





2007: Named to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List ... appeared in 45 games in 2007, starting all but two...posted a .286 batting average with 44 hits, 13 doubles, five home runs and 37 RBIs...suffered a tear to the PCL (posterior cruciate ligament) of his right knee on a diving attempt in left field in the series finale against Virginia Tech...returned to the starting line-up in game one of the Clemson series starting as the DH after missing 10 games...re aggravated his right knee injury in his third at-bat against the Tigers... returned to action in a pinch hitting role in the third game of the ACC Tournament....started all four games of the Tallahassee Regional at the DH position hitting a home runs and driving in four runs...made 30 starts in left field and 13 as the designated hitter...hit in the number five spot in 41 games...hit home runs in back-to-back games (NC State - 4/8 and Jacksonville - 4/10)...registered his first three-hit game of the season in the series finale against Hofstra...hit safely in seven consecutive games (2/16 - 2/25)...registered 13 multi-hit games in 2007...had the game-winning RBI in game three against Wake Forest...tied his career-high for hits with four against Boston College...set a career-high with three doubles in game one...went a perfect 4-for-4 and 3-for-3 in games one and three, respectively against Boston College...hit .328 in 16 league games while posting a slugging percentage of .574...was perfect from the field on 56 opportunities to go along with four assists.

categories...third among ACC players in RBIs, seventh in home runs and total bases and in the top 10 for slugging percentage led the team in RBIs , doubles and home runs...second on the team in slugging percentage and total bases...joins J.D. Drew and Jeremy Morris as just the third player in FSU history with three grand slams in a season and is the youngest Seminole to ever accomplish that feat...led the team with seven sac flies...had just 31 K's in 236 at bats...the fastest to reach 50 RBIs in a season since Ryan Barthelemy in 2002...led the team with 21 two-out RBIs...second on the team with a .371 average versus right-handed pitchers and .355 average with runners on base...went 7-for-17 for a .412 average with the bases loaded.... hit .402 with runners in scoring position ... recorded an RBI in 14 straight games, the longest streak at FSU since 1999...his 14game hitting streak was the second-longest by an FSU player in 2006...had a hit in 22 of 25 games at one point during the 2006 season...led the Seminoles with 16 multi-RBI games and was third on the squad with 25 multi-hit games...started 26 ACC games for FSU missing only the Boston College series due to illness...second on the team behind All-American Shane Robinson for batting average in conference games...led the team in RBIs and triples, second in slugging percentage, hits and homers and third in total bases in conference games...sixth in the ACC in triples in conference play and eighth in hits...hit at least .329 versus both lefties and righties...led the team hitting with runners in scoring position and was second among starters in average with runners on...led the squad with a .429 average with the bases loaded...reached base 48% of the time when leading off an inning.

2005: A reserve first baseman who appeared in 16 games with 10 at-bats...appeared in two ACC games during the regular season as he entered the game as a pinch hitter and finished the game at first base in a victory over Virginia Tech and against NC State in the regular season finale...drew two walks in two plate appearances in Florida State's victory over St. Joseph's in Tallahassee...scored his first career run in the Seminoles' victory over Appalachian State...appeared as a pinch hitter in the Seminoles' game against Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament semifinals.

HIGH SCHOOL: A two-time first team All-State player in both 4A and 1A...District 5A Player of the Year and a second team All-State selection as a junior...Winter Haven High School was state runner up his senior year when he hit .476 with six home runs and 52 RBIs...as a junior batted .480 with seven home runs and 49 RBIs...sophomore year hit .535 with seven home runs and 56 RBIs.

2007: Made four appearances as a junior all as a relief pitcher...pitched in two non-conference wins and in one conference game against Clemson...pitched a scoreless inning in the ACC Tournament against Miami allowing no hits while striking out one...pitched a season-high 1.0 inning twice in 2007...his appearance against Hofstra on February 18 was his first since the end of the 2005 season as he underwent Tommy John surgery and did not see any action while recovering from the process in 2006...tied a career-high with three strikeouts in an inning of work vs. Hofstra...closed out the season throwing 1.1 shutout innings of no hit ball.

2006: Did not see any action in 2006 due to recovery from Tommy John surgery.

2005: Appeared in 10 games with each of his trips to the mound coming in relief...Florida State had a 6-4 record in games which Jarvis earned pitching time...pitched in a victory over Duke, against Clemson and Wake Forest...allowed only four earned runs in his 10 appearances...did not allow a home run in any of his 10 appearances...posted a 2:1 strikeout to walk ratio with eight strikeouts and only four walks...averaged more K's per nine innings than any pitcher on the FSU staff in 2005...career-high 1.0 innings pitched against four teams.

RHP • R-R • 6-1 • 209 • JR Tallahassee, FL (Chiles HS)

2007: Led all relievers in ERA (1.39) with at least 10 appearances...went 2-0 with 27 strikeouts...gave up just five earned runs in 32.1 innings of work in 2007...has given up runs in 12 of 42 career appearances, a span covering 63.2 innings...opponents hit a team-low .205, while he limited the opposition to a .121 batting average with runner's on base...closed out the season with a scoreless innings pitched streak of 13.1 innings, a span covering 10 straight relief appearances...matched his career-high in innings pitched with 4.0 against Jacksonville...gave up a run in one inning of relief against Boston College, snapping his run of seven scoreless innings earlier in the year...topped his four innings of work against Jacksonville with a career-high 4.1 innings against the Wolfpack of NC State in Raleigh...posted two or more strikeouts in eight appearances...both victories came in league play pitching wins against Wake Forest (3/16) and North Carolina (4/21)...pitched 16.1 innings in 11 appearances in the ACC posting a 2.20 ERA...closed out the season with two strikeouts in 0.2 innings of work against Mississippi State in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional.


2006: One of the top freshman hurlers for FSU who played a key role out of the bullpen and started two games as well...the only freshman to start a game for Florida State in 2006...led all first-year players in ERA...combined on one shutout...did not allow a run in 11 of his 19 appearances... recorded at least one strikeout in 14 of his 19 games...both lefties and righties hit below .300 versus the freshman... teams hit just .250 off him with runners on base...pitched in 11 ACC games, second-most on the team...only All-Americans Tyler Chambliss, Bryan Henry and Luke Tucker had lower ERA's in ACC games in 2006...only freshman to start a conference game...held ACC opponents to a .279 batting average...conference batters hit just .212 versus Marshall with runners on base...averaged more than two strikeouts for ever walk he issued...recorded at least one strikeout in nine of his 11 appearances.
