... A giant political figure born and raised in Columbus, Ohio, Secretary Carreker stands guard over the party's defense system. A calculating strategic mind for stopping the opposition and the ability to stay one move ahead helps him keep this department solid. In Chief Bowden's notoriously tough system the 6-6 250-pound secretary graded out consistently higher than any other member of the defense department staff—never below 70 percent in 1982.

... His size and strength alone makes the Secretary an imposing figure in the midst of the Seminoles' line of defense. That will make him a certain high draft pick when the NFL meets for its annual candidate selection next spring. Political observers know he'll be a contender for many years to come.

... Secretary Carreker's credentials for this post are clear-cut. He has spent the last three years in the trenches, earning three letters of citation for his efforts. During the last campaign, the Secretary stopped more offensive movements than any other member of the defensive front.

... Ninety-seven times he stifled potential uprisings in 1982, many times traveling onto foreign turf to insure strong defense. His eight quarterback sacks aided him in protecting his territory and moving him swiftly into the national political spotlight.

... Polls are indicating he'll be a landslide winner on the 1983 All-America Team.

Cleveland, Ohio

—just where this athlete will play is up in the air ... if you're betting on it, the safe odds might be the offense ... after two years at tailback, Billy was moved to defense to shore up an unstable backfield ... his great speed (4.34 in the 40 yards for a 200-pound man) and size were attractive to defensive coaches ... played well in the spring game at cornerback but was asked to move over to the offense and help out on a few downs there, too ... responded with 142 yards and a touchdown in 14 carries ... Bowden was so impressed he nicknamed him "the 60-minute man" ... the main problem here is that Allen wants to play—anywhere ... he hasn't seen much time at tailback over the last two years because of the depth there but he's too valuable to be sitting on the bench ... how well FSU's newcomers at tailback do in the fall may dictate exactly where he'll play ... carried the ball 29 times for 119 yards last season and returned six kickoffs for 194 yards, an average of 32.3 yards per return ... set a Gator Bowl record with a 95-yard touchdown return ... that wasn't the first TD he scored on a return—he did it as a freshman against LSU for 97 yards ... led the team in rushing in the first two games as a frosh but finished with just 222 yards on a 5.2 average after fumbling problems limited his carries to 43 ... 89 yards in his first collegiate game against Louisville included a 50-yard touchdown run ... came to FSU as a 22-year old walk-on out of the Air Force ... Bowden had seen him play in Europe on a service team and invited him to look at FSU ... also participates on FSU's track team where he runs the 100 and 200 meters as well as anchoring the 400 meter relay ... oldest member of the football team, Billy will be 25 on September 25th.

—Mr. Touchdown ... after two years at Florida State Allen is already the top running back to pass through Tallahassee ... tremendous all-purpose runner who is best known for getting the ball into the endzone ... led the nation in scoring and set every Florida State record in that category last year with 21 total TDs for 126 points ... 20 of those came by land and one by the air ... had a net of 776 yards rushing although he never started a game ... continued to build on his already incredible all-purpose yard total with 515 more on kickoff returns and 233 on 16 pass receptions ... was responsible for 1,524 yards in 1982—a figure that was 11th best in the country ... his kickoff return average of 25.7 ranked seventh in the country ... best day of 1982 was 173 yards on 25 carries and four touchdowns vs. Louisville ... also scored four touchdowns against South Carolina ... burst upon the college scene as a freshman in '81 with a 202-yard rushing day against LSU ... came back the next week as a starter to shatter two NCAA records in rushing for a freshman record 322 yards and another record 417 all-purpose yards vs. Western Carolina ... has six career 100-or-better yard games to his credit ... the last one came in the Gator Bowl when he ran for 138 yards and the Bowl's MVP award ... ran for 888 yards as a freshman and his two-year total of 1,664 yards already has him in fourth place on the FSU career list ... the list of honors is endless ... in 1982: AP honorable mention All-American, All-South Independent, WTBS-Chevrolet MVP vs. Louisville, *Football News* All-Bowl team, Gator Bowl MVP ... in 1981: AP honorable mention All-American, All-South Independent, *Football News* Freshman All-American ... —Florida State's only 11-game freshman starter in 1982 . . . coaches were so impressed with him that Bowden hints that he may be the best offensive guard to play here before his four-year career is over . . . along with Ken Lanier—now a Denver Bronco—Dukes is the only other freshman to start in his first season on the offensive line under Bowden . . . quickness is his trademark and has all the physical tools for all-star honors . . . excellent pulling guard and good pass protector . . . played every down without relief in his first collegiate game vs. Cincinnati . . . later FSU coaches rotated the line but Dukes still played most of the way . . . has bench pressed 450 pounds . . . wears a size 56 sports jacket . . . born June 14, 1964.

(Mosley) ... versatile lineman who completes the trio of Mosley graduates to sign with FSU ... center looks to be his natural position ... reaped first team all-state honors as an offensive lineman ... Bay County Player of the Year in 1982 ...

ROOSEVELT SNIPES, Running Back, 5-9, 170, Sarasota, Fla. (Coffeyville (Kan) J.C.) ... originally signed with Florida State out of Sarasota High School in 1981 ... coaches feel this one will play right away ... rushed for more than 1,000 yards and averaged 10 yards per carry ... Oklahoma was the loser in the battle for Snipes ... also finished in top three at J.C. 100-meter dash and runs a 4.4 40 yards ... will have three years of eligibility remaining ... his first duties could be in the return area ...

ERIC STIEHL, Outside Linebacker, 6-5, 225, Jacksonville, Fla. (Fletcher) ... played his way onto the Florida Times Union's Top 24 team as a defensive end ... as a junior, graded out at 81 percent ... a broken knee cap suffered while playing basketball shortened his senior season ... will be just 17 when he puts an FSU jersey on this fall ... great growth potential ...

SHAWN THOMAS, Defensive Line, 6-4, 260, Columbus, Ohio (Eastmoor) ... comes from the same high school that FSU plucked linebacker Stuart Wyatt out of last year ... most recruiting observers didn't notice him at first but now they're calling him a sleeper ... picked FSU over Purdue, Maryland, Tennessee and Wisconsin ... averaged 10 tackles a game as a senior on his way to honorable mention all-state honors ...

TERRY WARREN, Outside Linebacker, 6-3, 215, Tallahassee, Fla. (Leon) ... played linebacker as a senior at Leon High School and as a junior at Titusville Astronaut ... has size and speed to play several different positions on the defense ... brother Scott was a former defensive standout who played on 11-0 team of 1979 that went to the Orange Bowl ... former FSU ball boy ...

CHUCK WELLS, Defensive Back, 6-1, 200, Jacksonville, Fla. Atlanta Journal-Constitution Back of the Year as a senior ... rushed for 400 yards and 12 TDs at fullback and caught 52 passes as a senior ... made 126 tackles ... highly recruited by most major colleges, including Georgia, Clemson and Alabama ... member of Street and Smith's top 100 list ... coached by Thurston Taylor, a former Seminole player in the '60s ...

RANDY WHITE, Wide Receiver/Defensive Back, 6-2, 165, Marianna, Fla. (Marianna) ... although listed as a defensive back, Randy will get a shot at wide receiver ... earned first team all-state honors after catching 45 passes for 1,006 yards as a senior ...

ERIC WILLIAMS, Wide Receiver/Defensive Back, 5-9, 170, Clearwater, Fla. (Countryside) ... caught 30 passes as a senior for 905 yards and 12 touchdowns ... like Randy White, he'll probably get a look at as a wide receiver but coaches recruited him to help in the defensive backfield ... had 11 interceptions as a senior defensive back ... third team all-state ...

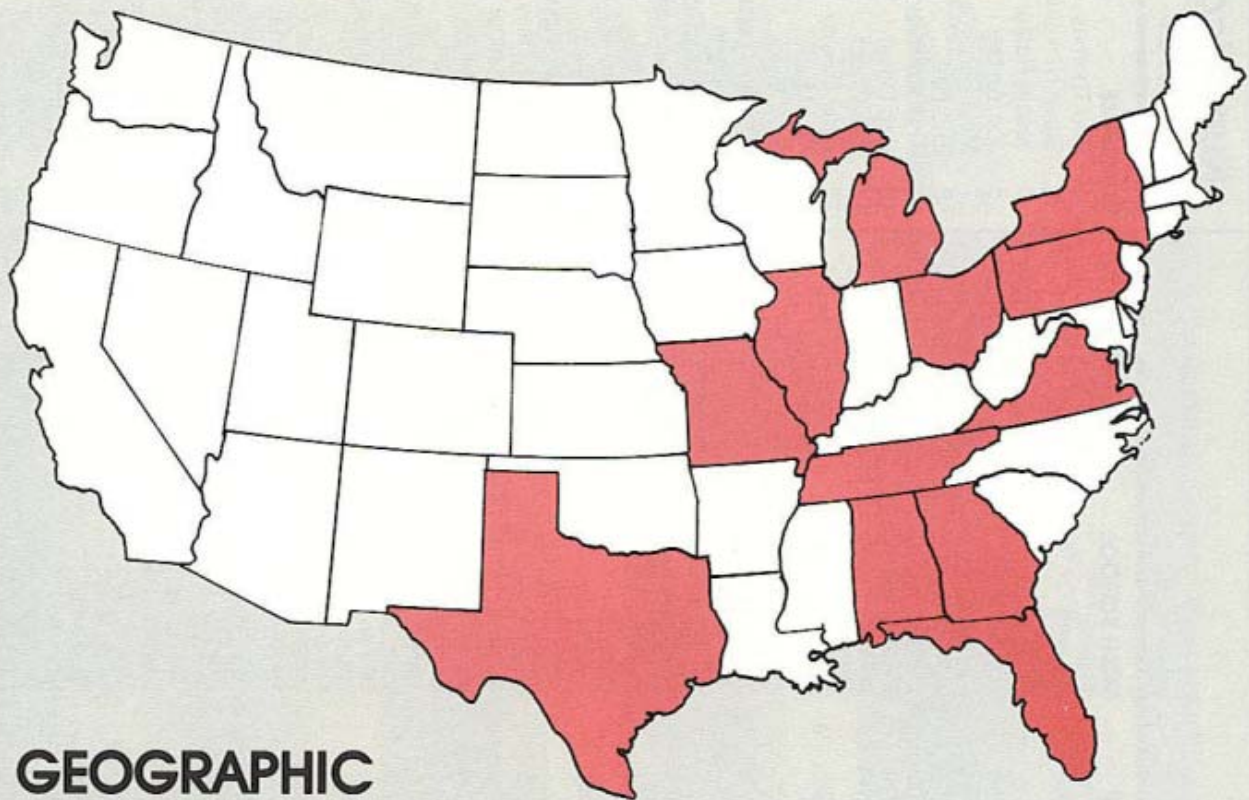
