

#### GENERAL OUTLOOK

- For the second consecutive season Florida State returns seven of nine position starters, though the two losses - centerfielder Tyler Holt and shortstop Stephen Cardullo - leave significant gaps which must be filled. On the mound the Seminoles return their two most productive performers in No. 1 starter Sean Gilmartin (21 wins over the past two seasons) and Mike McGee, whose 13 saves - and stellar offensive production as the left field starter - led him to the inaugural John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award. In all, 11 of 13 pitchers with eight or more appearances last season return to the fold. FSU welcomes back 22 of 29 letter winners from last season's 48-20 team, which advanced to the College World Series for the 20th time in school history.
- The Seminoles return 77 percent of their run production from a year ago, led by McGee, who drove in a team-leading 73 runs and also topped the club with 17 homers. James Ramsey (63 RBI) and Sherman Johnson (58) follow close behind, while Jayce Boyd and Stuart Tapley knocked in 39 and 38, respectively.
- Four of the top six hitters from a club that batted .300 on the season are back, led by Johnson (.337), McGee (.328) and Boyd (.326). The departure of Holt and his .471 on base percentage and 30 stolen bases, will place a premium on uncovering a new leadoff hitter. Not coincidentally, Cardullo drove in 53 runs batting behind Holt much of the year, where he also contributed 21 stolen bases.
- Florida State's 2011 roster includes 12 newcomers, seven of whom bring junior college experience to the table. Sophomore Seth Miller (Northwest Florida State College) will compete for Holt's vacated outfield spot, while Gary Merians (Santa Fe College), Adam Simmons (South Florida Community College) and Connor Nolan (St. Johns River Community College) are seasoned veterans who will figure into the pitching plans. Among the heralded freshmen newcomers, pitchers Peter Miller, Brandon Johnson and Evan Geist bring impressive credentials to the program, as well as slugger Eric Arce.
- FSU will compete for its fifth consecutive ACC Atlantic Division title, having averaged 21 league wins over the past four seasons. The Seminoles went on to win their fifth Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament championship, which formally secured the program's 33rd consecutive NCAA Regional appearance in 2010. That is the second longest active streak in the nation.

- No team in college baseball has won more games in the new millennium than Florida State. The Seminoles' 552 victories since the start of the 2000 season (50.2 per year) are 18 clear of their closest competitor. FSU's .740 winning percentage in that span ranks second only to Rice by .003.
- Mike Martin enters his 32nd season at the helm of the Seminoles as the nation's active leader among Division I programs in winning percentage (.744). He has compiled a record of 1,627-558-4 and ranks third all-time in wins at college baseball's top level. Martin has led the Seminoles to the postseason in each of his first 31 seasons. He is largely responsible for FSU's nation-leading marking of 209 NCAA Tournament games and its 137 victories, which is tied for the most by any Division I team. The Seminoles' 20th all-time College World Series appearance in 2010 was the 14th on Martin's watch.
- Florida State will begin the year ranked among the top 13 teams nationally in all four major preseason polls, including: No. 10 National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA); No. 11 USA Today/ESPN Coaches; No. 12 Baseball America and No. 13 Collegiate Baseball. The Seminoles closed the 2010 season ranked sixth nationally in the aforementioned polls. Mike McGee, a first-team All-American in 2010, has received multiple preseason All-American honors entering his senior season.

#### Mike Martin shares his thoughts heading into the 2011 season:

What excites you most about this year's team? "Attitude. The attitude of the club is excellent. Everyone understands what it takes to get to Omaha. Now it's up to us to go out and compete."

#### Is there a danger as a veteran team that there is potential for complacency?

"We got to be sure that we have the understanding that, just because we have a lot of these guys back, we've still got a lot to prove."

#### Is there the same kind of desire to be in Omaha when the CWS debuts at the new TD Ameritrade Park in June as there was being a part of the final one at Rosenblatt Stadium?

"There's no doubt. I'm totally convinced that getting to Omaha and the new stadium will be extra special, because there's only eight teams that have a chance to close one down and open another one up. We want to be one of those eight."

#### **PITCHING**

- Although the Seminoles enter the season without a settled rotation, there is no shortage of options behind a pair of junior left-handers who have significant experience in the weekend lineup. Sean Gilmartin has spent the better part of two seasons as FSU's No. 1 and that's not likely to change. The California native has added muscle to his lean frame and brings back significant innings with Team USA from the past summer. With 21 career wins to his credit, Gilmartin is a durable, proven commodity, despite a 9-8 campaign last season which saw his ERA jump to 5.24. Brian Busch has finished each of his first two seasons in the starting rotation, and is 12-4 with a 3.95 career ERA, even though he's been saddled with 12 no decisions in 23 career starts. Three of his career wins have come in NCAA postseason play.
- Martin and veteran pitching coach Jamey Shouppe will explore a number of possibilities as they complete the rotation. The most experienced candidates are sophomore right-handers Scott Sitz and Robert Benincasa, who bring a combined 10 starts back for their second seasons. Sitz (5-0, 3.76) made six starts early in the season and came out of the bullpen late. He did not allow a single run in his last five appearances, including four in the postseason. Benincasa (2-0, 5.32) made four starts early and finished as a reliever. Junior right-hander Hunter Scantling (3-2, 4.47) is the only other returnee with any significant starting experience.
- Senior right-hander Mike McGee provides the Seminoles with a luxury of sorts. Used almost exclusively as a closer in 2010, he ranked second in the ACC with 13 saves, converting on 15 opportunities and finished 4-1 with a 2.96 ERA. McGee also has 23 career starts to his credit and boasts a 17-4 all-time record, which includes a sixinning, no-hit effort at Jacksonville in his lone start last season. Not surprisingly, the 'Noles were 37-1 in games when they led after eight innings.

- Senior right-hander Daniel Bennett played an integral role as the Seminoles' side-arming, setup man in 2010. He led the team last season with 35 appearances and went 5-1 with a 3.51 ERA, including three saves. Capable of working extended innings, Bennett was at his best in the postseason, registering 15 strikeouts in 13.2 innings over six appearances with a pair of wins to his credit. Hard-throwing senior right-hander Tyler Everett (3-1, 3.77 in 23 appearances) had a solid season interrupted by a back injury, but has the ability to dominate. Senior left-hander Tye Buckley (0-0, 2.70 in 19 appearances) could be used again primarily to match up with left-handed hitters. Junior right-hander Jack Posey missed all of 2010 while recovering from Tommy John surgery, but made 15 appearances in '09 and possesses some of the best movement of anyone on the staff.
- A cast of new arms will also play a role in the staff's evolution. Right-hander Gary Merians was a workhorse and a winner in two seasons at Santa Fe College, where he led the nation in innings pitched in 2010. Junior right-hander Adam Simmons (South Florida CC) has logged significant innings as well, as has left-hander Connor Nolan (St. Johns River CC), who should be ready to go early in the season as he completes his recovery from shoulder surgery.
- Three incoming freshmen left-handers Evan Geist and Brandon Johnson, and right-hander Peter Miller – will also have a chance to leave an impression. All three hail from winning high school programs and bring impressive prep credentials into the equation.

#### Martin on pitching:

Is there a comfort level with the number of experienced pitchers at your disposal?

"With the return of Gilmartin, Busch, McGee, Bennett, Stitz, Benincasa, Tyler Everett and Jack Posey ... you feel comfortable, but yet an injury or two and you have real problems. That is where the newcomers that displayed talent in the fall come into view, guys like Gary Merians, Peter Miller and Adam Simmons."

#### What are you hoping to find from the group heading into the season?

"We do have strength in numbers. Do we have a replacement for a Johnny Gast and a Geoff Parker, who did such a good job for us? ...

"We're looking at four or five guys to compete for the third, fourth and fifth starters. Those guys are Sitz, Benincasa, Simmons, Merians. We'll start the season with McGee as our closer and Bennett as the set-up guy. I like Posey, also."

### DEFENSE

- The Seminoles return three quarters of their 2010 starting infield, which provided more than steady work. FSU's .969 fielding percentage ranks tied for third in school history and is the second-best season since 1994. The glove of third baseman Sherman Johnson, second baseman Devon Travis and first baseman Jayce Boyd played no small role. All three were first-year starters last season and performed at a level of efficiency which defied their lack of experience.
- Sophomore Justin Gonzalez steps into the starting role at shortstop, replacing Cardullo. Gonzalez, who made 18 of his 21 starts last season at second base, returns to his natural position where he brings improved range and a strong arm.
- McGee and James Ramsey were solid defensively as last season's starters in left and right field, respectively. Replacing Holt, one of the most outstanding defensive centerfielders in school history, will be difficult. The Seminoles entered the preseason with junior Taiwan Easterling and sophomore transfer Seth Miller battling to win the spot. McGee, however, is an option in center after working there in the fall. Seniors Robby Stahl and Stuart Tapley, who has been getting work in left as well as third base, provide depth. So does Gilmartin, who is a capable hitter but lacks significant outfield experience.
- FSU is set behind the plate with a pair of seniors, led by Rafael Lopez, who is a preseason candidate for the Johnny Bench Award in just his second season of full-time catching duties. Lopez had just six errors in 46 starts behind the dish. Brunelle made 22 starts, in addition to some late-

inning appearances, and was charged with just one error. Opponents converted only 40 percent of their stolen base attempts against the Seminoles last season.

■ Depth could be an issue defensively. The 'Noles have no shortage of corner infield options, including Tapley at third. While FSU added newcomers Wil Breton and Arce as potential first base options, both Posey and Gilmartin have game experience there as well. JUCO transfer Taed Moses is an option as a utility player up the middle.

#### Martin on the Seminoles' defense:

What do you see as the strengths of the team? "Where we're looking very comfortable is the fact that we have so many returning (infield) starters, with Lopez and Boyd, Travis and Sherman. Then you've got Justin Gonzalez, who started [21] games last year, returning to his normal position of shortstop. Then you've got James Ramsey and Mike McGee in the outfield."

#### Are there any major concerns heading into the season?

"I think that the key to this club is we've got to stay healthy. There's not a lot of depth. ... We have depth behind the plate, but with what we've lost, we just have to stay healthy."

#### What position(s) remain unsettled as preseason practice gets underway?

"The only position that is not settled is centerfield and that is between Seth Miller and Taiwan Easterling, and both could end up playing big roles on an everyday basis. With Mike McGee as the closer, one of them is available to play left field."

# **2011 OUTLOOK**

#### **OFFENSE**

- Florida State was not a prolific offensive team in 2010, but it was a timely bunch, which bodes well with the return of 10 of last season's top 12 hitters based on average. Collectively the Seminoles batted just .300, yet still averaged nearly eight runs a game, making the most of opportunities. FSU boasted a .411 team on-base percentage, drawing 402 walks and getting aboard via hit batters 61 times. Martin's team also put together a combined 80 sacrifices and were successful on 97 of 115 stolen base attempts.
- Though the 'Noles did not slug for a high percentage (.496) last season, they return more than ample firepower to the lineup, with the players producing 72 percent of the team's extra base hits (184 of 255) back in 2010. Broken down, returnees produced 61 of 86 homers, 105 of 147 doubles and 18 of 22 triples.
- Again, the timeliness of FSU's production a year ago should not go unnoticed given the number of returnees. Of the team's 485 RBI in '10, 373 belong to players who are back a year later. McGee (73 RBI), Ramsey (63), Johnson (58), Boyd (39) and Tapley (38) were each run-producing threats. McGee, Tapley and Ramsey figure to be in the middle of the order again this season.
- McGee is a rarity in the college ranks; a player who has led the team in homers and RBI for consecutive seasons, returning for his senior season for a shot at pulling off that double three years in a row.
- Unearthing a productive leadoff batter from the mix will be essential in filling the void created by Tyler Holt's absence. Holt merely reached base 47 percent of the time by hitting a team-best .355 and drawing more walks (59) than anyone else on the squad. He also led the Seminoles with 30 stolen bases. Devon Travis and Sherman Johnson could be options to bat first.
- As for bats off the bench, either as a DH or in pinch-hitting roles, Tapley will likely retain the job he held throughout much of last season as the designated hitter. Seth Miller, Eric Arce and Sean Gilmartin could be left-handed hitting options, while Stephen McGee remains a right-handed alternative along with Robby Stahl and perhaps Taiwan Easterling.
- With the NCAA mandating the move to composite bats in an effort to improve safety, the popular theory is that home run and scoring production will be reduced. That could lead to more "small ball" play around the country and the limiting of the big inning, courtesy the long ball.

#### Martin on the FSU offense:

# What concerns you the most offensively heading into the season?


"What people don't look at is how big were Tyler Holt and Stephen Cardullo (to the team). When you look at the leadoff guy and the guy who hit second the majority of the year, you've looking at two guys that started for three years - two All-Americans. One of which (Holt), for three years, got on base an average of twice a game. That's mind-boggling to think."

# You have a number of proven commodities. Who could emerge as this year's surprise player offensively?

"Jayce Boyd is our first baseman. I'm very, very proud of this young man. I see this young man blossoming into one that will leave a legacy here at Florida State. This kid is fun. I would love to see him become a middle of the order guy that we look at to be a big run producer."

#### SCHEDULE AND TANGIBLES

- The Seminoles face no shortage of challenges in terms of opposition in 2011. They will face in-state rival Florida which is ranked No. 1 in at least one preseason poll four times, including two neutral site games. An early, three-game road series at Georgia will provide a formidable challenge, as will a late three-game home slate with UCF, which is expected to challenge for a title in Conference USA.
- Florida State's Feb. 24 exhibition game against the Philadelphia Phillies won't count in the standings, but it is always a highly-anticipated event for the players, coaches and fans. The game at Bright House Networks Field in Clearwater will be the first of spring training and provide the 'Noles with a peek at the best starting rotation in Major League Baseball.
- Most are expecting another hotly-contested season in the Atlantic Coast Conference. To that end, the Seminoles drew a mixed bag when it comes to home and road dates. FSU must travel to Coastal Division favorite Virginia, annual nemesis Miami and ACC Tournament runner-up NC State. The home slate in league play includes visits from Boston College, Wake Forest, North Carolina and Duke. It culminates with a visit from Atlantic Division favorite Clemson in the final regular season homestand.
- An uncharacteristically large senior class totaling nine Seminoles, including fourth-year veterans Stuart Tapley, Mike McGee, Parker Brunelle and Tyler Everett, will once again be called on to show the way.

#### Final thoughts from Martin:

# Which players do you expect to be leaders in the clubhouse and on the field?

"Stuart Tapley is a tremendous leader. ... He has the Buster Posey persona on this club. People look at Tapley and how he does things. Tapley, along with other seniors that are playing – Mike McGee and Rafael Lopez – are so important to this ballclub. Ramsey, as a junior, is another guy who carries himself so well."

#### With so many returnees from a team that just found ways to win and was at its best under duress last season, what do you know about the core of this team?

"There's just so much about this game that requires mental toughness. That's what our guys have. That's what our guys displayed (last season). You're going to have ups and downs in this game. Who can control their destiny? That's what makes this game so intriguing.

"We lost four in a row at the end of the year. We lost four in a row. Then, just miraculously, we got into the ACC finals. Things had to happen. Then we win it. ... Who would have thought we were going to get to Omaha after losing three straight at Clemson, then getting blown out by Miami in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament? We finished fifth in the league [based on record]. Baseball is so different than any sport out there. The best team doesn't always win the game."
