2007: Enters the season vying for starting duties in left field or as FSU's DH.

2006: One of four returning starters that hit over .300 last season...his .582 slugging percentage is the third-highest among returning Seminoles...one of FSU's most dangerous hitters with runners on base and in scoring position as Anderson hit over .350 in both of those situations... despite starting just 21 games, Anderson was in the top five for batting average, slugging percentage and on base percentage last season...named to the All-ACC Tournament Team after hitting .643 and slugging 1.214 in four starts with two home runs, two doubles and four RBIs...led the team in nine offensive categories at the tournament...was a triple short of the cycle in FSU's 11-0 win over UVA... named to the NCAA Athens Regional All-Tournament team...had seven RBIs and slugged .500 in the NCAA Tournament... had a great start to the 2006 season before an ankle sprain sidelined him until ACC play...was FSU's starting DH versus left-handed pitchers and also saw time in

left field backing up Mark Gildea.

ACC: Played in 13 conference games and made four starts...led the Seminoles by hitting .500 with runners on and runners in scoring position during ACC play... slugged .722 in conference games...hit .375 versus left-handed pitching...all three of his three-hit games came in ACC play... half of his doubles and four of his five homers all came versus ACC teams... season-high seven total bases came in two ACC contests.

CHIPOLA JUNIOR COLLEGE: Named 1st Team All-Panhandle Conference as a sophomore after hitting .396 with 11 homers and 50 RBIs...named second team all-state...led Chipola to conference title... 2nd Team All-Panhandle Conference as a freshman.

2007: Enters the season as one of FSU's top relievers.

2006: His 31 appearances were the most on the team...the only Seminole to appear in 30 games last season...had the third-best ERA and trails only Luke Tucker in that category among returners...third among returning players with a .252 opponent batting average...combined on two shutouts in 2006...allowed an earned run in just eight of his 31 appearances...allowed just two earned runs in his last 13 appearances covering 15 innings...left-handers hit just .222 off Chambers all season.

ACC: Pitched in 14 ACC games, most on the team...led all FSU pitchers in K:BB ratio at 4.3:1 in conference play...averaged a strikeout per inning in ACC games...issued a walk in just four of 14 appearances...conference lefties hit just .214 off Chambers.

2005: Had a career-high 16 appearances — all in relief — in 2005...showed improvement from his freshman year as he posted a 4.67 ERA and a 2-0 record in 2005...doubled his win total from the previous year...eleven of his 16 appearances came against NCAA Tournament teams including each of his last seven outings...wins came in the ACC against Wake Forest in his longest career outing of 4.2 innings and against Stetson...appeared in 10 ACC games with pitching time coming in six Seminole conference wins including one victory over Clemson and NC State and two against North Carolina...only three walks allowed in 17.1 innings pitched and had a 3.7:1 strikeout to walk ratio...allowed fewer walks per nine innings than any pitcher on the staff...allowed only one home run and five extra base hits in 16 appearances.

2004: True freshman made an impact

in 2004 appearing in 12 games and posting a 1-0 record...started three games and had a strikeout to walk ratio of almost 2:1...Florida State posted a 3-0 record in the three games Chambers started... held left-handed hit-ers to an average of just .277, seventh lowest on the team... averaged almost seven K's per appearance.

HIGH SCHOOL: Went 4-4 with a 1.80 ERA as a senior...named All-District, All-Region, All-County and All-Sun Coast as a junior...also named honorable mention All-State...went 7-3 with a 1.26 ERA as junior...played at Tropicana Field for the Perfect Game National Showcase...struck out 14 batters including the first nine he faced and only allowed two hits against East Bay in the Tony Saladino tournament in the spring of 2003 in Tampa, FL.

2006: The top returning power threat for Florida State...had a break-out year in his first season as a starter...the only Seminole to win ACC Player of the Week in 2006...three-time member of the College Baseball Foundation Honor Roll...was in the top five of 10 different offensive categories...third among ACC players in RBIs, seventh in home runs and total bases and in the top 10 for slugging percentage led the team in RBIs, doubles and home runs...second on the team in slugging percentage and total bases...joins J.D.
