Nebraska's high powered offense scored in the 50's four times last season . . . that offense outscored its opponents 470-110 . . . Tom Osborne returns to Nebraska for his 20th season—and his ninth as head coach . . . since Osborne has been head coach at Nebraska, the team has been in a bowl game every season . . . FSU head coach Bobby Bowden was the recipient of the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year award in 1980 while Osborne received it in 1978 . . . the Cornhuskers were ranked in the Top 10 each year during the 70's, the only team in college football to achieve that honor.

Pitt's most spectacular player may be Dwight Collins, who as a freshman, caught 30 passes for 827 yards ... only two Pitt losses have come in the last two years ... the Panthers have had at least one first-team All-America selection in each of the last eight years ... FSU defensive coordinator Jack Stanton is a native of Pittsburgh.

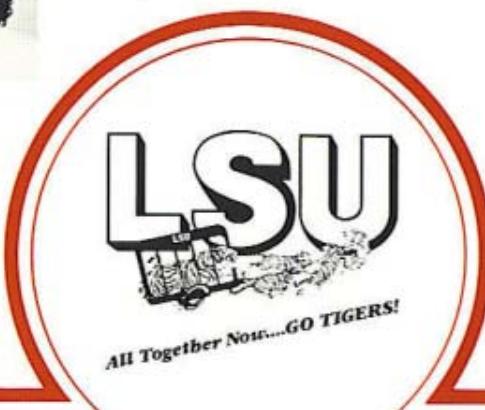

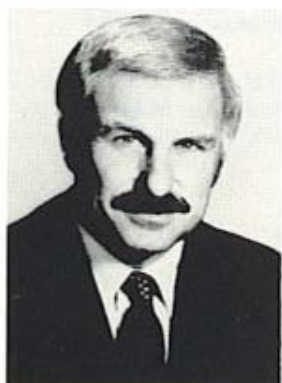
