



• Fifty-one years, eight head coaches and always the same result — a winning season for the Seminoles. Florida State has never posted a losing record during its history, in fact, the closest the Seminoles ever came was a 9-8 mark in their inaugural season of 1948 under the tenure of Charlie Armstrong. Over the last 19 seasons, Mike Martin has led FSU to 17 50-win seasons, including each of the last five

Florida State has made 16 trips to the College World Series—the sixth-best total in NCAA history—and 36 appearances in the NCAA Baseball Tournament—the second-best total in NCAA history. The Seminoles have appeared in the NCAA Tournament for 21 consecutive seasons, the second-longest current streak in Division I Baseball.

The Seminoles have won 14 conference championships, including two Atlantic Coast Conference titles since joining the league in 1997

 Florida State has produced 163 players that have been selected in the Major League Draft (since 1966), including 13 first-round picks. The Seminoles have had 41 former players advance to the Major Leagues, including four in 1998 — J.D. Drew, Doug Mientkiewicz, Jeff Tam and

Jonathan Johnson.

Since Dick Howser became Florida State's first All-American in 1957, 64 Seminoles have garnered All-America honors. Three Seminoles — Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd and J.D. Drew — have won the Golden Spikes Award, the Heisman Trophy of amateur baseball.

### PRESS SERVICES

The 1999 Florida State Baseball Media Guide is a multi-purpose guide for use by media, fans and friends of the Seminole baseball team. Additional information, up-to-date statistics and photographs are available to members of accredited media upon request. Any questions not answered in the media guide should be directed to Assistant SID Amy Farnum in the FSU Sports Information Office at 850/644-0615.

## CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

All requests for working press, radio and television should be made as early as possible prior to game day. Requests should be made in writing if possible and can be picked up prior to the game at the Sports Information office or held at the Will Call window at Dick Howser Stadium for game day pick up.

### PARKING

A limited number of parking passes are available to select members of the working media. Parking is available in the Moore Athletic Center lot on a first-come, first-serve basis. All media are encouraged to arrive as early as possible to avoid parking problems.

### **PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Accredited photographers holding passes will be admitted to shoot in designated areas on the field. These areas are marked just inside the gates in the protected area at the corners of the home and visitors' dugouts. Still photographers are asked not to restrict views of the fans if at all possible.

### **TELEVISION**

Facilities are available for network broadcasts. Please contact Amy Farnum at the Sports Information Office for more information.

### **RADIO**

One booth is available for the opposing team's radio broadcast. If more than one booth is needed to accommodate visiting radio crews, an area will be made available in the stadium. When such a case occurs, the visiting team's SID will allocate booth space.

### PHONE LINES

Florida State has three phone lines in the main press box for use by media before, during and after home games. Tallahassee radio station WNLS-AM, which carries broadcasts

### **INTERVIEWS**

On game days, Florida State players are available to the media prior to and during batting practice. FSU Head Coach Mike Martin and his players will be available for postgame interviews following a 10-minute cooling off period. Martin will meet with the media in the Florida State dugout immediately after talking with the team in the Seminole lockerroom. Requested Florida State players will be escorted to the interview area by Florida State Sports Information personnel after Coach Martin.

Florida State players are also available on the field at Dick Howser Stadium prior to practice on non-game days. Reporters who wish to interview players before practice should be at the field between 1:30-2:30 p.m. Please contact Amy Farnum at the Florida State Sports Information office to arrange off-day player phone interviews. Contact Coach Martin's office directly at 850/644-1073 to arrange interviews with him.

ACC MEDIA

In order to provide you with timely and accurate information, the ACC utilizes the ACC Faxback System. The Faxback allows members of the media 24-hour access to the latest press releases, notes and statistics from the ACC office and each of the nine member institutions.

Simply dial the Faxback number on your fax machine phone. You will then be instructed step-by-step on how to retrieve information. Connect your fax at the tone and the requested information will be transmitted to you. This system is in operation 24 hours a day and is constantly updated with new information. 

The 1999 Seminoles debut on Sunshine on February 5th against Arizona State.



We're looking at only five of 21 players who have ever played for Florida State. We've also lost the first five hitters from last year's lineup and 55 percent of our home runs. I think you can very easily see that we've got an extremely young, new group of



Stocks, a Baseball America Freshman All-American, led the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 2.35 ERA last season and also was a member of Team USA last summer. McDonald led the Seminoles with a 10-4 record in 1998 and garnered Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-America and second Team All-ACC honors. He was also a teammate of Stocks on Team USA.

The third spot in the Seminoles' weekend starting rotation could be quite a competition between several pitchers.

"There are a couple of people who have surfaced and are looking pretty good," commented Martin. "Mike Smalley is a young man who can figure prominently this year. He's got a

year under his belt and pitched pretty good in the fall."

Smalley pitched just 17.1 innings and appeared in 16 games last year, but gained experience playing summer baseball in the Virginia Valley League.

Blair Varnes is also a young man who we're looking at to help us," said Martin. "Jason Hubbard has got a lot of improving to do, but we're going to keep a real close watch on him."

Varnes redshirted last year after undergoing elbow surgery and is expected to be ready to open the season and battle for a spot in the rotation. Hubbard is still trying to return to 100 percent after coming back from shoulder surgery last year. He was penciled into the Tribe's starting rotation in the 1998 preseason before his injury.

Senior righthander Chris Chavez, who has pitched in a number of big games over his career, will also fight for a spot in the starting rotation. Chavez also threw the Seminoles' first nohitter in 10 seasons against Charleston Southern last year.

"Chris Chavez is a gutty pitcher and an outstanding competitor," commented Martin.

Coaches also have their eye on freshman Chris Whidden,

most likely in middle relief, but he could also figure in as a

'Chris Whidden has thrown a cut fastball very, very well and it's a dominating pitch if you can throw it in the strikezone, which he's been doing," commented Martin.

Martin also hopes junior righthander John Bentley will return to form early this year after a shoulder operation following last season. Bentley has won 12 games in 16 starts over the last two years. Senior lefthander Zach Diaz, who missed fall practice due to an elbow injury, also is excepted to return to his spot as a middle reliever on the Seminoles' staff. Diaz has led Florida State in appearances in each of the last three seasons.

The closer will be lefthander Mike DiBlasi who recorded four saves and posted the lowest ERA on last year's Seminole squad with a 1.14.

The vacant spot behind the plate is probably Florida State's biggest hole to fill after losing three-year starter and All-American Jeremy Salazar. Senior Jeremiah Klosterman is the only catcher on the 1999 squad with any Division I collegiate experience. Klosterman will be pushed by freshman Chris Hart and junior transfer J.C. Huguet.

The biggest concern that I have on this baseball team is behind the plate," said Martin. "It's going to be a three-horse race — Jeremiah Klosteman, Chris Hart and J.C. Huguet. Klosterman gives you experience. Hart and Huguet are both very good receivers - we're looking forward to seeing how the battle develops."

Martin will field an extremely young infield with just two years of starting experience between the four positions.

"First base will be one of three people with Kevin Cash having the inside track," said Martin. "John Halliday and Ryan Barthemely are also in the running for the job. The designated hitter will come from one of the two who does not start. We need to keep our eyes peeled to this situation, because it could be that we try to get all three guys in the lineup. I think that Barthemely and Halliday can give us much needed power. We just have to be sure we get them enough reps to develop them."

At second base, newcomers Sam Scott and Bobby Spano will battle for the position. "I expect that Scott will probably be the starter, but Spano will play an awful lot both at second and

shortstop," Martin said.

Sophomore Brett Groves returns at shortstop but coaches say he needs to improve offensively. "He's got to be more of a 'Jose Zabala' type of player and get on base," commented Martin. "He's got to get on base for us."

At third base, junior transfer Marshall MacDougall is expected to start. "He's a young man that has been very impressive and is very solid defensively," said Martin. Freshman Mike Futrell will back McDougall up and could also see action in the outfield.

Matt Diaz, the 1998 Sporting News Freshman of the Year, returns to his rightfield position and has been tabbed a Collegiate Baseball Preseason third team All-American. Diaz, the NCAA Atlantic II Regional MVP and FSU freshman home run record holder, looks to be the anchor of the Seminole lineup.

Sophomore Karl Jernigan will move over from leftfield into the centerfield spot this season after batting .308 with 42 RBI in his rookie year. "Jernigan looks very good," commented Martin. "He's matured and we're very excited about what he brings to the ball club."

Freshman Chris Smith is expected to start in leftfield. "Smith has got a lot of speed and throws well," said Martin. "He will be a young man who we look at to come in and close some games for us.

Freshmen John-Ford Griffin and Clint Thigpen, as well as Futrell, will serve as backup outfielders.

As in the custom with Florida State baseball, the Seminoles face a difficult schedule in 1999. Florida State will face eight teams that are ranked 17th or higher in Baseball America's Preseason Top 25 Poll. In fact, 26 games on the Seminoles' schedule are against those teams. No. 12 Arizona State will be first on the slate as the Sun Devils travel to Tallahassee on February 5-7.

"I think the schedule will definitely get us prepared quickly because we're playing Arizona State, a team that played in the National Championship game last year, in the second series of the season," said Martin.
