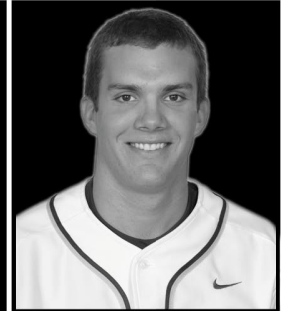

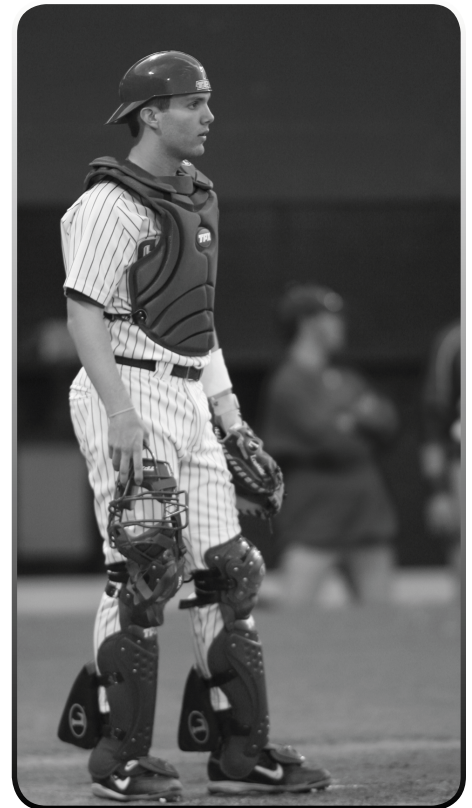

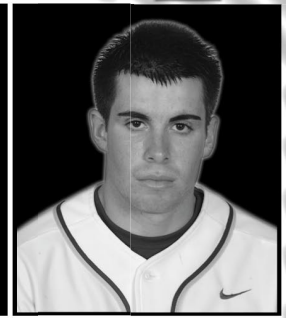

2008: Appeared in 41 games with 10 starts as a sophomore making seven starts at third and three as the

Seminole designated hitter...hit .387 (24-of-62) registering the fourth highest batting average in a single-season in school history among players with 50 to 100 at-bats...posted five doubles and three home runs en route to a .613 slugging percentage...finished the year with 17 runs and 17 RBI...was equally impressive during league play batting .400 with 12 hits in 30 at-bats...belted three doubles and two home runs (Miami and NC State), while scoring seven times and driving in six...was a perfect 2-for-2 in stolen bases against conference foes...made his first start of the season in game three against Miami collecting two hits, two runs scored and an RBI...was the starting third baseman for all three games at North Carolina...led all Seminoles in average (.444), on-base percentage (.538) and hits (4) during the three-game set against the Tar Heels...recorded a career-high three hits in game two versus Savannah State...finished the series hitting .667 with two multi-hit games...batted .500 (2-for-4) at the ACC Tournament in Jacksonville...biggest hit of the tournament was a one out, ninth inning single to ignite the Seminoles' ninth-inning rally over UNC...earned playing time in four of the five games of the Tallahassee Regional...recorded a hit and two RBI in an elimination victory over Bucknell...played in all three games of the Super Regional series victory over Wichita State...tied for third on the team with four pinch

hits...posted a .448 average with runners in scoring position, the third highest on the team...hit .432 against right handed hitters.

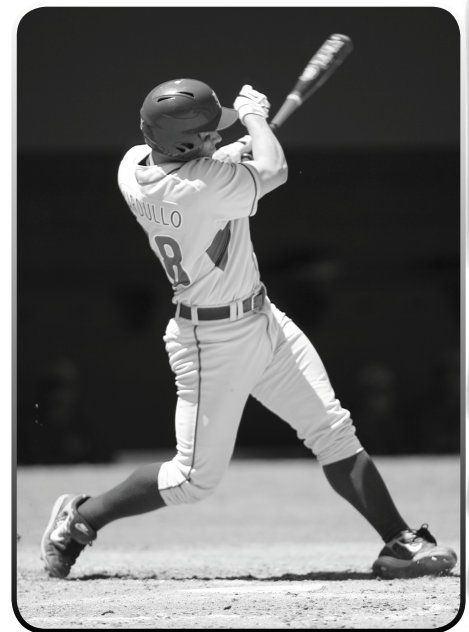

2008: Made 18 appearances, all in relief, in his first season at Florida State...pitched two innings in his Seminole debut allowing one run on a hit while striking out one against Duquesne...followed with effective outings against Auburn and UNC Asheville working two innings each game...worked a season-high two innings four times in 2008...credited with his first career victory after one inning of work in the second of two games against UNC Asheville...had a stretch of 3.1 innings without giving up a run including 1.1 scoreless innings over two games against Miami...allowed only one hit to the eight Hurricane batters that he faced...closed out his regular season with a scoreless inning of work against NC State setting a career-high with two strikeouts...made four appearances in the postseason including 0.1 inning of work against Stanford in the College World Series...tied a career-high with two strikeouts in game two of the Super Regional against Wichita State.
