Pitt, after winning the last two games, has taken a 4-3 edge in the series . . . the Panthers defeated FSU 37-17 in 1982 in what may have been the wettest game of the college football season . . . deadlocked in a 17-tie at half, a drenching storm that saw ankle-deep water accumulate on the field favored Pitt's power game . . . both teams finished the season with identical 9-3 records with Pitt ranked 9th by UPI and Florida State 10th . . . Pitt's flashy receiver Dwight Collins has caught 10 passes for 248 yards and a pair of TDs against the Seminoles over the last three years . . .
