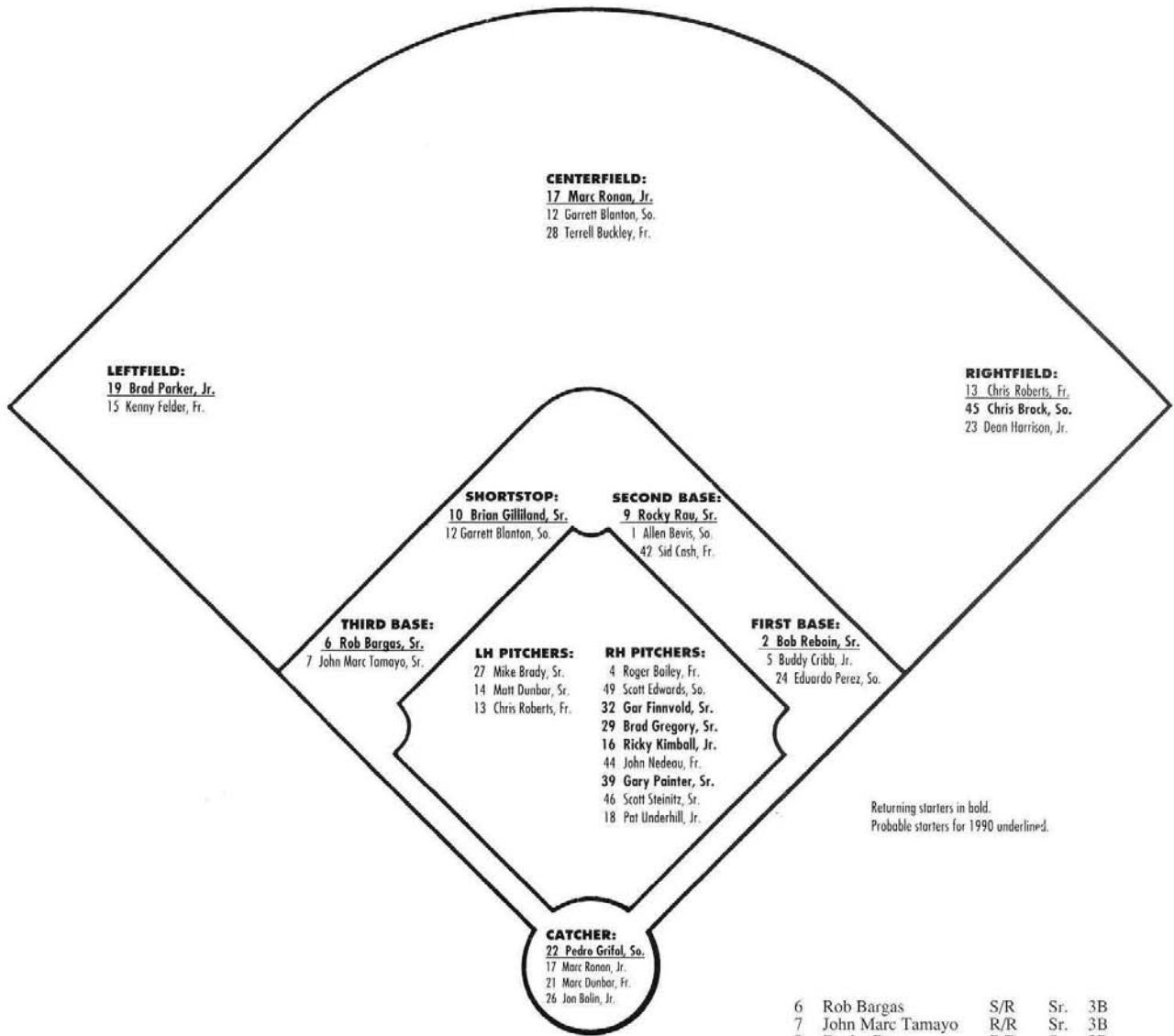
In contrast to last season, when little was expected of the Seminoles, Mike Martin's 1990 squad enters the season with high expectations as the preseason number one team.

The differences between the two teams end there, though. With the same everyday lineup, the added experience of the returnees, the return of most of the pitching staff and the addition of three top-notch freshmen, FSU looks to add to its tremendous baseball tradition in 1990.

"Using great pitching, speed, and defense is the way we will continue to try and play in 1990," said Seminole Head Coach Mike Martin, the fourth-winningest active coach in collegiate baseball. "It's baseball the FSU way."

Heading into a new decade, no one would argue it's also a winning way.
