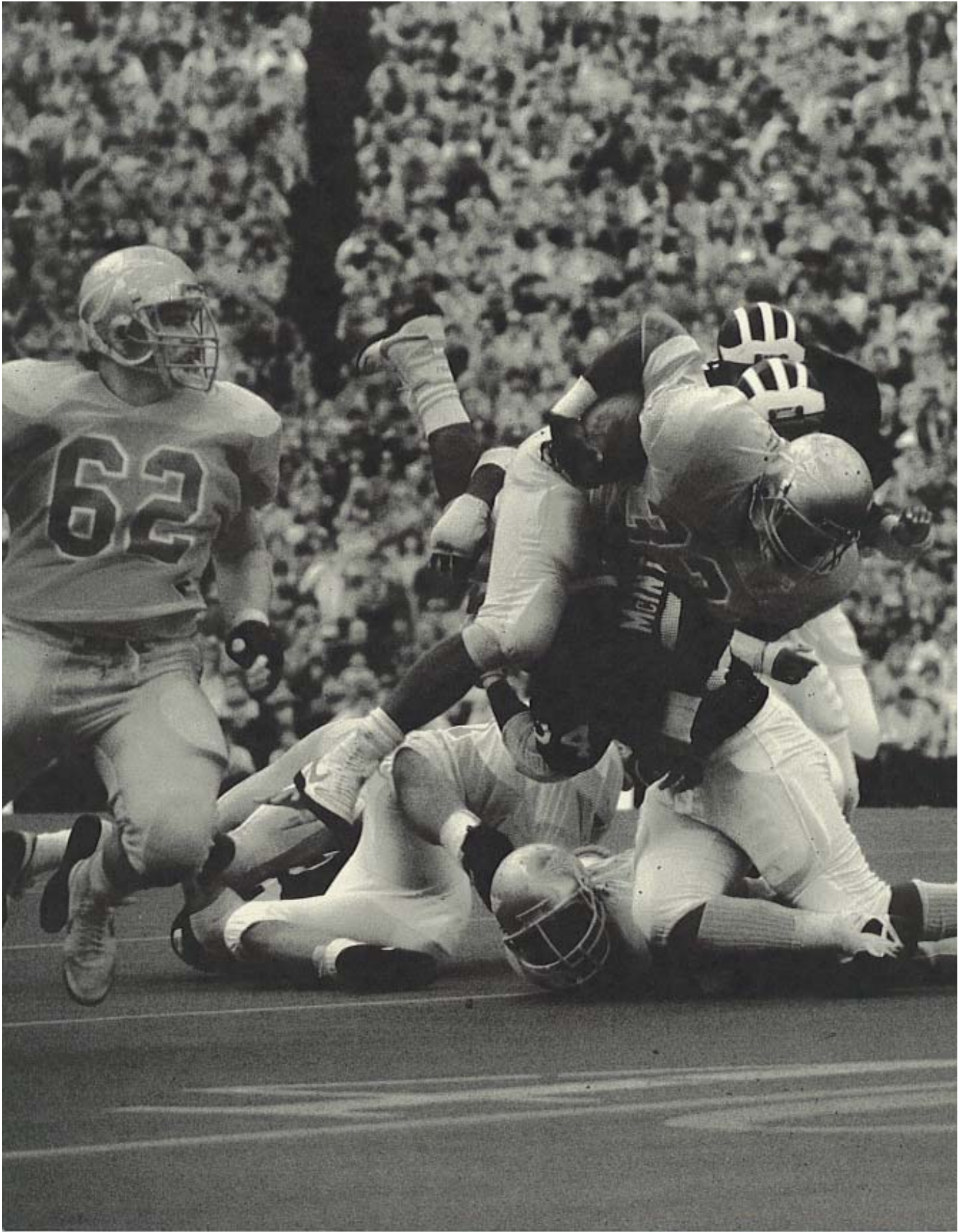

The Seminoles are unbeaten in this series with a 4-0 lead over the Pirates... all the games have been played in Tallahassee and this is the Seminoles' first trip to Ficklin Stadium... in this series, the Seminoles have scored 213 points, or an average of 53.3 per game... the series began in 1980 with a 63-7 whipping by the Seminoles... the most exciting contest was in 1983 when FSU eeked out a 47-46 win in a year when the Pirates went 8-3... head coach Art Baker was on the sidelines as East Carolina's offensive coordinator that year... the next season, in 1984, he was the Seminoles' assistant head coach and quarterback coach before leaving to take the East Carolina head post... ECU secondary coach Jeff Ferrington also spent the 1984 season at Florida State as a graduate assistant...

Florida State won the last meeting between the schools—19-10 in 1985... one FSU player who will remember the game, although he didn't at the time is quarterback Danny McManus, who was knocked unconscious for the second straight week... the Seminoles have won five of the last seven games with the Tigers... FSU kicker Derek Schmidt has kicked five field goals in his two-game career vs. MSU... both schools are members of the Metro Conference, which features competition in baseball, basketball, track and field, tennis, golf, volleyball and swimming...

**GAME NOTES:**

this is the first game between the Spartans and Seminoles... the game is the first of a two-year contract that will have Michigan State playing in Tallahassee in 1988... the Spartans fine tailback, Lorenzo White, is a Florida native and attended Ft. Lauderdale's Dillard High School... the Seminoles will be seeing a few Michigan teams in the coming four years, with the University of Michigan, Western Michigan and Michigan State on future schedules...
