Sports Magazine's pre-season All-American teams...one of three Seminoles to play on the 1994 USA Baseball Team this past summer...compiled a team-low 1.54 ERA in 58.3 innings of work...struck out 53 batters to lead the staff en route to 6-3 mark...another in a long line of hard-throwing right-handers to attend FSU...also possesses a sharp curve and great off-speed pitch...1993 Atlantic Coast Conference Rookie of the Year...has a career record of 22-2 with a 2.44 ERA...a Baseball America Freshman of the Year...selected in the 34th round by the Montreal Expos out of high school...1994 as a Sophomore: A second team All-ACC selection and third-team Collegiate Baseball/Mizuno All-American...Florida State's number two starter... emerged as the staff's go-to guy in May, posting all five FSU wins during the last three weeks of the season...went 6-0 vs. the ACC...one of three FSU pitchers listed among the conference's top-four in earned run average...ERA of 3.17 was fourth best in the league...checked in among the conference leaders in wins (3rd-12), strikeouts (3rd-137), innings pitched (4th-112), strikeouts per nine innings (5th-10.11), hits per nine innings (4th-7.23) and opponents

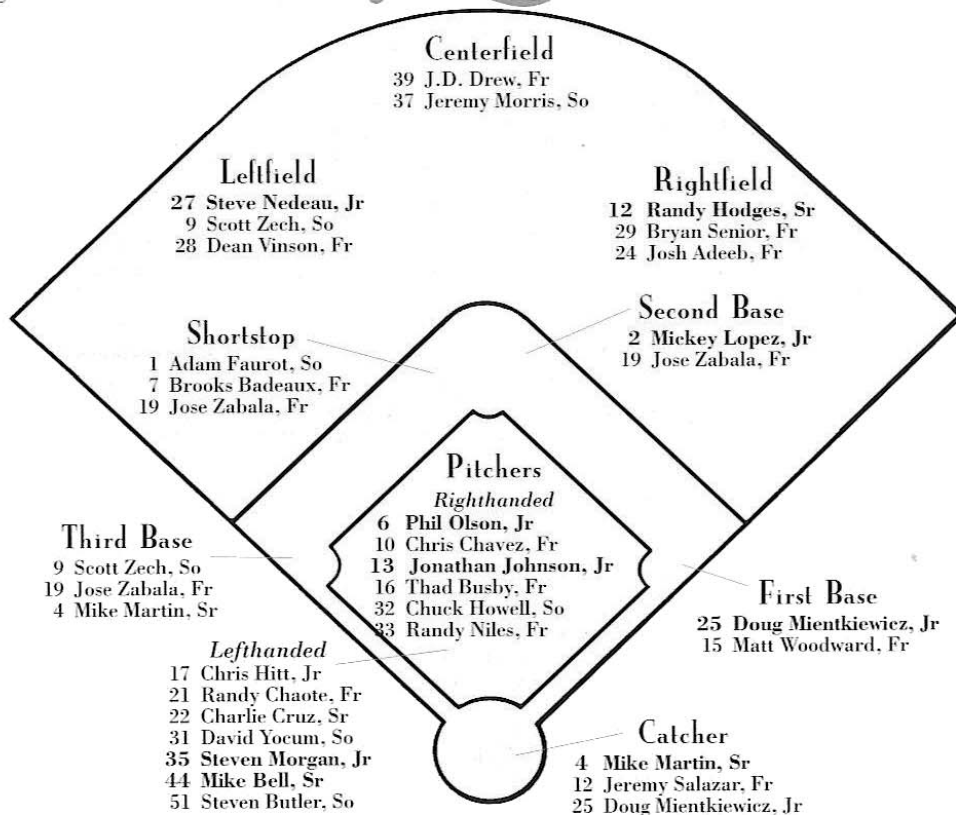
