

After failing to advance to the College World Series for the first time in three years, the Florida State Seminoles were hopeful that 1994 would provide the program with its 13th trip to the CWS. Returning 15 letterwinners from the '93 club and one of the top pitching tandems in the nation in Paul Wilson and Jonathan Johnson, hope reined supreme in Tallahassee.

The Seminoles began the year ranked second and fourth in the *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball* preseason polls, respectively. Coupled with the return of seven position players and five pitchers, FSU kicked off the campaign with a recruiting class ranked third in the nation.

And the 1994 edition of Seminole baseball did not disappoint. The Tribe started the year with a seven game road trip to "Paradise." Preseason All-American Paul Wilson led the Seminoles to an 11-3 season-opening win over the University of Hawaii as FSU posted a 5-2 mark during their Hawaiian tour. Doug Mientkiewicz delivered the big blow with a dramatic two-out, ninth inning grand slam as FSU rallied for a 6-4 come-from-behind triumph in Game 2.

Florida State was immediately put to the test upon its return home as the highly-ranked Arizona State Sun Devils came calling. Playing 21 of its next 23 games in front of the home crowd, FSU proved to be for real as the Seminoles swept ASU. Mientkiewicz and Mickey Lopez supplied FSU's firepower as the duo combined to score nine

runs and knock in seven RBI. The Seminoles continued their impressive play in running their home record to 9-0 with sweeps of Minnesota and Coastal Carolina. The FSU offense was running on all cylinders as the Seminoles scored 92 runs in nine games. Paul Wilson also improved his record to 4-1 with a one-hit shutout over Coastal Carolina.

Florida State's season-best 11-game win streak came to a halt when arch-rival Florida blanked the Tribe 4-0 in the first game of the teams four-game home-and-home series. Florida pitcher Rob Bannano held the Seminoles to a season-low one hit in picking up the shutout.

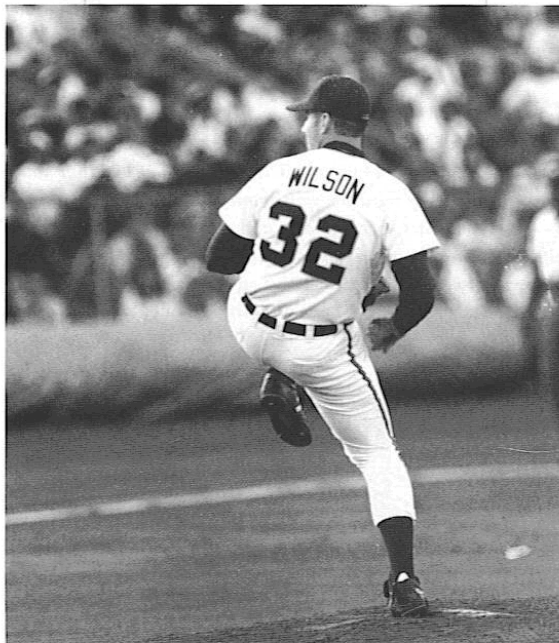
Led by the pitching of Jonathan Johnson and Scooby Morgan, the Seminoles rebounded to win the next two games before dropping Game 4 for a series split.

The College of Charleston shocked the Seminoles with a 3-0 win to start their series before FSU awoke for a pair of shutout victories over the Cougars. In the midst of twelve straight home games, the Tribe went 9-3. After the opening game lost to College of Charleston, the Seminoles went on an eight-game winning streak, improving their record to 24-5. The Seminoles swept SE Missouri State and UNC-Asheville along the way.

Picked to finish second in the Atlantic Coast Conference in a preseason poll of league coaches, the Seminoles opened their ACC schedule at home against Maryland. In the first two

games the tandem of Wilson and Johnson threw a pair of two-hitters as the Tribe took 5-2 and 6-0 decisions. The Terps extracted some revenge in Game 3 with a 15-hit attack and a 6-4 victory.

Florida State then embarked on a six-game road trip to the Carolinas. Wake Forest proved to be little more than a small bump in the road as the Seminoles pounded out 55 hits and scored no less than 12 runs in each game for the sweep. In Game 3 of the series FSU shelled Demon Deacon pitching for a season-high 22 hits. The contest also saw the Tribe plate 11 runs in the seventh inning.

Then it was on to North Carolina where rain forced the cancellation of the series' third game. In Game 1 FSU's David Yocum and UNC's Thad Crismon engaged in a classic pitchers duel with the Tar Heels coming out on top, 3-2. The Seminoles salvaged a split when Doug Mientkiewicz' home run led a 12 hit attack and a 9-5 triumph.

In the midst of an 18-game hitting streak, Link Jarrett fueled a sweep of N.C. State. With its winning combination of pitching and defense FSU eked out 3-2, 2-1 and 8-7 decisions over the Wolfpack. The victories improved FSU's record to 31-7 and landed the Seminoles the number one ranking in the *Baseball America* weekly poll.

The Seminoles prepared for their annual series with the University of Miami with a victory over Jacksonville. Junior pitcher Mike Bell held JU to one run and scattered seven hits as the Seminoles cruised to a 6-1 win.

The No. 1 ranked Seminoles hosted the fifth ranked Hurricanes in the biggest home-and-home

series of the year. The Tribe took the opener 6-3, in front of a season-high of 5,524 Dick Houser Stadium fans. The tables turned over the next two games as Jonathan Johnson suffered his only loss of the year in dropping a 5-1 decision to the Hurricanes. The next day Lady Luck was still wearing Orange & Green as the 'Canes doubled up on the Tribe 2-1.

Before travelling to South Florida for the rematch, the Seminoles entertained the Houser Stadium faithful to an 11-0 thumping of Mercer.

Paul Wilson continued his mastery of Miami in beating the 'Canes for the second time in a week by scattering five hits and leading FSU to a 6-1 victory. Miami pitcher Eric Morgan shutout the Seminoles in Game 2, 8-0. And as he predicted after his loss to Miami at home, Jonathan Johnson came back to beat UM as his Seminole teammates parlayed five Hurricane errors into three runs for a 7-2 decision.

After a disappointing loss to Jacksonville, the Seminoles returned to their winning ways with a pair of shutout victories over Furman.

The Tribe returned to conference play when the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets brought their potent offensive attack to Tallahassee. The Yellow Jackets took two-out-of-three from FSU in becoming college baseball's top-ranked team.

The slump would continue as FSU lost seven of its next nine ball games. The Seminoles closed out ACC regular season play by dropping two-of-three to Duke and

Clemson before rebounding for a pair of wins at Virginia.

The Seminoles' 14-9, fourth place ACC finish matched them up with N.C. State in Round 1 of the Atlantic Coast Conference championship tournament.

Perhaps looking ahead, head coach Mike Martin named Charlie Cruz, a surprise starter, to take the hill against the Wolfpack. The gamble nearly paid off as FSU fell into the losers bracket by dropping a 6-5 decision.

Florida State then made conference history by coming out of the losers bracket to advance into the championship game where they would face the Clemson Tigers. Along the way the Tribe beat Maryland (7-1), Wake Forest (18-3), Clemson (10-4), and N.C. State (7-4).

In a sign of things to come starting pitcher David Yocum twisted his ankle covering first and was forced to leave in the third inning. Steve Butler, on in relief of Yocum, surrendered a sixth inning two-run HR to tournament MVP Shane Monahan as the Tigers captured the conference title with a 4-1 victory.

For the 11th time in 12 years Florida State hosted NCAA Regional action. The Seminoles entered the Atlantic II Tournament as the No. 2 seed. After disposing of Central Michigan (8-6), and Jacksonville (5-1, 5-1), Florida State found itself matched up against fifth seeded BYU in the championship.

Tournament MVP Mike Martin lined a three-run homer to right in the fifth and Doug Mientkiewicz had three hits, as the pair provided all the offense Mike Bell would need in going the distance for a 7-1 win.

Making their sixth pilgrimage to Omaha in the last nine years the Seminoles got by opening round foe LSU, 6-3, to set up a showdown with conference-rival Georgia Tech.

The Yellow Jackets scored eight unanswered runs in the 10th inning to take a 12-4 triumph and put FSU on the brink of elimination.

In what proved to be their final

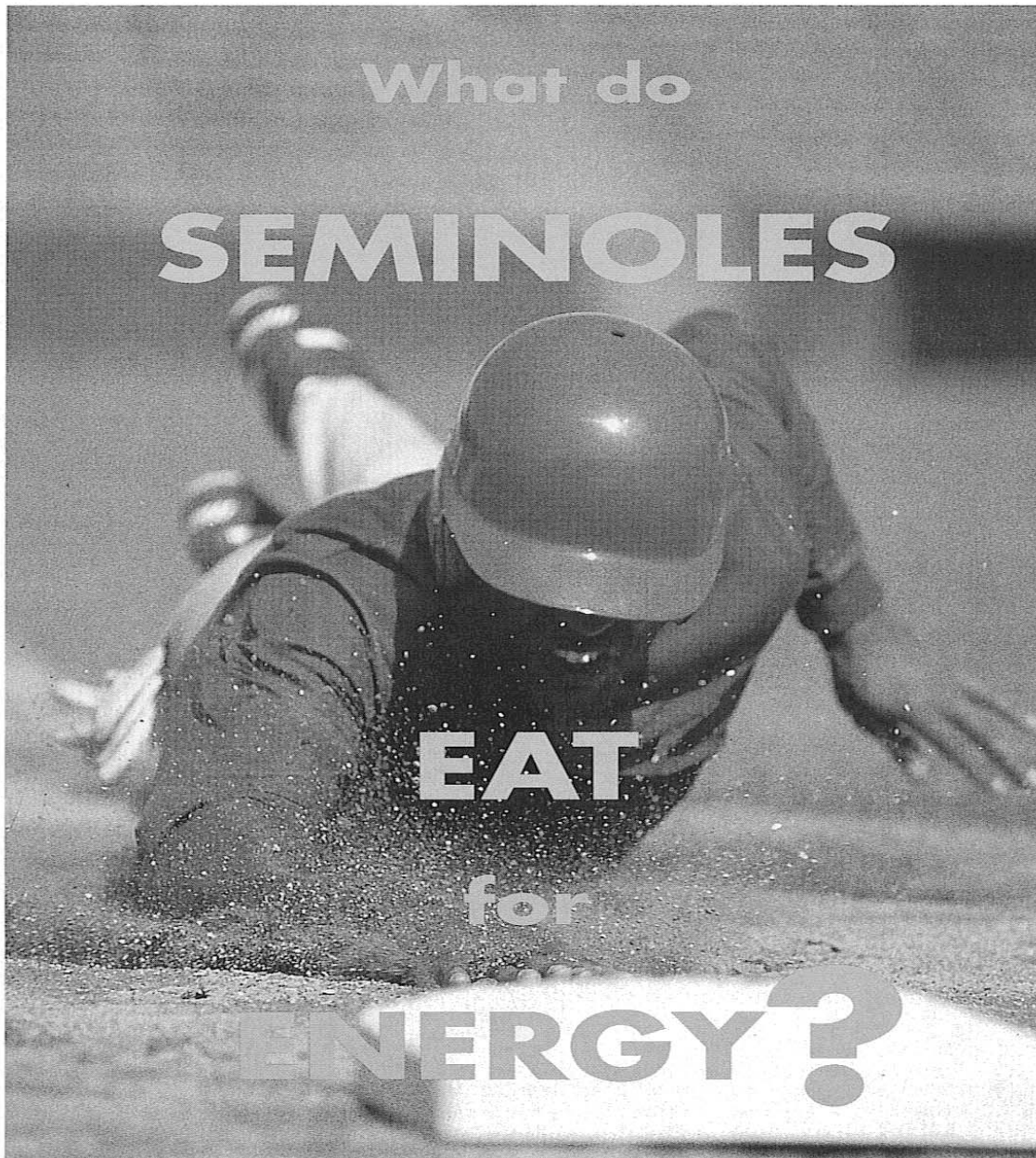


A fixture in the Seminole lineup, Link Jarrett was a four-year starter at shortstop.

game of the year, the Tribe squared off against Cal. State-Fullerton. Fullerton's Mark Kotsay proved to be the difference as his home run and seven RBIs led the Titans to a 10-3 victory.

The 1994 Seminoles finished with a 53-22 record and a final ranking of fifth in the *Baseball*

America poll. The duo of Wilson and Johnson combined for a 24-6 record and a 2.58 ERA. The tandem struck out 285 batters in 248 innings and threw 10 complete games. Wilson capped an illustrious career by being the first player chosen in the Major League Baseball draft.
