Pitt's only 1980 loss came on a visit to Doak Campbell Stadium where the Seminoles enjoyed a 36-22 victory ... Seminoles must again face Heisman Trophy candidate Dan Marino, who completed 15 of 27 passes for 251 yards and three touchdowns in last year's contest ... halfback Bryan Thomas gained 217 yards on the ground ... FSU must face all three ... Pitt may also have the best receiving corps in the country with Dwight Collins and Julius Dawkins ... against FSU over the last two years, Dawkins has caught three passes for 102 yards and two TDs while Collins has caught eight for 216 yards and two TDs ... new Pitt head coach Foge Fazio had been Pitt's defensive coordinator since 1979 ... his defensive teams were ranked first in the country in rushing defense and total defense for the last two seasons ... three members of the FSU athletic staff are Pittsburgh natives, including defensive coordinator Jack Stanton ... remember, too, that QB coach Mike Kruczek played his pro ball in the Steel City.

In a series that began in 1952, Southern Miss leads 8-7-1 ... the most recent win for the Golden Eagles came last year as they destroyed the Seminoles 58-14 ... that loss was the third worst ever administered to an FSU squad and the 58 points were the most ever scored by an opponent ... the loss marked the first time the Seminoles had dropped back-to-back games since the '78 season ... Seminoles are 3-4-1 in visits to Hattiesburg ... the 1981 Southern Miss squad had its own "Oktoberfest"—while the Seminoles had five consecutive road games, the Golden Eagles had a six game spread ... in '81, USM quarterback Reggie Collier ran for 150 yards and passed for another 76 against the Seminoles ... he is the only player in NCAA history to run for 1,000 yards AND pass for 1,000 in the same season ... Collier is one of two quarterbacks named to the 1981 Associated Press All-American squad that the Seminoles must face ... the other is Dan Marino of Pitt ... USM mentor Jim Carmody is the second of three first year head coaches FSU meets.

OSU head coach Earle Bruce was a former Tampa head coach.
