2005: Drafted in the 38th round of the 2005 MLB draft by the Colorado Rockies... second on the team with 15 starting assignments but was moved to the bullpen at the end of the season... had seven relief appearances in his last eight outings... posted a 4-4 record on the season... led FSU with 74 strikeouts including 31 batters struck out looking... named ACC Pitcher of the Week after pitching 7.2 innings and not allowing an earned run in a win over Clemson... one of three Seminole pitchers to earn ACC Pitcher of the Week honors (April 4)... tied for second on the team in innings pitched with 89.0 and was tied for third in innings per appearance... was fourth on the team with a .214 opponent batting average when runners were on base... held left-handed opposing batters to just a .250 average on the season... fourth on the team with 24 appearances... led all FSU starters in strikeouts per nine innings... his 3.54 ERA was the fifth best on the team... tied for eighth in

the ACC for games started and ranked 10th in conference games with 7.49 SO/G... Florida State was 5-3 in Browning's eight ACC starts... was 3-1 in Friday night starts during the regular season... allowed only 12 runs in the first nine starts of his FSU career... in those first nine starts, Browning never allowed more than three runs and in five of those starts he surrendered either one or no runs... had at least five strikeouts in four starts including a career-high 11 in a no-decision against Hawaii-Hilo... a 2:1 ratio of strikeouts to walks as a relief pitcher with 10 strikeouts and five walks allowed... zero runs allowed in eight of his 14 appearances (nine in relief and five starting assignments) against NCAA Tournament teams.

JUNIOR COLLEGE: Drafted in the 26th round of the 2004 draft by the Chicago Cubs... was clocked at 91mph.

SUMMER BALL: Two USSSA and one AAU National Championship with Savannah Chain.

HIGH SCHOOL: Drafted in the sixth round by the Boston Red Sox in 2002... Wayne County High School MVP his senior season... Wayne County High School Pitcher's Award... Georgia High School Dugout Club Player of the Week (2001).

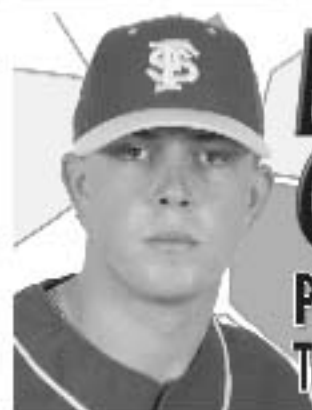

2005: Had a career-high 16 appearances — all in relief — in 2005...showed improvement from his freshman year as he posted a 4.67 ERA and a 2-0 record in 2005...doubled his win total from the previous year...eleven of his 16 appearances came against NCAA Tournament teams including each of his last seven outings...wins came in the ACC against Wake Forest in his longest career outing of 4.2 innings and against Stetson...appeared in 10 ACC games with pitching time coming in six Seminole conference wins including one victory over Clemson and NC State and two against North Carolina...only three walks allowed in 17.1 innings pitched and had a 3.7:1 strikeout to walk ratio...allowed fewer walks per nine innings than any pitcher on the staff...allowed only one home run and five extra base hits in 16 appearances.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2004): True freshman made an impact in 2004 appearing in 12 games and posting a 1-0 record...started

three games and had a strikeout to walk ratio of almost 2:1...Florida State posted a 3-0 record in the three games Chambers started...held left-handed hitters to an average of just .277, seventh lowest on the team...averaged almost seven K's per appearance.

HIGH SCHOOL: Went 4-4 with a 1.80 ERA as a senior...named All-District, All-Region, All-County and All-Sun Coast as a junior...also named honorable mention All-State...went 7-3 with a 1.26 ERA as junior...played at Tropicana Field for the Perfect Game National Showcase...struck out 14 batters including the first nine he faced and only allowed two hits against East Bay in the Tony Saladino tournament in the spring of 2003 in Tampa, FL.

2006: Preseason 3rd team NCBWA All-American...Roger Clemens Award and Brooks Wallace watch list.
2005: NCBWA third team All-American...a member of the watch lists for the Roger Clemens and NCBWA Stopper of the Year Awards...All-ACC second team selection...one of only three relief pitchers to be named All-ACC...first in the ACC and fourth nationally with 15 saves...led for the ACC lead in saves recorded in conference games...finished the season only three saves shy of tying the all-time Florida State record...named the national pitcher of the week by the NCBWA (March 1)...led for third on the team with seven victories, second on the team in ERA (2.06), first on the team in opponent batting average (.196), second in K's (73), first in games finished (37) and second in hits allowed (34)...allowed earned runs in only nine of 39 appearances...had a hand in 22 of the Seminoles' 53 victories (42%)...led for second on the team, tied for second in the ACC and sixth in the nation with 39 appearances...only allowed three extra base hits in 39 appearances...no FSU pitcher allowed fewer hits per

nine innings of work than Chambliss...his average of 12.6 K's per nine innings was almost three better than any FSU pitcher with more than six innings pitched...allowed just three extra base hits all season, eight fewer than any Seminole with more than 18 innings pitched...Florida State was 29-7 when Chambliss was the Seminoles' final pitcher of a game...established career-highs in victories with seven in 2005 (recorded four in 2004), saves with 15 (earned one in 2004) and appearances with 39 (had 27 in 2004)...4-2 record with four saves in 18 appearances against NCAA Tournament teams during the regular season and ACC Tournament...six saves and three wins in 19 appearances against ACC opponents during the regular season and in the ACC Tournament...wins over NCAA Tournament teams came against Stetson (Feb. 22), Clemson (April 3) and twice against North Carolina (May 15, 25)...saves against NCAA Tournament teams during the regular season came against Stetson (Feb. 23), Florida (April 3, May 3) and Virginia (May 1)...recorded a save in the NCAA Regional against Army (June 3)...ACC saves

recorded against Virginia Tech (March 18), Clemson (April 2), Wake Forest (April 8, 9), Maryland (May 8) and North Carolina (May 15)...pitched three or more innings five times - three times in Seminole victories...3.1 innings in a 6-4 win at Hawaii-Hilo (March 5), in a 13-10 loss against Wake Forest (April 10), in a 7-6 victory over North Carolina (May 15), 3.2 versus Florida in the Super Regional (June 11) and a career-high 4.0 innings in a 3-2 victory over North Carolina in the ACC Tournament (May 25)...had a 3.2:1 strikeout to walks ratio on the season...had a 2.6:1 strikeout to walks ratio (34 strikeouts against 13 walks) against NCAA Tournament teams during the regular season and in the ACC Tournament...two saves in two appearances against Florida as the Seminoles' took two of three from the National Champion Runner-Up Gators.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2004): One of FSU's top relievers in 2004...posted a 4-1 record and appeared in 27 games...had the fifth-best ERA on the FSU staff at 3.89...opponents hit just .213 off Chambliss, which was second-best among Tribe pitchers...tied for fourth on the team with one save...struck out more than twice as many batters as he walked...right-handed batters hit just .205 against the freshman, third-lowest on the staff...only one FSU hurler had a lower opponent average versus lefties than Chambliss' .224...also second on the team when it comes to pitching with runners on base as he held opponents to a .205 average...no FSU pitcher in 2004 had a higher winning percentage and a lower ERA than Chambliss...was among the top five on the team in a dozen different categories...was first or second on the team in nine categories...led the squad with 19 games finished, fewest hits allowed (32), triples allowed (0), home runs allowed (3) and doubles allowed (6)...second on the staff in win percentage (.800), games in relief (26), runs allowed (26) and earned runs allowed (17)...fifth-most appearances amongst all ACC pitchers.

PREP: As a senior, he hit .380 with five home runs and was named first team All-State as a utility player...saw playing time at third base in addition to his pitching duties...recorded 12 strike-outs against Santa Fe High School in the district playoffs his senior year...pitched five innings with 10 strikeouts against North Florida Christian and only allowed three hits...a third team All-State selection at third base as a junior...hit .401 with two home runs...also pitched his junior year with a 6-2 record and a 1.77 ERA...played for the Tallahassee Titans in the Perfect Game World Wooden Bat Championships in Jupiter, Florida over the last three years.

2005: Florida State's back-up catcher started two games behind the plate for the Seminoles... starting assignments came against Hawaii-Hilo and Duke in the second game of a doubleheader... played in a single-season career-high 27 games and made a career-high two starts... also established career-highs for doubles (two) and homeruns (one) while recording four hits... slugging percentage of .450 on the year as Diaz exhibited big-time power in limited opportunities... of his four hits two were doubles and one was a home run... slugging percentage was sixth-best on the squad... first homer of his career came in a pinch hitting role versus VMI and was a two-run blast... only single of the season came in a pinch-hitting role against Jacksonville... hits came in four different games including a

Seminole's victory over Virginia Tech... career-high tying two RBIs in Florida State's victory over VMI.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2004): Appeared in 23 games as a true freshman backing up Aaron Cheesman behind the plate... hit .250 in 24 at bats including a double and four RBIs... did not make a start last season... fielded an impressive .977... hit .333 versus left-handed pitchers and reached base safely 50% of the time when leading off an inning.

PREP: Named second team All-Dade County as a senior after hitting .406 with five home runs and 41 RBI... was charged with only one error during his entire senior season... voted team MVP at Southridge... had a game-winning hit in every playoff game through the regional semifinals... recorded



three home runs in five postseason games... Southridge was ranked No. 1 in the nation in five different polls during his junior and senior seasons... hit .343 with three home runs as a junior... helped lead Southridge to a 35-2 record his junior season as they advanced to the State Championship at Legends Field in Tampa... went 2-for-3 with a double in the Championship game.

2005: Florida State's top set-up man pitched in a single-season career-high 39 games...recorded career-bests for ERA (2.76), innings pitched (42.1), strikeouts (44) and victories (one)...had the team's fourth-best ERA and third-best opponent batting average (.217)...finished eight games (second on the team) and struck out 20 batters looking (third on the team)...third among pitchers with more than six innings of work for K's per nine innings...the only FSU pitcher on the Seminoles' post-season roster who did not allow a homerun in 2005...Florida State earned victories in 25 of DiBlasi's 39 appearances...outstanding strikeout to walk ratio of nearly 3:1 with 44 strikeouts and only 14 walks issued...tied for second in the ACC and sixth nationally with 39 appearances...fifth in the ACC for appearances in conference games...had the third best opponent batting average on the Seminole staff (.217) and third best opponent batting average against right-handed hitters (.190)...22 strikeouts in 24 appearances against NCAA Tournament teams...first career victory came to open the series against Duke in one-third of an inning pitched out of the bullpen...more strikeouts in 2005 (44) than during his first two seasons combined (36)...of his 39 appearances only six went for 2.0 innings or more...season-high 4.1 innings pitched came in the Super Regional against Florida...outstanding in relief with 1.2 innings pitched and no hits or runs allowed in Florida State's victory over North Carolina in the ACC Tournament.

SOPHOMORE YEAR (2004): An emerging left-hander who improved on almost all his numbers from his freshman campaign...appeared in more games (24 versus 14) and lowered his ERA from 5.14 as a freshman to 3.85 last season...his 3.85 ERA was the third-lowest among the staff and he shared the team lead with one combined shutout...only four hurlers had more appearances than DiBlasi in 2004...opponents hit just .257 off the sophomore in 2004...was third on the team with two saves...an excellent fielding pitcher who posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage in seven chances...tied for fourth on the team with six games finished...picked off the second-most runners of any FSU pitcher in 2004...only three Seminole hurlers did a better job against opponents with runners on as DiBlasi held batters to just a .250 average...had

the team's fifth best opponent batting average against lefties at .255...no Seminole regular did better at closing out an inning as DiBlasi limited opponents to just a .156 average with two outs in a frame giving up just five hits in 32 at bats...posted a strikeout to walk ratio of 2.2 to 1.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2003): Worked a scoreless inning of relief vs. Siena (3/4), striking out two...went one inning without giving up a hit or a run vs. St. Joseph's (3/12)...pitched one scoreless inning vs. Wake Forest (4/5) and did not allow a hit, striking out one and walking one...struck out two in a scoreless inning of relief vs. Clemson (4/11)...pitched a scoreless inning of relief at Duke (5/17)...worked a scoreless inning of relief vs. Rutgers

(NCAA Regional) on 5/31...allowed two runs on two hits against Texas (6/8) in game one of the Super Regional.
