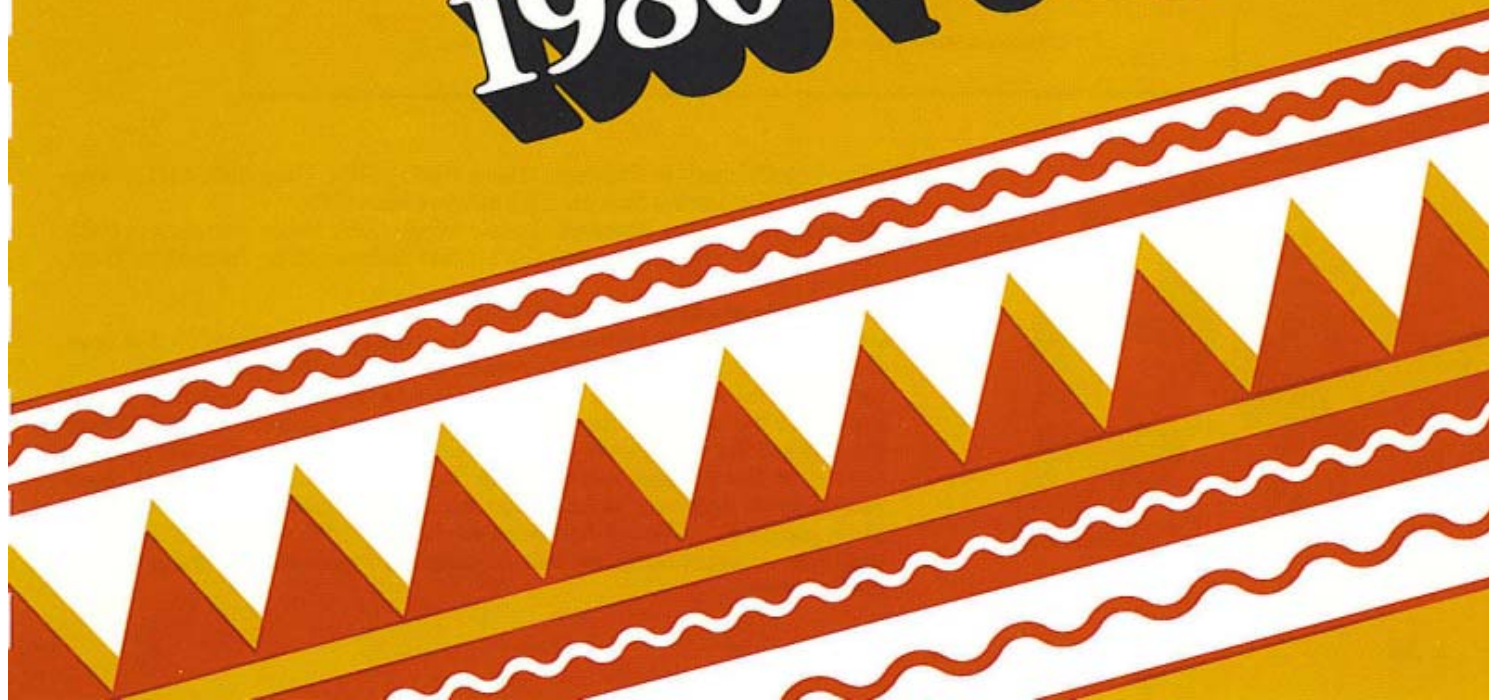

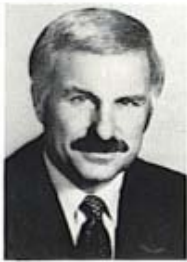

Pitt defensive back Terry White hails from nearby Thomasville, Ga., while FSU defensive back Monk Bonasorte is from Pittsburgh . . . Pitt is picked to finish 4th in the nation by the Tangerine Bowl Committee . . . the game will be broadcast nationwide on NBC radio . . . Pitt won the last match-up in 1978, 7-3.
