Expected to start at shortstop this season...a much improved infielder since the middle of the 1995 season...is an offensive threat as a switch hitter with base-stealing ability...a great technique bunter who can get the job done...hit the ball well in the World University Games in Japan last August...played shortstop, secondbase and thirdbase for the Kenai Oilers in the Alaska League last summer...received All-Alaska Team honors. **1995 AS A FRESHMAN:** The

One of only two seniors on the roster...a former walk-on who became a starter in 1994...a much improved bunter...has become a better hitter by being more patient at the plate...possesses good range in the outfield and gets a good jump on the ball...has made several heart-stopping catches over his career, taking away extra-base hits...still remembered for sparking the 1994 Seminoles in the College World Series with a lead-off triple in a come-from-



behind 6-3 victory against LSU...is the brother of former FSU pitcher John Nedecau. **1995 AS A JUNIOR:** Was a starter in the outfield for the first month of the season, then was used primarily in a platoon situation vs. lefthanded pitchers...appeared in 57 games, including 27 starts...played both left and centerfield...hit his only home run of the season in the seventh inning at Georgia Tech on May 5 tying the game...started the N.C. State game at the ACC Tournament. **1994 AS A SOPHOMORE:** Joined the team in January after transferring from Tallahassee Community College...named to the Atlantic II Regional All-Tournament team after batting .429 (6-for-14)...collected three hits in the finale vs. BYU, and delivered a two-run triple in FSU's 5-1 elimination victory over Jacksonville...swiped four bases on four attempts vs. Virginia in last
