## #7 DENNIS ANDERSON ..... INF • R-R • 6-1 • 175 • Jacksonville, FL (Bishop Kenny)



**FRESHMAN YEAR (2004):** Started 41 games including 39 starts at third base...made two starts at short and appeared in 61 of Florida State's 68 games...posted a .901 fielding percentage committing 11 errors in 111 chances...hit his best in pressure situations as his average with runners on and with runners in scoring position were both higher than his overall average...had the 10th-most two-out RBIs on the squad with nine...led the squad with 12 sacrifice bunts...was a perfect 2-for-2 in steals...was third on the squad in assists and in the top five for fielding double plays...recorded seven multi-hit games and four multi-RBI games last season...finished the season on a career-best three game hitting streak...recorded his first-career hit against VMI (2/2) while going 1-for-1...made his first-career start at third base and went 1-for-2 at Arizona State (2/7) with one RBI...hit his first-career home run at Jacksonville (2/15)...had his first-career multi-hit game as he went 2-for-3 against Michigan State (3/13)...first career multi-RBI

game came against Jacksonville (3/17) as he went 2-for-4 with a double and two RBIs...best series off the year came at Wake Forest where Anderson went 5-for-12 with five runs scored, four RBIs and a home run...in the NCAA Regional, Anderson went 2-for-3 with three runs scored, three RBIs, a home run and two walks.

## #29 EDDIE CANNON ..... P • R-R • 6-0 • 180 • Sebring, FL • (South Florida CC)



**SENIOR YEAR (2004):** Appeared in 20 games and was second on the squad with nine wins...his 3.87 ERA was the best among FSU starters...went 9-7 with one complete game...one of just two Seminole pitchers to throw a complete game in 2004...led the team with 111.2 innings pitched, 96 strikeouts, 19 starts, 28 batters struck out looking, and three runners picked off...ERA was third-best in the team and he held opposing batters to an .249 average, fourth-best on the squad...right-handers hit just .205 versus Cannon in 2004...his strikeout-to-walk ratio was an impressive 5.3-to-1...earned his first win of the season against VMI (2/2)...allowed four runs (two earned) on three hits with three walks and three strikeouts at Arizona State (2/7)...only allowed one hit and tied a career-high with nine strikeouts in 6.0 innings against Jacksonville (2/16)...named ACC Pitcher of the Week (2/23) after going 2-0 against Jacksonville and Oral Roberts while recording 18 strikeouts in 12.2 innings...tied a career-high with nine strikeouts in

both outings...pitched a career-high eight innings against UNC Asheville (2/28) and didn't allow a run with seven strikeouts...had his third nine strikeout game of the season against Michigan State (3/13) and only allowed one run on five hits in six innings of work...only allowed one run on five hits in seven innings of work in the conference opener against Maryland (3/20)...made his first-career Friday start against NC State (4/2) and allowed four runs (one earned) on eight hits with six strikeouts and two walks...took a no-decision at then-No. 6 Florida (5/12) after working 7.1 innings allowing just one unearned run on eight hits with two strikeouts and no walks...earned his first-career save against Duke (5/16) on Senior Day after working a perfect final three innings with three strikeouts...recorded just the second complete game of the year for the Seminoles in the NCAA Regional versus Bethune-Cookman (6/4)...pitched 8.1 innings in the Super Regional versus Arkansas allowing just two earned runs in the loss.

**JUNIOR YEAR (2004):** The 15th overall pick in the first round of the 2004 draft by the Arizona Diamondbacks...named a second-team All-America by *Baseball America*...named a third-team All-America selection by *Collegiate Baseball*, ABCA and NCBWA...a first-team All-ACC selection...one of only six Seminoles to ever record back-to-back first-team All-ACC selections in their career...the first three-time All-ACC selection in FSU history...the only ACC Rookie of the Year to go on to become a three-time All-ACC selection in conference history...named to the 2004 Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament Team where he shared MVP honors with fellow Seminole Bryan Zech...named to the 2004 All-ACC Tournament Team...started 57 games at shortstop...was in the top five for Florida State in 11 offensive categories...led the squad in on base percentage (.458), runs scored (68) and triples (7)...second on the team in slugging (.692), RBIs (56), home runs (17), walks (45) and total bases (157)...third on the squad in average (.347), steals (12) and steal attempts (14)...tied Luis Alicea's record from 1986 for triples in a career with 19...hit

.377 with runners on base and was second on the team with 24 two-out RBIs...his 26 multi-hit games and his 14 multi-RBI games were the second-most on the team...had the fourth-longest hitting streak of the year at 10 games...named ACC



Player of the Week (5/3)...named to the 2004 Dairy Queen Classic All-Tournament team...went 2-for-4 with three runs, an RBI, one home run and a stolen base in the season opener against VMI (1/31)...hit his second home run of the season at Arizona State (2/7) while going 2-for-5 with one run and one RBI...scored three runs while going 3-for-4 at Jacksonville (2/15)...went 2-for-4 with two runs and an RBI against Oral Roberts (2/20)...hit .714 (5-for-7) with two runs, two RBI, one double and was walked six times in the series against UNC Asheville...went 4-for-5 with two RBI, one double and a run scored against UNCA (2/28)...went 3-for-4 with a home run, two runs scored and an RBI against Nebraska (3/5)...had three RBI, a double and a triple while going 2-for-5 with a run scored versus West Virginia (3/6)...doubled his season home run output after having back-to-back multi-home run games against Miami on Friday and Saturday in Tallahassee...had a season-high five RBI with two runs scored while going 2-for-4 with two home runs against Miami (4/9)...had four RBI on two home runs against Miami (4/10)...went 4-for-7 (.571) with three runs, two doubles and three RBI in the final two games at Miami...scored a season-high four runs while going 4-for-5 with two doubles, a home run and three RBI against Florida (4/21)...hit his 10th home run of the season while going 2-for-5 with a run scored against Georgia Tech (4/23)...went 4-for-8 (.500) with a double, home run, three runs and four RBI in the first two games at Clemson...hit .462 in the Duke series with two doubles, triple and five runs scored while slugging .769...posted a 10-game hitting streak that began with the final game in the Duke series. During the streak, Drew hit .449, scored 17 runs, had 11 extra base hits, 15 RBIs and slugged .837...hit .355 at the ACC Tournament with eight RBI, five extra base hits, 19 total bases and slugged .613...hit .500 in the NCAA Regional against UCF scoring five runs and driving in three.

**SENIOR YEAR (2004):** Posted the most wins of any FSU pitcher (10-3) with the second-best ERA (3.36) on the staff...named to the 2004 Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament Team...his 29 appearances were the second-most on the team...second on the team with three saves...ranked in the top four of ten different pitching categories...second on the team with 109.2 innings pitched and 93 strikeouts...third on the staff for opponent batting average (.239), winning percentage (.769), appearances (29), games finished (9), runners picked off (1) and batters struck out looking (22)...held opponents to the third-lowest batting average with runners on base (.226)...did not allow a triple all season...named ACC Pitcher of the Week after pitching a complete game shutout in his first Friday night start at Virginia...worked a career-long 4.2 innings in game two at Arizona State (2/7) giving up three runs (two earned) on six hits with three strikeouts...earned his first-career save at Jacksonville (2/15) after recording three strikeouts

with no hits in the final 1.1 innings...picked up two wins in the Friday and Sunday games against Oral Roberts...worked 6.2 innings in the series against Oral Roberts allowing three runs on six hits with one walk and six strikeouts...only allowed one hit in two innings of work with one walk and one strikeout against UNC Asheville (2/27)...pitched three scoreless innings and only allowed one hit with a career-high six strikeouts...earned his second save after pitching the final 2.1 innings at UNC (3/26) with one hit and two strikeouts...made his first-career start at Florida (3/31) and recorded a career-high eight strikeouts in a career-long six innings of work...worked two scoreless innings of relief with four strikeouts, one walk and one hit against NC State (4/4)...pitched a total of 8.1 innings of relief in the home series against Miami, including 6.1 on April 11th against the Canes...earned the win while making his first weekend start on Sunday at Miami (4/18)...worked 6.2 innings with three runs on seven hits and seven strikeouts...pitched a career-long 8.2 innings of relief for starter Hunter Jones who left with a sore elbow at Clemson (5/1)...only allowed three runs (one earned) on four hits with seven strikeouts and five walks...pitched a complete game shutout in his first Friday night start at Virginia (5/7)...only gave up four hits, two in the ninth inning, while striking out six and walking two...earned his seventh win of the season after working 7.0 innings with just one run on six hits with five strikeouts and one walk...had gone 20 scoreless innings prior to giving up the run against Duke.

**#13 EDDY MARTINEZ-ESTEVE... 3B/OF • R-R • 6-3 • 215 • Miami, FL (Westminster Christian)**



**SOPHOMORE YEAR (2004):** A consensus first-team All-America selection in 2004...joins John-Ford Griffin, Marshall McDougall and J.D. Drew as the only consensus first-team All-Americans in FSU history...a second round pick (70th overall) of the San Francisco Giants...led FSU in eight major offensive categories...was first in batting average (.385), slugging percentage (.707), hits (104), RBIs (81), doubles (24), home runs (19), total bases (191) and plate appearances (315)...led the team in extra-base hits...second in on base percentage (.457), runs scored (57) and at bats (270)...hit a team-best .535 versus left-handed pitchers...also led the squad with a .413 average with runners on base, a 1.000 average with the bases loaded, 25 two-out RBIs and a .611 percentage in advancing runners successfully...was second in average with runners in scoring position and two out hitting...his 33 multi-hit games and 21 multi-RBI games were both the best marks on the team in 2004...posted the second-longest hitting

streak of the season at 12...started every game but one...made 34 starts as FSU's DH, 27 in right and six in left...was named



ACC Player of the Week (3/29)... named to the 2004 All-ACC Tournament Team...named to the Dairy Queen Classic All-Tournament team as an outfielder...recorded two RBIs with a run scored while going 1-for-3 in the season opener against VMI (1/31)...went 2-for-5 with his second-career multi home run game (2) which included three RBI and two runs scored at Arizona State (2/7)...had three hits with one RBI at Arizona State (2/8)...hit a two-run home run and went 2-for-4 with three RBI against Jacksonville (2/16)...went 3-for-5 with two RBIs, a run scored and his fourth home run of the season against UNC Asheville (2/28)...had a double and a triple while going 2-for-3 with a run scored versus West Virginia (3/6)...went 2-for-5 with a run and an RBI against Illinois State (3/9)...had two RBI and scored two runs while going 3-for-5 with a home run against Butler (3/10)...knocked in a career-high seven RBI and went 3-for-4 with two runs scored and the first-ever home run over the 60-foot scoreboard in left field...went 4-for-5 with a double and three RBI against Maryland (3/19)... hit .667 (8-12) with six runs, two doubles, a home run and seven RBI against Maryland...went 4-for-5 with a home run, a double, two runs scored and an RBI at UNC (3/27)...hit .750 (9-12) with three home runs, a double, four runs scored and a slugging % of 1.583 in the series at UNC...went 3-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a run scored against NC State (4/4)...had a double and three RBI while going 4-for-6 with a run scored at Jacksonville (4/7)...went 2-for-3 with a home run and a double against Miami (4/10)...knocked in four runs while going 2-for-6 with a home run, double and two runs scored against Florida (4/21)...went 2-for-5 with a run scored and a stolen base against Georgia Tech (4/25)...hit .625 (5-8) with two doubles, three runs and three RBI in the first two games of the Clemson series...recorded two doubles while going 2-for-4 with two runs and an RBI at Virginia (5/7)...went 3-for-4 with a home run, triple and two runs scored at Florida (5/12)...had a career-high two stolen bases against Duke (5/14)...hit his 14th home run of the season while going 2-for-5 with two runs scored and five RBI against Duke (5/15)...went 8 for 14 with 11 RBIs, two doubles and three home runs in the Wake Forest series...recorded his second multi-homer game of the season when he went yard twice and drove in six runs against the Demon Deacons (5/21)...recorded multi-hit games in four of the six ACC Tournament games and recorded nine RBIs in the tournament...helped send FSU to the NCAA Super Regional by going 2-for-3 with three runs scored and two RBIs in the Regional Championship game versus UCF...recorded hits in both Super Regional games versus Arkansas.

**SENIOR YEAR (2004):** Started 67 of FSU's 68 games and appeared in every game...named to the 2004 Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament Team...one of only three Seminoles to play in all 68 games...played all season in the FSU outfield starting 41 games in right and 27 games in left...batted .274, scored 48 runs, and eight of his 60 hits were doubles...hit one triple and one home run while slugging .333 on the season with 33 RBIs...had the team's second-best fielding percentage (.985)...hit an impressive .333 with runners on base and was second amongst starters with a .407 average when runners were in scoring position...was also third on the squad in driving in runs with a runner on third and less than two outs in an inning...registered 11 two-out RBIs...sixth on the team with 18 multi-hit games and ninth with five multi-RBI games...was fifth on the team with a .418 on base percentage and he led FSU in walks with 48...was second on the team with 15 steals...third in sac

bunts and fourth in sac flies...scored a run while going 1-for-4 at Arizona State (2/7)...moved into the leadoff spot in the Sunday game at Arizona State (2/8) and went 1-for-3 with two walks...went 2-for-3 with one run and one RBI against Oral Roberts (2/20)...recorded the game winning hit that scored Gibbs Chapman in the bottom of the ninth against Oral Roberts (2/22) to propel FSU to a 4-3 victory...had two runs while going 1-for-2 with an RBI vs. West Virginia (3/6)...went 3-for-3 with a double, stolen base, a run scored and an RBI against Butler (3/10)...one of his best-career games came against Michigan State (3/13) as he went 3-for-4 with two stolen bases, three RBI, three runs scored...scored two runs while going 2-for-5 against Jacksonville (3/17)...hit .625 (5-8) with four runs, a double and three RBI in the series against Maryland...went 2-for-5 with a run and an RBI at Florida (3/31)...drove in the game winning run in the bottom of the 11th inning in the Seminoles' 7-6 win over NC State (4/3)...went 2-for-3 with a triple, two runs scored and an RBI against NC State (4/4)...scored two runs while going 1-for-2 in a 6-5 win over Miami (4/9)...hit his first home run of the season while going 2-for-4 with three runs, a stolen base and an RBI at Miami (4/18)...went 2-for-3 with two runs scored at Clemson (5/2)...hit .778 (7-for-9) in the Duke series with two doubles, five runs scored, four RBI and a slugging % of 1.000...recorded hits in four of the six ACC Tournament games and drove in a run in three of the six contests...went on a season-long seven-game hit streak during the postseason that culminated with a 4-for-5 day in the Regional Championship versus UCF including three RBIs and a double (6/6)...drove in a run and scored a run in the Super Regional versus Arkansas.

**SENIOR YEAR (2004):** FSU's starting second baseman in 2004...named to the 2004 Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament Team where he shared MVP honors with fellow Seminole Stephen Drew...was a team-leader in seven different offensive categories...tied for the team lead in runs scored (68) and second on the team in hits...had the fourth-best batting average (.342) and was fifth with a .485 slugging percentage...his 46 RBIs and eight home runs were also good enough for fourth on the team...batted .435 against left-handed hitters, second-best among starters...when there was a runner on third and less than two outs, Zech drove the run in over 79% of the time...recorded 14 two out RBIs...second on the team with 26 multi-hit games and fifth on the squad with 10 multi-RBI games...had the second-longest hitting streak of the season at 12 games...led the team with 147 assists and in fielding double plays with 50...started 65 games including 57 at second base...his other nine starts came at shortstop...named to

the Dairy Queen Classic All-Tournament team at second base...scored a run while going 2-for-3 against VMI (2/2)...went 4-for-11 (.364) with three runs, one double, one RBI and two walks in the series with Arizona State...scored three runs while going 3-for-4 with a stolen base at Jacksonville (2/15)...went 1-for-3 with two runs, an RBI and his first home run of the season vs. West Virginia (3/6)...made his first appearance of the season as the leadoff hitter against Illinois State (3/9) and went 2-for-5 with two runs scored...went 5-for-11 (.455) with two runs and two RBI in the series against Michigan State...scored two runs while going 2-for-5 with a double against Jacksonville (3/17)...hit .455 (5-11) with seven runs and five RBI in the series against Maryland...went 3-for-5 with a home run, two runs scored and an RBI at UNC (3/28)...led off the game at Florida (3/31) with a home run while going 3-for-6...went 3-for-6 with an RBI against NC State (4/3)...scored two runs and had two RBI while going 2-for-3 with a home run at Jacksonville (4/7)...went 2-for-2 with two runs and an RBI against Miami (4/9)...knocked in three runs and scored two while going 3-for-4 with a home run against Florida (4/21)...scored a career-high four runs at Clemson (5/1)...hit .429 (6-14) at Clemson with six runs, two doubles, a stolen base and four RBI...had three doubles while going 4-for-12 (.333) in the series at Virginia...went 2-for-4 with a run, two RBI and a season-high two doubles in the final game of the series...was one of two players to have a multi-hit game at then-No.6 Florida (5/12) while going 2-for-4...had two stolen bases against Duke (5/14)...hit .600 (6-for-10) in the series against Duke with four runs scored...ended the Wake Forest series by going 5-for-9 with six runs scored and four RBIs...had hits in all three games versus Georgia Tech including three RBIs in leading FSU to the conference title...went on an eight-game hit streak in the postseason in which he recorded a base hit in every NCAA Tournament game except for the season finale versus Arkansas...hit .467 with six runs, four RBIs and two home runs while slugging .867 in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional...also drew four walks, struck out just two times and was a perfect 2-for-2 in steals...went 2-for-5 with an RBI in the opening game of the Super Regional versus Arkansas.
