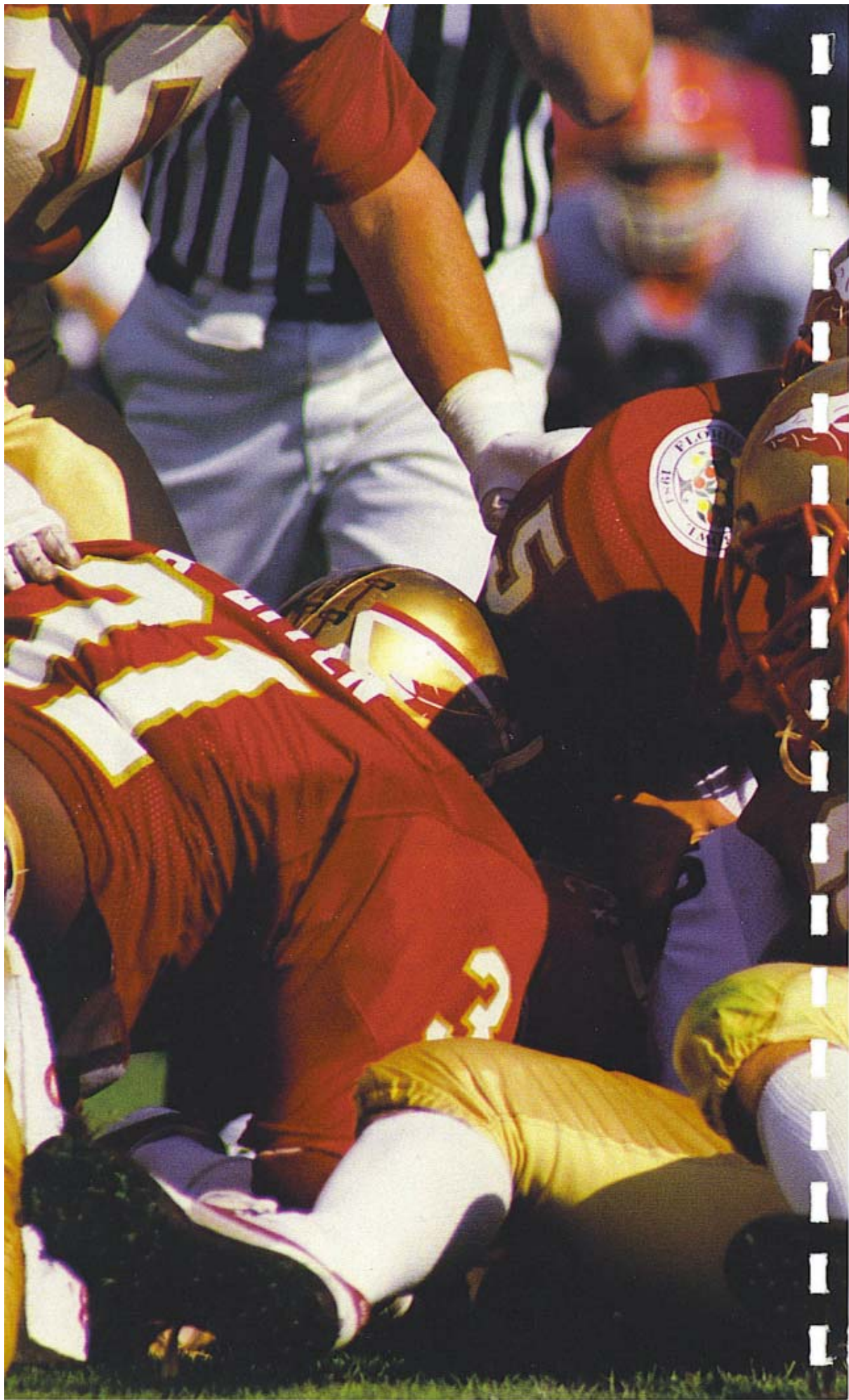


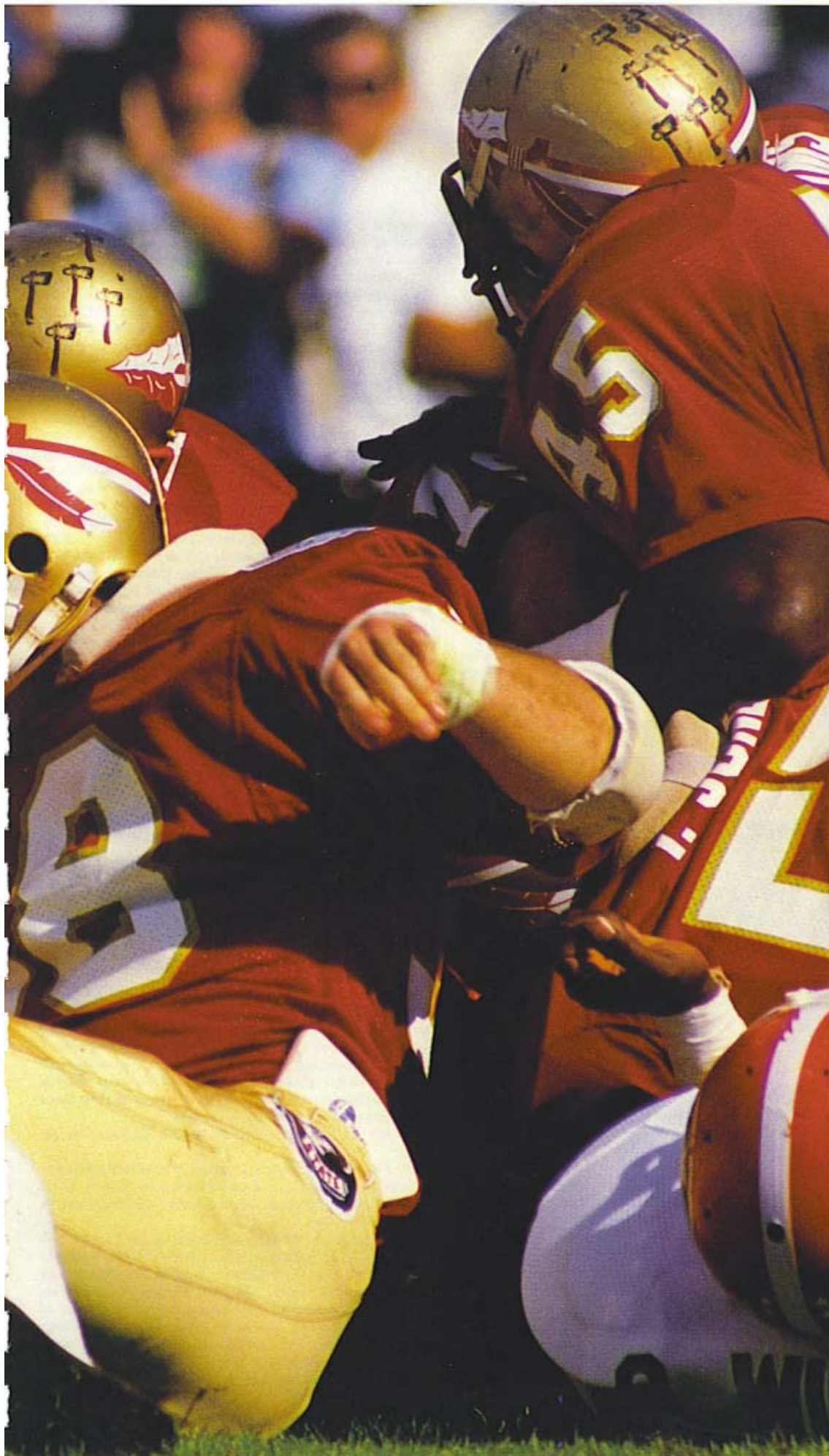

... many FSU followers are of the opinion that he is Florida State's finest lineman ever ... has started an FSU record 36 games in just three years since his initial start as a freshman ... that includes 33 regular season games and the 1982 Gator, the 1983 Peach and the 1984 Citrus bowls ... an excellent pulling guard with great quickness ... FSU offensive coordinator Wayne McDuffie, a man of few words, says that Dukes "is the best offensive lineman that I've ever coached" ... McDuffie has coached six offensive linemen who were drafted by the NFL and three are still active today ... he also coached the 1980 national championship line that paved the way for Herschel Walker's record breaking season at Georgia ... behind Dukes, Florida State has set school records for rushing the last two years ... has trimmed down from the 290 pounds that he weighed when he first stepped on the FSU campus ... **1984:** second team Football News All-American ... first team All-South Independent and first team All-Metro Conference ... helped FSU's running backs set the school record for yards in a season (3,021) ... tailback Greg Allen was named to the Walter Camp All-American team for the second consecutive year ... behind Dukes' blocks, FSU rushers went for 12 100-yard games ... Jamie graded out to an average of 85 percent over the season ...

separated a shoulder in East Carolina season opener while springing tailback Rosie Snipes on a 5-yard TD run ... missed the second half of that game but played the next week ... Florida State trained at Dukes' high school in Orlando for the Citrus Bowl ... **1983:** second team All-South Independent as he helped FSU rushers to a school record 2,522 yards (broken in 1984) ... tailback Greg Allen gained a record 1,134 yards and was named to the UPI and Walter Camp first-team All-American lists ... FSU runners had nine 100-yard games ... following the season, Dukes earned the "Hinesman Award", given to the FSU player with the most outstanding 1984 spring session ... **1982:** as a freshman, helped FSU set school records for total offense in a season (5,124), most yards per game (465.8) and touchdowns (53) ... named to the Sporting News Freshman All-American team ... was only the second offensive lineman in FSU history to start every game as a freshman—the other was Denver Bronco starter Ken Lanier ... graded out the highest of any FSU offensive lineman in every game ... **High School:** all-state and All-South as well as *Orlando Sentinel's* "Sweet 16" list ... also named Orange County Player of the Year as a senior ... hails from the same school as FSU redshirt freshman John Hadley ... **Personal:** born in Schenectady, N.Y. on June 14, 1964 as the middle of three children ... moved to Orlando in 1976 ... wears a size 56 sport jacket ... plays on FSU's "Untouchables" intramural basketball team with several other FSU players and can dunk the ball ... majoring in communication ...

Q: Going into your senior year, do you feel any added pressure to perform well?

A: I don't really feel any pressure. Of course I want to do well and everybody else does, too. I just want to do what it takes to win.

Q: What kind of a leader are you?

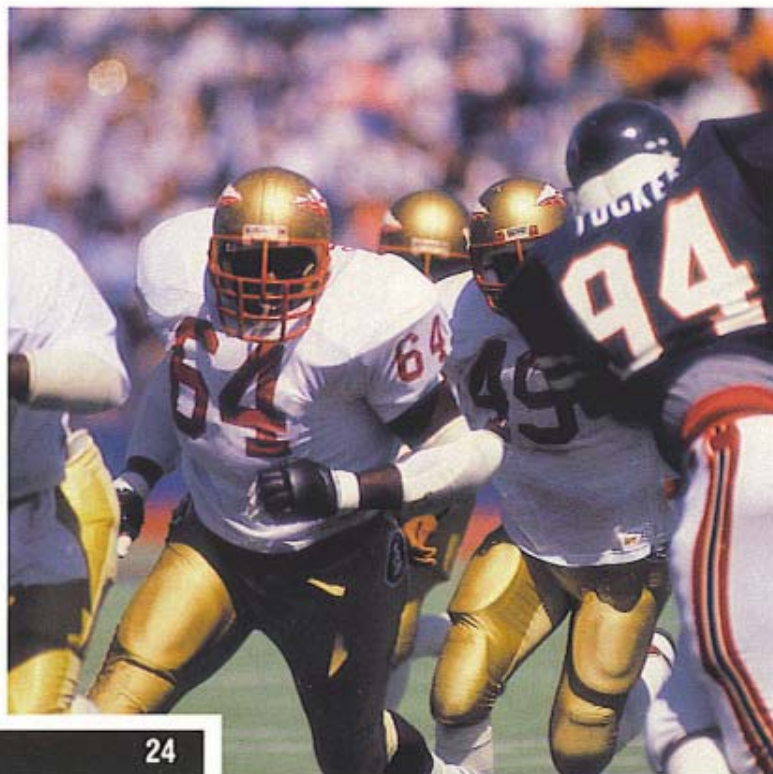
A: As far as the offense is concerned, I'm a more vocal leader as is John Ionata. Hassan (Jones) is more the one who leads by way of action. When things are going well, I rarely say anything 'cause no one needs encouragement then. It's when times get tougher and we start making mistakes that I have to help relax everyone, calm them down so we can do what it takes to get it back.

Q: What do you see yourself doing 10 or 15 years down the road?

A: I'll graduate after next summer in communication and I want to get into some area of communication or sales. Down the line, I'd really like to get into real estate and be successful in that.

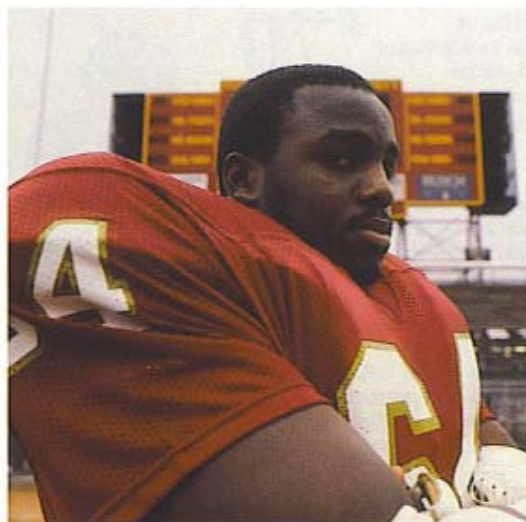
Q: Who has had the biggest influence on you?

A: Coach McDuffie has been the biggest influence on me because he taught me technique. Before I had played using my athletic ability only, and no technique. He taught me technique and how to play hard every down instead of waiting and coasting until a key situation came up. That's important because there are players out there with the same level of athletic ability as I have and I won't always be able to rely on it. Coach McDuffie really made me a better player.

"Jamie Dukes is the best offensive lineman I've ever coached and that includes all those linemen at Georgia on the national championship team. He can play any position on the line and I really believe he could play either side of the ball. One of the things that impresses me is that everybody we play—every time I run into a coach we've played—they always mention what a great player Dukes is."—Florida State offensive coordinator and line coach Wayne McDuffie



phonso Carreker has really helped me a lot. He's been a guiding influence to me, because he's in the pros now. He tells me what goes on, what things I need to work on.

Q: What kind of advice would you give to high school athletes now?

A: Academics before athletics. They may not believe me, but all they have to do is look at the papers. It's been a problem at colleges across the country. If they don't perform in the classroom, they can't make it. You can't play football forever. You can be the best athlete in the world, but one day, a knee, an ankle or bone chips and that's it.

Q: How would you like other people to see you?

A: I hope they would say I'm easy-going, relaxed and very outgoing.

Q: If you didn't play football, what sport would you choose?

A: I love basketball. I was raised in New York and that's all we did was play basketball. I was decent but not great. I gave it up, though, when I decided I wanted to go to school and realized basketball was not gonna take me there.

Q: Who is your favorite athlete?

A: Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. I've always followed his career, since he was at UCLA and Milwaukee. I've read some books about him, too and needless to say I'm a Lakers fan. My favorite football player is Larry Little, the former Miami Dolphin great who coaches Bethune-Cookman now. I think he and I are in the same mold: short, but really quick with good feet. I try to model some of my play after the way he played.

Q: If you could be whatever you wanted to, what would you choose?

A: A professional football player, or a millionaire.

Q: Is this the best time of your life right now?

A: Yes, most of my best memories spring from playing football here and meeting friends here. The friendships have been important to me, from people like Hassan (Jones) and Darryl (Gray). It's gonna be hard to leave, but we've all got to get out and do our own thing. We're ready to go out and live our own lives, but hopefully we can stay in touch.

Q: Coming in to Florida State as a freshman four years ago, what expectations did you have?

A: I thought it was going to be hard. I thought all the guys would be grizzly bears. But when I got here, I realized the guys were definitely good players, a little better than me, a little bigger and quicker, but they did not have a huge strength advantage. (Former FSU defensive tackle) Al-

All-American candidate who should give the Seminoles a big year ... with NFL first-rounder Jessie Hester graduated, Jones should be in the spotlight for the first time ... since coming to FSU, he has played with Chicago Bears starter Dennis McKinnon, Pittsburgh Steelers third receiver Weegie Thompson and Hester ... honored with the Hinesman Award, an honor that goes to the top player of spring workouts, after dropping only three passes during the '85 spring and catching eight passes for 144 yards and two TDs in the Garnet and Gold game ... great hands, 4.48 speed in the 40 and outstanding size ... can also throw the ball 80 yards ... a team leader ... has moved into FSU record books in a tie for 7th place in career touchdown receptions (12) ... his 1,026 receiving yards are just 99 yards short of breaking into FSU's all-time top 10 ... 64 career catches ... **1984:** FSU's second leading receiver behind Hester with 28 catches and seven TDs ... averaged 17.9 yards per reception, his longest a 50-yarder vs. Kansas ... outstanding game came vs. Auburn with seven catches for 101 yards and two TDs ... caught four for 82 yards vs. Arizona State, including a crucial 45-yarder to keep a drive alive when FSU was down 20-10 ... threw two passes, completing one of 43 yards during the season ... shut out of just the Florida game when he did not catch a pass ... **1983:** 24 receptions, third on the team, for a 13.8 per-catch average and two TDs ... completed one pass for 30 yards ... **1982:** 12 catches for 193 yards, a 16.1 average, and scored three TDs ... not included in totals are three passes he caught in Gator Bowl ... **High School:** Parade All-American as well as Scholastic Magazine All-American ... named Hertz High School

Myers)—played quarterback and defensive back his senior year of high school . . . ran for 133 yards one game and passed for 136 in another . . . his season totals were 839 passing yards and 499 rushing . . . picked off four interceptions as a defensive back . . . limited by a knee injury late in the season . . . recovered in time for basketball season, and was chosen to the Southwest Florida team as well as second team all-state while averaging 24 points per game . . . may give some thought to playing baseball at FSU also. . . .

Sammie Smith, TB, 6-1, 214, Apopka, Fla. (Apopka)—named to almost every all-star team in the country . . . a *Parade* All-American, *USA Today* All-American, Bally's All-American, Super Senior 24 list in the state of Florida and a first team Class AAAA all-state choice . . . he was also named to *Football Weekly's* list of top 100 football players in the country . . . gained 1,210 yards in 119 carries and scored 16 TDs while playing just 7.5 games his senior season . . . rushed for 930 yards in just five games . . . had two 200-yard first halves . . . as a junior, rushed for 1,485 yards in 180 carries and scored 23 times . . . also excels on the track where he won the Class AAAA state championship in the 100 (9.6) and 200 (21.3) his junior year . . . and finished third as a senior. . . .

Michael Tanks, LB, 6-3, 240, Decatur, Ga. (Southwest Dekalb)—will be one of 12 future Seminoles in the Florida-Georgia all-star game this summer . . . his high school coach William Godfrey will coach the wide receivers in that game . . . played defensive end and tight end for his Southwest Dekalb High School team . . . the team went undefeated in the regular season . . . runs a 4.6 in the 40 yards . . . took official visits to Wisconsin, Wake Forest, Eastern Kentucky, East Carolina and FSU. . . .

Shelton Thompson, LB, 6-3, 200, Lakeland, Fla. (Lake Gibson)—third team AAA all-state selection as a senior at Lake Gibson High School . . . also earned all-county recognition at both linebacker and offensive tackle . . . holds the school record in the discus. . . .

Pat Tomberlin, OL/DL, 6-4, 300, Middleburg, Fla. (Middleburg)—made 65 stops as a defensive tackle his senior year . . . first team Class AAAA all-state performer and Super 24

Senior . . . biggest 1985 Florida State signee . . . considered to have good speed . . . also pitches for his high school's baseball team. . . .

Patrick White, WR, 6-2, 186, Tampa, Fla. (Hillsborough)—caught 47 passes for 743 yards and five touchdowns . . . led all AAAA receivers in yardage and was fifth in 3A and 4A receptions . . . his high school wide receiver coach was Roger Overby, a former wide receiver at FSU . . . has also played some tight end . . . has just played a total of two years of football . . . chose FSU over Tennessee, Syracuse, Arizona State and Louisville . . . a 3.5 student while taking college preparatory classes. . . .



Alphonso Williams, DB, 6-0, 187, Lloyd, Fla. (Jefferson County)—rates among the top 15 defensive backs in the state according to the *Orlando Sentinel* . . . played cornerback and safety on defense and wide receiver on offense at Jefferson County High School . . . a first team Class AA all-state selection . . . averaged 13 solo tackles per game, 130 on the season in 1984 . . . best single game effort was a 17 solo tackle game . . . as a wide receiver, caught 20 passes and three touchdowns . . . All-Big Bend . . . a B student. . . .

Anthony Williams, DL, 6-3, 268, Apopka, Fla. (Apopka)—an All-South performer out of Apopka High . . . a first team all-state selection in Class AAAA . . . received the Orlando Touchdown Club's Defensive Player of the Year award . . . named to *Football Weekly's* list of top 100 high school seniors in the nation . . . will be playing with and against future teammates at the Florida-Georgia All-Star game this summer . . . could get an early look in the Seminole fall workouts. . . .

Peter Tom Willis, QB, 6-3, 180, Morris, Ala. (Mortimer Jordan)—the Class AAAA Player of the Year in Alabama . . . an all-state and All-South selection as well . . . threw for over 2,000 yards and 21 touchdowns at Mortimer Jordan High School . . . passed for nearly 400 yards in one game and five touchdowns in another as his school went 9-3 . . . honorable mention all-state in basketball his senior season. . . .

Tony Yeomans, DL, 6-2, 285, Jesup, Ga. (Wayne County)—played noseguard at Wayne County High School . . . had 46 solo tackles and 26 assists in 1984 . . . also caused 24 fumbles . . . was a four-year starter on the defensive line . . . will play in Florida-Georgia all-star game . . . has a 3.3 grade point average . . . recruiting specialist Bill Buchalter calls him "the most unknown lineman in the South". . . .

Newcomers like Parade All-American Sammie Smith have given recruiting expert Joe Terranova reason to rate FSU's recruiting number one in the nation. South expert Bill Buchalter gave the Seminole newcomers his top grade as well. If these experts are accurate, Florida State football should see plenty of good times ahead.

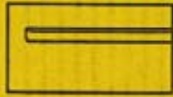

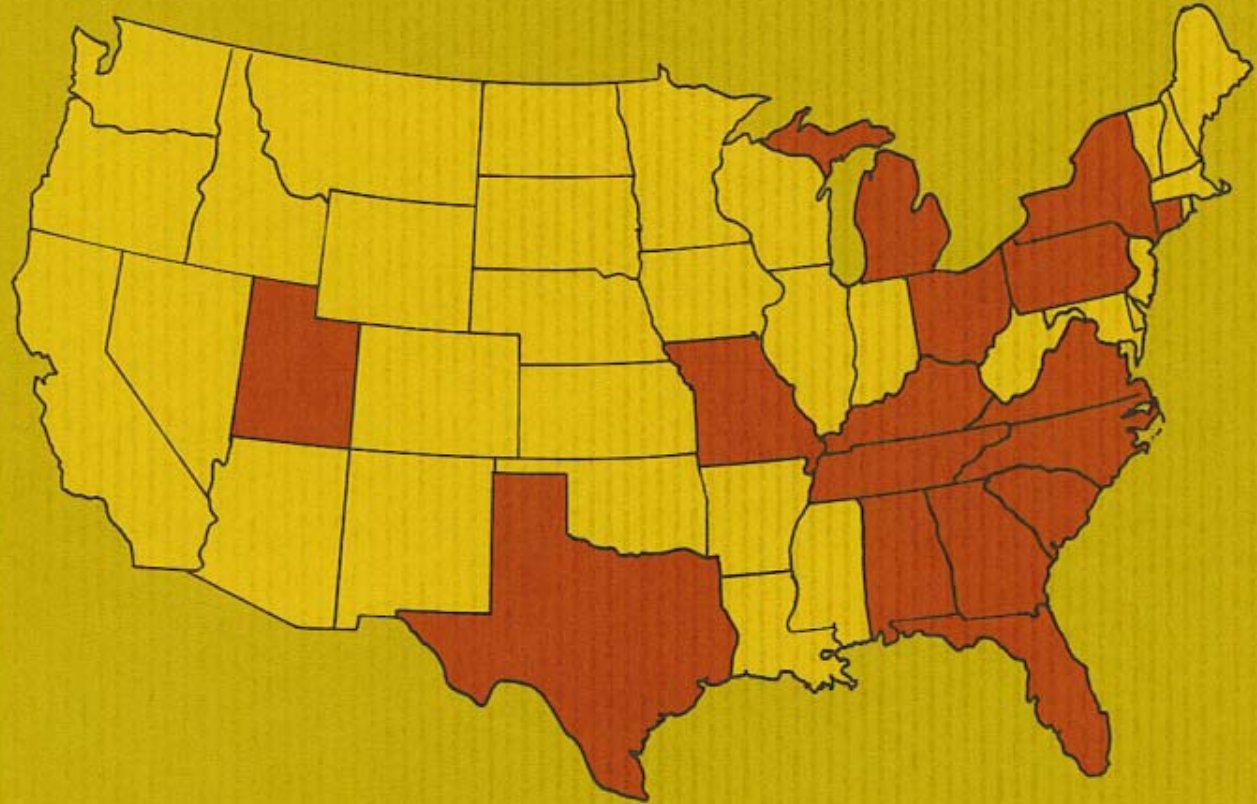
