

2004 Season REVIEW

SUPER SIZED

When Florida State downed UCF 19-3 in the NCAA Regional final, the win moved the Tribe to the Super Regional for the sixth consecutive season. Since the NCAA moved to a Super Regional format in 1999, FSU has advanced every year. Florida State is one of only three schools to advance to the Super Regional for six consecutive seasons. The other two schools are fellow ACC member Miami and SEC power LSU.

LSU (17) and Fullerton (14) make up the top five in terms of consecutive NCAA bids. The last 25 NCAA appearances for FSU have come under Mike Martin. The 2004 Seminoles advanced out of the regional thanks to a 19-3 victory over UCF in the final. Half of the 12-man all-tournament team was made up of Seminoles and two Seminoles were named co-MVPs of the regional. It was the 27th time in program history that FSU hosted a regional or super regional.

ANOTHER 1

For the 17th time in program history, the Tribe had a player selected in the first round of the Major League Baseball draft when shortstop Stephen Drew was taken 15th overall by the Arizona Diamondbacks. The All-American was FSU's seventh first round pick in the last decade and the first FSU shortstop ever to be picked in the first round. Drew was the ninth first round draft pick in Arizona franchise history and the first Seminole taken in the opening round by the D-Backs. Stephen's brother J.D. was a two-time first round draft pick out of Florida State in 1997 and 1998.

GOT IT AGAIN

For the second time in three years and the fourth time since joining the ACC, Florida State captured the league crown at the 2004 ACC Championships in Salem, VA. The Tribe has won more ACC Championships than any school since entering the league in 1992. The Tribe also leads the conference with six regular season titles since 1992 as well. Of the 26 regular season and tournament titles up for grabs since 1992, FSU has captured an astonishing 10 regular season and tournament crowns. No other ACC team has more than five.

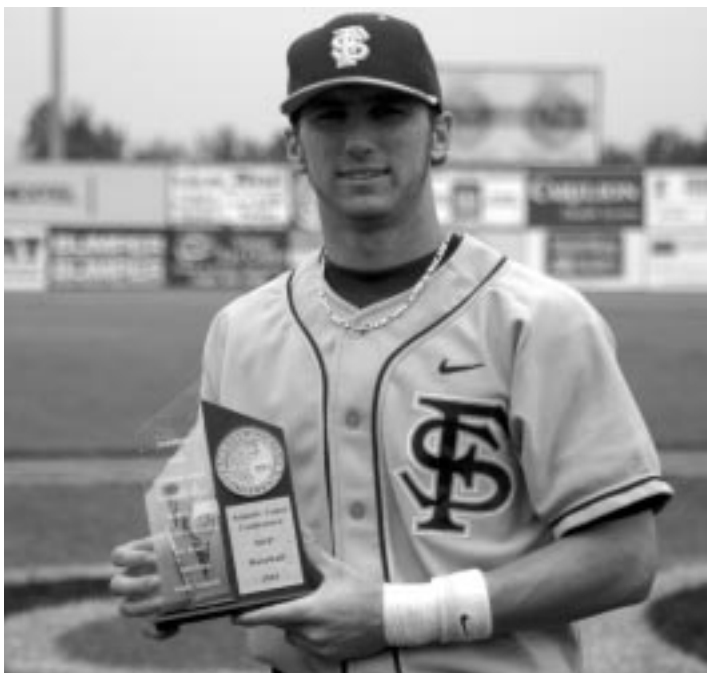
WE HAVE A CONSENSUS

Eddy Martinez-Esteve became just the fourth consensus first team All-American in Florida State history in 2004 joining John-Ford Griffin, Marshall McDougall and J.D. Drew. The Seminole slugger, who was a second round pick (70th

overall) of the San Francisco Giants, led FSU in eight major offensive categories during a season that saw him come just two RBIs shy of winning the ACC's triple crown. Martinez-Esteve led the Seminoles in batting average (.385), slugging percentage (.707), hits (104), RBIs (81), doubles (24), home runs (19), total bases (191), plate appearances (315) and extra base hits. He was second in on base percentage (.457), runs scored (57) and at bats (270). The third baseman/outfielder hit a team-best .535 versus left-handed pitchers and also led the squad with a .413 average with runners on base, a 1.000 average with the bases loaded, 25 two-out RBIs and

a .611 percentage in advancing runners successfully. His 33 multi-hit games and 21 multi-RBI games were both the best marks on the team in 2004 on top of the fact he posted the second-longest hitting streak of the season at 12 games.

RECORD CROWDS

FSU saw record crowds throughout the 2004 season at Dick Howser Stadium. A total of four home games with over 5,400 fans broke into the top 20 all-time attendance records including 6,387 against Miami on April 10, which was the second-largest crowd in Dick Howser history. With 35 playing dates in 2004, the home attendance was 115,680, the fourth-largest figure in stadium history. The average paid attendance in 2004 was 3,305, which is the highest average in FSU history as well. Nationally, FSU ranked 11th in total attendance and 13th in average attendance. Clemson was the only ACC school to rank ahead of FSU in either of those national categories.

FRESHMEN ALL-AMERICANS

Both Ryne Malone and Brian Schultz earned freshman All-American honors in 2004. They were the 30th and 31st freshman All-Americans in head coach Mike Martin's 25 years at the helm. It was the first time since 1990 when pitcher Roger Bailey and outfielder Chris Roberts were named second team freshman All-Americans that the Tribe had two players receive such an honor in one season. Overall, the Seminoles have only had two freshman All-Americans in the same year six times in program history.

CAPE NOTE

A pair of FSU returners spent their summer tearing up the Cape Cod League. Shane Robinson and Mark Sauls, who both played for the Hyannis Mets, were selected to participate in the 2004 Cape League All-Star Game. Robinson was chosen as a starter in right field while Sauls was named a reserve pitcher for the West Division All-Stars. Heading into the All-Star game, Robinson had started 18 games for Hyannis and was hitting .292 with a .417 slugging percentage. He was fourth on the squad with 10 RBIs, second on the team with six steals and third in total bases with 30. Sauls was the ace of the Hyannis staff. He led the team in wins and winning percentage. No Met starter had allowed fewer runs or held opposing hitters to a lower batting average than Sauls heading into the All-Star break. He posted a record of 3-0 with a 1.69 ERA. He struck out 25 batters and issued just seven walks while holding the opposition to a .156 batting average.

ROBINSON LEADS SEMINOLES TO ACC TOURNAMENT TITLE

Freshman Shane Robinson was named the 2004 ACC Tournament MVP as he helped lead FSU to the championship with his offense as well as his defensive play in center field. Robinson hit .423 in Salem with three doubles and a triple (.615 slugging percentage). Stephen Drew, Eddy Martinez-Esteve and Mark Sauls joined Robinson on the ACC All-Tournament team.

JUST LIKE HIS BIG BRO

Stephen Drew finished his FSU career just like his big brother J.D. and that was as a first round Major League draft pick. Stephen was the 15th overall pick in the first round of the 2004 draft by the Arizona Diamondbacks. The pick came on the heels of a year where the shortstop was named a second team All-America by *Baseball America* and a third team



All-America selection by Collegiate Baseball, ABCA and NCBWA. Drew was a first-team All-ACC selection and became one of only six Seminoles to ever record back-to-back first team All-ACC selections in their career. He was also the first three-time All-ACC selection in FSU history. Drew was the only ACC Rookie of the Year to go on to become a three-time All-ACC selection in conference history. He was named to the 2004 Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament Team where he shared MVP honors with fellow Seminole Bryan Zech on top of being named to the 2004 All-ACC Tournament Team as a member of the tournament champion Seminoles. Drew finished 2004 in the top five of 11 offensive categories. He led the squad in on base percentage (.458), runs scored (68) and triples (7) and was second on the team in slugging (.692), RBIs (56), home runs (17), walks (45) and total bases (157). He left FSU having tied Luis Alicea's record from 1986 for triples in a career with 19.

ACC'S TOP PITCHING STAFF

Florida State's pitching staff has easily been the most dominant in the Atlantic Coast Conference since Jamey Shouppe took over as pitching coach in 1993. Under Shouppe, the Seminoles have led the ACC in team ERA in 10 of the last 12 seasons. FSU has ranked among the NCAA top 10 in team ERA in eight of those 12 years.

NATION'S SECOND WINNINGEST PROGRAM

The Florida State baseball program has compiled a record of 2237-824-10 in 55 seasons of baseball. FSU's winning percentage of .730 ranks second nationally behind only Texas (2818-882-26, .760). Here's a look at the top five:
