2011: Fourth-year Seminole helps give the club one of the most solid catching tandems in the country...brings added value as a switch-hitter who can jump into a pinch-hitting role.

2010: Appeared in a career-high 42 games with 22 starts and set new standards for home runs (3) and RBI (31)...batted .207...committed just one error in 198 fielding opportunities for a .995 fielding percentage...threw out 37 percent of would-be base stealers on the year...strung together a seven-game hitting streak with at least one RBI in six of those, highlighted by three, 3-RBI games...registered a hit on opening day with a eighth-inning single...earned his first start of the season in the second game of a doubleheader against Hofstra and homered to lead off the fourth...it was his first home run since Feb. 23, 2008...started the March 8 game at Jacksonville and came through with an RBI in the 2-0 victory...recorded a season-high 10 putouts...started league games against Virginia and North Carolina...enjoyed a career night against Stetson on March 24, establishing career-highs with four hits and two doubles, while equaling his previous best for at-bats (5), runs (2) and RBI (3)...he was the first Seminole to record a four-hit game in 2010...matched his 3 RBI effort in the Sunday game against Virginia Tech, when his two-run homer in the seventh tied the game...hit .400 at Wake Forest with two hits in two starts...established career-highs for at-bats (6) and runs (3) in Sunday's series finale against the Demon Deacons...he doubled, tripled and finished with 3 RBI for the third time on the season...caught two innings in game one of the College World Series against TCU.

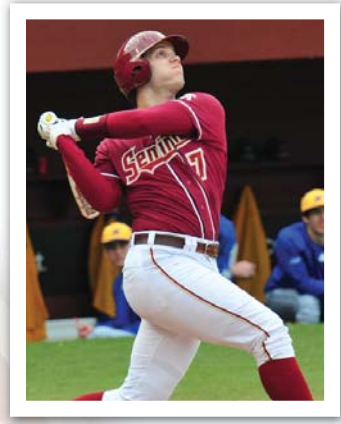

2009: Appeared in 38 games making 16 starts for the Seminoles as a sophomore...started behind the late on opening day in a 9-3 victory over Hofstra...closed out the season hitting .239 with 17 hits and 11 RBI in 71 at-bats...registered two doubles and a pair of triples en route to posting a .324 slugging percentage...tied for second on the team in triples...recorded a career-high 14 putouts from behind the plate in the regular season finale

against Grambling as Mike McGee struck out 12 on May 16...hit .429 (3-for-7) in two games against Maryland...first career triple came in a game three start at Miami...tied a career-high with two hits four times in 2009 posting multiple hits against Maryland, Georgia Tech and twice against North Florida...started against Georgia Tech in the third game of the ACC Tournament going 2-for-3 with a pair of singles and a walk...scored twice in two appearances in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional...became part of school history on May 3 recording the second out and assisting on the third of a 9-2-4 triple play against Virginia Tech...threw out 40 percent of would be base stealers on the year.

2010: Made 23 appearances - 22 in relief - while posting a 3-1 record with a 3.77 ERA as a junior...registered 39 strikeouts in 45.1 innings of work...missed some time with a sore back...struck out five in his season debut against Georgia State, working two scoreless

2011: A three-year starter, Tapley brings a wealth of experience and success in big-game settings to the table and is undoubtedly the Seminoles' team leader.

2010: Appeared in 63 games and made 58 starts, 54 of which came as the Seminoles' DH...batted .272 with 11 doubles, seven home runs and 38 RBI...boasted a .416 on-base percentage...established career-best 15-game hit streak dating back to 2009...recorded a hit-by-pitch and a sacrifice fly against Florida in the College World Series to move into the top 10 all-time at FSU in both categories with 26 each...belted the first home run of the season in the final game of the season-opening series against Georgia State...hit .823 in three-game sweep of Hofstra, reaching base on 12 of 13 plate appearances, including 10 consecutive trips to close out the series...had a staggering .923 OBP...drove in a season-high three runs in season finale against Georgia...batted .500 in the Maryland series, including a homer and three RBI in game 1...collected three hits in the middle game of the Virginia Tech series...hit .300 against Miami (3 for 10), with three extra-base hits...doubled twice, including the walk-off, game-winner with the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth of game 2...set a season high with four RBI...started as the DH in the first two games of the Super Regional...drew three walks in the series and scored a run in game 2.
