2005: Named All-ACC second team for the second straight season...the only two-time All-ACC selection on last year's Seminole team...Brooks Wallace National Player of the Year preseason watch list...named to the National Baseball Foundation Honor Roll May 16 after his performance against North Carolina (May 13-15) as Florida State swept the Tar Heels...named the ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career after helping the Seminoles to the three-game sweep of the nationally ranked Heels...began the season as the Seminoles first baseman before making the switch to third when Bryan Henry moved into the starting rotation after the Georgia Tech series...dubbed the shot heard around the Seminole nation to help Florida

State past No. 8 North Carolina (May 14) and to an eventual sweep of the Tar Heels with a two-out, two-strike, three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give the Seminoles a come-from-behind 6-5 victory...one of the most thrilling victories in the recent history of the program...came within a double of hitting for the cycle for the first time in his career in the victory over North Carolina...started 29 consecutive games at third base and made 34 starts at the position during the season...also made 33 starts at first base and two in left field...the No. 2 hitter in the lineup for 37 consecutive games at the end of the season...enjoyed the best season of his two-year career with single-season career high statistics for hits (83), runs scored (62), doubles (22), RBIs (61),

walks (50) and stolen bases (10)...cut his errors down dramatically from 17 to 9 despite spending much of his playing time at two positions...started a career-high 69 of the Seminoles' 73 games in 2005...fifth in the ACC in walks in conference games and eighth in the conference in overall walks...six of his seven homeruns all came in Florida State victories – against Auburn (Feb. 11), Jacksonville (April 6, May 17), Virginia (May 1) and North Carolina (May 13, 14)...his only homerun in a non-win came against Wake Forest (May 10)...his homerun against the Demon Deacons allowed the Seminoles to storm back from a 6-1 deficit, tie the game and send it into extra innings...more extra base hits (32) than he did in earning freshman All-America honors (30) during the 2004 season...22 multiple-hit games including two of four in the ACC Tournament...11 of his 22 multiple-hit games came against ACC competition...second on the team with 15 multiple RBI games...traded only national player of the year Shane Robinson in hits, doubles, walks and runs per nine innings...was second on the team in RBIs per nine innings and tied for third in triples per nine innings...career-high tying five RBI games in wins over North Carolina (May 14) and Jacksonville (April 12)...recorded hits in both NCAA Super Regional games and enters 2006 on a 16-game hitting streak...at least one hit in every game since May 13 against North Carolina...hit .390 (.25-of-64) since May 13 with seven multi-hit games.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2004): Louisville

Sluggers Freshman All-American...second team All-ACC as an at-large selection...2004 Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament Team at first base...saw action in 66 games and started 51...made 36 starts at first, 10 at second base and five at third...led all freshmen in every category...only senior Aaron Cheesman returns coming off a better overall season than Malone...was in the top five of 13 offensive categories...fifth in average, third in slugging percentage, fourth in on base percentage, fifth in runs scored, third in RBIs, fourth in doubles and triples, third in home runs, fourth in total bases, fifth in walks, second in sac flies, fourth in stolen bases and third in stolen base percentage...no starter hit righties better than Malone (.352)...only MLB draftees Stephen Drew and Eddy Martinez-Esteve hit better with runners on (.356) than Malone in 2004...Malone led the team with four hits with the bases loaded and was second in average with the bags full (.364)...was third among starters in reaching base when leading off an inning (.442)...the Tribe's best pinch hitter as well as Malone went 3 for 4 in those opportunities...his .444 average with runners in scoring position led the team and only two players recorded more hits with runners in scoring position...in 19 opportunities with a runner on third and less than two outs, Malone recorded an RBI 16 times which led the team...Malone was third on the team with 13 multi-RBI games and sixth on the squad with 18 multi-hit games...ranked fifth in the ACC in slugging percentage at .611...led all ACC players with 34 RBIs in conference

games...only teammate Eddy Martinez-Esteve hit more home runs in ACC games than did Malone in 2004 and had a higher slugging percentage...third among ACC players when it came to total bases in ACC contests...posted the ACC's fourth-best on base percentage in conference games...was fourth in the conference in batting average in ACC games and 10th in hits per game...fifth in the ACC in runs scored in conference games...he finished the season on an 11-game hitting streak, the third longest on the team in 2004.

PREP: Earned All-State honors in all four years as a starter at P.K. Yonge...played in the East Coast Pro in Wilmington, North Carolina and the Florida Diamond Club in Tampa...named the Diamond Club for Florida Player of the Year in Florida...played in back-to-back state semifinals as a sophomore and a junior...attended Team USA Olympic trials in 2000, 2001 and 2002...Gainesville Sun Player of the Year in 2003...broke a 16-year old state record with 265 career hits, which ranks second nationally all-time...set school career records with 28 home runs, a .538 career batting average, 153 RBIs, 13 triples, 68 doubles, .713 OBP, 84 stolen bases in 86 attempts and 158 consecutive games played...struck out only 19 times during his entire prep career.

2005: An important outfield reserve who made 40 appearance and started 14 games in right field...started five games in right field in ACC competition...hit .227 in 66 at bats...best game of his first season as a Seminole came in a victory over Virginia Tech as he recorded a career-high three hits and a career-high five RBIs...also pounded out a career-high two doubles and scored a run...hit two home runs and both came in wins over VMI and Hawaii-Pacific...home run against Hawaii-Pacific came in a pinch hitting role at Aloha Stadium...totaled 16 RBIs on 15 hits with three multiple-RBI games...career-high five RBIs against Virginia Tech, three against Hawaii-Pacific and two against VMI rank as his biggest games.

HIGH SCHOOL: The #1 rated player in Illinois by PG/Baseball America and Midwest Prospects since June of 2002...rated 42nd at the Perfect Game National Showcase in June of 2004...projected as a third-10th round draft choice by Baseball America prior to signing with the Seminoles...earned all-conference honors as a sophomore...Chicago Tribune All-State catcher special mention in 2003...attended the Chicago White Sox Silver & Black

Series/Combine in the summer of 2004...Area Code tryouts summer of 2004...Minnesota Twins Top Prospect Team (East Coast MLB Showcase) summer 2004...a three year varsity starter and two year captain...in three years at Oak Park-River Forest he collected 110 hits and posted a batting average of .425 with 14 HR, eight triples and 43 doubles in 259 at bats...after just three seasons, O'Connor finished third all-time for home runs in school history...slugged .814 with an on base percentage of .515...junior year he hit .377 with three home runs and 27 RBIs while playing short...as a sophomore O'Connor batted .449, slugged 1.017 and was on base 56% of the time...hit eight homers, drove in 47 runs and struck out just once per every 10 at bats.

SUMMER BALL: This past summer with the Indiana Yankees he hit .473 with three home runs and struck out only four times in 55 at bats on top of playing seven positions for the Yankees.

PERSONAL: Graduated early from high school to enroll at FSU in the spring of 2005...J. Kyle Baird Leadership Award...starting QB on varsity football team as a sophomore

...had a 3.5 GPA...father Pat is an FSU grad and his mother Irene attended FSU before eventually getting her degree from Harvard...enrolled in FSU's undergraduate studies program.

2006: Consensus preseason All-American...on Brooks Wallace watch list... NCBWA Preseason National Player of the Year.

2005: Collegiate Baseball's National Player of the Year...SEBaseball.com's ACC Player of the Year and a candidate for all four National Player of the Year honors...just the fifth consensus first team All-American in FSU history...NCBWA District III co-player of the year...named first team All-ACC and was a candidate for ACC Player of the Year honors...on every honors list that exists in college baseball...named to the NCAA Tallahassee Regional All-Tournament team and was one of just two FSU players to earn ACC Player of the Week honors...enjoyed a school record 40-game hitting streak that garnered the sopho-

more national attention including a resolution passed by the Florida House of Representatives recognizing the streak...it was the ninth longest streak ever in Division I baseball... went on to reach base safely in 17 more games giving him a 57-game streak of reaching base safely...the first player in FSU history to record 100 hits and steal 40 bases in the same season and he was also the first player in the nation to reach the 100-hit plateau in 2005...led the nation in hits (122) and runs scored (96) as he was one of only two players to finish the season ranked first nationally in two offensive categories... finished the season ranked in the top five nationally for hits (122), runs (96), on base percentage (.532), doubles (25), steals (49), steal attempts (56), games played (73) and

games started (73)...the only player in America to finish in the top five in hits, runs, doubles and stolen bases...also ranked in the top 10 nationally for walks (57), total bases (173), and batting average (.427)...no player in America finished 2005 ranked in the top five of more offensive categories than Robinson...finished the season with the second-most bases ever stolen in a year at FSU...was in the top 10 at Florida State for single season walks (57) and third in batting average and hits...won the regular season ACC Batting Title and had more hits, runs, stolen bases and total bases than any player in the conference...there were only two games all season in which Robinson did not reach base...Robinson's .427 batting average led the team and the ACC, and placed him tied for sixth in the nation...led the team in 12 of 22 offensive categories...had a total of 40 multi-hit games including 18 three hit games and 22 two hit games...recorded multiple hits in almost 55% of FSU's games...recorded a hit in over 90% of the Seminoles' games and there were only two games all season in which Robinson did not reach base...accounted for almost 30% of Florida State's runs in 2005 via RBIs or runs scored...started in the leadoff position in all 73 games that the Seminoles played in 2005...led off the game by getting on base over 57% of the time while batting .436 and slugging .654 in FSU's first at bat of a game...of the 42 times Robinson reached base to lead off a game, he scored FSU's first run 25 times...struck out only five times all season in his first at bat of a game...has now started 139 straight games in his two years at FSU...slugged .605 which led the team and placed him in the top three in the ACC...

Robinson reached base more than half the time accumulating a .532 on base percentage, which lead the team and also led the ACC...his 122 hits led the ACC and the team...recorded 25 doubles which placed him second in the ACC...his 57 walks were more than double that of any of his other teammates and ranked seventh on the national leader board and was second-best in the ACC...49 stolen bases led the team, the ACC, and was good for third-best in the nation...scored 96 runs on the season, far and away the best in the ACC and put him first in the national rankings...after the season, named to the US National Team, becoming the first Seminole since Doug Mientkiewicz in 2000 to play for Team USA.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2004): Another of FSU's impressive freshmen in 2004, Robinson started all 68 games for the Seminoles in center field...Robinson was the only rookie to start every game last year and joined junior catcher Aaron Cheesman as the only two players to start all 68 contests...named ACC Tournament MVP after going 11-for-26 with six RBIs and also making several dazzling catches in centerfield...was in the top five in nine different offensive categories...led FSU in stolen bases, attempted steals and at bats...was second on the squad in doubles, total plate appearances and stolen base percentage...fourth on the team in runs scored and fifth in hits...hit .302 with runners on base last season and reached base over 46% of the time when leading off an inning...his 16 two-out RBIs were the fourth-most on the team...had 23 multi hit games, third-most and nine multi RBI games, which was the sixth-most by a Seminole...had a season-long eight game hit streak



and ended the year on a five-game run...ranked ninth in the ACC in steals per game and totaled the fifth-most steals in the conference...had the fifth-most steals per game among ACC players in conference contests.

HIGH SCHOOL: Voted first team All-State in baseball and football as a junior and senior...hit .370 as a senior, .431 as a junior, .376 as a sophomore and .364 during his freshman season...a four-year starter in center field for Jesuit...voted the Sarasota Classic's Best Offensive Player during his junior year...named to the Saladino All-Tournament team after recording the highest batting average (.600)...picked to play for the FACA All-Star Baseball Team in 2003...played for the Perfect Game National Showcase as one of the top 200 high school prospects...ran the fastest time (6.4 in the 60) at the Showcase as a junior...recognized by Collegiate Baseball as one of the top high school prospects in the nation following his sophomore season...named to the All-Hillsborough County his sophomore year...defeated Bishop Kenny in the State Championship his freshman year in 2000 against former Seminoles Tony Richie and Dennis Anderson...also played football all four years at Jesuit...had his #3 jersey retired at Jesuit for football following his senior season...invited to play in the Florida-Georgia All-Star football game as a junior...recruited by Duke and Stanford for football.



2005: Florida State's everyday right fielder who started 59 of the Seminoles' 73 games...started 26 consecutive games in right field to finish the year...named to the 2005 ACC All-Tournament team...ranked second on the team in batting average with a .328 mark...finished in the top five on the team in six offensive categories...led all FSU freshmen in average, on base percentage, hits and doubles...committed only one error in 85 chances for a .988 fielding percentage...missed only two games...fifth on the team in hits with 64 which included 15 games with multiple hits...15 multiple-hit games was fifth on the team...career-high four hits in a win over Hawaii-Hilo...ACC high of three hits against Virginia Tech...14 doubles ranked tied for third on the team...multiple RBIs in six games — four of which were victories for the Seminoles...two hits in ACC wins against Virginia Tech and Virginia...two home runs



were both in ACC play and both in Florida State wins over Duke and NC State...eight sacrifices to rank as one of eight players on the team with eight or more sacrifices...a .340 hitter in 36 games against NCAA Tournament teams...named to the All-Tournament team at the 2005 ACC Tournament after he hit .462 (6 for 13) in four games.

HIGH SCHOOL: Four-time first team all-league...hit over .400 all four years of high school...had a .483 OBP and went 14-of-14 on stolen base attempts in 2003...only 10 strikeouts in 188 plate appearances during last two years of high school...second team All-Southern California.

PERSONAL: Won "Big Stick Award" in Mickey Mantle World Series...attended FSU's Advanced Baseball Camp...principal's honor roll all four years of high school...hobbies include surfing and snowboarding...born March 8, 1986...son of Alan and Debbie...father pitched at UCLA...has two sisters (Ashley and Lindsay) and a brother (Patrick)...major is business...2005 ACC Honor Roll.

2005: Sauls was 6-2 as a starter in 2005... his six wins ranked fifth on the Seminoles' pitching staff... tied his single-season career high for wins matching his total from the 2004 season when he finished with a 6-4 mark... recorded a 4.18 ERA on the season... allowed two earned runs or less in eight of his 14 starts... pitched five or more innings in eight of his 14 starts... did not allow a single run in three of his four relief appearances... was fifth on the team with 66.2 innings pitched... 
