Senior left-hander who returns as FSU's closer...a preseason third team Collegiate Baseball All-American...led the 2002 team with 12 saves and a 2.56 ERA...recorded 10 of his 12 saves over the last eight weeks of the season as the Seminoles won 25 straight games...ranks second in school history with 19 career saves, trailing only Ricky Kimball (32)...needs just 29 appearances to break the FSU career record.

2002 AS A JUNIOR: Emerged as FSU's closer...led the team with 12 saves...tops among pitchers with a 2.56 overall ERA and a 2.13 ACC ERA...second in the ACC in appearances (36) and saves (12)...tied for third (Chris Chavez, 1999) in FSU history with 36 appearances in a single season...among the conference leaders with five saves in ACC play...10 of his 12 saves (two vs. Miami, two vs. Ga. Tech, one vs. NC State, one vs. Clemson, three in the ACC Tournament and one in the NCAA Regional) came over the last eight weeks of the season...walked only three batters over his last 22 outings (41.1 IP)...picked up two saves in one day (3/25) against Georgia Tech and Clemson in the ACC Tournament...earned his first save of the year against Arizona State (2/15)...pitched a season-long 4.2 innings in the Seminoles 13-inning, 9-7 win over Miami on April 7...gave up only two runs over his last 10 appearances of the season.

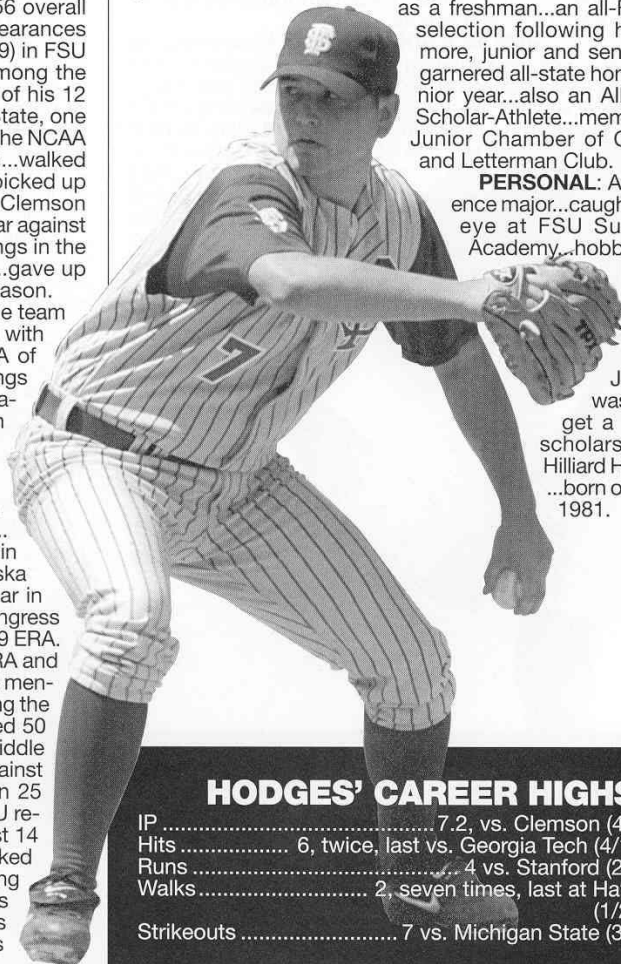
