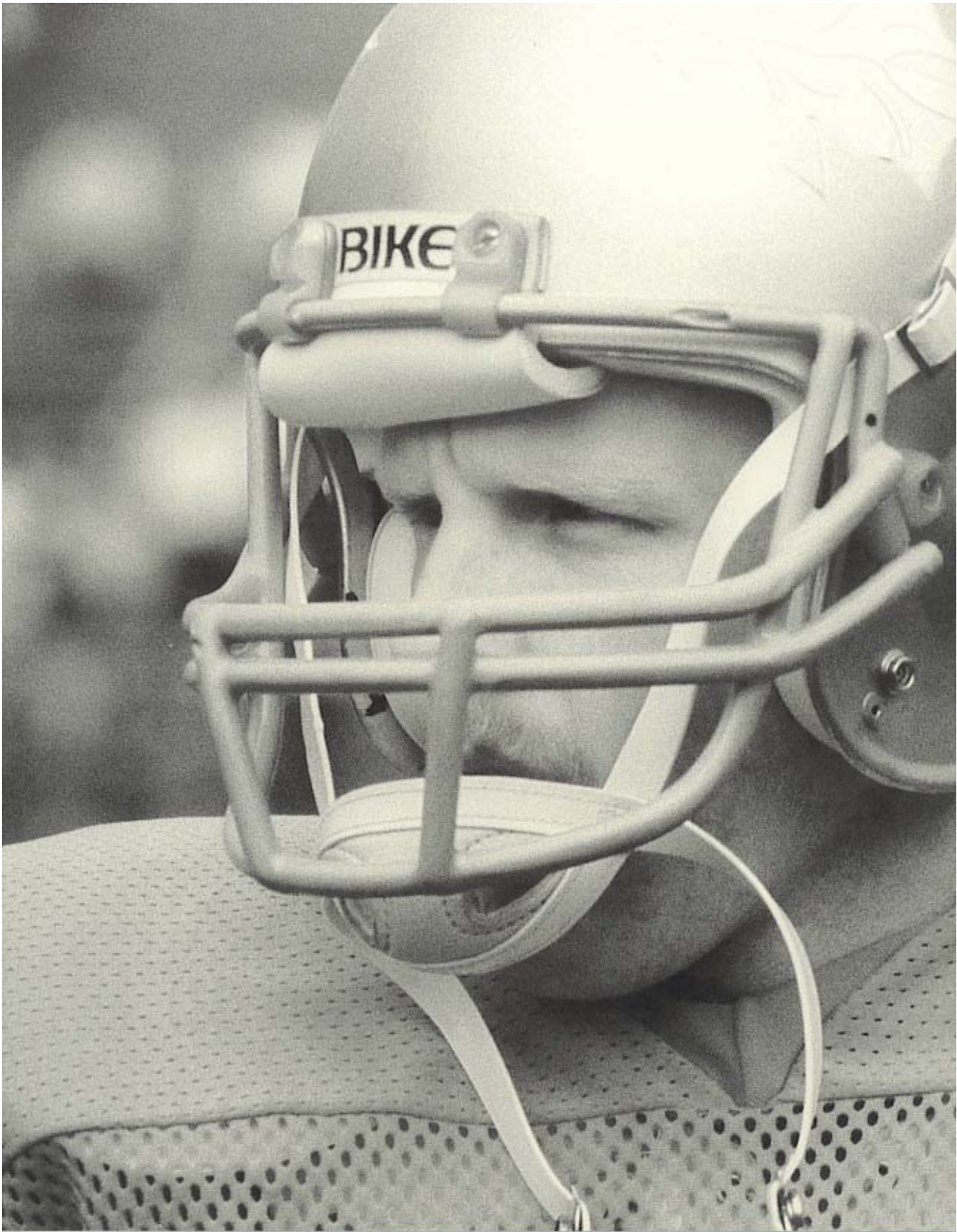

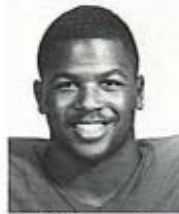

... because coaches have not seen him play, they're not quite sure where he will fit in ... goes into the fall listed at fifth team in the strong safety position ... he will get a long look in the nickel back position also ... coaches will bring him along just as quickly as they can ... has great athletic talent ... **1986:** was one of five FSU players who had to sit out the season under Proposition 48 ... he loses the year of eligibility ... **High School:** probably the most honored player that FSU signed during the 1986 recruiting year ... named to the Bally and Adidas All-American teams ... listed as one of the nation's top 100 prospects by scout Joe Terranova ... played in the Florida-Georgia all-star game and was a member of the Florida super 24 team ... made 139 tackles and five interceptions on defense and carried the ball 31 times for a 15.3 average on offense ... high school rival of FSU sophomore wide receiver Ronald Lewis, who played at Raines ... **Personal:** wants to major in hotel and restaurant management ... born July 19, 1968.

1986: was redshirted ... **High School:** was a recruited walkon after a career at Taylor High School ... **Personal:** put together a 3.2 GPA during his first fall on the FSU campus and currently carries over a 3.0 average ... has not chosen a major ... born May 1, 1968.

fans in the Miami game with a 90-yard kickoff return that came after he scooped up a Keith Ross lateral pass at the 10-yard line ... Carter finished the season with a 30.9 return average on eight returns ... he also rushed the football 22 times for 95 yards and two TDs ... the TDs came on a 19-yard run vs. Tulane and a 30-yarder vs. Louisville ... also caught a pass for 32 yards ... originally intended for a redshirt, Carter was activated after the first two games when the Seminoles had some injuries at tailback ... **High School:** 3A all-stater who rushed for 1,400 yards as a senior ... rushed for 1,800 as a junior and had a total of 4,050 in his career ... named to the *Florida Times Union's* Super 11 list ... attended the Bobby Bowden camp while in high school ... **Personal:** will be enrolled in the basic studies program at FSU for two more semesters before choosing a major ... born Sept. 15, 1967.

High School: named to the *Parade* All-American team as well as the *USA Today* All-American team ... also picked first team all-state in Class 4A and the *Orlando Sentinel* Super Senior 24 list ... *Football Weekly* tabloid also had him listed as one of its top 100 high school seniors in the country ... scored 44 points in a basketball game as a junior ... chose Florida State over Oklahoma, Southern Cal, Ohio State and Ole Miss ...

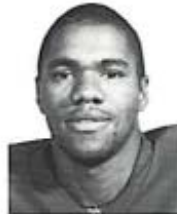


... one of the finest tight ends in the country and one of Florida State's All-American candidates ... although Carter doesn't have the statistics that some tight ends have, he is rated as the #2 professional prospect coming out of the college ranks this year ... much of that is attributed to his outstanding blocking, but he also has fine hands ... there is a thought among pro scouts who have seen him play that he could be moved inside in the pros ... has 43 career receptions for an 11.7 average and five TDs at FSU as a three-year starter ... had an outstanding spring where he received the Hinesman Award for the best performance on the team ... caught seven passes for 79 yards in the Garnet and Gold game ... his 31-inch vertical jump despite his 258 pounds attests to his athletic ability ... **1986:** named honorable mention A.P. All-American and was named to the first team of the All-South Independent squad ... caught 14 passes for an 11.9 average ... didn't catch a TD pass but did catch two two-point conversion passes ... caught two passes for 15 yards vs. Nebraska and four for 32 vs. Toledo ... **1985:** started every game except for Auburn, Western Carolina and the Gator Bowl ... caught 14 passes for 154 yards and three TDs ... not included was a big Gator Bowl game where he caught five for 81 yards—including a key third down play that went for 23 yards ... caught three passes for 34 yards and a TD vs. Miami ... his other TD catches came on a 26-yarder vs. Tulsa and a 3-yarder vs. South Carolina ... **1984:** had perhaps the best year of any freshman in FSU history at the tight end position and was named the most improved player on the FSU offense for the season ... started six games and caught 13 passes for 175 yards, a 13.5 average, and two scores ... touchdowns came against South Carolina, where he had five catches for 62 yards, and Florida, where he had four for 37 ... in his second game as a Seminole, Pat was a starter (vs. Kansas) and responded by catching two passes for 43 yards ... was one of three FSU receivers in double-figure catches for '85 ... longest catch of the year was a 33-yarder vs. South Carolina ... **High School:** caught 21 passes for 303 yards and three touchdowns as a senior at Riverview High where he was a teammate of kicker Derek Schmidt ... **Personal:** a political science major ... first name is actually "Wendell", but he prefers his middle name of Pat ... born Aug. 1, 1966.

... because coaches haven't seen him play, they're not sure where he will fit into the picture ... will be at a fourth-team flanker position in the fall ... **1986:** as an athlete who came under the Proposition 48 ruling, he was ineligible to play ... **High School:** played on two state championship teams under FSU grad Thurston Taylor at Palmetto High ... enrolled at FSU with a list of honors trailing him that included All-South, honorable mention All-America by *USA Today* and *Sporting News* Top 100 ... played in the Florida-Georgia all-star game ... caught 36 passes for 780 yards and six TDs as a senior ... caught 101 passes in his career ... FSU senior tight end Gaylon White also played at Palmetto ... **Personal:** has not chosen a major ... born July 14, 1966.

#39 Brian Davis

... he has played more positions than any other player ... started at inside linebacker upon coming to FSU, then switched to strong safety, moved to outside linebacker and now he's been at inside linebacker for a year ... involved in strong competition with Keith Carter for a backup role at the weak-side linebacker position ... has been worked into the nickel defense where he is a starter ... had both thumb and ankle surgery in May ... **1986:** the tackle chart lists 16 tackles for Brian, including a sack and tackle for loss ... caused a fumble vs. Louisville and recovered another vs. Nebraska ... had a season-high seven tackles vs. Wichita State ... **1985:** missed the first two games of the year, then played in the next 10 ... had a total of 11 tackles while playing and lettering on the special teams ... spent the year at the strong safety position ... **1984:** played in just the Miami game, getting some special team work, and qualified for a redshirt year ... practiced at inside linebacker ... **High School:** first team 3A all-state linebacker and Big Bend Player of the Year ... *USA Today* All-American ... 139 tackles as a senior and 349 in his career ... **Personal:** a social sciences major ... made his best semester GPA (3.38) last spring ... born Oct. 21, 1966.

... he's been held back by injuries, but he'll continue to contribute in spot situations ... had arthroscopic surgery on his knee in the spring and also was sidelined with a concussion ... **1986:** lettered as a redshirt freshman, playing in every game and catching eight passes for 96 yards and a TD ... the touchdown, the first of his career, came on a 22-yard pass from Danny McManus vs. Wichita State ... **1985:** redshirted as all but seven members of his class were ... **High School:** a class 4A all-state performer ... caught 38 passes for 676 yards and seven touchdowns his senior year ... rated as one of the top 10 receivers in the South by one recruiting analyst ... **Personal:** has not yet declared a major ... put together a 3.31 GPA for the '87 spring semester ... born Jan. 14, 1967.

Dedrick could also serve as FSU's nickel man again ... **1986:** made 30 tackles while playing on the special teams and in nickel back situations ... also got reps at free safety in games where FSU was well ahead ... broke up two passes and made two interceptions ... the pickoffs came vs. Louisville and vs. Southern Miss, where he ran 47 yards for a touchdown ... **1985:** redshirted along with 17 other FSU freshmen ... **High School:** first team 2A all-state as a receiver in his senior year with 52 catches for 617 yards ... made 12 interceptions as a defensive back ... also a standout baseball and basketball player ... was his team's MVP as a junior before requiring shoulder surgery as a senior ... **Personal:** changed his name as a high school senior after being born as Dedrick Allen ... he was legally adopted by Richmond and Ann Dodge ... nicknamed "The Blade" for his thin physique ... will choose a major in the fall ... born June 14, 1967.

John was named the most improved linebacker in the spring for the second straight year ... whether he starts or not will determine if he plays on the special teams ... bench presses 440 pounds ... **1986:** earned his second letter while getting most of his playing time on the special teams ... made 24 tackles, including four for loss ... his first career interception came in the Wichita State game ... **1985:** qualified for a medical hardship after playing in just three games—Tulane, Nebraska and Kansas ... suffered a knee ligament injury that took time to heal ... **1984:** lettered as a member of the special teams and also got in a few plays at outside linebacker ... made 24 tackles, 16 of them primary hits, and caused a fumble ... **High School:** *Parade* and *USA Today* All-American ... best game of senior year came against Killian High School when he recovered three fumbles and intercepted a pass ... **Personal:** a criminology major ... earned a 3.37 GPA for the '87 spring semester ... one of the squad's married members ... born Feb. 4, 1966.

... is currently in a battle for a backup slot at noseguard with fellow freshman redshirt Lamar Williams ... switched over from the offensive line last fall ... a very dependable player who improved more than the coaches expected he would after just one season ... improved his bench press 40 pounds to 415 since stepping foot in the FSU weight room ... **1986:** was one of 17 freshmen who were redshirted ... **High School:** played both lines ... finished third in the class 4A heavyweight weightlifting championship ... **Personal:** has not chosen a major yet ... his father is a cardiologist of Egyptian decent while his mother is Yugoslavian ... one of his nicknames, "Fous", comes from his middle name of Malfouz ... born on Valentine's Day in 1968.

#5 Chip Ferguson

Quarterback

6-2, 197, Junior
Charlotte, North Carolina
(Spartanburg S.C. High School)



... although he is FSU's backup quarterback, he's played a lot of football for FSU ... he is 123 yards from becoming the school's 10th all-time career yardage leader ... his 15 TD passes already put him in 10th place on the TD list ... in the spring game, hit just 8 of 19 passes for 86 yards while throwing two interceptions ... **1986:** although it certainly didn't measure up to his outstanding freshman year, he did contribute ... began the season as the starter and came out hot, hitting 17 of 28 passes vs. Toledo for 176 yards ... over the next three games, Ferguson would be sacked 12 times while completing just 21 of 49 passes for 356 yards ... Nebraska sacked him seven times ... his 6 of 19 for 73 yards and three interceptions vs. Michigan finally got him pulled in favor of Danny McManus ... Ferguson went to third team until he was called upon in the South Carolina game to relieve Peter Tom Willis, who had started in place of an injured McManus ... Ferguson took over and brought the Seminoles back from a 21-6 USC lead, completing 15 of 22 passes for 228 yards and a TD for an eventual 45-28 win ... he didn't play in the Florida game or the All-American Bowl ... on the season completed 63 of 128 passes (49.1 percent) for

807 yards and four TDs ... intercepted seven times ... **1985:** it was a storybook season for Ferguson, who came from a fourth-team position to lead the Seminoles to the Gator Bowl championship ... in that game, he was named the MVP after completing 20 of 43 passes for 338 yards and two TDs ... it was later learned that Ferguson had cracked a collarbone in the first quarter ... during the regular season he completed 70 of 130 passes for 990 yards, a 53.8 completion percentage, and 11 TDs ... named freshman All-America by *Football News* ... first was called upon in a pressure situation in the Kansas game—the fourth game of the season—with FSU behind 20-10 in the fourth quarter ... got the Seminoles quickly on the board with a 68-yard TD bomb to Phillip Bryant and then on the next series, directed a 62-yard drive to get the winning TD ... came off the bench again in the North Carolina game in the third quarter to complete 15 of 23 passes for 124 yards and a TD while FSU once again came from behind ... got his first start against Miami and took over the controls for the rest of the season ... probably his most "freshman-like" performance came against Auburn early in the season when he was intercepted and fumbled on his first two series, both leading to Tiger scores ... his first snaps as a collegian came in the Tulane game where he relieved starter McManus once the Seminoles had a lead ... not unexpectedly, Ferguson was named the Seminoles' most improved offensive player ... **High School:** played in the South Carolina-North Carolina Shrine game as a senior and threw for 125 yards and a TD ... played at Spartanburg (S.C.) High, setting single-season records for touchdowns (21) and total offensive yards (2,557), breaking Steve Fuller's (Clemson and the Chicago Bears) marks ... also ran for 10 TDs as his team went 12-1 and lost in the state finals ... Chip played at Independence (N.C.) High as a junior, throwing for 1,400 yards and leading his team to a 7-3 record ... he was a teammate of FSU defensive tackle Steve Gabbard there ... as a sophomore Ferguson hit 59 of 60 extra points, serving as the squad's kicker while quarterback Mark Maye (now at North Carolina) led Independence ... **Personal:** Ferguson counts a boa constrictor as one of his roommates ... has not chosen a major yet ... born Mar. 16, 1967.

#27 Victor Floyd

Tailback

6-0, 201, Junior
Pensacola, Florida
(Pensacola High School)



... he is just 112 yards away from becoming the 10th most productive back in FSU history ... has rushed for 1,273 yards in his career and scored 10 TDs ... the TD total ties him for seventh on the FSU all-time list with two seasons left to play ... despite those sterling statistics, Floyd will be second team when he lines up in the fall—behind Sammie Smith ... Floyd and Smith will most likely split playing time as head coach Bobby

Bowden likes to keep a fresh tailback in the game . . . Floyd is most valuable in third and long situations because of his abilities as a receiver—he has caught 31 passes in his career . . . has had a career against South Carolina, rushing for 331 yards and four TDs and catching five passes for 74 yards and another TD in just two games . . . vertical jump is 36 inches . . . also plays baseball for FSU's nationally-ranked team . . . **1986:** FSU's leading rusher and second leading receiver, Floyd totaled 654 yards, a 6.1 average, and six TDs on the ground while catching 21 passes for an 11.0 average and two TDs . . . with his 21 catches, he became the first running back since 1980 to catch over 20 passes in a season . . . his scoring total of 48 points was second only to kicker Derek Schmidt . . . started eight games, splitting time with Smith . . . his best game was clearly South Carolina, where he rushed for 119 yards and two TDs and caught four passes for 60 yards and another TD . . . also picked up a 100-yard game vs. Louisville where he had 110 in 18 carries . . . 93 yards in 16 carries vs. Tulane . . . named to Harry DeVold's Almost All-American team following the season and also made the second unit of the Metro Conference team . . . batted .306 as a reserve outfielder for the Seminole baseball team in his first year out for the team . . . **1985:** was perhaps the biggest surprise of the season, winning the starting tailback job after seven games . . . started the last four of the regular season . . . totaled 619 yards on 90 carries, a 6.9 average, and four TDs . . . also caught 10 passes for 71 yards and a TD . . . in his first start vs. Miami rushed for 72 yards . . . best game was a 212-yard, two TD performance vs. South Carolina . . . that rushing total was the fourth best in FSU record books and gave him the distinction of becoming just the second FSU player to ever rush for 200 or more yards in a game . . . his 61-yard gallop for a TD in that game was the 10th longest TD run from scrimmage in history . . . scored his first career TD in the fourth quarter of the Kansas game on a 7-yard run that proved to be the game winner . . . named an A.P. honorable mention All-American and made the All-South Independent first team . . . missed the Nebraska game and played the first part of the season with a broken wrist in a cast . . . **1984:** was redshirted to give him eligibility through 1988 . . . in spring practice named most improved freshman on offense . . . **High School:** played only one year of football and rushed for 1,500 yards in 176 carries . . . had games of 230 and 298 yards . . . picked to the first team of the 3A all-state squad and was an honorable mention Adidas All-American and a member of the *Orlando Sentinel's* "Sweet 16" list . . . hit .450 as a baseball player . . . **Personal:** majoring in criminology . . . born Jan. 24, 1966.

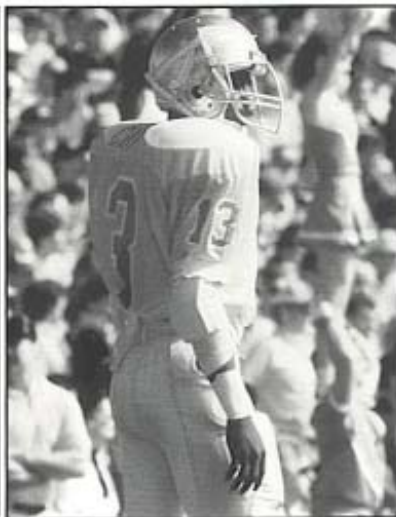
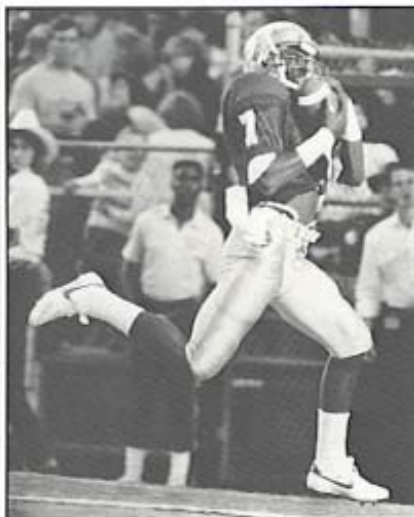

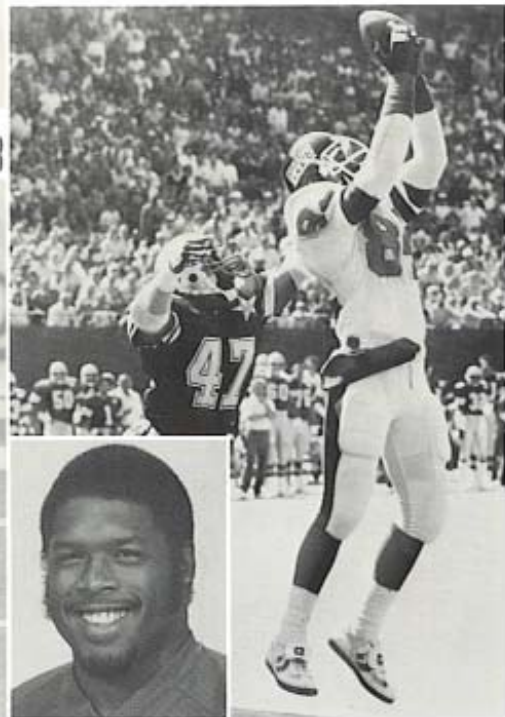
