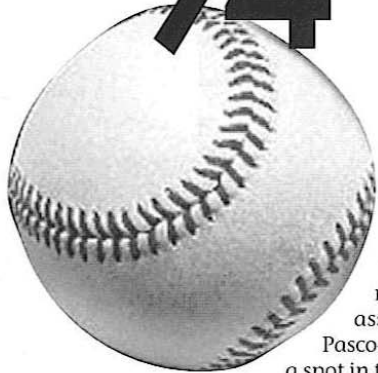

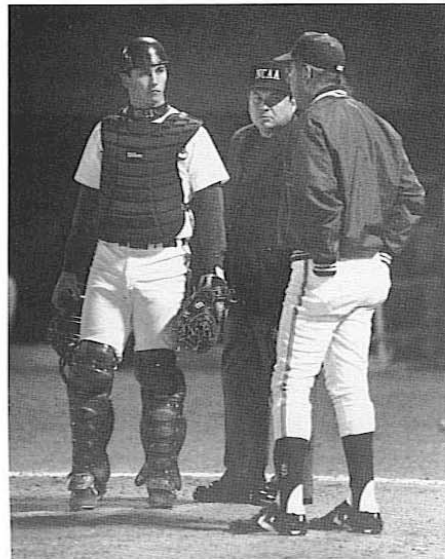

Miami (Westminster Christian)

Another prize recruit out of Miami Westminster Christian...joins former prep teammates Mickey Lopez and Doug Mientkiewicz at Florida State...a big, strong athlete with unlimited potential...a versatile player, Butler will be used as a pitcher, designated hitter and first baseman...has proven to be a winner at all levels...played for Junior Team USA the past two summers...used the fall to correct mechanical flaws on the mound...PREP: A two-time prep All-American...also earned all-state honors in '92 and '93...as a junior, won Dade County Player of the Year honors after helping Westminster Christian to the national championship...hit .380 with six homers and 30 RBI and was 13-0 on the hill, with an ERA of 0.88...went 9-4 last year with a 1.02 ERA and 105 strikeouts...hit .400 with six home runs and 35 RBI...played five years of varsity

baseball and also earned three letters as a swimmer...PERSONAL: Enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program...born June 13, 1975.

a freshman...scored his only interception of the season in the Florida game...PREP: A first-team 4A all-state selection out of South Miami HS...an honorable mention All-American pick by *USA Today* and *Baseball America*...hit .403 with 33 stolen bases and 29 RBI as a senior...swiped 27 bases as a junior, hit .365 and drove in 36 runs...PERSONAL: Nephew of former NFL standout Neal Colzie...plans to major in sports management...born December 8, 1974.

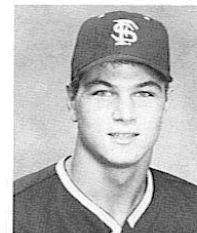
#49 CHARLIE CRUZ, LHP

Miami (North Miami Senior)

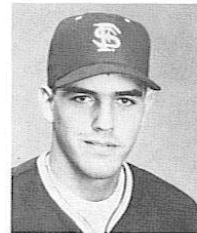
Proved himself late last season as a go-to-guy out of the bullpen...can be used in any capacity, as a starter and a reliever...lefty with a hard curve ball and deceptive speed...had a good summer playing in both the Valley and Cape Cod summer leagues...led the Valley League with 78 K's while posting a 5-3 record and 2.97 ERA...helped the Orleans Cardinals to the Cape Cod League title...As a Sophomore in 1993: Used primarily as a set-up man out of the bullpen...appeared in 20 games, including two in the NCAA East Regional...pinned with a loss in his only decision of the year in FSU's 4-3 loss to Notre Dame (5/29)...best performance came at the ACC Tournament, when he recorded his second save of the year against Clemson...struck out a season-high eight batters in 3.2 innings of work enabling FSU to move into the championship bracket...pitched the ninth inning of a 7-4 win over No. Iowa for his first save...As a Freshman in 1992: Gained strength and valuable experience, making eight relief appearances with no decisions...posted a 2.35 ERA with 18 strikeouts in 15.1 innings of work...came out of the pen in six ACC games, tying Tim Davis for team high in that category...fanned 12 in nine innings...held opposing hitters to a .210 average...PREP: A 1991 first-team all-state selection at North Miami HS...also named Dade County Player of the Year by the Miami Herald...a three-year starter, Cruz was team MVP in '91...competed in the Sunbelt Classic and the Florida all-star game...selected to the Ted Williams Classic all-tournament team...PERSONAL: Majoring in social science...nicknamed "Cruz-Control"...born October 18, 1973.

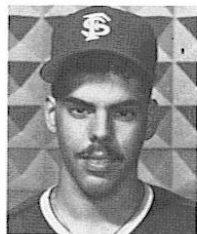

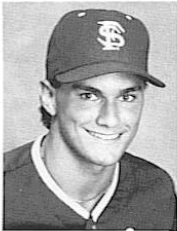
#15 TODD HARRELL, RHP

Tallahassee (Gulf Coast CC)

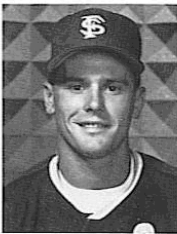

in the fall...enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program...born June 15, 1974.

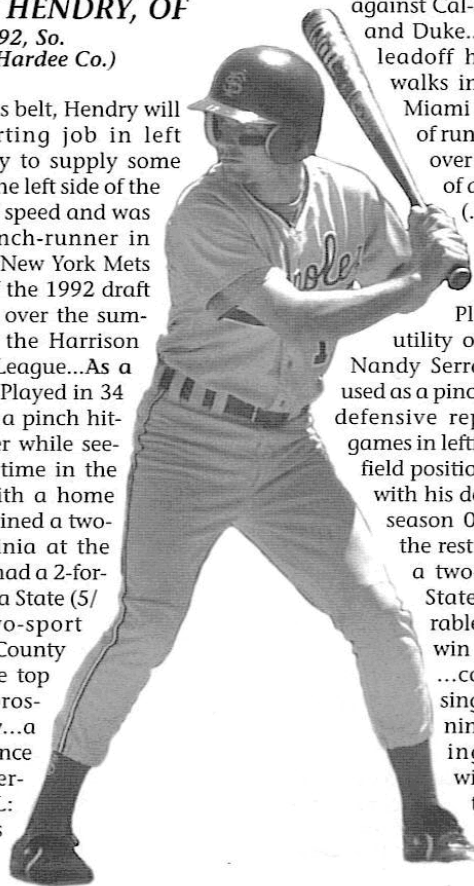
#14 RANDY HODGES, RF

An aggressive, experienced veteran who will be looked to for leadership...enters the season as the starter in right field...FSU's most experienced outfielder...has good defensive instincts and a strong, accurate arm...always goes all out, whether it's attempting the diving catch in the outfield or trying to take an extra base...a solid, patient hitter from the left side...will wear number 14 this year after two years as number 12...As A Sophomore in 1993: Became the every day starter in right field during the Miami series in early April and started 28 of the last 30 games...hit in 22 of the last 27 games (27-for-84, .321)...made a game-saving catch at the wall in the 7th inning of FSU's 5-2 win over Ga. Tech...hit three home runs in the first half of the season...batted .295 in 64 games with three home runs and 30 RBI...homered

against Cal-State Fullerton, No. Iowa and Duke...spent some time as the leadoff hitter and worked four walks in the series opener with Miami (4/9)...doubled in a pair of runs to give FSU a 13-10 lead over Miami in the 10th inning of a 14-13 loss...was 7-for-10 (.700) over a three-game stretch vs. WFU, Mercer, and Jacksonville...As a Freshman in 1992:

Played in 49 games as a utility outfielder and backup to Nandy Serrano at third base...also used as a pinch-runner and late-inning defensive replacement...started 11 games in leftfield, played all three outfield positions and saved two games with his defensive play...began the season 0-for-11, but batted .314 the rest of the way...first hit was a two-run single vs. Georgia State (3/19)...had a memorable afternoon in FSU's only win vs. Miami (4/26) in 1992...contributed a pinch-hit single that drove in the winning run and made a diving, game-saving catch with two outs in the ninth to preserve FSU's 3-2 win, the 700th win of Mike Martin's career...threw

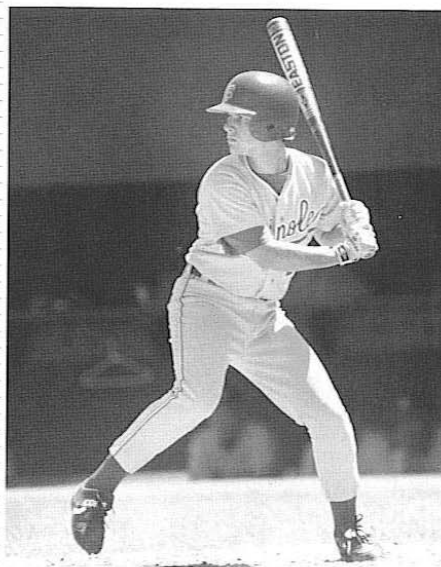

State at the ACC

One of two freshman recruited to the program out of Leon High in Tallahassee...slated for duty as a middle reliever...has a sharp curve, a hard slider and a fastball clocked in the 82-86 range...impressed the coaching staff in the fall...a focused, poised competitor...had a busy summer playing for Team Florida and Tallahassee Post 13...PREP: Led Leon to the state championship game...was named the Class 3A player of the year after posting an 11-1 record and 0.48 ERA...went 8-1 on the hill with a 1.40 ERA as a junior...was named all-Big Bend and Leon's most valuable pitcher after each of his three seasons under former Seminole Greg Jones...PERSONAL: Enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program while deciding on a major...born August 14, 1974.

Tallahassee (Florida High)

One of the best defensive shortstops in the nation and one of the most consistent to ever play at Florida State...a three-year starter at FSU...was named a second-team NCBWA All-American in 1993 for his defensive prowess...gets a great first step and makes the tough play look routine thanks in part to an accurate arm...a switch-hitter who can hit in any spot in the batting order...coaches expect Jarrett to return to the form that saw him lead the team with a .325 average in 1992 and an

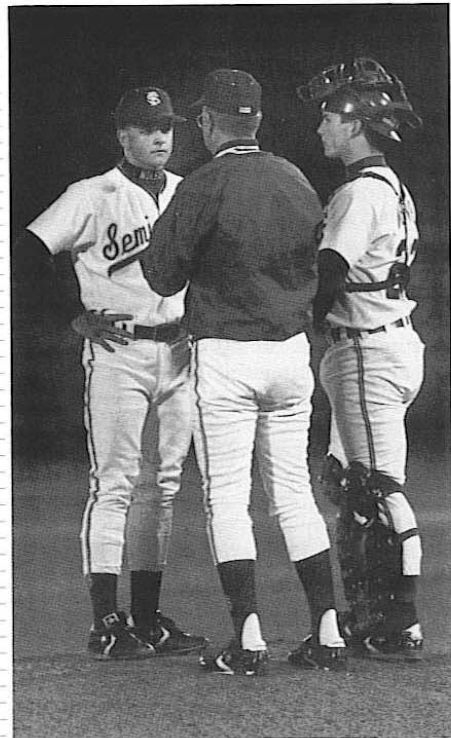

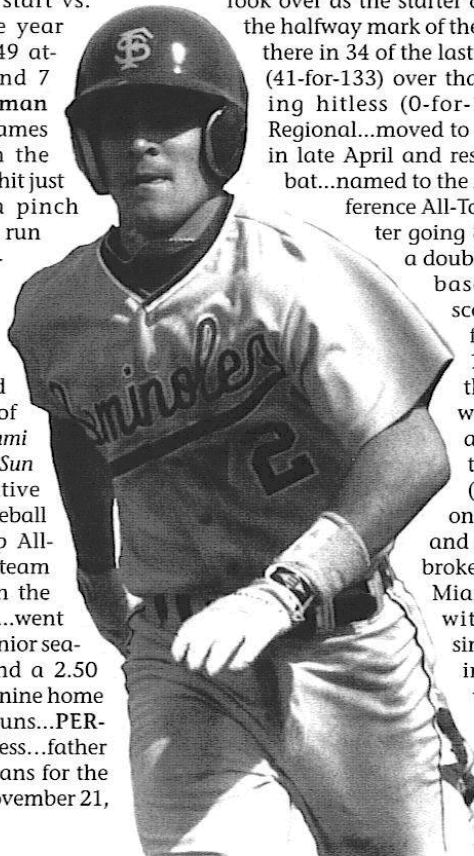

named ACC Rookie of the Year in '93...a confident pitcher with a live fastball and a big-breaking curve...also found great success a year ago with the change-up...invited to Team USA trials at the conclusion of last season and again this past fall...As a Freshman in 1993: Earned a spot in the starting rotation early in the season...solidified that role by winning five consecutive starts, compiling a 0.83 ERA over that span...ranked among the nation's ERA leaders all season...won 10 of his 13 starts, firing three complete games...went nine innings four times, including a 13 strikeout performance in FSU's extra inning win over Notre Dame in the NCAA East Regional...named to the all-tournament team after his dominating performance...combined with Phil Olson for a shutout of Wake Forest (4/17), fanning 11 in eight in-nings...allowed only four hits and struck out eight in beating Miami (4/10)...went the distance in a 17-3 win at Georgia Tech (4/3)...relieved John Wasdin in the series finale at NC State and kept FSU close with four innings of three-hit work on just three days rest...beat Duke 3-1, striking out 10 and allowing an unearned run in the ninth...fired a complete-game shutout vs. Northern Iowa (3/19) fanning a career- and FSU season-high 14...did not allow a Panther baserunner to reach third base while becom

ing the first FSU freshman to hurl a complete-game shutout since David Sorokowski blanked Iowa in 1988...fanned 10 and yielded just two hits over seven innings in his first career start vs. Appalachian State (2/17) ...PREP: High School Player of the Year in the Ocala area in 1992...an all-area selection in both '91 and '92...PERSONAL: Plans to major in special education...born July 16, 1974.

Ft. Lauderdale (Westminster Academy)

Will battle for a spot in the line-up after joining the squad in January...coaches hope Kanell will provide needed pop in the batting order...could find himself in the DH spot on opening day...an important piece of the puzzle, according to Mike Martin...can play first base and in the outfield...selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 19th round of the 1992 draft...backed up Charlie Ward at quarterback each of the past two seasons and has also served as the holder for kicks...led FSU to a 49-20 win by completing 28 of 38 passes for 341 yards in his only start vs. Maryland...finished the year with 36 completions in 49 attempts for 499 yards and 7 touchdowns...As a Freshman in 1993: Played in 23 games while sharing time with the football team...as a result, hit just .182...used mostly as a pinch hitter...hit his only home run in an 11-2 win over Mercer (3/31)...PREP: Played high school ball for former major leaguer Tommy John at Westminster Academy...named Broward County Player of the Year by both the *Miami Herald* and *Ft. 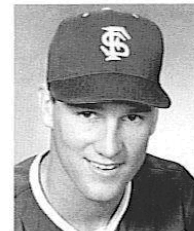

Should be the starter opening day behind home plate...one of the top returning catchers in the country...a solid backstop with excellent knowledge of the game...equally impressive at the plate, Martin hit .307 last year with five home runs and 43 RBI...has an outstanding arm, good speed and a quick bat... will also be used at third base and in the DH spot...a 1993 Team USA selection, Martin injured his knee last summer while touring with the team...underwent surgery in the summer, and again in late November...had torn cartilage sown together in June, and had cartilage and scar tissue removed late in the fall...while undergoing rehab, managed to work out some in the fall...As a Sophomore in 1993: Iron man for the Seminoles, starting 52 of the last 56 games behind the dish ...won the catching duties during the Fullerton series after opening the season at third base...quickly became the Tribe's top backstop since Pedro Grifol...lined a clutch, 10th-inning home run to tie the score at 5-5 in FSU's 7-5, 12-inning win over Central Florida...ACC Player of the Week (3/15) after a 6-for-16 performance that week that included 5 RBI... carried the team's longest hitting streak of the year at 14 games, hitting .426 (23-for-54) over the streak...gunned down a pair of Clemson runners and picked off two more in a splendid performance in FSU's 7-6 loss on 5/7...went 5-for-17 (.294) in the ACC Tournament and followed with a 4-for-5 series against Georgia State that included a home run, five runs scored and five RBI...led the team with seven sacrifice flies and 44 runs scored...also among the team leaders in hits (65-2nd), RBI (43-T2nd) and average (.307)...JUCO: An all-con-
