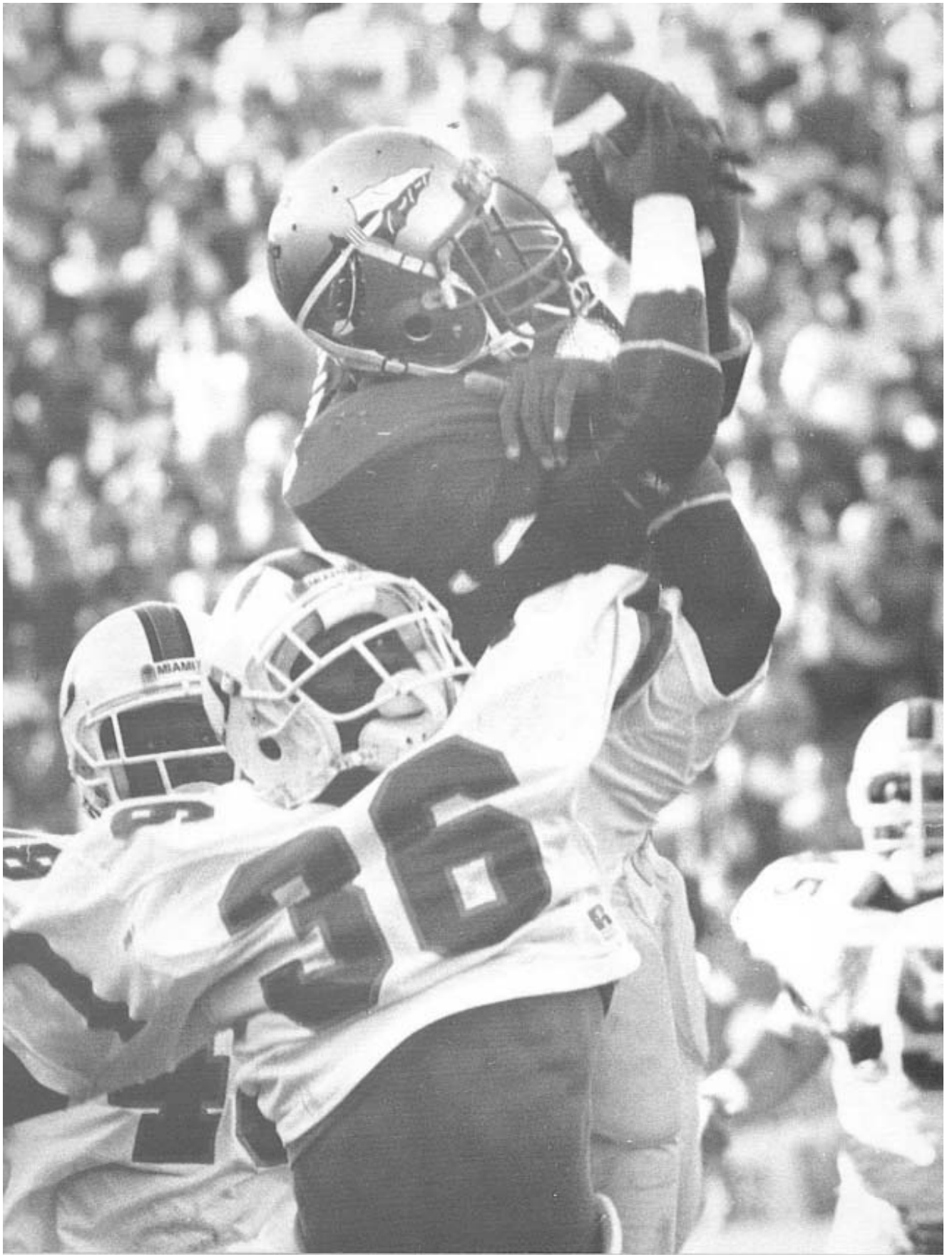

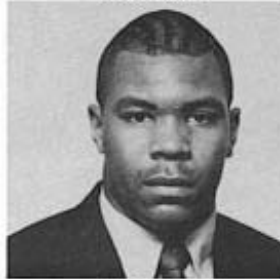


GAME NOTES

This match-up between 1987's national champion and runner-up will be the college football kickoff for CBS on September 3 from the Orange Bowl... it will be the third straight year that CBS has shown the game to a national television audience... the match-up is quickly developing into one of the finest series in college football, although Miami is actually the oldest opponent on the FSU schedule... the Hurricanes have an 18-13 advantage in the series and have won three straight over the Seminoles... FSU has fared well in the Orange Bowl over the years, winning 12 of the 21 games the teams have played there... ironically, Florida State has only won one game in its own Doak Campbell Stadium vs. UM... in 1980 (10-9) and in 1987 (28-25), only one point stood between possible national championships for FSU when Miami prevailed... interestingly, both contests came down to a failed two-point conversion when FSU could have kicked the extra point and settled for a tie... three of the 12 games Bobby Bowden has played with Miami have been one-point outcomes, all in Miami's favor... fourth-year FSU quarterback coach Mark Richt is a former Gane quarterback... FSU tailback Sammie Smith won the CBS MVP award for last season's game with his 189 yards vs. the 'Cane defense... Florida State has blocked at least one Miami punt in four of the last five games the schools have played - in 1983, 1985, 1986 and 1987... in 1986, FSU blocked a Miami punt but was called for illegal procedure... the punt block team lined up again and on the very next play blocked the punt again...

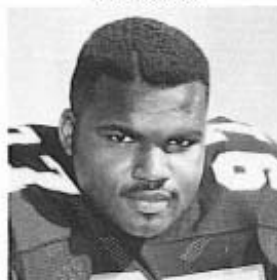

The Tribe leads the series 11-7-1... in games played in Tallahassee, Florida State is 6-3... FSU has won three straight over USM, including last year's 61-10 win in Hattiesburg... defensive line coach Mike Bugar is a 1969 graduate of Florida State and a former football letterman... FSU tailback Sammie Smith has rushed for 216 yards and two TDs in two games vs. Southern Miss while USM's Shelton Gandy, another 1,000 yard rusher in 1987, has rushed for 141 yards vs. FSU in a pair of games... the longest rush vs. FSU since the 1984 season was by USM's Tim Warnsley, who ran for a 69-yard TD in '87... Golden Eagle freshman QB Brett Favre had a tough outing a year ago, completing just 5 of 30 passes for 40 yards and throwing four interceptions... USM freshman Brian Wood is out of Tallahassee's Goody High School... both schools are members of the Metro Conference in sports other than football.

This will be only the fourth meeting in history between the schools . . . the Seminoles hold a slim 2-1 series lead . . . the last time the schools met — 1976 — Clemson won 15-12 . . . both teams are pre-season ranked in the top 10 and coming off bowl victories . . . the Tigers finished the season ranked 12th in the Associated Press and 10th in the United Press International polls while FSU was second in both . . . Danny Ford is the sixth winningest active football coach in college football while Bobby Bowden is fourth . . . Seminole athletic director Hootie Ingram was head coach at Clemson from 1970-72, facing FSU in 1970 . . . Ingram is generally credited with coming up with Clemson's famous "Tiger Paw" logo. . .

The Seminoles lead this series, one that began in 1983, 5-0... this will be the third time FSU has played in New Orleans... FSU actually lost to the Green Wave (34-29) on its first trip to New Orleans... that game was later forfeited because Tulane used ineligible quarterback Jon English... two Tulane assistant coaches have served as defensive line coaches at Florida State — John Davlin (1971-72) and Bill Shaw (1979-81)... Shaw, now the TU defensive line coach, also is a '72 FSU grad... Tulane head coach Greg Davis is one of three first-year coaches who the Seminoles will face... terrific Tulane quarterback Terrence Jones has passed for 430 yards and two TDs and rushed for pair of a TDs in three games vs. FSU... his very first collegiate game came against FSU and in a backup role he completed 2 of 3 passes for 33 yards... Wave redshirt freshman France Green is a wide receiver from Lincoln High School in Tallahassee...

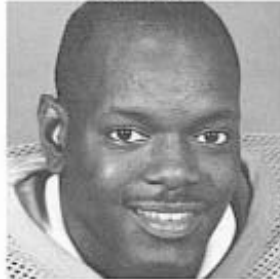

The Seminole Sports Network, a regional radio network covering three states, brings Florida State football to fans, alumni and college football enthusiasts throughout the Southeast.

In June of 1985, Bud Sports, a division of the Anheuser-Busch Marketing Department in St. Louis, acquired the broadcasting rights to the network. The company also produces the St. Louis Cardinal Baseball Network and a pair of nationally broadcasted weekly programs.

The Florida State network extends into more than 45 markets. Locally in Tallahassee, WTNT carries Seminole football.

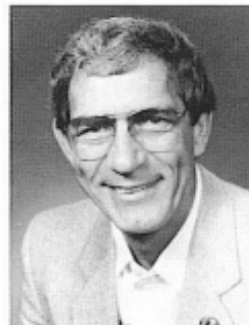
