



**JUNIOR YEAR (2004):** The Tribe's top reliever in 2004, Lynch had the staff's lowest ERA and most appearances...led the team with five saves...Lynch appeared in 30 games for the third straight season putting him just 37 away from the career record as he enters his senior season...lowered his ERA for the third straight year and had five times as many saves in one season than he had in the previous two years...set a new career high for innings pitched with 37.1 and for strikeouts with 34...in the top five among FSU pitchers in 12 categories while leading the staff in nine categories...number one in ERA, saves, appearances, games in relief, runs allowed, earned runs allowed, walks allowed, triples allowed and home runs allowed...not only had the lowest ERA but also allowed the fewest runs per game earned or unearned among the staff...second on the team in games finished (13) and doubles allowed (10) and fifth in opposing batting average...fourth-lowest opponent batting average (.212) versus right-handed hitters...the second-best hurler on the staff when it came to keeping the leadoff runner off base (.214)...had the third-lowest average for walks per game (2.43) and the fourth-highest average for strikeouts per game (8.27)...second among all ACC pitchers in appearances and recorded the third-most saves in the conference...was third in the conference with three saves in ACC games...had the second-best strikeout to walk ratio on the staff at 3.4 to 1...held opposing batters to an average of .260 or below for the second straight season...was tied for second among ACC pitchers with 30 appearances...third in the conference with three saves in ACC games...posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage in 11 chances.

**GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** Picked up the win in the season opener against VMI (1/31) after working 2.0 innings...only allowed one run on two hits with three strikeouts...pitched a scoreless ninth inning against Oral Roberts (2/21) with two hits and two strikeouts...picked up his second win of the season against Nebraska (3/5) after working the final 1.1 innings with one strikeout and no hits...earned the save against Illinois State (3/9) while working the final 1.1 innings with one strikeout and no hits...closed out the final two-thirds of the ninth inning against Michigan State (3/12) for his third win of the year...worked a scoreless eighth inning of relief against Maryland (3/21)...suffered his third loss of the season after pitching the final two-thirds of the sixth inning with one hit, one run (unearned), one walk and one strikeout at UNC (3/28)...pitched a scoreless inning of relief against NC State (4/3) with two strikeouts and just one hit...worked a combined 2.2 innings of relief and allowed one unearned run on three hits with two walks in the three games at Miami...did not allow a hit in 1.2 innings of scoreless relief in the Seminoles 10-1 win at Clemson (5/2)...picked up his third save of the season after pitching a perfect final three innings with a season-high four strikeouts at Virginia (5/9)...earned his fourth save of the year against Duke (5/15) as he worked the final three innings with just one run (unearned) scored on two hits with four strikeouts...picked up his next save versus Wake Forest (5/20) pitching one inning...opened the ACC Tournament by pitching 3.2 innings in a 6-5 win over NC State (5/26)...next outing came versus Georgia Tech (5/29) where he went three innings in an FSU victory...made two appearances versus UCF in the NCAA Regional and didn't allow a run in either outing...pitched 1.1 innings in the Super Regional versus Arkansas (6/11) allowing one run.

**2003 (Sophomore Year):** Served as FSU's set-up man out of the bullpen for closer Daniel Hodges...pitched one inning of relief vs. VMI (1/31) and struck out two...pitched in two games against Evansville (2/14, 2/16) and did not allow a hit while striking out three...retired two batters vs. Wake Forest (4/6) and gave up one hit...pitched a total of 6.2 scoreless innings of relief in four appearances vs. Miami, giving up just four hits and striking out five with no walks...worked a scoreless 1.2 innings at Maryland (5/9)... picked up his third win of the season in a two-inning outing at Duke (5/17)...pitched one scoreless inning of relief in the ACC Tournament vs. Georgia Tech...did not allow an earned run in 16 of his last 19 appearances... worked three scoreless innings of relief in the NCAA Regional in two appearances...gave up one run on two hits against Texas (6/8) in the Super Regional.

**2002 AS A FRESHMAN:** Had two hits at Hawaii (2/1) as the starter in left field...held opponents hitless in 12 of his 30 outings...gave up only three runs in his first 14 appearances...picked up the first two wins of his career against then-No. 6 Florida...tied for 10th on FSU's all-time single season appearance list with 30...helped Florida State pick up its first shutout of the season in a 1-0 win over Jacksonville (Feb. 23)...his 30 appearances ranked fifth in the ACC...earned his lone save of the year vs. Georgia Tech (April 20)...did not allow a hit or a run and struck out two Yellow Jacket batters (1.1 IP)...four wins were tops among FSU freshmen...went a career-long 3.2 innings against then-No.1 Stanford (Feb. 8)...had an outstanding second half of the season and didn't allow a run in his final six outings.

**PREP:** Attained All-State honors in 2000 and 2001...a 2001 *Collegiate Baseball All-American*...was named Area Player of the Year his senior season after hitting .400 with two home runs, 13 doubles, 26 RBIs and five triples...as a pitcher, he finished his senior year with a record of 10-0 with a 0.66 ERA...voted All-State and All-Area for football his junior and senior year.

**FRESHMAN YEAR (2004):** Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American...second team All-ACC as an at-large selection...2004 Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament Team at first base...saw action in 66 games and started 51...made 36 starts at first, 10 at second base and five at third...led all freshmen in every category...only senior Aaron Cheesman returns coming off a better overall season than Malone...was in the top five of 13 offensive categories...fifth in average, third in slugging percentage, fourth in on base percentage, fifth in runs scored, third in RBIs, fourth in doubles and triples, third in home runs, fourth in total bases, fifth in walks, second in sac flies, fourth in stolen bases and third in stolen base percentage...no starter hit righties better than Malone (.352)...only MLB draftees Stephen Drew and Eddy Martinez-Esteve hit better with runners on (.356) than Malone in 2004...Malone led the team with four hits with the bases loaded and was second in average with the bags full (.364)...was third among starters in reaching base when leading off an inning (.442)...the Tribe's best pinch hitter as well as Malone went 3 for 4 in those opportunities...his .444 average with runners in scoring position led the team and only two players recorded more hits with runners in scoring position...in 19 opportunities with a runner on third and less than two outs, Malone recorded an RBI 16 times which led the team...Malone was third on the team with 13 multi-RBI games and sixth on the squad with 18 multi-hit games...ranked fifth in the ACC in slugging percentage at .611...led all ACC players with 34 RBIs in conference games...only teammate Eddy Martinez-Esteve hit more home runs in ACC games than did Malone in 2004 and had a higher slugging percentage...third among ACC players when it came to total bases in ACC contests...posted the ACC's fourth-best on base percentage in conference games...was fourth in the conference in batting average in ACC games and 10<sup>th</sup> in hits per game...fifth in the ACC in runs scored in conference games...he finished the season on an 11-game hitting streak, the third longest on the team in 2004.

**GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** Went 1-for-2 with a triple and a run scored while starting at third base in his first career game...had career-high three hits while going 3-for-5 with a run scored at Arizona State (2/8)...recorded his first-career RBI while going 1-for-3 against Jacksonville (2/16)...came in at first base for starter Danny Wardell against Oral Roberts (2/21) and went 1-for-2 with a run scored...scored a run with an RBI while going 1-for-1 against Illinois State (3/9)...against Butler, went 2-for-4 with two RBIs and a run scored...hit his first-career home run against Michigan State (3/14)...hit .400 (4-10) with five runs, one double, one triple and two grand slams for 13 RBIs in the series against Maryland...recorded a season-high four hits (4-for-5) at UNC (3/27) with a double, three runs and three RBIs...belted two home runs in the Sunday game at UNC (3/28) while going 2-for-4 with two runs and two RBIs...hit .583 (7-12) with three home runs, a double and a slugging percentage of 1.417 in the series at UNC...scored two runs with an RBI and a stolen base while going 1-for-3 against NC State (4/4)...hit his eighth home run of the season while going 2-for-3 with a double, an RBI and two runs scored at Jacksonville (4/7)...went 5-for-12 (.417) in the series against Georgia Tech...hit .400 (4-10) with a double, three runs and four RBIs in the series at Clemson...had a key two-run pinch hit single which helped propel FSU to a 10-1 win at Clemson (5/2)...hit .400 (4-for-10) in the series at Virginia including going 2-for-3 with a double and two RBIs on May 7...hit .444 (4-for-9) in the Duke series with his ninth home run of the season, three runs scored and three RBIs while slugging .778%...opened the Wake Forest (5/20) series by going 2-for-4 with two runs scored and two RBIs...the next day he went 3-for-6 and

came just a single away from hitting for the cycle. Drove in two runs and scored three as he hit a double, triple and a home run...recorded a double in four of the six games at the ACC Championships as FSU went on to take the league crown...had a big game against Duke (5/27) at the ACC Tournament going 2-for-4 with a run scored, an RBI and two doubles...followed that game up by going 2-for-3 against Georgia Tech (5/28) with another run, another RBI and another double...doubled and scored a run in his third straight ACC Tournament game going 1-for-3 versus North Carolina (5/29)...after driving in another run versus Georgia Tech (5/29) later that day, Malone helped FSU clinch the title versus the Jackets (5/30) by recording another double and another RBI on top of scoring his fourth run of the tournament in the championship game...continued his hot hitting from the ACC Tournament at the NCAA Regional as Malone upped his streak of consecutive games with an RBI to six knocking in nine runs during the run...opened the Tallahassee Regional with an RBI versus BCC (6/4) and UCF (6/5)...followed up by homering in back-to-back games versus UCF...in the Regional Championship, Malone went 2-for-4 with a homer, two runs scored and four RBIs...opened NCAA Super Regional play with a 2-for-5 day while scoring twice against Arkansas (6/11)...recorded a hit in his 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive game to end the season in the final game versus the Razorbacks (6/12).

**PREP:** Earned All-State honors in all four years as a starter at P.K. Yonge...played in the East Coast Pro in Wilmington, North Carolina and the Florida Diamond Club in Tampa...named the Diamond Club for Florida Player of the Year in Florida...played in back-to-back state semifinals as a sophomore and a junior...attended Team USA Olympic trials in 2000, 2001 and 2002...Gainesville Sun Player of the Year in 2003...broke a 16-year old state record with 265 career hits, which ranks second nationally all-time...set school career records with 28 home runs, a .538 career batting average, 153 RBIs, 13 triples, 68 doubles, .713 OBP, 84 stolen bases in 86 attempts and 158 consecutive games played...struck out only 19 times during his entire prep career.

**FRESHMAN YEAR (2004):** One of FSU's top freshmen in 2004...saw action in 37 games and started 16...his .306 average was the seventh-best on the squad...scored 12 runs, homered three times and drove in 13 RBIs...slugging percentage of .444 was seventh-best...hit lefties very well batting .342...with runners on base Peacher hit .359, which was third-best on the team...also had the team's third-highest batting average with the bases loaded...hit .300 as a pinch hitter and was second on the team with runners in scoring position hitting .409...had three multi-hit games and two multi-RBI games last season...also strung together a five-game hitting streak.
