ormer Seminole MIKE YASTRZEMSKI played for Florida State and head coach Mike Martin from 1980-83. The only son of Red Sox legend and Baseball Hall of Famer Carl Yastrzemski passed away in September of 2004 leaving a hole in the Seminole Baseball family. He still holds the record for games played with the Seminoles (279), who amassed an amazing record of 217-60-2, including four 50-win seasons, when Yastrzemski name was in the lineup. CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Press credentials are issued to members of the working media and all credential requests for working press, radio and television should be made as early as possible prior to game day. Credential requests should be made in writing if possible and either faxed to FSU Sports Information (850) 644-3820 or emailed to Elliott Finebloom (efineblm@ mailer.fsu.edu). Credentials can either be picked up at the Sports Information Office located on the second floor of the Moore Athletic Center. Credentials can also be held at the will call window, which is located at the main ticket booth at Dick Howser Stadium for game day pick up only.

PARKING

There is no designated media parking for Florida State baseball games. Parking is available in university lots around Dick Howser Stadium on a first-come, first-serve basis. All media are encouraged to arrive as early as possible to avoid parking problems. Legally parked cars will not be ticketed on game days (two hours prior to first pitch).

PHOTOGRAPHERS

In accordance with NCAA rules and regulations, all photographers are required to shoot from inside the photo boxes marked on the playing field. Only credentialed photographers holding passes will be admitted to shoot in those designated areas on the field. These areas are marked just inside the gates in the protected area at the corners of the home and visitors' dugouts. Still photographers are asked not to restrict the view of fans if possible.

TELEVISION

Facilities are available at Dick Howser Stadium for televi-

sion broadcasts. Please contact Elliott Finebloom in the Sports Information Office for more information.

PHONE LINES

Florida State provides a radio booth and one phone line for visiting team's radio broadcasts. Phone lines can be used to make local calls only. There is a second line in each radio booth but the line must be activated through the university's Office of Telecommunications. Please contact SID Elliott Finebloom for further information on activating a second phone line.

Florida State also has multiple phone lines and high speed internet connections in the main press box for use by the media before, during and after games.

INTERVIEWS

On game days, FSU head coach Mike Martin and Seminole players will be available to the media after the game and following a 10-minute cooling off period. Martin will meet the media in the first base dugout immediately after he finishes addressing the team. Requested FSU players will be escorted to the field or a pre-designated interview area by Florida State sports information personnel after Martin's interview is completed.

Florida State players are also available to the media at Dick Howser stadium between 1:30-2:30 before practice. Media who wish to interview players or coaches must arrange those interviews through Elliott Finebloom in the Sports Information Office.

Media, fans and alumni are encouraged to access FSU Baseball information via the internet at the official athletic website for Florida State University Seminoles.com. Game stories and box scores are posted after every game and statistics are update following each contest. The site also offers schedules, a PDF version of the media guide, weekly releases, links to live internet radio broadcasts and so much more. Log on and keep up with FSU baseball.

or 15 years, Lee Bowen served as the voice of the Florida State Seminoles. From Marshall McDougall's record-setting six home run game at Maryland to numerous NCAA postseason appearances, Lee Bowen was Seminole baseball.

Bowen called the action for over 1,000 Florida State baseball games over his 15-year career, including 26 from the College World Series. He was behind the mic-rophone for more than 100 Seminole NCAA postseason games.

He was a one-man show on the road, calling the action from as far as away as Hawaii and California. At home, Bowen teamed with longtime partner Jim Crosby as the many fans sitting at Dick Howser Stadium would listen in as they watched the ballgames. Bowen traveled with the team to the College World Series in Omaha eight times, including the 1999 CWS in which Florida State defeated Stanford in extra innings to advance to the national championship game.

Over the last five years, Bowen was joined in the radio booth by his wife Adrienne. The two were married on June 27, 1999 and Adrienne would often accompany her husband on Seminole baseball road trips.

Bowen, who was instrumental in getting all Florida State baseball games on the radio, also served as the broadcast coordinator for football and men's basketball on FSU's radio network. He began his career as a statistician on the network after he came to Tallahassee from the Burlington Indians of the Appalachian League, where he called play-by-play for the rookie league team.

RADIO

Iorida State's flagship radio station, WFLA news Radio 1270, will again broadcast every inning of every Seminole Baseball game in 2005. WFLA-AM will air Florida State Baseball for the 24th consecutive season. From the opener January 28th to all the ACC and NCAA Tournament



action beginning in May, WFLA gives FSU fans the best coverage in college baseball. For out of town fans, the live radio broadcasts for all FSU games (home and away) will be carried on the official site for Florida State athletics Seminoles.com. Steve Melewski is in his first year as the

Seminoles' radio announcer and is currently the broadcaster for the Aberdeen IronBirds of the New York-Penn League.

He called all 76 games in 2004 for the

Steve Melewski

IronBirds, which is a Class A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles and owned by baseball legend Cal Ripken, Jr. He also served as the color commentator on the Frederick Keys and Bowie Baysox games on CN-8 Television the last two summers.

For four years Melewski served as the number two announcer with the AAA Richmond Braves and he also served another four year stint as the pre and post-game show callin host of Orioles talk on the team's flagship station WBAL. Melewski even called an inning of an Oriole game during his time with WBAL.

Melewski's experience extends beyond the diamond. He is currently employed by his alma mater Towson University as both a play-by-play announcer and color commentator for women's basketball CAA games and Tiger football in the Atlantic 10 Conference. He hosted the George Welsh football and Jeff Jones basketball shows at the University of Virginia on top of working for the University of Virginia radio network. For two seasons he also hosted the Gary Williams Maryland Basketball Radio Show.

Not only has Melewski been an on the air personality he has extensive experience behind the scenes as well. Melewski served as the sports director for WBAL Radio in Baltimore and WFMD Radio in Frederick, MD. At WBAL, Melewski was named Maryland Sportscaster of the Year in 2000 and was named a two-time finalist by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. In Frederick he anchored the AM and PM drive sportscasts at the station, which was the winner of eight sports awards, including the 1986 UPI Award for "Best Sports Coverage" in the Eastern region among 14 states.

TELEVISION

Florida State's rich baseball tradition will once again attract live coverage from cable television networks throughout the Southeast. The Seminoles' strong baseball tradition and Atlantic Coast Conference schedule make Florida State no stranger to television exposure. This year, the FSU baseball team can be seen on television 12 times.

The Sunshine Network is once again the home of Seminole baseball in 2004. The Sunshine Network, a Floridabased cable network, will televise 12 FSU games, both home



and away. Gene Deckerhoff and Tom Block will handle the play-by-play and color again for Sunshine in 2004. The Sunshine Network takes Florida State baseball to all corners of the state. The 2004 Seminoles debut on Sunshine against Maryland on March 19 in Dick Howser Stadium.

THE MIKE MARTIN SHOW

Seminole fans who miss the baseball action on radio and television can still keep informed by tuning in to "The Mike Martin Show." The show, which will air weekly beginning in mid-February, gives a recap of the past week's action.

mid-February, gives a recap of the past week's action. For 30 minutes each week, FSU Head Coach Mike Martin takes a look at recent highlights and gives his insight on upcoming opponents. The show, hosted by Assistant Athletics Director for Media & Public Relations Rob Wilson, also features player interviews and a weekly baseball tip from Coach Martin.

The show is produced by Jim Garbarino of Seminole Productions and will air statewide on the Sunshine Network and locally on Fox 49. Check local listings for dates and times.

SP has garnered national recognition as one of the best video production facilities in the nation and consistently ranks at the top of the in-game entertainment arena for universities across the nation. And it only gets better...

Seminole Productions will soon move out of its current area in the Doak Campbell Stadium press box to a new 6,000 square foot communication center in the new Coyle Moore Athletic Center. This new state-of-the-art facility will include a brand new studio, two control rooms, 10 Avid digital editing and graphics suites, private offices, a green room, a new computer editing and graphics classroom, a student producer area and much more. There will also be fiber optic video camera connections to all areas of the Coyle Moore Athletic Center, Doak Campbell Stadium, the Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center and FSU Basketball Training Center with con-nections to WFSU-TV's uplink. This will create the ability to do live, multi-camera productions or uplink feeds. With a simple camera connection we can send the signal through fiber to WFSU's satellite uplink and bang, Coach Bowden's wit and charm is instantly seen all over the world.

But FSU Athletics won't be the only one reaping the benefits of this new stateof-the-art communication center. Students

in the College of Communication media production program will also have plenty of hands-on access to some of the finest equipment around. Since Seminole Productions' mission is one of teaching, students studying in the art of television design, production and performance will work alongside the SP staff gaining real experience with real deadlines in a professional environment while gaining class credit as well as professional experience. This new facility will also ensure that FSU continues to attract the best and brightest students of media production from all across the globe.

Seminole Productions recently garnered two Gold Awards in the Aurora Awards international competition to bring its international awards total to seven this year. The Aurora Awards is an international competition

designed to recognize excellence in the film and video industries. It specifically targets programs and commercials that would not normally have the opportunity to compete on a national level, by focusing on non-national commercials, regional or special interest entertainment and corporate sponsored film and video. Entries come from across the United States and abroad including Canada, Hong Kong, Denmark, Mexico and others.

Seminole Productions received Gold Awards for the 2002 Baseball Highlight open, produced and created by Jim Garbarino, and the Tallahassee Boy's Choir/Gift of Life, produced by Jerry Tootle. Other previous Gold Award winners of note have been Disney I.D.E.A.S, The History Channel, A&E Network and Fox Sports Net. The Aurora statue itself was commissioned specifically for the competition by a nationally renowned sculptor. The statues are cast in the same foundry that creates the Emmy, Oscar and Clio statues.

NETWORK Florida State University & Sunshine Network

Florida State University and Sunshine Network announced a multi-year contract in August of 2000 that ensured Sunshine Network will continue to be the exclusive Florida cable home of FSU athletics for many years to come. Twelve regular season baseball games will be shown on Sunshine Network in 2004.

Since 1988, Sunshine Network has been the exclusive regional sports network home of FSU athletics in Florida. Available in over 5.5 million homes statewide via cable and satellite, Sunshine Network provides more coverage of FSU athletics than any other Florida television outlet.

Each year, Sunshine network airs over 100 games/programs for FSU, including its own production of every FSU regular season football game, which replay statewide on Sunshine Sunday evenings at 7 p.m. during "Prime Time 'Noles."

Also included in the agreement are the rights to a minimum of 14 women's events including basketball, volleyball, soccer and softball.

Other programming includes highlight shows for fall and spring sports, call-in and/or coaches shows, "Seminole Summer Showcase," highlighting replays or highlights of previous FSU events, "Seminole Sports Magazine," "Seminole Uprising" and more. Additional FSU athletic



events, including men's and women's basketball, are available to Sunshine Network from the Atlantic Coast Conference and its rightsholders.

An agreement with the ACC provides Sunshine Network with additional FSU games and events, including the conference's new Sunday night ACC basketball package which begins this fall on regional sports networks nationwide (exclusively on Sunshine in Florida). The network also airs "ACC Live!," Mondays at 7 p.m., and numerous other games/events for the ACC, giving FSU fans coverage of not only their home team, but FSU's conference opponents as well.

"Our contractual partnership with Sunshine Network provides an extremely valuable distribution avenue for Florida State University events which are showcased within our own state and well beyond," FSU Director of Athletics Dave Hart said.
