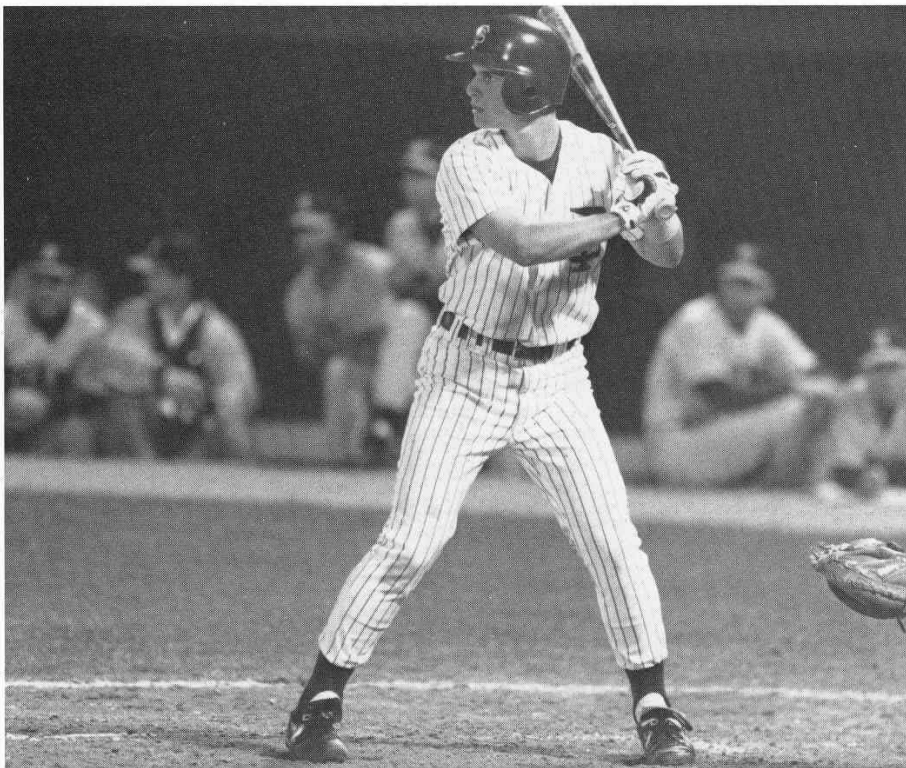
starting at shortstop in all but one...after hitting .265 as a freshman, Jarrett led the Seminoles with a .325 average in 1992...

doubled 25 times to lead the ACC...one of five switch-hitters on this year's team...a steady gloveman with good range and an accurate arm...makes the routine play as well as anyone...benefited greatly from work with assistant track coach Tom Shaw in the summer of 1991 to improve his speed on the bases and around short...**1992:** FSU's most improved offensive player in 1992...opened the season with a career-high four hits vs. Charleston (2/1)...finished second on the team with 81 hits...hit .438 (7-16) at the ACC Tournament to lead the Seminoles...25

doubles were just 4 short of FSU record...had 29 extra base hits, including two triples and two home runs...had 22 multiple-hit games, including six three-hit games...led the team in assists with 215...with improved arm-strength and range, committed just 25 errors in 330 chances (.924)...had just five errors in FSU's last 26 games, 116 chances (.957)...hit first career home run in a 9-4 win at Wake Forest (4/18)...also homered to lead off FSU's 4-3 win over Western Carolina that forced a deciding game at the South II Regional...hit the first pitch of the game over the right field screen as FSU beat WCU twice to advance to the College World Series...blasted a lead off double and scored the game's only run in a 1-0 win over N.C. State at the ACC Tournament...**1991:** Became the first freshman to earn the starting job at shortstop in Mike Martin's 17 years as a coach at Florida State...played consistent defensively while his offensive talents were a surprise...hit .265 with eight doubles and 18 RBI while scoring 41 runs...provided steady defense at shortstop with only 20 errors in 250 chances for a fielding percentage of .920 — a marked improvement over the previous season when FSU's shortstop combination made 39

miscues...in on 39 double plays...in post-season play, hit .333 (12-36), scored nine runs and drove in six...at the Atlantic Regional tournament, picked up four hits in 14 at bats and drove in a pair...scored four runs in FSU's 13-12 comeback win over Cincinnati in the Metro Tournament...named to the Metro Conference All-Tournament team...tallied 13 multi-hit games and three times picked up three hits in a game...his 10th-inning sacrifice fly against Arizona State scored Eduardo Perez and gave FSU a sweep of the series with the Sun Devils...**PREP:** A 2A first-team all-state choice as a utility infielder his senior year...played in two state championship games and one Final Four (1988-89-90) while at Florida High...MVP of the Florida High team his senior year...invited to play in the Florida Athletic Coaches Association all-star Series...hit .395 and drove in 32 runs his final season...as a pitcher, went 10-2 with 69 strikeouts and a 1.27 earned run average in 71.2 innings of work...all-Big Bend





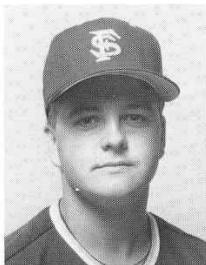

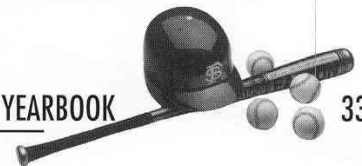

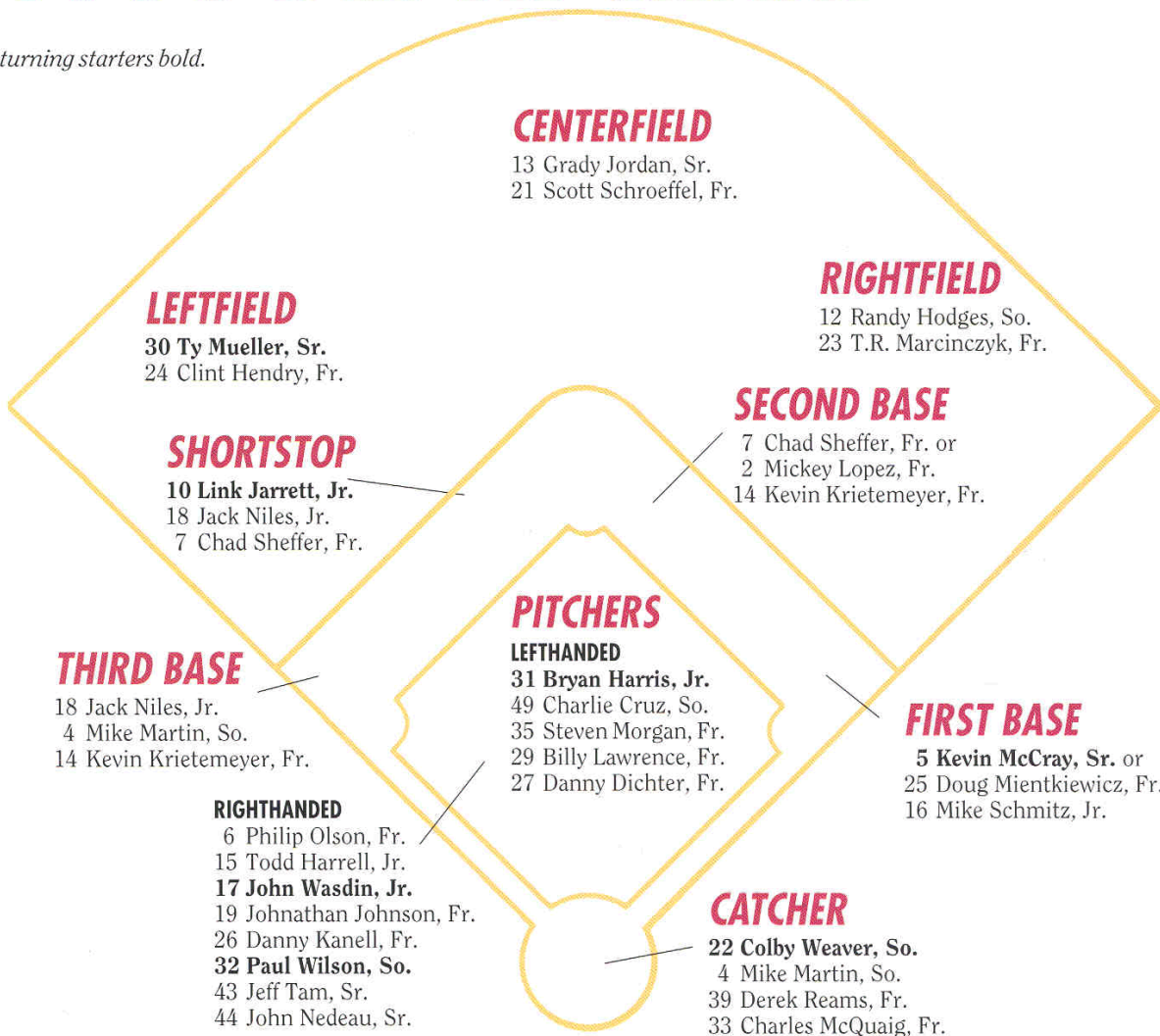
