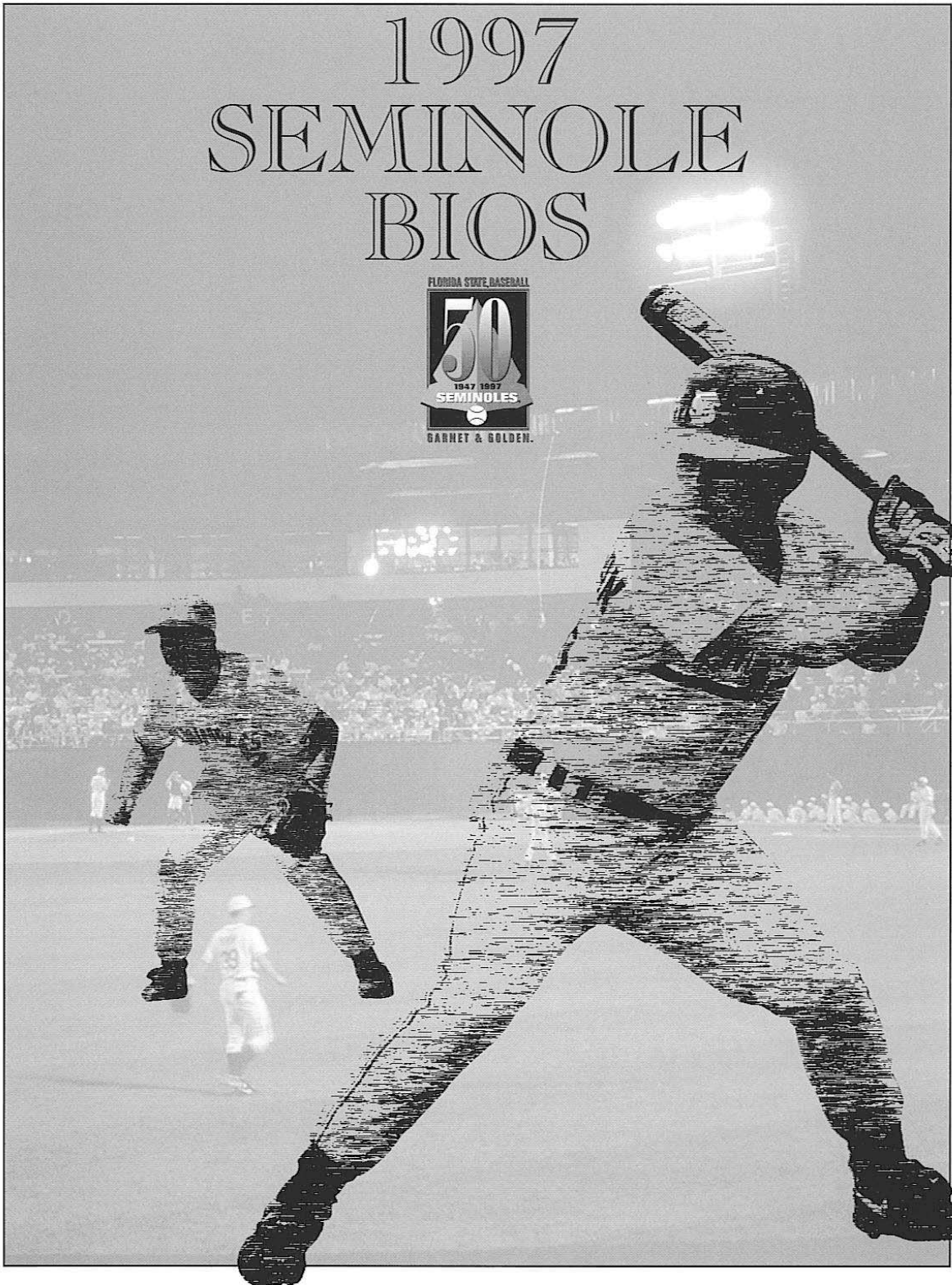

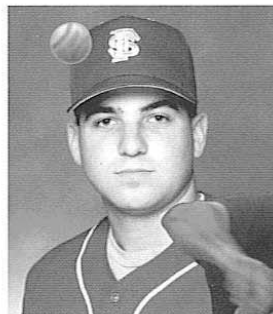


# SEMINOLE BIOGRAPHIES

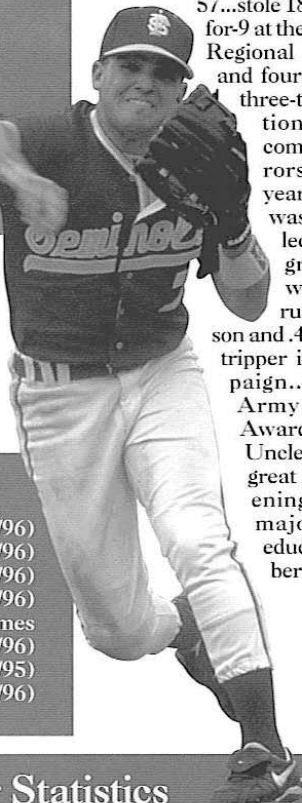
**W**ill return to his starting spot at shortstop...is expected to lead-off in the batting order again this season...a solid middle infielder who combines with Scott Zech for one of the most consistent and experienced double-play duos in the nation...played for the Hyannis Mets with Randy Choate and Randy Niles last summer. 1996 AS A SOPHOMORE: 1st Team All-ACC... 1st Team All-Atlantic Region...started every game at shortstop...produced a .449 on-base percentage as Seminoles' lead-off hitter...began the season with a 23-game hitting streak carried over from the 1995 College World Series...the streak was snapped in FSU's 8-6 win over Maryland, but he scored the game-winning run after walking in his final plate appearance...had 31 multi-hit games, including a career-high four hits against Minnesota on Feb. 17th...belted a team-record two triples against Miami on April 5th...reached base safely (hit, walk, hit by pitch) in all but three games last season...reached base safely in 53 consecutive games until an 0-for-5 performance on May 6 vs. Clemson. 1995 AS A FRESHMAN: The first freshman ever to start opening day at shortstop in Mike Martin's 16 years at the FSU helm...only the second freshman

ever to start at short under Martin (Link Jarrett was the other)...can hit in the clutch as he led the team with 22 two-out RBI and posted a .344 average with two outs...an excellent bunter, his seven sacrifice hits was second highest on the team...snapped a 12-game errorless streak by committing his first error in 40 chances against N.C. State at the ACC Tournament...tallied three hits in a game four times, including a perfect 3-for-3 effort vs. College of Charleston ...hit .443 when he led off an inning... leads all returnees in runs scored with 57...stole 18 of 19 bases...hit 3-for-9 at the last year's NCAA Regional with seven walks and four RBI. PREP: A three-time all-state selection in Louisiana... committed only six errors in his final two years of high school... was an all-district selection as an eighth grader...batted .500 with three home runs in his junior season and .400 with one round-tripper in his senior campaign...recipient of the Army Scholar-Athlete Award. PERSONAL: Uncle is former Yankee great "Louisiana Lightning" Ron Guidry... majoring in physical education...born October 20, 1975.
